SF Deltas Searching for Three Points at Indy Eleven

SFD-IND: The Series

- SFD is and Indy have battled to three draws thus far this season.
- The Deltas tied Indy 1-1 in an Opening Night affair on March 25
- SFD came back from two goals down to tie Indy 2-2 at the last gasp on a header from Devon Sandoval at Kezar Stadium in their last meeting on June 3

The Playoff Picture

- There's still 11 matches left in the Fall Season, but the second-place Deltas (32 pts) are two points ahead of third-place New York Cosmos and three points ahead of fourth-place Jacksonville Armada in the Combined Standings. Miami FC, which won the Spring Season and already guaranteed a postseason berth, has 48 points in the Combined Standings.
- There are three playoff spots remaining - one for the Fall Season Champion, and two more for the next two teams with the highest point totals in the Combined Standings.
- Miami FC (12 pts) leads the Fall Standings, followed by Puerto Rico FC (9 pts) and FC Edmonton (8 pts). Deltas are in sixth place on six points.

Indy Eleven Trend

- The Boys in Blue have gone four matches without a victory (1D-3L), their last win coming on July 30 against FC Edmonton.
- Indy has conceded 3+ goals in three of their last six home matches in league play (3W-3L). They had conceded 3+ goals in three of their previous 42 home games.
- Indy is 3W-3D-4L at The Mike this season.

Marc Dos Santos was named the first-ever head coach of the San Francisco Deltas on August 17, 2016. Dos Santos brings over a decade of coaching experience to the Deltas, having developed players at both the professional and amateur levels in the US, Canada, Brazil, Portugal and Mozambique.

Dos Santos joined the Deltas from his head coaching role at Swope Park Rangers, the United Soccer League affiliate of MLS side Sporting Kansas City. Dos Santos formerly served as head coach for the Ottawa Fury's inaugural season in 2014 and led them to the North American Soccer League (NASL) Championship Final in 2015 where he was named Coach of the Year.

Dos Santos began his career in Portugal and Mozambique. In 2007, he was hired by his hometown team, the Montreal Impact, to lead the club's reserve team, Trois-Rivieres Attak FC. Under his leadership, the team won the 2007 Open Canada Cup and became 2008 CSL National Division champions, which led to him to being named the Impact's assistant coach and then their head coach. With Dos Santos, the Montreal Impact won the Canadian Championship in 2008, reached the Quarterfinals in the 2008-09 CONCACAF Champions League, and won the USL First Division title in 2009.

His appetite for new challenges led him to move to Brazil in 2012 and coach FC Primeira Camisa (U-20's) and SE Palmeiras (U-15's), culminating with a Copa do Brasil U-15 championship and then a head coaching position with Desportivo Brasil. He then returned to Canada in 2013 as the head coach of the Ottawa Fury.

A dual citizen of Canada and Portugal, Dos Santos holds a UEFA "A" coaching license and is fluent in four languages (English, French, Spanish and Portuguese). He and his wife Marie have three children.

Deltas Notes

SFD Factoids

- The Deltas have scored at least one goal in their last six home matches in - The Deltas have lost only one road match this season and take a 4W-5D-1L mark into this contest.
- San Francisco has just two road goals since June 24 th , the fewest of any NASL team (1W-1L- 2D). However, their two road clean sheets in that time are the second most in the league.
- The Deltas are allowing just 3.4 shots on target per game in the Fall Season, the fewest of any NASL team.

- Steward Ceus was with the Rapids organization the year they won their only MLS Cup.
