ABOUT REAL MONARCHS SLC

Real Monarchs SLC is the USL Championship defending champion. It beat the two-time defending champion Louisville City FC 3-1 in Nov. 17, 2019. It had advanced to the championship final after beating El Paso Locomotive FC 2-1 in the Western Conference finals. It became the second MLS reserve team, after New York Red Bulls II to win the USL Championship title.

The team is owned by, and operates as the reserve team of, the Major League Soccer club Real Salt Lake. While the senior club is based, and plays, in Rio Tinto Stadium, Sandy, Utah, Real Monarchs SLC are based in the Real Salt Lake training facility in Herriman, Utah, playing out of Zions Bank Stadium.

Real Monarchs SLC has had recent success while winning the regular season Conference title in 2017, finishing with 67 points in the table. Real Monarchs broke the All-Time USL Record with nine consecutive victories by beating Reno 1868 2-1 at Rio Tinto Stadium in June 2017.

In 2020, with Jamison Olave installed permanently as Head Coach, the side will defend its crown with some familiar faces still part of the squad and a stellar homefield advantage to lean on. Over the past two seasons, the Monarchs have made Zions Bank Stadium one of the toughest places to visit in the Championship. Since its opening on April 30, 2018, the Monarchs have posted a 23-4-6 record in the regular season for the most home regular-season wins of any side in the Championship over that span. That has been aided most recently by the likes of midfielder Jack Blake, who returns for his second full season at the club after serving as a central piece in 2019's postseason run with 11 goals and 51 chances created.

Real Monarchs SLC opened the 2020 season with a 1-0 loss to San Antonio FC before the pause in play due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

KEY PLAYERS

After notching 84 goals across the regular season and playoffs in 2019, the Monarchs have also added some new pieces to potentially fill the gaps left by forwards Douglas Martinez and Maikel Chang, both now officially RSL players. Among those are two recent USL League One standouts in Chris Bermudez (Greenville Triumph SC) and Joe Gallardo (Richmond Kickers) as well as former Phoenix Rising FC midfielder Devin Vega.

This is the first ever meeting between SD Loyal and Real Monarchs SLC.

ABOUT SD LOYAL

Launched on June 19, 2019, San Diego Loyal is the newest member of USL Championship Western Conference. San Diego Loyal plays for America's Finest City and is led by some of the best in the sport. The Club is led by Chairman Andrew Vassiliadis, who is the youngest principal owner in USL Championship. It was founded and led on the business-side by experienced soccer executive Warren Smith, a co-founder and former president of Sacramento Republic FC. Executive Vice President of Soccer Operations Landon Donovan, one of the most decorated soccer players in the U.S., leads the technical side as both EVP and Team 1 Manager.

San Diego Loyal is built on four core pillars – Completion, Commitment, Connection, Camaraderie.

San Diego Loyal held its first training camp in January 2020 at the Chula Vista Elite Athlete Training Center, which also serves as its training center. Team 1 Manager Donovan's roster played in four exhibition matches leading up to the 2020 Inaugural USL Championship season match against Las Vegas Lights FC. SD Loyal faced MLS-side FC Dallas, Cal State Fullerton, Panama's Costa del Este and USL-side Reno 1868 FC to prepare for its first ever official match.

Home matches are played at Torero Stadium located on the University of San Diego campus. Torero stadium has hosted numerous important soccer events including the U.S. Women's National team and MLS clubs LA Galaxy, Chivas USA and Club Tijuana. It is also the home field to USD's football team, soccer teams and San Diego Legion Rugby team.

ABOUT USL CHAMPIONSHIP



The USL Championship is one of the most successful professional soccer leagues in the world, reaching a population of more than 84 million and fueling the growth of the game across North America. Sanctioned by the U.S. Soccer Federation as a Division II professional league, The Championship includes a membership of more than 30 clubs across the United States and Canada. Through the Championship's headquarters in Tampa, Florida, the league's clubs are provided with unparalleled support with a growing team of more than 50 professionals across 17 departments, ranging from operations to marketing, communications and sponsorship.

The Championship has a national media partnership with ESPN, wherein all league matches are broadcast on ESPN+, ESPN3 and across linear channels. The league also operates USL Productions, which includes a state-of-the-art facility that produced and distributed more than 500 league matches and more than 1,000 hours of original content to national partners, local affiliates and international markets throughout the 2018 season.

The USL Championship was formed when two existing professional leagues were combined into a single league property before the 2011 season. The league was designed to help ensure the long-term stability of professional soccer in North America and featured 12 teams in a pair of six-team divisions during its initial campaign.

The league's current club owners also hold stakes in teams that compete in the National Basketball Association, Major League Baseball, the National Hockey League, Minor League Baseball and the NBA G-League. The U.S. Soccer Federation granted the USL Division II status beginning in the 2017 season, recognizing the significant investment and high level of operating excellence within the USL Championship and its member clubs.

San Diego Loyal earned first ever win in first road match

It was another night of firsts for San Diego Loyal Soccer Club (SD Loyal) Wednesday. Manager Landon Donovan's team earned its first ever win in the team's first road match in its history after beating host Tacoma Defiance 2-1 at an empty Cheney Stadium.

Francis Atuahene scored in the 31st and 85th minute for SD Loyal, helping the team to its first road victory and three more points in the Western Conference in the young USL Championship season. SD Loyal (1W-0L-1T, 4 points) was coming off a 1-1 draw against Las Vegas Lights FC in its inaugural match at a sold-out University of San Diego Stadium's Torero Stadium March 7.

There were no fans at Cheney Stadium Wednesday night after league and team officials decided to hold the match behind closed doors due to developments in the region regarding COVID-19. The decision came following Washington Gov. Jay Inslee's announcement suspending large public gatherings. SD Loyal had been in contact with Tacoma Defiance, United Soccer League, regional government agencies and health authorities, and ultimately determined that it was safe to proceed with the match behind closed doors.

There were no fans in house to cheer Atuehene's goals but his teammates celebrated with him, accordingly. They surrounded and hugged the Ghana-born midfielder after he jogged back from scoring by the opponent's six-yard line.

SD Loyal opened up the scoring when Atuahene sent in a free kick by Collin Martin. The midfielder bent his set piece from right to left and found Atuahene charging the six-yard box, connecting with his foot while jumping. The shot ricocheted past Tacoma Defiance goalkeeper Trey Muse.

Atuahene sent in his second of the night past Muse when he took a quick pass from Jack Metcalf from the right flank. Atuahene took it and buried it from the top of the six-yard box.

Tacoma Defiance (0W-1L-1T, 1 point) tied the match in the 56th minute as Justin Dhillon scored off a cross by Shandon Hopeau that came from right to left. The low-rolling assist was on point for Dhillon to only tap it in past SD Loyal goalkeeper Jon Kempin.

San Diego Loyal made debut with 1-1 tie against Las Vegas Lights FC

A new soccer era began at the University of San Diego Torero's Stadium Saturday night. San Diego Loyal Soccer Club (SD Loyal) made its debut playing to a 1-1 tie against visiting Las Vegas Lights FC in the USL Championship 2020 season opener for both teams.

A sold-out crowd witnessed the milestone for San Diego and its communities as Manager Landon Donovan led "Team 1" to its first point in his coaching debut. Donovan can in part thank Charlie Adams for the milestone as the British midfielder sent in the first score in franchise history to tie the match. Las Vegas Lights FC had taken an early 1-0 lead when Junior Burgos sent in a blast from about 20-yards and the top of the arc, catching SD Loyal goalkeeper Jake Fenlason off his line in the fourth minute. It was a similar play to the initial Las Vegas touch after kickoff as it tried a shot from midfield that had Fenlason scrambling but making the save.

The visitor's lead didn't last long. SD Loyal tied the match in the 15th minute when Adams sent a left-footed low shot just inside the right post of Las Vegas FC goalkeeper Edward Delgado. Adams brought down with right foot a header by the Lights defense, switched it to his other foot as he cleared a defender for space before firing. The first goal in franchise history sent the more than 6,100 in attendance into cheers as the British midfielder celebrated with teammates as he jogged back to midfield.

ATUAHENE SCORED PAIR IN FIRST EVER WIN



Francis Atuahene had reason to celebrate his first start with SD Loyal. He was getting another opportunity to show case his abilities within USL Championship. He didn't waste his chance. Atuahene went down in SD Loyal history as the man to lead the team to its first ever win. Atuahene scored a pair of goals in SD Loyal's 2-1 win at Tacoma Defiance in the club's first ever road match Mar. 11, 2020. He scored on a free kick by Collin Martin on his first goal and then found the net off a Jack Metcalf through pass during his second goal. Atuahene didn't start in the team's inaugural game but he came on as a sub to help SD Loyal to a 1-1 tie against Las Vegas Lights March 7.

SD LOYAL RAISED 75K FOR RADYS CHILDREN HOSPITAL



San Diego Loyal SC, along with help of fans and the community, the team raised \$75,000 for The Conrad Prebys Foundation COVID-19 Response Challenge in May. The Conrad Foundation will match the proceeds raised, bringing the total to \$150,000 in support of Rady Children's Hospital-San Diego's COVID-19 efforts. "We are proud to see the outpouring of support from our fans and the community who along with our team, stepped up during this unprecedented time to raise funds for Rady Children's as they continue to be a leader on the forefront of childhood healthcare," said Warren Smith, president of SD Loyal. A NIGHT TO REMEMBER



It was a moment he might remember for a while. And if he doesn't always remember it, SD Loyal fans will most likely do so. Charlie Adams went down as the person to score the team's first-ever goal. The British midfielder found the net in the 15th minute in SD Loyal's inaugural game against Las Vegas Lights FC, March 7 at USD Torero Stadium. It was not only the first goal but it also helped SD Loyal to save a point with a 1-1 tie. Adams held back any extra excitement when describing his goal, a low-left-footed shot.

"I anticipated the second ball," Adams said. "I tried to initially stop the counter-attack and I did that, and in turn I had a good touch and was able to score. Great, great feeling."

Adams was fine with his score but said he'd preferred a different outcome as a result.

"There are things to improve on, you know," Adams said. "It's positive that we got the point. Personally, not my best game. As a team, I think we can improve as well, probably on possession on the ball."
