ABOUT PHOENIX RISING FC

Phoenix Rising FC is coming off one of its best seasons as it reached the USL Championship final in 2020 under a revamped schedule. It was scheduled to play Tampa Bay Rowdies after winning the Western Conference title after beating El Paso Locomotive FC in penalty kicks. But the championship final was canceled due to a COVID-19 outbreak in the within the Rowdies organization. Phoenix Rising FC had earned the right to host the USL Championship final but gave up homefield advantage to the Eastern Conference champion due to outcry that came from SD Loyal's forfeit of its regular season finale. Phoenix Rising FC went on to finish the regular season with a 11-3-2 record with 35 points, good enough to win Group B. The 35 points was tied for second best behind the now defunct Reno 1868 FC 36 points in the Group A standings.

Phoenix Rising FC played 12 preseason matches in 2021, finishing with a 2-0-10 record. It's last pair of preparation matches were last week. Phoenix would split the games, losing 4-0 to the fellow USL Championship side before coming back to beat the League One club 2-1.

The performances mirrored Phoenix's preseason as the club finished with half of its losses being to MLS' Sporting Kansas City, Colorado Rapids, Portland Timbers and Real Salt Lake. Phoenix was slated to travel to Seattle to take on the Sounders, but that match was canceled due to a false COVID-19 positive in Rising's camp. Rising only managed to keep one clean sheet in those 12 matches. That shutout came in the second leg of two 75-minute games against Colorado Springs Switchbacks. Both teams were playing their second units. Phoenix Rising FC enters the 2021 season without its starting goalkeeper Zac Lubin, who is out indefinitely with a lower-back strain. Center back James Musa has been nursing a bilateral calf injury recently and only played 80 minutes against Tucson.

OPENING NIGHT AT A NEW STADIUM

Phoenix Rising FC has a new homeground: Wild Horse Pass Stadium. Tonight's match is the first official competition at the new facility. The 10,000 capacity stadium is part of a massive sports and entertainment project on Gila River Indian land.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

The Sept. 30, 2020 match ended in a forfeit. SD Loyal led at halftime but the team decided not to return to the pitch in protest after a homophobic slur was used against one of its players. Phoenix Rising FC won the first meeting 2-0 on Aug. 15 at its former home ground Casino Arizona Field.

ABOUT SD LOYAL

SD Loyal enters its second season after becoming an expansion and playing in its inaugural season in the USL Championship last year. It was a turbulent 2020 season for the club due the COVID-19 pandemic. It got to play its inaugural game in front of a sold-out home crowd then competition came to a halt in March. The league revamped the schedule and resumed play in July. SD Loyal went on to a 6-5-5 record under first-year coach Landon Donovan, finishing in fourth place in the Group B standings.

It finished the season with a forfeit in its regular season finale against Phoenix Rising FC after SD Loyal players walked off the pitch after a homophobic slur was used against one of its players before halftime. SD Loyal was in position to make a push for the playoffs before the forfeit. It was the second forfeit by SD Loyal in 2020. Donovan's team also forfeit a match against L.A. Galaxy II after a racial slur was used against one of its players.

Launched on June 19, 2019, San Diego Loyal is the newest member of USL Championship Western Conference. San Diego Loyal plays for America's Finest City and is led by some of the best in sport. The Club is led by Chairman Andrew Vassiliadis, who is the youngest principal owner in USL Championship. It was founded and led on the business-side by experienced soccer executive Warren Smith, a co-founder and former president of Sacramento Republic FC. Executive Vice President of Soccer Operations Landon Donovan, one of the most decorated soccer players in the U.S., leads the technical side as both EVP and Team Manager.

San Diego Loyal is built on four core pillars – Completion, Commitment, Connection, Camaraderie.

San Diego Loyal held training camp in late March and most of April 2021 at the Chula Vista Elite Athlete Training Center, which also serves as its training center. Donovan's roster played in four eight matches leading up to the 2021 USL Championship season opener at Pacific Division rival Phoenix Rising FC.

Home matches are played at Torero Stadium located on the University of San Diego campus. Torero stadium has hosted numerous important soccer events including the U.S. Women's National team and MLS clubs LA Galaxy, Chivas USA and Club Tijuana. It is also the home field to USD's football team, soccer teams and San Diego Legion Rugby team.

- **1** San Diego Loyal SC travels to Phoenix for the 3rd time in club history. The previous meetings were at Casino Arizona Field within 5 weeks of each other in August/September 2020. Phoenix won the first game 2-0, before San Diego turned the tables to win 3-2.
- **2** While their most recent meeting was overshadowed in the Loyal's final regular season game of 2020 was overshadowed by an on-field incident and a forfeit, Loyal were leading the game 3-1 at the time, including what would have been the Loyal's first-ever goal directly from a free kick, when Rubio Rubin scored in the 45th minute. As the game was forfeited, this goal has been annulled.
- **3** Discounting the forfeited game, Loyal scored 12 of their 23 total points in the 6 games prior to their ill-fated meeting with Phoenix. Loyal only scored 7 goals in the opening 10 games of the 2020 season, but after the acquisition of Alejandro Guido and subsequently Rubio Rubin they broke through for 10 goals in 5 games (13 goals in 5 ½ games, if you included the forfeited final game). Rubin has joined MLS side Real Salt Lake in 2021 and contributed 2 assists in their 2-1 against Minnesota United last weekend.
- **4** Rubin is one of 18 players who appeared for the Loyal last year who do not return for the 2021 season. That list of players also include Joe Greenspan (the 2019 USL Defender Of The Year who spent most of last year out injured), Tarek Morad, whose 89.0% pass accuracy from the center of defense led the entire Loyal roster, and goalkeeper Jon Kempin, whose 0.54 goalsper-90 would have set an all-time USL Championship record, had Pittsburgh's Danny Vitiello not recorded an even-better 0.50 goals-per-90!
- **5** The Loyal begin 2021 having not trailed at any point in their final 6 league games of 2020 7 if you include the forfeited game. That came after a period in which they went 506 minutes over 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ games without ever leading their opponents in mid-season.
- **6** Some players have changed their squad numbers over the offseason. Tumi Moshobane has exchanged #15 for #11 this year, while Ben Spencer moves from #29 to #9. Last but not least, Alejandro Guido was #33 in his late-season appearances, but now wears #10.
- 7 To say Guido was the team's talisman in 2020 would be more than just a feeling. Joining with only 6 games remaining last year, Guido never played beyond the 75th minute of any game, yet all of the Loyal's 10 goals (13 including the forfeited game) were scored when Guido was on the pitch. Discounting the minutes when Guido was on the pitch, Loyal scored just once in their final 11 games (Carlos Alvarez in the 1-3 loss to Reno).
- **8** Guido scored 2 goals of his own last season, but his contribution to the team is not just statistical he never touched the ball in the box in the 3-2 win in Phoenix and only made 12 passes in his 45 minutes on the pitch. Both his off-the-ball running as well as his ability to time his passes freed up space for Jack Metcalf on the right wing, who led the Loyal in passes for the only time all year in that game.
- **9** San Diego Loyal were very shot-shy in 2020. No player on the team took more than 15 shots all season, with the most coming from Francis Atuahene (who is no longer with the team). The offseason acquisition of Corey Hertzog massively changes that statistic, as he took nearly three times as many shots as any Loyal player last year (41), the same number as Phoenix Rising striker Rufat Dadashov.

- **10 –** San Diego officially conceded 18 goals in the 2020 season, 1 more than Phoenix Rising. However, that total includes the 3-0 forfeited game, which San Diego were winning 3-1 at the time. Had those numbers been applied instead, Loyal only conceded 16 goals compared to Phoenix's 20 goals.
- **11 –** The Loyal never received a red card in their first 13 league games last season notwithstanding Irvin Parra's red card in the preseason friendly against Costa del Este but then saw reds in 3 straight games to end the year. Grant Stoneman received a 2nd yellow in the 97th minute of the 3-2 win vs Phoenix on September 19, before Elijah Martin also saw a 2nd yellow in the 89th minute of the 1-1 draw with LA Galaxy II only four days later. Finally and unfortunately Collin Martin erroneously saw red in the forfeited Phoenix game, although it was almost immediately rescinded.
- **12 –** Coincidentally, the only penalties conceded by both San Diego and Phoenix last season were both awarded on July 25, both were for handballs and neither of them were directly converted. Loyal's came while leading 1-0 in first half stoppage time home to Las Vegas on July 25, due to a Grant Stoneman handball. Jon Kempin saved both the Jose Carrera penalty and his rebound, only for Rashawn Dally to score at the third attempt. For Phoenix, Joe Farrell handballed in the 62nd minute of their 1-0 loss to Orange County, but Aodhan Quinn hit his penalty kick over the bar.
- **13** Charlie Adams has been on the winning side against Phoenix Rising 4 times in the last 3 years, twice for Real Monarchs, once for Orange County and once for San Diego. Along similar lines, Carlos Alvarez scored for Las Vegas Lights the last time Phoenix lost by more than one goal (a 5-2 defeat on October 10 2018)
- **14 –** Loyal's Ben Spencer made 18 appearances for Phoenix Rising in the 2019 season scoring 5 goals. He will hope to get among the goal rush this weekend, as the Loyal have never scored a goal whenever he has come on as a substitute and they have only scored once ever when he has been on the pitch. He played more minutes (338) than any other Loyal striker without scoring in 2020.
- **15 –** Loyal have never lost when they have scored first and have never lost when they have been leading a half-time. Conversely, they have never won a game in which they have conceded first.
- **16** Phoenix Rising scored 5 goals in stoppage time last season, six if you include Solomon Asante's 90th minute penalty versus LA Galaxy II on August 22.

Preseason ends with another win

San Diego Loyal beats USD at Torero Stadium in final preparation match







San Diego (April 23, 2021) –Training camp, preparation matches and double scrimmages are over. And so is nearly two months of constant work towards what is next: the USL Championship season.

San Diego Loyal completed its preseason schedule with a 5-0 win against USD Toreros Friday night at Torero Stadium.

Coach Landon Donovan's team was back at its home stadium for a match for the first time since the end of the 2020 regular season in September. It was a spring of preparing for the franchise's second season. Donovan got a chance to test his squad and see what players were ready to be part of the final roster and worthy of his first eleven.

"In my opinion it's been almost a perfect preseason," Donovan said. "We played a variety of different teams, some very good teams. We finished the preseason with almost three full 90-minute performances from our guys, so, they are fit and ready to start the season. Most importantly, no injuries. We are very happy with how it's gone and we're ready for Phoenix now."

Against USD, Donovan fined tuned the final details heading into the season opener next week against Phoenix Rising FC.

Newcomers Jack Blake and Niki Jackson both sent in a pair of goals. Ben Spencer also found the net for SD Loyal in the preseason finale.

SD Loyal played eight preseason dates against Cal United Strikers FC, 1904 FC of the NISA and college teams Azuza Pacific and Cal State Fullerton in addition to USD. Donovan's also played against Seattle Sounders and LA Galaxy, both of MLS.

San Diego Loyal beats Cal State Fullerton and Azuza Pacific



(Chula Vists, Calif.) Collin Martin walked away from near the penalty box pumping his fist Saturday. The midfielder had just scored after beating the goalkeeper on a one-on-one play.

It was a brief celebration from the 26-year-old from Maryland. And he had reason to as he sent in his goal in a 4-1 win against Cal State Fullerton at the Chula Vista Elite Athlete Training Center. It was the second win in a pair of preseason matches for SD Loyal, heading into the USL Championship opener April

Martin broke away after taking the ball on the Cal State Fullerton side of the pitch. He sped up with only the goalkeeper to beat. That's when Martin made his move left then right to get past the goalkeeper. He ran freely to send a low, rolling shot from right to left into an open net in the 40th minute.

Martin's goals gave SD Loyal a 3-0 lead after Corey Hertzog (31st minute) and Jack Metcalf (35th) had previously scored. Hertzog converted a penalty kick after Martin was taken down in the penalty area. Metcalf fired and buried a right-footed shot from just inside the 16-yard box.

But the scoring didn't end there for SD Loyal. Jack Blake blasted a free kick into the net for a 4-1 lead in the 48th minute. Cal State Fullerton scored in the 63rd minute.



This were the sixth and seventh preseason games for SD Loyal as it heads into its second season. Coach Landon Donovan usec two sets of lineups that included a handful of trialists.

"We are really starting to gel now," Donovan said. "It generally takes time in preseason with new faces. We are really happy how today went and we're 13 days away now. We've gotten a lot of different looks and the good thing is guys have to figure out and solve problems. They are doing a great job at that. The team is really growing and there is a lot of accountability on the field."


The first lineup led SD Loyal to a 2-1 win against Azuza Pacific in the day cap of the preseason doubleheader. Ben Spencer

scored a pair of goals in the day cap to help his team to a 2-1 win in the preseason affair. Spencer put back a loose ball in the area in his first goal and converted a penalty kick. Donovan's team now heads into its final preparation match Friday April 23 against USD at Torero Stadium, a week from its season opener at Phoenix Rising FC.

"I am really happy where we are, we've made a lot of good progress," Donovan said. "We have a really good opportunity Friday night against USD to really be sharp and play well and then we have probably the best team in the season. So, we have to be ready to go."

Seattle - (April 10, 2021) -The plan was to lineup the best possible opponents in the preseason. At least that's what San Diego Loyal SC coach Landon Donovan wanted. He wanted to put his players in the best position and face top-notch competition. That included facing one of Major League Soccer's top clubs. Enter Seattle Sounders.

Donovan's squad made the trip north to visit the two-time MLS Cup champions Saturday for a pair of 90-minute scrimmages. SD Loyal showed quality of play in the day and night set of scrimmages as Seattle won both with 1-0 scores at Lumen Field.

Will Bruin scored in the sixth minute of the night cap affair in what was Seattle's final preseason match heading into its season opener against Minnesota United FC Friday. He put back a loose ball inside the box. Seattle nearly scored again in the 50th minute when a shot came off the post.

SD Loyal nearly tied it in the 75th minute when Tumi Moshobane smacked a shot from inside the box off the post. It was one of a handful of chances created by Donovan's team. There were also some defensive plays that stood out. Goalkeeper Trey Muse made a one-handed diving save in the 87th minute against the team he was sent from on loan to SD Loyal.

Seattle won the day game 1-0 with a 70th minute goal by its academy midfielder Juan Alvarez.

Chula Vista. (April 3, 2021) -The regular season is one step closer. San Diego Loyal Soccer Club got its first taste of 2021 USL Championship competition as it played to a 2-1 loss against New Mexico United in a preseason match Saturday.

It was the first full run of play for coach Landon Donovan's team as it had previously played sets of multiple scrimmages each weekend last month. This time, it was a USL Championship opponent it will see in the regular season.

Saturday's match at the Chula Vista Elite Athlete Training Center saw Charile Adams and Grant Stoneman connect for SD Loyal's goal in the 64th minute of the exhibition match. Adams floated a pass from left to right, finding Stoneman at the six-yard box. That's where the 6-foot-2 defender connected via a header as he went to the ground, sending his shot into the net inside the far post.

It was a collective scoring play for SD Loyal but New Mexico got scores from Amando Moreno (27th minute) and the gamewinner by Devon Sandoval in the 86th minute. Moreno scored on a shot from the top of the box. Sandoval put back a shot off a deflection. Sandoval's goal came after SD Loyal continued to attack and create chances in the second half. Tumi Moshobane, Corey Hertzog and Alejandro Guido threatened the New Mexico United goal. Moshobane sent a shot on frame while Guido and Hertzog had back-to-back shots before Stoneman finally scored for Donovan's team.

Goalkeeper Trey Muse kept the game tied with a handful of saves, including a standout one in the 70th minute. But New Mexico United finished off the scoring with Sandoval's goal.

This was SD Loyal's fourth preseason affair. It will now prepare for another preparation match at Major League Soccer side Seattle Sounders April 10. It will then finish the preseason with a game against Cal State Fullerton April 17. The USL Championship season opener is at Phoenix Rising April 30.

First clash between San Diego clubs comes in preseason formSan Diego Loyal beats 1904FC in pair of scrimmages Sunday

Chula Vista. (March 28, 2021) -It was the first of perhaps many to come. San Diego Loyal SC faced 1904FC in the battle between the city's two professional teams. And there was no shortage in goals as SD Loyal beat the National Independent Soccer Association (NISA) team in a pair of scrimmages Sunday at the Chula Vista Elite Athlete Training Center.

Coach Landon Donovan's team beat 1904FC 6-0 in the first of two 75-minute scrimmages that were divided into 45-minute halves, a 15-minute break and another 30 minutes of actions in each. SD Loyal won the second scrimmage 3-1.

It was a morning and afternoon of goals for the USL Championship club as SD Loyal broke out with a flurry of goals while using two sets of lineups. It was a day that paired two San Diego teams in a highly anticipated meeting.

"It's great to have two teams here that people care about, because for so long it has been zero teams." Donovan said. "I thought it was great to get everyone together. It's obvious there is a lot of talent in this part of the country and I thought it was a really great day."

It was a day of converting chances for SD Loyal. Donovan's team opened up the scoring in the shutout win of the first scrimmage with a goal by Corey Hertzog as he converted a penalty kick nine minutes into the session. "Playing a local team, the guys wanted to win," Donovan said. "This game certainly meant more for both teams. Scoring nine goals is great. I'm not sure I've seen more scoring chances in my life. I think we keep progressing."



After sitting out the 2016 season, Moshobane shined in 2017 and 2018, scoring 17 goals and seven assists in 40 appearances while earning all-conference and honorable mention All-American honors in NAIA. Before that, Moshobane he had played in the South African Premiere Soccer League's youth system with the Kaizer Chiefs. He eventually saw time with the first team and impressed enough that he was also called to South Africa's team that was looking to secure a spot in the 2016 Olympic Games. Things didn't work for Moshobane in South Africa and decided to come to the United States. His first minutes in professional soccer in the United States came with Lansing United of the National Premier Soccer League.

LANDON DONOVAN

Regarded as one of the greatest U.S. soccer players in history, Landon Donovan brings his extensive knowledge of the game to San Diego Loyal's technical staff. During his 19-year professional career, Donovan's accomplishments span both his time domestically and internationally. In total, he played for five professional teams covering three leagues: Bayer 04 Leverkusen and Bayern Munich (Bundesliga); Everton (Premier League); San Jose Earthquakes and LA Galaxy (Major League Soccer). He played in six MLS Cups, Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup and two MLS Supporters' Shields. Individually, he was named to an MLS record 14-consecutive MLS All-Star games from 2001-2014, was honored with the Landon Donovan MVP Award in 2009 and won the Golden Boot in 2008, as well as being one of just two players to be named MLS Cup MVP twice. He continues to lead in MLS record books with assists (136), playoff goals (25) and coleads MLS in playoff assists (14). He is second to Chris Wondolowski with most regular-season goals at 145. Donovan's contributions to the U.S. Men's National Team continues to dominate the record books. He leads the U.S. men in goals (57), assists (58), second in appearances (157) and is the only American player to surpass both 50 goals and 50 assists in his career. He was the fastest American to earn 100 caps and played for the U.S. in three FIFA World Cups. His individual awards include the only American to win the Golden Ball Award, FIFA's Best Young Player of the World Cup in 2002, the CONCACAF Gold Cup MVP in 2013, the Gold Cup Best XI four times and U.S. Soccer Athlete of the Year a record four times.

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH



NATE MILLER

Miller is in his second season with SD Loyal as the associate head coach. Miller joined the team in 2020 after serving as head coach of the Spring Arbor University men's soccer program for six seasons, where his accomplishments include an overall record of 86-32-15, one league championship title, two regular season titles and being named 2018 Crossroads League Coach of the Year. Miller was also the general manager and head coach of Lansing United – a former member of the Premier Development League (PDL) – and, in 2019, was the inaugural head coach of USL League One expansion side Lansing Ignite FC.
