QUICK SHOTS

CHASING HISTORY:

Heading into the 2020 season, Corey Hertzog sits fourth all-time in career USL goals with 62. Just ahead of Hertzog with 63 is Birmingham Legion's Chandler Hoffman. With 72 is recently-retired Jorge Herrera, and leading the USL Championship is Charlotte's Dane Kelly with 77. Hertzog has a healthy lead on fifth-place George Davis, who owns 56 and currently plays for Louisville City FC. Of the top five all-time goal scorers in USL history, Hertzog is the only one to have scored more than 10 goals last season.

LEAGUE HISTORY:

In 2019, Reno tied FC Cincinnati for the most regular-season wins in a club's first three seasons with 51. Reno and Cincinnati are the only clubs to win 50 matches through three seasons, and Reno did so with a +75 goal differential to Cincinnati's +50. Reno is also one of just six teams to make the playoffs in each of their first three seasons. Only FCC, Reno, Louisville City, Swope Park Rangers, New York Red Bulls II and Sacramento Republic FC accomplished the feat.

HE'S BACK!

Forward Corey Hertzog returns to Reno for year two with the club after a record-breaking year one for the veteran. Hertzog finished the year with 19 goals, breaking Dane Kelly's club record of 18 set in 2017. The total broke Hertzog's previous career high of 14, set in 2017. The attacker's six assists also represented a career best.

FOUR YEAR MEN:

Reno's 2020 squad includes two players from the club's inaugural 2017 season, defenders Brent Richards and Thomas Janjigian. Richards owns club records in starts (87) and caps (89). Janjigian is 10th all-time in starts with 40. Through the club's first four seasons, the boys in blue have played 104 games (including playoffs) and Richards has missed just five. Additionally, Richards 13 assists are tied for fourth all-time, and tops among active 1868 FC players.

FRIENDLY FOE:

Reno's played Tacoma Defiance six times, including twice as Seattle Sounders 2, and never lost. Reno owns a 3-0-3 record against the club, including last September's 5-0 drubbing in Reno. Defender Brent Richards tied a USL Championship record with three assists in that game. Despite the success, Reno has never won at Tacoma/Seattle, drawing both games.

KICKING THINGS OFF:

In Reno's first three seasons, the club has never won a season opener, going 0-2-1. This is the first time in club history that Reno has opened the season on the road. In road openers, Reno owns a 0-1-2 record.

On the final preseason friendly

"We went down early and fought back in the second half to make it 3-2, I thought we were gonna get another couple of goals there but then they got a fourth and we didn't really create a lot of chances after that."

RENO DROPS PRESEASON FRIENDLY TO SAN DIEGO LOYAL SC

Two goals by Corey Hertzog not enough in final game of preseason

RENO, Nev. – Reno 1868 FC fell 4-2 to San Diego Loyal SC today, despite a pair of goals from forward Corey Hertzog. Reno came back after trailing 3-0 in the first half, but could not complete the comeback in the pre-season finale.

After trailing 3-0 from San Diego goals in the 7th, 24th and 30th minutes, Hertzog banged in a goal from the edge of the box. Coming in the 44th minute, the strike brought the score to 3-1 at the end of the first half.

Less than five minutes into the second half, Hertzog would convert a penalty to make it 3-2. Reno would possess the ball and create chances, but allowed a fourth goal in the 75th minute to make it 4-2.

The regular season kicks off next week, with a Friday road game against Tacoma Defiance. Kickoff is set for 7:00 p.m., and the game will be streamed on ESPN+. Reno plays at Greater Nevada Field again on March 14 for the regular season home opener against OKC Energy FC at 6:15 p.m. PT.

IAN RUSSELL - HEAD COACH - FOURTH SEASON

Reno 1868 FC head coach Ian Russell returns to Reno for his fourth season at the helm after a record-breaking 2019 to cap the best three-year start in USL history. Russell has been a finalist for USL Coach of the Year twice, and owns 52 wins with Reno. In 2019, Russell guided Reno to 18 wins and 60 points, both club records. Reno's September 20th win in New Mexico not only clinched the club's third straight trip to the playoffs, only five other clubs have made playoffs in each of their first three seasons, it was Russell's 50th win. Russell began his coaching career in 2008 with the Earthquakes as an assistant coach, a position he held for eight seasons. He helped lead the club to the postseason twice, while earning the Supporters' Shield for best regular season record (19-6-9) in 2012. Russell was also instrumental in the Quakes' international and collegiate scouting efforts, and briefly helped oversee the club's youth development as the academy's technical director. He served as the Earthquakes interim head coach for the final two games of the 2014 season and holds a U.S. Soccer Federation "A" coaching license. Russell played for the University of Washington before starting his professional career with the Seattle Sounders of the USL First Division in 1998 and 1999. Russell was drafted by the San Jose Earthquakes in 2000 and continued to play seven seasons in MLS. Six of those seasons came with the Earthquakes, where Russell helped the team win two MLS Cups in 2001 and 2003.



CASEY TATE - ASSISTANT COACH - FOURTH SEASON

Assistant Coach Casey Tate returns for his fourth season of coaching Reno 1868 FC, having been on Ian Russell's staff since the club's inception in 2017. Through his first three seasons with Reno 1868 FC, Tate has been a part of 51 regular season wins. The regular season win total tied FC Cincinnati's USL record for the most wins through a club's first three seasons. Before joining 1868, Tate spent eight seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Nevada. In 2016, Tate served as interim co-head coach with current Wolf Pack head coach Erin Otagaki. Prior to Nevada, Tate served as the girls' soccer coach at Seton Catholic Preparatory High School in Arizona where he led the school to back-to-back state titles in 2006 and 2007. Both years, Tate earned National Soccer Coaches Association of America Coach of the year honors. In 2007 and 2008, Tate was named Arizona state coach of the year, and regional coach of the year in 2007, 2008 and 2010. Tate played collegiately at Chandler-Gilbert, Indiana Institute of Technology, and Arizona State University. He received his degree from Ottawa University in History, and holds his US Soccer Federation Class A coaching license.



CHRIS MALENAB - ASSISTANT COACH - THIRD SEASON

Coach Chris Malenab returns to Reno for his third season of assistant coaching the club. Since joining Reno 1868 FC, Malenab has been a part of 34 regular season wins as well as the club's first playoff win over Real Monarchs SLC in 2018. He joined Reno 1868 FC in 2018 after spending the previous four seasons as an assistant at Sacramento Republic FC. During the 2014 inaugural season of Sacramento Republic FC, he served as an assistant coach to Predrag Radosavljević (Preki) during the club's championship campaign. From 2015 to 2017, Malenab added video analyst to his duties as an assistant coach for Sacramento under head coach Paul Buckle. Malenab currently holds various coaching certificates and licenses, including a USSF A-Senior License and the NSCAA (now United Soccer Coaches) Director of Coaching Diploma. Malenab received his bachelor's degree in sociology from California State University, Sacramento and has completed course work in two masters programs; Cross Cultural Education and Performance Psychology.

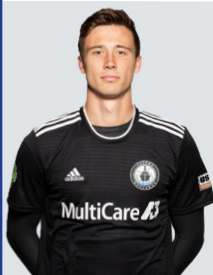
