## Head Coach

In January of 2016, Darren Powell was introduced to San Antonio as the first ever head coach of the later named San Antonio FC. Powell became the face of a new franchise in San Antonio and began working towards putting his roster and staff together for the 2016 USL season.

Powell joined SAFC from MLS side Orlando City SC where he was the club's academy director.

Powell led all aspects of the Orlando City Academy from its inception after OCSC was awarded an MLS expansion spot. Powell would help develop the style of play between all age groups in the academy that would match the MLS first team.

Prior to his time with Orlando City, Powell was the head coach of Elon University since December 2004. During Powell's tenure, the program produced 45 All-Southern Conference performers, four conference players of the year and two league freshmen of the year. Powell has been named the SoCon's Coach of the Year four times.

In 2013 the Powell-led Phoenix won 15 games and became only the third team in league history to capture three consecutive SoCon Tournament titles. Powell earned his second straight SoCon Coach of the Year accolade and fourth overall.

In 2012, Powell led the Phoenix to arguably its best season ever at the Division I level. The program won 15 games, including four against ranked competition, and captured the league's regular-season and tournament title for the first time in school history. Powell was rewarded as the SoCon's Coach of the Year for the third time in his career and led the maroon and gold to its second consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance.

The 2010 squad battled a tough schedule on its way to an 8-6-5 overall ledger, the sixth consecutive winning season for the program. In 2009, Elon finished the year with a .500 or better record for the fifth consecutive year, earning a 10-8-2 mark that included a victory over ACC-foe Clemson. The Phoenix also advanced to the SoCon Tournament championship game for the first time in program history.

In 2008, Powell guided Elon to its first-ever NCAA Division I league title and a perfect 7-0-0 mark in conference play during the regular season. Powell was honored as the conference's top coach, his second such honor in four seasons with the Phoenix. Under Powell's leadership, the Elon program claimed its first-ever NCAA Division I national ranking in 2006.

Powell joined Elon after serving four seasons as an assistant coach at Southern Conference rival UNC Greensboro.

During Powell's four seasons at UNCG, the Spartan program posted a 55-26-3 mark and became the nation's top-ranked program during the regular season in 2004. Powell assisted in all aspects of the program, including recruiting, scheduling and academic development. Powell was honored as one of the top NCAA Division I assistant coaches by College Soccer News and coached three MLS players.

Prior to joining the Spartan staff, Powell headed the Greensboro College men's soccer program for three seasons, posting a 50-12-3 ledger. He led the Pride to the NCAA Division III finals in 1998 and Dixie Conference titles in 1998, 1999 and 2000.

Following a four-year collegiate career at UNC Greensboro, Powell played professionally for the Carolina Dynamo USISL team, the Raleigh Flyers A-League team and the Wilmington Hammerheads USISL team from 1995-1999. At UNCG, Powell helped the Spartans to two NCAA Tournament appearances in 1993 and 1994. He was a two-time captain, team MVP and All-South Region selection as well as a three-time All-Big South Conference honoree. Powell became the first Spartan player to score over 100 career points at the Division I level.

Powell graduated from UNC Greensboro in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in leisure studies. He and his wife, Elise, have two children – Naomi and Caleb.

In the summer of 1973, a group of local investors leased the Dallas Chaparrals and relocated the team to San Antonio. Midway through their first season in the Alamo City, the group purchased the team outright and the Spurs have been a mainstay in San Antonio culture ever since. The Silver and Black played their first three seasons in the ABA before joining the NBA in the summer of 1976, along with the Nets, Nuggets and Pacers.

Over the last 18 years, the Spurs have enjoyed a tremendous amount of success. Since Tim Duncan joined the team in 1997-98 the Spurs have captured five NBA Championships and have posted the best regular season winning percentage of any team in the four major U.S. sports (MLB, NBA, NFL and NHL). During that time, San Antonio has posted the NBA's best record five times (1998-99, 2000-01, 2002-03, 2011-12 and 2013-14) and has won 11 division titles. The Spurs record during that span ranks as the best 18-year run of any team in league history. San Antonio has also posted 50-or-more wins in 16 consecutive seasons, the longest such streak in NBA history.

In September 2012, ESPN the Magazine name the Spurs the "Team of the Decade" in its annual Ultimate Standings survey. San Antonio has been named the best franchise in professional sports three times (2003, 2005 and 2014) and is the only franchise to rank in the Top 10 every year since ESPN introduced its annual survey in 2003.

The Spurs are led by head coach Gregg Popovich, who has been at the helm for the past 20 seasons. The longest tenured coach with the same team in all of the four major U.S. professional sports, Popovich holds the third-best winning percentage (minimum 250 games coached) in NBA history.

On the court the Spurs are led by Tim Duncan, Tony Parker and Manu Ginobili, who have won four NBA titles together and have the most total wins (regular season and playoffs) as a trio in NBA history. **GREGG POPOVICH**

In his 20th season as the Spurs head coach ... the longest tenured coach with the same team among the 122 NBA, NFL, NHL and MLB franchises ... has led the Spurs to five NBA Championships (1999, 2003, 2005, 2007 and 2014) ... he and Eric Spoelstra are the only two active coaches with multiple NBA titles ... one of five coaches in history with five-or-more NBA Championships (along with Red Auerbach, Phil Jackson, John Kundla and Pat Riley) ... finished the 2014-15 season with a career mark of 1,022-470 ... career winning percentage of .685 ranks third in NBA history (behind Jackson and Billy Cunningham) ... ranks eighth in NBA history in career victories and first among active coaches ... his 1,022 wins with one team rank second all-time in NBA history behind Jerry Sloan (who amassed 1,127 wins in Utah) ... became the ninth head coach in NBA history to record 1,000 career wins with a 95-93 victory at Indiana on Feb. 9, 2015 ... the third-fastest coach to 1,000 career victories (behind Jackson and Riley) ... posted his 900th career win vs. Utah on March 22, 2013 ... his 152 playoff wins rank third in NBA history (behind Jackson and Riley) and his playoff career winning percentage of .618 (152-94) is the third-best in league history (minimum of 100 games) ... one of three coaches (along with Don Nelson and Riley) in NBA history to be named NBA Coach of the Year three times (2003, 2012 and 2014) ... has been named the NBA Coach of the Month 16 times (4/99, 3/01, 3/02, 1/03, 3/03, 12/03, 12/05, 3/06, 3/07, 11/07, 11/10, 12/10, 2/12, 3/12, 4/14 and 12/15), the most in league annals ... has led San Antonio to the NBA's best regular season record five times (1998-99, 2000-01, 2002-03, 2011-12 and 2013-14) ... the Western Conference All-Star coach in 2005, 2011, 2013 and 2016 ... the Spurs all-time leader in both regular season and playoff wins ... a 1970 graduate of the United States Air Force Academy with a degree in Soviet studies ... played four seasons at the Air Force Academy ... as a senior was the team's captain and leading scorer ... following his graduation served his five-year military commitment ... during that time toured Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union as a member of the U.S. Armed Forces Team ... selected to represent the U.S. on the national AAU Team touring the Soviet Union ... in 1972 was the captain of the Armed Forces team, which won the AAU Championship ... earned an invitation to the 1972 U.S. Olympic Team Training Camp ... in 1973 returned to the Air Force Academy as an assistant coach ... spent six years at Air Force during which time he obtained his master's degree in physical education and sports sciences from the University of Denver ... in 1979 was named the head coach at Pomona-Pitzer in Claremont, California ... spent the next eight seasons at Pomona ... during the 1985-86 season led the team to its first conference championship in 68 years and to a berth in the NCAA Division III Tournament ... while at Pomona was an active member of the school's academic community, working as an associate professor, chairing the college's Student Life committee, serving on the Women's Commission and even - for one year - living in a dorm with his family ... moved to the NBA in July of 1988, joining the Spurs as an assistant coach as a member of Larry Brown's staff ... spent the next four seasons in San Antonio with a Spurs team that won a pair of Midwest Division titles ... in the summer of 1992 was named an assistant coach on Don Nelson's staff with Golden State ... spent the next two seasons with the Warriors ... returned to San Antonio on May 31, 1994, as the Spurs executive vice president of basketball operations/general manager (served as GM for eight seasons before turning the job over to R.C. Buford on July 1, 2002) ... named the Spurs head coach in December of 1996 ... served as an assistant coach for USA Basketball's Men's Senior Team for three consecutive summers (at the 2002 World Basketball Championship, the 2003 FIBA America Men's Olympic Qualifying Tournament and the 2004 Olympic Games) ... a very active member of the San Antonio community ... in 1991 teamed with Frank Martin to create the Spurs Youth Basketball League ... today 26 organizations participate in the league at 62 locations in San Antonio and throughout South Texas ... over 10,000 boys and girls, ages 5 to 16, played in the league in 2013-14 ... prior to every game, each participant takes a pledge, promising to remain drug and alcohol free while showing good sportsmanship and fair play ... the league was honored with a Daily Point of Light Award by President Bush in February of 1992 ... is involved in several charities in the San Antonio area including the San Antonio Food Bank, Roy Maas' Youth Alternatives, Boys and Girls Club and The Miracle League ... honored by the Air Force Academy with its Distinguished Graduate Award in 2007 ... he and his wife of 39 years, Erin, have been blessed with two children, Micky and Jill.

## SAN ANTONIO RAMPAGE

The San Antonio Rampage celebrates its 14th season in 2015-16 and serves as the top American Hockey League affiliate of the Colorado Avalanche following an agreement announced on April 17, 2015. The Rampage will serve the top affiliate of the Avalanche for the next five years. San Antonio has previously been affiliated with the Florida Panthers (2002-05 and 2011-15) and the then-Phoenix Coyotes (2005-11).

The Rampage are one of 30 AHL teams competing for the Calder Cup, and over the course of a 76-game schedule, will face 14 different opponents, all from the league's Western Conference. The Rampage will face their in-state rivals the Texas Stars 14 times (seven home, seven away) while welcoming five new opponents in the newly-formed Pacific Division. San Antonio will face the Bakersfield Condors, Ontario (CA) Reign, San Diego Gulls, San Jose Barracuda and Stockton Heat six times each, including three matchups with each division opponent inside the friendly confines of the AT&T Center.

The Rampage finished the 2014-15 campaign 45-23-7-1, completing a record-breaking season in which they set franchise records for wins (45), goals (248) and points (98) in a season while capturing their first-ever West Division Championship. San Antonio also set a record for the longest winning streak in franchise history, as they won nine games straight from Mar. 14-Apr. 2. The Silver and Black boasted one of the league's most prolific offenses, ranking second in scoring with an average of 3.26 goals per game.

Forward Bobby Butler ranked in the top 20 of the AHL in scoring, finishing with 27 goals and 32 assists, and Connor Brickley ranked sixth among the league's rookies with 47 points (22G, 25A).

San Antonio annually ranks as one of the AHL's top teams in attendance, having placed among the top seven in the league for each of the last five seasons. The Silver and Black drew an average of 6,579 fans per game for the 2014-15 campaign, which ranked seventh in the American Hockey League.

The Rampage held its fifth annual Pink in the Rink game on Feb. 7, drawing 13,125 fans to a come-from-behind win over the Oklahoma City Barons. Between a jersey auction and additional fundraisers by the Rampage Wives and Girlfriends, the Rampage raised \$44,560 for breast health awareness and research efforts.

San Antonio continued its Face Off Against Kids Cancer program for the sixth straight season. The program pairs Rampage players with kids from the Children's Hospital of San Antonio who are in various stages of cancer treatment or in remission. The team participated in a series of activities in order to raise awareness for childhood cancer in the community while forging lasting relationships. A jersey auction during the annual Face Off Against Kids Cancer game honoring the program participants raised more than \$15,000 for the Face Off Against Kids Cancer Program and the Children's Hospital of San Antonio.

In operation since 1936, the American Hockey League continues to serve as the top development league for the players, coaches, managers, executives, broadcasters and staff of all 30 National Hockey League teams. More than 88 percent of today's NHL players are American Hockey League graduates, and for the 14th year in a row, more than 6 million fans attended AHL games across North America in 2014-15. Through the years, the AHL has been home to more than 100 future members of the Hockey Hall of Fame.

## DEAN CHYNOWETH

Dean Chynoweth (shin-OWTH) enters his first season as the head coach of the San Antonio Rampage and his fourth leading the AHL affiliate of the Colorado Avalanche. He spent the last three seasons as the head coach of the Lake Erie Monsters, where he led the team to a 35-29-8-4 record during the 2014-15 campaign.

Chynoweth spent the prior three seasons (2009-12) as an assistant coach for the NHL's New York Islanders. Before that, the Calgary native served as head coach in Canada's Western Hockey League for nine seasons, five with the Swift Current Broncos (2004-09) and four with the Seattle Thunderbirds (2000-04). Chynoweth also served as general manager for Swift Current. His first stint on the bench was with the Utah Grizzlies of the International Hockey League, where he served as assistant coach for two seasons (1998-00).

A defenseman, Chynoweth was selected 13th overall by the New York Islanders in the 1987 NHL Entry Draft. He went on to play parts of nine seasons in the NHL, recording a total of four goals, 18 assists and 667 penalty minutes in 241 games. Chynoweth played for both the Islanders (1988-96) and the Boston Bruins (1996-98). He also spent time in the AHL and IHL during his professional career.

### SAN ANTONIO STARS

The San Antonio Stars posted an 8-26 record during the 2015 WNBA season ... Head coach Dan Hughes wrapped up his 15th season in the WNBA and his 10th overall with the Stars in 2015 ... Coach Hughes has accumulated 231 wins in his career ... in 2015, Stars forward Sophia Young-Malcolm announced that she would retire at the end of the season... She ended her career as the Stars all-time leader in games played, points, rebounds, steals, minutes, field goals made and free throws made ... Danielle Robinson and Kayla McBride were named to the 2015 WNBA Western Conference All-Star team ... McBride led the Stars, averaging 13.8 points per game in 2015.

In 2003 the Utah Starzz, one of the WNBA's founding franchises, relocated to San Antonio and became the San Antonio Silver Stars ... the Silver Stars enjoyed the best season in franchise history during the 2008 campaign when the team posted a 24-10 record and made their first trip to the WNBA Finals falling to the Detroit Shock in three games ... Prior to the 2014 season, the team announced a rebranding, dropping the "Silver" and becoming the San Antonio Stars... HEB was also announced as a new marquee partner for the franchise... the Stars are currently one of 12 teams comprising the WNBA, which celebrated its 19th season in 2015 ... created on April 24, 1996, when the NBA Board of Governors approved the concept for a women's league, the first WNBA game was played in June 1997 ... the WNBA's 34-game regular-season schedule typically runs from Memorial Day to Labor Day. ### DAN HUGHES

Just completed his 10th season with the Stars ... the winningest coach in franchise history ... oversees the Stars basketball staff, the team's roster development and all player acquisitions, while also coaching the team ... stepped aside as head coach to assume a full-time general manager role for the 2010 season and resumed his dual roles in 2011 ... in 15 years as a head coach - of the Charlotte Sting, the Cleveland Rockers and San Antonio - has led his teams to ten playoff appearances, four Western Conference Finals and one WNBA Final ... picked up his 200th career victory during the 2013 season ... is the only coach in WNBA history to take three different franchises to the playoffs ... guided the 2008 Silver Stars to a 24-10 mark, earning the best record in the league and the franchise's first Western Conference Championship and its first trip to the WNBA Finals ... is a two-time WNBA Coach of the Year - most recently in 2007 - and has finished as runner-up four times ... a member of the five-person USA Basketball Selection Committee for the 2010 World Championships, the 2012 Olympics and 2014 World Championships ... serves as a member of the selection committee for the Kay Yow Award ... has also spent time working as a broadcaster on San Antonio Spurs telecasts, as well as on men's and women's college games ... has coached 16 WNBA All-Stars ... many of Hughes' former players and assistant coaches have gone on to become coaches both at the college and professional level. Hughes' former athletes who went on to become Division I coaches are: Suzie McConnell-Serio (Duchesne); Dawn Staley (South Carolina); Jennifer Rizzotti Sullivan (Hartford); and Tricia Bader Binford (Montana State). Five of Hughes' former assistants have become WNBA Head Coaches: T.R. Dunn (Charlotte); Brian Agler (Seattle); Cheryl Reeve (Minnesota); Sandy Brondello (Phoenix); Stephanie White (Indiana); and Suzie McConnell-Serio (formerly Minnesota) ... another Hughes alum, Becky Hammon, is an assistant coach for the San Antonio Spurs... a native of Lowell, Ohio ... has been involved in coaching basketball at almost every level in the Buckeye State ... prior to joining the Sting, served as the assistant coach with the University of Toledo's women's basketball program (1996-97) and men's basketball program (1991-96) ... during his tenure with the Rockets' women's team, they posted a 27-4 record, winning the MAC Championship, and made an NCAA Tournament appearance ... had assistant coaching stints with the men's teams at Mount Union College (1982-84 and 1985-91) and Baldwin-Wallace College (1984-85) ... during the 1977-78 season, served as a graduate assistant at Miami of Ohio, helping the team to a MAC Championship and an appearance in the NCAA Regionals ... graduated with a degree in physical education and history from Muskingum College in New Concord, Ohio, in 1977 ... earned a Master's Degree in education from Miami University of Ohio in 1978 ... Hughes and his wife, Mary, have two children, Bryce and Sara, and three grandchildren.

**AUSTIN SPURS**

With the 2014-15 season bringing a new name change and a new partnership with SWBC, the Austin Spurs were ready to take on the year behind Head Coach Ken McDonald.

Coach McDonald led the team to a 32-18 regular season record and a Southwest Division Championship title. Making a deep playoff run, the coaching staff piloted the players to the Western Conference finals, where they fell to the Santa Cruz Warriors in a decisive game three, 83-97. Returning player JaMychal Green was a crucial component in the early season success of the team. Playing 21 games with Austin, the 6-8 forward averaged 21.9 points, 10.4 rebounds, and 2.3 assists per game, earning 15 double-doubles and leading the team to a 22-9 record. On January 18th, Green signed a 10-day contract with the San Antonio Spurs. After not re-signing with San Antonio, Green signed two ten-day contracts (Feb. 2 & Feb 19th) with the Memphis Grizzlies. On March 2nd, JaMychal signed a multi-year contract with Memphis.

San Antonio Spurs affiliate Bryce Cotton proved to be an essential asset to Austin's roster. Playing and starting in 34 games with the team, the former Providence College guard led the entire D-League in minutes played (40.5), claimed fifth in the league in points scored, averaging 22.4 points per game, and placed fifth in three-point field goal shooting percentage (44.3 percent).

The San Antonio Spurs assigned rookie Kyle Anderson to the Austin Spurs for 26 games during the 2014-15 regular season. During his time with Austin, Anderson averaged 21.3 points (6th best), 8.7 rebounds (19th best) and 4.8 assists (16th best) per game, earning 11 double-doubles in the regular season.

Austin enjoyed their best season in franchise history in 2011-12, highlighted by winning their first NBA D-League Championship defeating the Los Angeles in a best-of-three series ... the then Toros posted a franchise-best 33-17 during the regular season and were a league-best 18-4 at on their home floor at the Cedar Park Center ... five Austin players received GATORADE Call-Ups during the season ... Eric Dawson (San Antonio, twice), Justin Dentmon (San Antonio and Toronto), Lester Hudson (Cleveland and Memphis), Carldeell Johnson (New Orleans) and Lance Thomas (New Orleans, twice) all saw NBA action ... Dentmon was named NBA D-League Most Valuable Player for the 2011-12 season and was selected to the All-NBA D-League First Team ... he was named NBA D-League Player of the Month in January and represented Austin in the 2012 NBA D-League All-Star Game ... Dawson was named NBA D-League Impact Player of the Year and was selected to the All-NBA D-League Second Team ... the Spurs assigned rookie guard Cory Joseph to Austin on three occasions throughout the season and playoffs ... he earned NBA Development League Performer of the Week for games played March 19-25, after posting a triple-double with 15 points, 17 rebounds and 12 assists in a 112-82 win over the Maine Red Claws on March 23 ... Austin broke their all-time franchise attendance record on March 3, when 7,708 fans came out to watch the then Toros take on the Texas Legends ... Austin joined the D-League on May 4, 2005, when the Columbus Riverdragons moved from Georgia to Texas ... Spurs Sports & Entertainment purchased the team on June 28, 2007 ... former Toros head coaches are the late Dennis Johnson (2005-07), who was inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame in 2010, Quin Snyder (2007-10), who is now an assistant coach with the Atlanta Hawks and Utah Jazz assistant coach Brad Jones (2010-12) ... Taylor Jenkins accepted an assistant coach position with the Atlanta Hawks for the 2013-14 season. The NBA D-League, founded in 2001, is the NBA's official minor league ... featuring 18 teams with direct affiliations to NBA franchises, the NBA D-League is a proven developer of talent: 30 percent of players in the NBA at the conclusion of the 2013-14 season boasted NBA D-League experience, and the league continues to develop coaches, referees, and front-office staff for the NBA and its teams ... for more information on the Toros contact the team's front office at (512) 236-8333.

**KEN MCDONALD**

Ken McDonald is in his third season as head coach with the Austin Spurs. He served as an assistant coach during the 2012-13 season with the Toros, helping lead the team to a 27-23 overall record and to the semifinals of the 2013 NBA D-League Playoffs. McDonald has also served as head coach at Western Kentucky University (2008-11), where he led the team to the Sun Belt Regular Season Championship and Sun Belt Tournament Championship (2009). McDonald spent four seasons (2008-2012) as an assistant coach at the University of Texas under Head Coach Rick Barnes, who he has considered his mentor during his coaching career. In addition to guiding the Longhorns to four straight NCAA Tournament appearances, he also helped the team reach a 106-35 (.752) record throughout the four seasons he was with the team, which is still ranked as the most victories in a four-year period in school history. McDonald has also served as an assistant coach at the University of Georgia (2003-04), Western Kentucky University (1998-2003) and Clemson University (1994-98). He graduated from Providence College, where he played shooting guard (1991-92), before playing professionally for the St. Paul Revelles in Ireland (1993-94). While playing at the Community College of Rhode Island (1989-90) prior to transferring to Providence, McDonald was a first-team Junior College All-American and set school records for single-season scoring (754 points) and 3-pointers made in a game (9) and season (109). McDonald was born and raised in Providence, R.I. He has one daughter, Ella, who was born in 2008.





## AT&T CENTER

As the premier entertainment venue in South Texas, the AT&T Center opened in November of 2002. The AT&T Center was built by the initiatives of a public-private venture amongst Bexar County, the Coliseum Advisory Board, the San Antonio Livestock Show & Rodeo and Spurs Sports & Entertainment.

The facility hosts four anchor tenants: the NBA Spurs, the AHL Rampage, the WNBA Stars and the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo. Additionally, the venue attracts a multitude of concerts, family shows and special events. In 10 years of operation, the AT&T Center has hosted over 1,000 events with entertaining in excess of 15 million guests. George Strait, the Rolling Stones, Billy Joel & Elton John, The Police, Luciano Pavarotti, George Lopez, Cirque du Soleil, Lady Gaga, Justin Bieber, and Bon Jovi are just a few of the musical acts that have visited the AT&T Center. Other events include NCAA Basketball, WWE Royal Rumble, Walking with Dinosaurs, and the Harlem Globetrotters.

The AT&T Center offers diverse events to the San Antonio community and all of South Texas thanks in part to its various seating capabilities, building configurations, curtaining system and technology upgrades. Configurations from an ice show, to basketball, to rodeo, to boxing, to theater can all be accomplished at the AT&T Center. Complementing every event held at the venue is a 360 in-arena LED ring, four video/scoring panels to the Scoreboard, two Lobby LED Color Matrix displays and over six hundred LCD HDTVs throughout the arena.

"We are enormously proud of the AT&T Center and what it brings to the community," said Holt, chairman of Spurs Sports & Entertainment. "We're proud to have been part of the effort. Now we can provide South Texas with some of the best sports and entertainment available anywhere in the U.S."

In April of 2015, SS&E announced the planned 100+ million dollar renovations of the AT&T Center, beginning in the summer of 2015. Technology enhancements to the AT&T Center are a key area of focus and technology updates will be visibly prevalent arena-wide with the installation of high definition televisions and LED signage throughout the arena. The addition of LED displays to the NE, SE and SW ticket towers and East Main Entrance will give the exterior a striking new look and provide the ability to showcase game action, event highlights and promotional messaging. The centerpiece of the technology updates will be the installation of a brand new center-hung video board that will provide a state-of-the-art, high-definition display and have more than four times the viewable area of the previous board. A new audio system and improved Wi-Fi capabilities round out the technology enhancements that will help elevate and create a more immersive fan experience.

The AT&T Center will receive all new seating arena-wide and infrastructure improvements will include expanded and updated concourses and enhancements to the arena entrances. There will be something new for everyone at all levels of the AT&T Center.

TOYOTA FIELD

Toyota Field is a soccer-specific stadium in San Antonio, Texas, United States. Located next to Heroes Stadium, and adjacent to the STAR Soccer Complex, the facility opened on April 13, 2013. The stadium is the home of San Antonio FC and has a capacity of 8,250 for soccer matches. The stadium is expandable to 18,000+ seating capacity. Toyota Motor Corporation currently holds the sponsor naming rights for the facility.

Toyota Field was originally owned and operated by S.O.A.R. Inc., a non-profit organization founded by San Antonio philanthropist Gordon Hartman. Construction of Toyota Field ran from February 2012 through April 2013. On April 13, 2013, the San Antonio Scorpions of the NASL started play at Toyota Field in a match against the Tampa Bay Rowdies.

Toyota Field was host of Soccer Bowl 2014, where the Scorpions claimed their first and only NASL championship over the Fort Lauderdale Strikers, 2-1.

In November 2015, the City of San Antonio and Bexar County jointly acquired the stadium for \$18 million. Spurs Sports & Entertainment (SS&E) paid an additional \$3 million to Hartman, bringing the total purchase price of the facility to \$21 million. SS&E received an initial 20 year lease to operate the facility with a new professional soccer team. Toyota Field will be host to San Antonio's USL franchise, San Antonio FC, starting play in April of 2016.

Toyota Field was designed by San Antonio architecture firm, Pro Sports Developments (PSD), which is the sports entertainment division of Luna Architecture and Design. The stadium was designed as a soccer-specific stadium, to strategically expand to upwards of 18,000 seats in 3 total phases and to accommodate UIL, NCAA, MLS and FIFA standard international soccer events. The design also accommodates lacrosse, American football, boxing and concerts.

The soccer field playing surface was designed and built by sports field contractor Texas Multi-Chem, of Kerrville, Texas. The field's natural grass surface is TifSport hybrid Bermuda and the root zone consists of an 8" layer of USGA sand and Dakota peat. The field also contains an internal drainage system to help avoid rain outs.

Single-game credentials will be issued on a space available basis. Credentials are good for admittance to the stadium, media workroom and both locker rooms.

Photographers are prohibited from entering the sideline areas in front of or behind the team benches or in front of fans on the East sideline. In addition, photographers are asked to observe USL guidelines.

## MEDIA ENTRANCE AND PARKING

The media entrance is located at the Northwest entrance of Toyota Field. All media members must enter the building through this entrance. USL and SAFC season passes will be honored and single-game credentials will be available at the will call desk for pickup. The press doors open two hours prior to kick-off. For those media members who receive season parking privileges, the media parking is located in Lot 2 across from the Northwest entrance. Media covering SAFC on a game-by-game basis can request a parking pass along with their single-game credential.

## MEDIA WORKROOM

The media workroom is located in the back of the press box, behind the operations booth and is only accessible with a valid credential. The room opens two hours prior to game time. The professional intent of the media workroom is to provide a working area for writers, photographers, broadcasters and game personnel. Family members and guests will not be admitted. Any abuse of the media workroom and/or press privileges will result in forfeiture of credentials. The media workroom is equipped with electrical outlets and Wifi access.

## MEDIA SEATING

Reserved media seating has been designated along press row in the outdoor seating section of the press box. All seats are reserved for each individual media member. Seating charts, if applicable, will be posted on display throughout the press box. Electrical outlets are placed on press row for your convenience. Statistics will be distributed after the game. Media are asked to finish and file stories in the media workroom to facilitate changeover at Toyota Field.

## USL MEDIA ACCESS POLICIES

### Day of Game

**Post-Game:** Club locker rooms will be opened to accredited media no later than 10 minutes following the conclusion of the match. A member of the club's communications staff must be present. The locker room will remain open to media for a period of 30 minutes. Still photography is not permitted inside USL locker rooms unless previously approved by club communications.

### Off Day Access

**Training:** All SAFC training sessions are open to the media. Please check with the communications staff regarding open practice times for that day. No interviews will take place prior to practice without advance arrangements being made through the communications department. All interviews will take place on the practice field at STAR Soccer Complex.
