BACK-TO-BACK ROAD TRIPS OPEN EXISTENCE

Utah Royals FC (0-0-1, 1 pt.) continues its inaugural season Friday evening by playing its second National Women's Soccer League match in club history on Friday, March 30 at 6:00 p.m. MT at Houston Dash in BBVA Compass Stadium ... The match marks the second of a twogame road trip to open the season and continues a run that sees three out of four away for Head Coach Laura Harvey's side ...

This week's trip to Texas precedes a FIFA international break, prior to a run that sees five home games out of six on the Wasatch Front from April 14 to May 19 ... That critical franchise-opening homestand is kicked off by the club's historic inaugural home game at Rio Tinto Stadium on Sat., April 14 against Chicago (1:30 p.m. MT, Lifetime Game of the Week) ...

Due to concurrent kickoffs Friday night for RSL at Toronto FC in MLS play and the Utah Royals FC match at Houston, the club's NWSL game will be televised locally on a slight delay at 9:00 p.m. MT on KMYU, with an 8:30 p.m. MT digital streaming kickoff on the KSL app / KSL.com ...

VALUABLE POINT AT ORLANDO

Last weekend in Orlando, Utah Royals FC claimed its first-ever point against the heavily-favored Pride with a third-minute strike from MF **Gunny Jonsdottir**, the Iceland WNT captain ... Assisted by Canadian international **Diana Matheson**, the goal came from an eight-pass buildup that started in the back and involved seven different players ... Despite conceding a penalty conversion following a disputed handball call, Royals FC left Florida with a 1-1 draw and 90 minutes competed as a group. Tuesday, Jonsdottir's strike was named the Week 1 NWSL Goal of the Week, as voted by fans ...

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

Utah Royals FC – coached by British expatriate Laura Harvey – boasts no fewer than 11 recently active national team players on the club's 24player inaugural roster, representing seven countries. With three each from the United States (Captain Becky Sauerbrunn, DF Kelley O'Hara and FW Amy Rodriguez) and Canada (MF Desiree Scott, M/F Diana Matheson and DF Maegan Kelly), the group also includes a pair of Scandinavians (MF Gunny Jonsdottir / Iceland; and FW Elise Thorsnes / Norway), as well as an Oceania pair (MF Katie Bowen / New Zealand; and MF Katrina Gorry / Australia), following the official signing last week of Scotland Captain and DF Rachel Corsie ...

APRIL 14 INAUGURAL HOME GAME

Born less than four months ago and already supported by more than 4,000 season ticket holders, Utah Royals FC tickets are available by calling 844.Real.Tix or visiting <u>www.UtahRoyalsFC.com</u> ... The club's 24-game regular season kicked off with last week's 1-1 draw at Orlando and continues with Friday's road game at Houston and an international bye week on April 7 prior to the club's inaugural home game the afternoon of Saturday, April 14 at Rio Tinto Stadium ...

Following the initial two road matches and an international FIFA break the weekend of April 7, Utah Royals FC return home to christen its Rio Tinto Stadium fortress for NWSL play against the Chicago Red Stars on Saturday, April 14 at 1:30 p.m. MT in the league's Lifetime Game of the Week to celebrate its inaugural home contest (which features tripleplatinum recording artist **Rachel Platten** to sing the national anthem and provide a post-game concert) ...

Tune in daily to The Mix 105.1 FM and follow the station's social media regularly for chances to win VIP experiences in conjunction with Rachel Platten and Utah Royals FC players and personalities leading up to and including this historic event ... 2018 OUTLOOK

While a majority of the 24-player Utah Royals FC roster is composed of a core of 14 former FCKC players who have played together for years, Head Coach **Laura Harvey**'s side remains in search of cohesion and chemistry as a shortened offseason timeline, integration of new international players and relocation necessitates a growth period ...

Early-season NWSL success will be measured by how quickly the team can assimilate into a new coaching style, chemistry, location, and culture, carving not only a distinct identity but a dynamic niche while taking advantage of the foundation provided by the rapidly-growing and expanding Real Salt Lake club pyramid ...

On the bright side, the Utah Royals FC will have seven months of season play to adapt, and will be welcoming opponents to Utah's high altitude — a challenge unseen before in the NWSL ...

The team carries strength in each third of the pitch ... Strong attackers like USWNT star **Amy Rodriguez** and Norwegian goalscorer **Elise Thorsnes** are expected to power through NWSL defenses using their speed and technical ability to get inside the box ...

Royals FC is also heavy in midfield talent, bringing on international veterans like Australia's **Katrina Gorry**, Iceland's **Gunnhildur Jonsdottir** and Canadian "destroyer" **Desiree Scott** — each of whom carry the ability to distribute wide and find open space for attackers ...

The defensive line may be the Utah Royals FC's strongest asset, boasting on former USWNT GK **Nicole Barnhart** and Texas Longhorn prodigy **Abby Smith** between the pipes ... The duo's ability to direct traffic and navigate play means that experienced defenders like USWNT **Kelley O'Hara** and Captain **Becky Sauerbrunn** can build out of the back and keep the ball out of the net ...

Ambitions are high for the club, as everyone from owner **Dell Loy Hansen**, to heralded HC **Laura Harvey**, to club captain Sauerbrunn are expecting nothing less than a rewarding 2018 campaign ... The addition over the last 125 days since the formation of the team of a million-dollar Rio Tinto Stadium locker room home, the most lucrative jersey-front kit deal in American Women's soccer history, and training homes at both the world-class Zions Bank Real Academy and America First Field all indicate the franchise is preparing for nothing less than success ...

KEY DATES IN CLUB HISTORY

November 16, 2017:

A historic day for Utah's sporting landscape as the Real Salt Lake pyramid saw Owner **Dell Loy Hansen** joined at Rio Tinto Stadium by Utah Governor **Gary Herbert** and NWSL Managing Director of Operations **Amanda Duffy** to announce that the club would acquiring an NWSL team for the 2018 season ...

The announcement was made just 24 hours after Hansen's ownership stake and partnership in the NWSL was officially signed in New York City ... The standing-room only event at the Interform Club on the venue's 2nd-floor also came just 15 days after Hansen received an initial phone call from Portland's **Merritt Paulsen** to gauge RSL interest in NWSL opportunities, one which created a whirlwind of exploratory discussions in Portland, New York, Chicago and Salt Lake regarding RSL's NWSL endeavor ...

One day later, the NWSL made official the transfer of FC Kansas City player rights to Salt Lake ... As a precursor to this transfer, the NWSL re-acquired FC Kansas City LLC's membership interest in the league and ceased club operations immediately.

November 27, 2017:

Real Salt Lake General Manager **Craig Waibel** announced the hiring of the two-time NWSL Coach of the Year **Laura Harvey**, the winningest manager in NWSL's five-year history ...

"Visiting with [RSL owner] Dell Loy Hansen, [general manager] Craig Waibel, [RSL MLS head coach] **Mike Petke** and others and having the chance to see their vision for the club locally and the sport nationally and internationally, it was impossible not to get excited about what RSL looks to do for women's soccer," Harvey said. "The facilities and environment that we will be able to offer our players are world-class. This is a great place for me to continue to develop as a coach, and I believe we will be able to make a huge stamp on women's soccer not just in Utah but nationwide."

December 1, 2017:

Unveiling the club's logo, name and colors, the **Utah Royals FC** identity was unveiled two weeks after Utah's intentions to participate in the NWSL for what would be a historic sixth season, and just days after visiting the Nike campus 20 days into its 90-day NWSL production cycle ...

During the previous year, the NWSL celebrated the 500th game in league history – more than the combined total of two prior high-profile domestic women's leagues – as it continued to push women's professional soccer to new heights as the best league in the world ...

December 21, 2017:

U.S. Women's National Team Captain **Becky Sauerbrunn** commits to Utah, arriving as a the club's inaugural player and setting tone for more

than a dozen other former FC Kansas City players to relocate to the new club's Rio Tinto Stadium home \ldots

December 29, 2017:

Via trade, Utah Royals FC acquired standout NWSL and USWNT defender **Kelley O'Hara** from Sky Blue FC, along with FW Taylor Lytle in exchange for Shea Groom, Christina Gibbons and the #4 overall pick in the 2018 NWSL College Draft ...

Due to international duty in the first quarter of 2018, O'Hara wouldn't be able to join her Utah teammates until March 10, just two weeks prior to the 2018 NWSL kickoff ...

February 5, 2018:

URFC Owner Hansen is joined by multiple players in Logan, Utah, to unveil the club's clean white secondary kit, emblazoned across the front with the **CONSERVICE** logo, to announce **the most lucrative jersey-front partnership in American women's soccer history** ... The reported 3-year, \$2 million deal receives a boost when the team's highly-anticipated primary gold kits are finally unveiled at Rio Tinto Stadium on March 10, at halftime of a standing-room only crowd present for RSL's 2018 MLS season opener ...

February 9, 2018:

Nine members of the club's front office and technical staff are unveiled, most prominently **Stephanie Lee** – a former colleague of Harvey in Seattle with the NWSL Reign – as the Utah Royals FC managing director (and the NWSL's lone female "alternate governor" at ownership meetings) ...

February 15, 2018:

Nearly two dozen players converge on Utah to convene as a group for the first time on the eve of preseason, meeting Owner **Dell Loy Hansen**, RSL club officials, and many teammates for the first time through a series of meals, community events, fitness tests, etc., culminating in the unveiling of housing and transportation assistance provided by the club, as well as the formal presentation of **newlyconstructed Rio Tinto Stadium locker room home** for Utah Royals FC ...

February 19, 2018:

Utah Royals FC kick off its **inaugural preseason training sessions** at the \$78 million dollar Zions Bank Real Academy in Herriman, Utah, wearing the colors and kicking a ball for the historic first time ...

Several of the club's 11 international players representing 7 countries would not join the group until the latter half of the preseason (March 12 in LA) due to international duties "For Club and Country" ...

Included on this list of late arrivals are: DF Kelley O'Hara for the United States; MF Desiree Scott, M/F Diana Matheson and FW Maegan Kelly for Canada; MF "Gunny" Jonsdottir for Iceland, FW Elise Thorsnes for Norway, D/M Katie Bowen for New Zealand, DF Rachel Corsie for Scotland and MF Katrina Gorry for Australia, who won't report to NWSL until the "Matildas" complete their Asian Cup qualifying tournament for FIFA Women's World Cup 2019 in France on April 20...

March 24, 2018:

The club finally takes the field at Orlando in a historic inaugural game, one which will be televised and streamed in Utah via KMYU television and KSL digital, the same broadcast outlets as Real Salt Lake/MLS ... One of the most prominent voices in Utah sports, **Greg Wrubell**, assumes duties as the club's play-by-play announcer for TV/radio, while former Real Monarchs broadcaster **Carla Haslam** – a former BYU women's soccer player – is the club's color analyst ...

THE INAUGURAL 24 HOURS

"This is the Best I've Ever Seen"

A 24-hour period in mid-February when the players reported for preseason might have been the most significant whirlwind of excitement for Utah Royals FC in its brief four-month history leading up to the Orlando opener ...

In less than a day, the new team members experienced their first team dinner, met new teammates and coaches — many of whom had played together in Kansas City or elsewhere in the NWSL — and moved into their housing accommodations, received use of new sponsored Ford Eco-Sport cars, ultimately walking through the brand new Royals FC locker room at Rio Tinto Stadium ...

"We set a goal to make this the best women's team in the world, and if that's our goal, then we need to provide nothing less than the best," said Owner Dell Loy Hansen, at the inaugural team dinner on Thursday night, Feb. 15 ...

Yet the dinner was not your typical team outing ... Prior to ordering their meals, the women were suddenly instructed to "Stop what you're doing, and go outside."

Unaware of the impending gift, the Utah Royals FC squad walked out to find six brand new Ford EcoSports waiting in the parking lot ... Many of the players were handed keys in the Ford ceremonial car event, and others were given a monthly \$100 Maverik gas card to cover training and community travel ...

"It is incredible how the Utah Royals FC have been able to take care of us like this," said midfielder **Erika Tymrak**. "I know that the women are so grateful for everything that has been given to us. Everyone is speechless."

Just 15 hours later, the team arrived to view its \$1-million dollar locker room at Rio Tinto Stadium, which left the women shocked with amazement — shrieks of excitement filled the large locker room, while others were left speechless ... Their new home consists of a worldclass facility, with individually-named lockers, a lounge and kitchen area, vanity, training area, exercise room, technical offices, and equipment room ...

Hansen concluded the incredible tour by tearfully promising to fly each woman's families out for the inaugural April 14 home game at Rio Tinto Stadium ... His closing remarks struck a deep chord of emotion for many of the new team members, prompting gracious hugs, tears, and expressions of gratitude ...

"This has been emotional for me. I've been playing professionally for a number of years, and I've lived apart from my boyfriend for all of them. So [playing professionally] is a conscious decision that I have to make every single year," said USWNT co-captain **Becky Sauerbrunn** ... "To have someone like Dell Loy that recognizes the sacrifices that we make—to make that a little bit easier—is wonderful ... We got emotional because there are husbands, there are partners, there are children that are being left behind. To make that a little bit easier, and take that off our shoulders a little bit, is truly amazing."

MORE REAX:

Dell Loy Hansen

"We created a place that honors the professionalism of this amazing group of women athletes. We've always given great treatment to the NBA, the NFL, college football, basketball — but here is the best group of women soccer players in the world. They deserve equal treatment; it's not even gray. They deserve equal treatment. And I think we came close to providing that true professionalism that they deserve."

"Today was like Christmas. You can have Christmas and not get anything close to this. It's like seeing your children with happy faces, almost unbelieving, that they have been able to join an organization that cares this much. We care this much and more. It is them that we honor. We want them to think of themselves as being nothing less than professional athletes, that their needs are met, that they're honored, that they have the dignity of being the best women's soccer team in the world — and we should treat them like that."

"When I saw their happy faces, I had to cry. We had a shared emotion. It was hard to keep a straight face. I raised seven daughters. I have been highly aware that women are sometimes viewed as not being as capable, or not given near the opportunities that men are. And I have always been a true believer in equal rights, equal pay, and equal respect. When we took this challenge on, we decided that the RSL men and the Royals women, in my mind, are absolutely equal and will be given equal treatment, equal field, and equal respect. While I don't control the salary cap, I can do everything up to that to let them know I am doing everything possible to create equality. We bend over backwards to build the best training facility for our men - to provide meals, help with housing, help with their immigration - Real exists in a way to serve the athlete so that they can be true professionals on the field. And I think these women will also become better athletes because they have that self-image that they are deserving, and that they will be what they deserve to be. I believe that."

Captain Becky Sauerbrunn

"Dell Loy has shown us the potential. He has treated us so well; I mean I fly in just yesterday, was picked up at the airport, was driven to my fully-furnished apartment, went to dinner, met Dell Loy, met a bunch of people from the front office, met my teammates that I haven't seen in a long time, and the ones that are new —and then we went outside and we got cars! You just want to be treated like a professional, and he has gone so beyond that. It is has been so amazing to be a part of that, like it's only been 24 hours — what's going to happen in 48 hours? Just seeing the locker room and hearing about the Opening Day plans is so wonderful, and it makes me feel very honored and fortunate to be a part of this."

"The locker room is fantastic! I have played in a lot of stadiums with the U.S. and been all over the world, and that is a world-class locker room. It has everything you could possibly need, I mean there are robes! You don't even need a robe — but like maybe I did need a robe?! All of it is so top-notch and so classy, and when we start playing soccer, everything we need is ready for us."

"When I came here on a visit, I got to meet Dell Loy, and he struck as a man that when he says he's going to do something, it's going to happen. So when he told me all the stuff that he was going to do, I thought that this was amazing, and that he was going to do it. And he did do it. He came through with everything that he said. I will never doubt that anything that comes out of his mouth, he's going to go and do it."

"You can always throw money and create something, but for him [Dell Loy Hansen], it seemed like this was so much more of a passion. He got emotional and made a lot of us emotional because he's really trying to understand the sacrifices that we've made. To help with that, but then understand all the issues—on field, off field that we come across in our careers — he's really trying to help. He's offering us opportunities outside of the stadium, which is amazing, enriching us in the community, and to set us up like that, to meet with powerful women in the community — this is something where people can build a life and build a career playing soccer and also beyond."

FW Amy Rodriguez

"I just got to Salt Lake City yesterday, and since I have arrived, so much has happened. I am a little bit blown away because everything is so grand and so wonderful. I can tell that our team is in the best of hands and that we have an organization that is going to be the very best. I could not be more excited. I think my teammates and I are ready to get out on the field, and get things going."

"The locker room is top-of-the-line, and is something that I have never really been a part of. As a professional athlete, this is part of our dream — to play in the best facilities, to have the best organization — and I feel that everyone has rallied behind us. I hope that we can put the best product on the field and show people what the best club in the world looks like."

"I've had my fair share of teams I've played on, and stadiums I've played in, but this is the best I've ever seen. To get to play on it, and

be here, and be a part of this — I'm speechless. This really is the best, and I just can't wait for the season to start."

"I almost feel like I don't deserve this. I feel like this is something that is so special, and to see Dell Loy up there speaking to us, and getting emotional about his passion for this club and for the sport — I just feel so lucky. I can't believe that this is part of my story. I really do hope that we can inspire the next generation of women, and create a movement. I see that Dell Loy is pioneering that for us."

Head Coach Laura Harvey

"It was amazing to see the players' reaction. I think the build-up has been big, but they didn't disappoint. I think Dell Loy promised that he would provide a locker room in a home that the players would want to be around, and there's no doubt that that's happened. I think you saw the girls' reactions is to more than just the building, but to everything Del Loy is trying to do here. I think it means that these players can actually feel like they're a part of something really special."

"The great thing about Dell Loy is that he's so authentic. You just see how he presents everything to them that he truly cares — it's not about him trying to stage things or make it big for no reason — but he truly cares. And when you have that feeling as a player or coach or a member of the staff, it makes you want to go the extra mile for that man. I think for me, it will be an easy team talk most days when I'm here to get the girls motivated to play, because you want to do it for someone who cares for you. And I think that is something that is going to resonate throughout the team. I think that is the next stage — we are in a position now to do our job. Our task is to go out and do it to the best of our ability, and we are set up to do that —it's great."

"I think they [players and staff] are just in shock. It's just not real yet. They're sitting now in the locker room and just chilling out. And I see it on their faces, looking around, asking themselves if this is real. And I think gradually over time they'll appreciate what it is. And I don't think it's going to end here — I think he's going to keep producing things and enable them to be the best professionals they can be. And ultimately, that is all they have ever wanted, is to be put in an environment where they can succeed, and they truly believe that they're here now."

"I said when I came here that I was sold on something, and to see that in reality makes me want to go out there on Monday and put out the best training sessions that I possibly can. I think from a players' perspective, they are going to feel the same by showing exactly who they are. You don't want them going out on the field thinking about everything that they're stressing about. You want them to wake up and be the best footballer that they can be, and I think he has set that tone that they can do that. That to me just makes my job way easier."

"Again, I go back to the thought that Dell Loy is authentic. You can't fake that. The moment that happened, I think that everyone in that room knew that this is real, that this is true, that he believes in everything he's saying, and he's going to follow through with everything he's saying he's going to do. When you have someone that is so invested in that, from a women's soccer perspective, every player and coach feels that they have a responsibility to give back to the next generation. When you have someone like Dell Loy that also has that vision, it means that you can truly make something that is going to have a history that is going to live on for a long, long time. And that is super exciting."

Look for Thorsnes ability to win balls out of the air, and muscle her way through players ... Her strength and agility will play a key role in getting goals for the new squad ...

DF Kelley O'Hara

There are few things that make a soccer coach more excited than a versatile defender who isn't afraid to get into the attack ... With experience as a goal-scoring forward in college, you can expect O'Hara to be a dangerous threat on the field ... Also take a mental note of how much ground O'Hara covers during the match ... As the regular winner of the USWNT beep fitness test, O'Hara is the energizer bunny that keeps on running, always pressuring the opponent ...

MF Desiree Scott

You can't watch **Utah Royals FC** without noticing **Desiree Scott** bossing the midfield ... Known as "The Destroyer," Scott provides the solid, steady midfield that every successful team needs ... Playing for Laura Harvey:

"It was a really exciting day when Laura called. I didn't really know what to say when she asked me to come out to training camp, other than I would absolutely love to be there. I had seen everything on social media — everything that the club was trying to do — watched some of the interviews that Becky had done, and I think that was something that was huge for the league as a whole, and the opportunity to be a part of that is something that I was excited about. "The greatest thing I've enjoyed over the last month is how welcoming the team has been, everyone from the staff to the club as a whole and I think that is huge to success. When you're comfortable, it's something that allows you to focus on the field, and I think that has been one of the biggest factors in allowing the team to progress over the last four weeks in preseason. "Laura is someone that I've really looked up too, and playing against her for the last five years, and to learn from her — and everything I've heard from her and her reputation — she obviously is one of the best coaches in the league, and in the world. So I am already learning a lot from her, and I feel very fortunate."

Team chemistry concerns?:

"I think it is really exciting because we have a core group of players that have played together for almost five years, and then you have these new players that add something new to the table, and so to get everyone on the same page may be tricky, but in the end it is going to make us more dynamic."

DF KELLEY O'HARA

Learning from Laura Harvey:

"Today (March 12) was my first training with her on the field, and last night I did a video session with her — and today we are already getting into tactics — so I am already so excited to be able to learn from her, and play for her, and develop as a player."

Establishing a new NWSL club:

"I've only been here for a few days with the club, and everyday I'm like this is so professional". I've been blown away. There really are no words because nothing rivals this. I'm pretty happy to be here."

Thoughts on April 14?:

"Is it April 14 yet? I'm stoked. I'm excited for our first game of the season, but I'm also looking forward to the home opener and playing in Utah in front of our fans, and being at the RioT."

What do you know about the Utah soccer community?:

"My first day in Utah was for the home opener for RSL, and unfortunately the game didn't go as well as we wanted it to, but the fans were awesome — we got to hang out with some of the fans and just the energy inside that stadium was incredible. I'm excited to a part of not just the soccer community, but the Utah community in general. I'm looking forward to just getting involved and being a part of everything that is Salt Lake, and that is Utah."

Team Chemistry thoughts:

"I think it is pretty exciting because a lot of the players have played together before. I've played with a couple of them, but it will be interesting to see us blend, and to see everybody learning about each other, the chemistry on the field, the tactics that Laura will implement, and hopefully build a championship team."

FW AMY RODRIGUEZ

Playing under Laura:

"I feel so lucky. When I got drafted to the team, I looked forward to the opportunity to play under her. I never got to do that because of the birth of my first son. Laura is a big-time coach with a lot of accolades, and I think that she is going to bring out the best in me as a player. I have faith that she is going to help this squad and bring us to a championship that we can bring back to Utah."

Establishing new club in Utah:

"Joining the RSL family is pretty cool. It's cool that we have an MLS brother that has led us along this path of success and championship. We hope to have the same and have a dual partnership in Utah. We want to excite the fans and create a big buzz. What better than to have an MLS and NWSL championship in the same year?"

"After moving my family to Utah, I would love to tap into the youth scene in Utah, and hopefully bring out some future NWSL stars. I can only hope that we are going to encourage and motivate other youth to join in on the NWSL and see more Utah faces."

Thoughts on April 14?

"I can't wait for the home opener. I do realize that the home opener is just the beginning. It will be the first time that the home crowd can see us play. In my mind, I just want to play a solid game and hopefully come away with a win, but also realize that is is a building block in the game. What we really want to win is a championship at the end of the year, so whatever our path is there, I hope we use our first home game as a way to build us up and build a strong squad that wins games."

Establishing team chemistry / cohesion:

"Building chemistry is the typical question of every season, whether it's a new team or not, it is all about getting the best chemistry out on the field, and that takes times. With a month long preseason, who knows what kind of chemistry we are going to have. We have our work cut out for us. I think we have a small advantage coming from Kansas City, and I think Laura has done a great job with the staff of putting everything together. Only time will tell."

MF DESIREE SCOTT

Playing under Laura?:

"I am super excited to play under Laura Harvey. I think she is one of the best coaches in the league, and I know I am going to learn a lot while under her belt. I think I am going to learn a lot of tactics and develop as a player. I think she allows us to have that freedom on the pitch."

Playing for the club?:

"From the few days that I have been here, it is been incredible — the fans have been incredible. We got to meet a lot of the fans at the Real Salt Lake game, and they have just been so excited to know that we are here, and I am pumped to get out on the pitch and show them what kind of soccer we are going to bring this season."

Thoughts on the Utah soccer community:

"I love interacting with the fans, so I am all about the energy and the good vibe. So I am all about a new team coming to the city and interacting with the fans and getting them excited about women's football being here."

Team chemistry establishment:

"It definitely takes time and takes patience, but it can also be exciting. We have a core group that is solid from Kansas City, but then are adding a few additions from across the league that are going to spice things up a little."

Thoughts on April 14?

"My family is going to be in the stands which is super exciting. I finally will get to play in that beautiful stadium — I know it will be an incredible match if the altitude doesn't kill me, but I am pumped."

M/F DIANA MATHESON

Playing under Laura?

"I am pretty excited because last year I signed with Seattle and never got to actually play for her. I love the way she sees the game and can't wait to play this season."

Playing for the new club:

"The welcome we have had in Utah, and the job that the club has done so far has been incredible. I think we feel the support that we have already before we ever step on the field. I think it's going to be a big honor and be pretty exciting when we step on the field for the season."

"Hopefully I can bring some exciting soccer games. I think we are going to be a pretty relatable team — people can come out and meet us and cheer us on. Hopefully our games are something else that people can do in the summer."

"I have been blown away with the Utah soccer community. Whether it's appearances or social media, or just being around town, everyone is so nice and so genuine. You can feel like the genuine excitement. We're just excited to be a part of the community. We want to do everything we can to get to know the fans, the supporters, and we would love to mingle with them as much as we can."

Team chemistry:

"It's definitely been an interesting situation with a bunch of us coming from Kansas City, but I think it gives us a core group of girls that has good chemistry. I think Laura has done a good job of putting together a team, and I think the players on the team are people that she's picked out. I think it all works — we are just going to keep moving forward with chemistry."

M/F ERIKA TYMRAK (cont'd)

Thoughts on April 14:

"I'm just excited to walk through that tunnel and be a part of the atmosphere. This'll be our first actual stadium to play in, and as a pro, you can't beat that. So we are all over buzzing over that and are probably overly-excited; on game days we're probably going to have to check our heart rates before the game. But there are so many good vibes going into it — everyone has such positive vibes, and that's all that matters."

DF BECCA MOROS

Playing under Laura:

"With one week before the season, I've been very focused on what Laura wants me to do, and how I fit into the team structure and tactics. We were missing a fair number of the players for a some time, so now I think some of that nitty gritty detail and analysis is going to come into how we play together — so I want to be cognizant of what my role is and how to help the team."

Playing for the club:

"One of the coolest things about this club is just how competitive it is from the top down. We're obviously extremely competitive on the field, however the management and staff is also very competitive — and wants to do more than just the status quo or what's expected — but turn over new stones and new opportunities. They want to raise the bar a little higher, not just for us, but for the league; not just soccer today, but for the future as well."

Thoughts on the Utah soccer community:

"We got to go to Carnival Real this past week, and there were tons of fans out there — people were really friendly, weren't afraid to ask us questions, or just tell us that they are here to support us. It was a warm welcome as our first introduction to the fan base and community. I think Utah has a healthy and robust soccer community, if not one of the fastest growing soccer cities in the country — there are a lot of people who are passionate about the game. I think it's been awesome for us to be here and a part of such a tight-knit soccer community."

Team chemistry establishment:

"There is a certain comfort that comes with having friends and teammates here, but the team is distinctly different from the team last year, and that comes because the coaching staff is different, the facilities are different, and difference in the landscape, but also half of the team is different — and that has given us a unique identity and a place to evolve. I think it has some of the same comfort, but a lot of the new excitement for being on a new club."

Thoughts on April 14 at RIoT

"I've heard nothing but amazing things about what that game's going to be like, what the stadium is going to look like, what our experience is going to be like, what it will be like for our families and the fans, and I am beyond excited to be in that stadium and have that crowd cheering us on."

DF SYDNEY MIRAMONTEZ

Playing under Laura:

"It has been incredible. To be honest, this is only the second time that I have ever played for a female coach, and to be able to be with a coach of her caliber and experience is an honor. She knows her stuff, she's very respected in this league and across the world, so I feel very lucky."

Playing for the club:

"It has also been incredible. The support we have gotten here in Utah has been indescribable. That puts a little bit of pressure on us because we want to put a product on the field that this organization will be proud of, but again, I feel very lucky to be here."

"What I've found since I've been here is the priority to developing youth soccer players — it's unmatched. I think there is so much coaching, and so much effort going into developing youth players who move on to play professionally or collegiately. Coming into that has been really inspiring and something that I want to help contribute to."

Team chemistry acceleration:

"Anytime you're coming into a new time, you have to figure out the new pieces. You have to figure out who we want to be as a team. But the underlying idea for this team is that we have a lot of passion and talent, and that we are excited to be part of an organization that is willing to give us off the field what we can provide on the field. I think that is on everybody's mind, and what everyone is working towards."

Thoughts on April 14 at Rio Tinto Stadium:

"It's going to be crazy! It's going to be a riot (chuckles)! I'm so excited. There definitely is going to be a lot of emotion, but I'm confident that this group is going to use that as motivation to kick butt."

MF KATIE BOWEN

Playing under Laura:

"I absolutely love her. I've found that she's a really positive coach, which I find refreshing because you sometimes get coaches that can be very critical, and it's not always constructive criticism. So far I am absolutely loving it and loving her guidance."

Playing for the club:

"It's been really cool. It's obviously incredibly professional, which is awesome. When I was in New Zealand I was seeing all the tweets and videos of the locker room and everything, so it kind of blow my mind it's surreal that we are treated equal to the men."

Thoughts on Utah:

"It was awesome to get to sign stuff and meet a lot of people that walked through and say that they've bought season tickets. All the fans were really positive and really happy in expressing that they're thankful that we are in Utah. It was good for me to see because I hadn't been exposed to the public yet."

"Hopefully I can get to do some coaching — that is something that I am looking to do. That will probably be my way of giving back. But I also want to give back in other ways, be a good role model, and get people out to the games."

Team chemistry build:

"It's been awesome. We've had people away, and people arriving on different days. The feedback I've received from others has been really good — the team is jelling very well. There are players here that have played together before, so we have that foundation. I think it's all about progressing from here, and finalizing, and focusing on Orlando and further on."

Thoughts on April 14 at RioT:

"My family will be in the stands, so I am incredibly excited. We were able to see the men's game, and just being at the stadium got us all incredibly hyped. Going out at half time was amazing. Hopefully we have a great atmosphere and a great game. We are taking on a great opponent, so I think it will be a good game of football — and then my birthday's the next day so I want it to be a good day."

FW ALEXA NEWFIELD

Playing under Laura:

"Playing under Laura has been awesome. She's the kind of coach that when she starts talking you want to listen — even if it's not to you or your role — you can always pick up on a learning tid-bit. It's been cool to see things as she sees them; there is definitely something to learn from her everyday in practice."

Playing for the club:

"It has been awesome as well. The event that we did on the weekend at the Carnival was packed and really cool to see the fans come out. Like I heard the support from everyone in the office, but to see the fans and have them tell you that they're excited was really cool."

Thoughts on Utah:

"I feel like it's definitely a huge community, and I was told prior to coming that Salt Lake City and Utah was a big into soccer. I think that we can contribute by getting some wins and keeping the community excited to get playing soccer. It's always fun to have a winning team that you can get behind, and makes you want to go play."

Team chemistry concerns:

"This was actually one of the first times where I actually felt that I knew the majority of the team, so it was different not to be one of the new people. I think everyone has gelled really well. I would like to think that there hasn't been a barrier between some of the Kansas City and new players — I think we know that we are a new team now, and the past is the past. What matters is that we're all together."

Thoughts on April 14 home opener:

"I'm really pumped. I can't wait to see it. I have images in my head of it, and I feel like I'm going to have a lot of energy that day."

MF BROOKE ELBY

Playing under Laura:

"The trainings have been amazing — super fast paced. It has been great getting to know all the girls and understanding her tactics. It's been interesting getting used to the altitude, but everything else has been high quality and high tempo."

Playing for the club:

"It's so cool to be part of something new. Obviously it's a huge step, not just for the city of Salt Lake, but for the league and women's soccer in general. To be a part of something that's so new and impactful is such an amazing feeling; you just feel like you already know you're doing something different and are paving that pathway to the future."

Thoughts on Utah:

"I'm super excited because, as I saw in our casual meet and greets, everyone else is just as excited as we are to get the season going. There are so many people that want to get involved and they make that apparent, like I've been in grocery stores and are coming up to me and are telling me that they're excited about it. So it's amazing how quickly the community has come together to form our fan base."

"I am looking forward to giving back in any way that I can. I've seen so many girl scouts, and I grew up being a girl scout, so it would be cool for me to get involved with them. I want to show that I can impact the community in a different way. There's the helping and serving the community, while playing on the field — and meshing that together."

Team chemistry acceleration:

"It's been surprisingly quick and easy to acclimate with everybody. I think that having a core group of girls that came from one team, but then throwing in some new girls into the mix adds a newness — or flavor. Now you have these different personalities that can jump in and already mesh with the core group. The Boston girls knew each other, the Kansas girls knew each other, so now we have to put it all together on the field."

Thoughts on April 14 at RioT:

"I'm so excited because my sister's never seen me play in a professional game, and she's going to be there. April 14 is just that moment where we get to put it all together and show everybody why we're here. We will get to show our fans why they should be believing in us, and just solidify what we're doing in this league, and how amazing we're going to be this season."

FW BRITTANY RATCLIFFE

Playing for Laura:

"I think Laura is an awesome coach. I absolutely love playing under her, and it's only been three weeks. She knows what she's doing, and as far as the organization, it's so professional — in fact, it's one of the most professional things I've been a part of. The owners, the coaches, the girls — everyone wants what is best for all, so it has been great to be a part of a team that really cares about being the best and doing the right thing."

Playing for new club:

"It's easy representing something that you really believe in, and I think we all really believe in this club and in what this club is trying to do for us and for women's soccer. It's been an honor represent this club and we're just getting started."

Thoughts on Utah soccer community:

"It was great to be at the Carnival because people were coming up to me and knew who I was. This one girl was telling me that she got season tickets for Christmas and a jersey for my birthday — and so it's awesome to be somewhere where they love the Royals and love soccer — it's contagious. It's awesome to be around, and we are all truly honored to be here in Utah, because from what we've seen, it's an awesome state."

Team chemistry build:

"I was one of the players that came from the Kansas City team, so for me it's been great knowing a majority of the players on the team. We still have a core of Kansas City girls, and I loved the team in Kansas we had great chemistry, so it's great to have that coming to Utah. And then as far as the new people, they have been awesome. I really feel that our team has been gelling and getting along great, and I hope that pays off on the field. We have great chemistry off the field, and so now we just have to keep working on our chemistry on the field."

Thoughts on April 14 at RioT:

"I'm really excited because it's a new team and the stadium is awesome. Everything we've been doing from the locker rooms to the promotions to the new team to the gear — like it's all building up. We still have two games before then, like our first season game is against Orlando, which is an important game, but our home opener is our first event at our home field. I'm really excited for it."

Arlitt, 24, was drafted by FC Kansas City in the 2016 NWSL College Draft. Arlitt enjoyed one of the most heralded careers as a defender in the history of the LSU soccer program, appearing in 89 matches with 87 starts. She finished her college campaign ranked third in school history for total appearances (89), and tied for second for career starts (87).

SCOUTING REPORT: "Arlitt was a good defender for FC Kansas City. Had a knee operation in August last year, in season, that she picked up during the off-season in Australia. Tried to rehab at Kansas City, didn't go great, and had to have another surgery in October ... is still recovering."

GK NICOLE BARNHART #18

Height: 5' 10" Birth Date: October 10, 1981 Birthplace: Pottstown, Pennsylvania College: Stanford

Barnhart, 36, comes to the Utah Royals FC with more than a decade of professional experience. With 54 caps with the United States Women's National team, and 108 starts for FC Kansas City, Barnhart comes to Salt Lake with two Olympic gold medals (2008, 2012) and a 2011 FIFA Women's World Cup runner-up. Up until 2017, Barnhart held the NWSL record for most consecutive "clean-sheets," going on a 10-game streak without allowing a goal. She was named the 2013 NWSL Goalkeeper of the Year, and would win an NWSL title in both 2014 and 2015 for FCKC, against Harvey and Seattle.

SCOUTING REPORT: "Barnie has been in the league since its start...she is a fantastic goalkeeper and ex U.S. national team goalkeeper...and a two-time gold medal winner. Obviously she is just coming back off of an ankle injury, but I have no doubt that when she's back, she will compete with Abby Smith ... she and Abby will be fighting for number one because it is super close ... She is a fantastic pro."

DF KATIE BOWEN #6

Height: 5' 7" Birth Date: April 15, 1994 Birthplace: Auckland, New Zealand College: North Carolina

Bowen, 23, is amongst the youngest players to represent New Zealand at an international level. She made her first appearance with the senior team in 2011 against Australia, also playing in the 2011 and 2014 FIFA Women's World Cup. She has since appeared in 37 matches for the New Zealand side, scoring one goal. In 2016, FC Kansas City selected Bowen in the NWSL College Draft, where she played in 34 games on the back line, scoring two goals.

SCOUTING REPORT: "Bowen is a New Zealand international that went to school at North Carolina, so she has been around and knows the U.S. system. She can play as a defender, a midfielder, and can actually play as a wide player — she is super flexible. Like a lot of UNC kids, Katie has the ability to play multiple positions ... can play the six, good on the ball, good awareness, good distribution."

DF RACHEL CORSIE #13

Height: 5' 9" Birth Date: August 17, 1989 Birthplace: Aberdeen, Scotland

Corsie, 28, comes to Salt Lake City with more than a decade of professional experience. As the captain of the Scotland WNT, Corsie has played in 94 games for the Scotland side, scoring 16 goals as a powerful centerback. Corsie also boasts five Scottish Women's League Cups (2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015), a Supporter's Player of the season (2014). Since making her NWSL debut in 2015 with the Seattle Reign, Corsie has played in 44 games in the NWSL, all under the guidance of Laura Harvey.

SCOUTING REPORT: "Corsie is a tried-and-tested Scottish international player...She played for Harvey in Seattle...and was looking for an opportunity outside of Seattle, and Utah happened to give her a call. We are lucky to have her ... typical British, no-nonsense defender who bullies opposing forwards and loves the tackle."

DF BROOKE ELBY #33

Height: 5' 4" Birth Date: May 24, 1993 Birthplace: Arcadia, California College: North Carolina

Elby, 24, was the Utah Royals FC's 23rd pick of the 2018 NWSL Dispersal Draft. Elby, who appeared in 13 matches during the NWSL 2017 season, logged over 800 minutes with the Boston Breakers. She made her professional career debut with Melbourne Victory on Ioan in Australia. Elby also had a successful career at the University of North Caroline Tar Heels, where she registered 73 games, with three career goals and seven assists.

SCOUTING REPORT: "Another UNC grad...she is one of the players that we picked up from Boston...She can play multiple positions. I think her best position is as an outside back, but she can play in the midfield and higher up the field ... versatile player, center mid or fullback, works hard ... agile."

MF KATRINA GORRY #19

Nickname: "Mini" Height: 5' 1" Birth Date: August, 13, 1992 Birthplace: Brisbane, Australia

Gorry, 24, is a current member of the Australian WNT with over 59 caps and 14 goals. Gorry was the 2014 Asia Football Confederation's Player of the Year, and the 2014 Australia Player of the year. Gorry clinched the 2014 NWSL title with FC Kansas City. The Matilda star also spent some time playing in Japan for Vegalta Sendai, where she earned 14 caps in 2017.

SCOUTING REPORT: "Katrina played for FC Kansas City in 2014, but left the league because she was super young and didn't think it was for her...but I spoke to her in the off-season and asked if she wanted to give it another go... she has improved tremendously since 2014...she has just grown into who she is now...She is a star for the Australian national team and has played great for the Brisbane Roar in the off-season...so I am really excited for her to get here."

MF GUNNHILDUR JONSDOTTIR #23

Nickname: "Gunny" Height: 5' 5" Birth Date: September 28, 1988 Birthplace: Garðabær, Iceland

Jonsdottir, 29, helped Iceland, one of the top 20 teams in the world, qualify for the 2013 Women's UEFA Cup Quarterfinals, and bagged crucial goals against Slovenia and Scotland in Women's UEFA 2016. As one of the top goalscorers in Iceland WNT history, and with 48 caps under her belt, Jonsdottir arrives in Utah with more than 200 club games played and nearly 50 caps for the Iceland National Team. Jonsdottir holds a national championship, winning the 2012 Iceland Women's Cup while starting for Stjarnan FC. She also was a member of the Norway Toppserien league's 2017 runner-up, Valerenga FC, reaching nearly 2,000 minutes, 21 games and five career goals in a single season.

SCOUTING REPORT: "Gunny is an Icelandic International that I came across through an ex player of mine that now plays at Seattle...I came to learn about Gunny and learned that she is just my type of player...she is a nut-case, funny player... I think she is going to be a league favorite because she has a personality that is infectious...watch out for her...she is a talented woman...has had a lot injuries, but now she is so athletic, so fit, and so strong, that she is in a really good place ... powerful and energetic with a motor that runs for days ... a true box-to-box midfielder."

FW MAEGAN KELLY #44

Height: 5' 7" Birth Date: February 19, 1992 Birthplace: Kansas City, Missouri College: Marquette

Kelly, 26, holds dual passports for both USA and Canada, and has recently been called into camps with the Canadian Women's National team. Kelly was drafted by FC Kansas City during the 2014 NWSL College Draft, but later transferred to UMF Stjarnan in Iceland. Kelly then moved to Finland to play in the Naisten Liga. Kelly returned to FC Kansas City in 2017 where she appeared in 22 games, netting five goals.

SCOUTING REPORT: "Kelly played for Kansas City last year and was a super sub for them...she scored so many goals...whenever she came on, she made a big impact...from that she got called up to the Canadian national team...played as a forward for Kansas City, but Canada actually recruited her as an outside back ..."

MF LO'EAU LABONTA #9

Nickname: "Lo" Height: 5' 2" Birth Date: March 18, 1993 Birthplace: Rancho Cucamonga, CA College: Stanford

LaBonta, 24, was a Stanford standout who played in almost 80 games for the Cardinals, and scored 22 goals during her four-year college campaign. She was drafted by Sky Blue FC in the 2015 NWSL College draft, where she made six appearances for the club. LaBonta earned a starting position in the NWSL after signing with FC Kansas City in May 2016, where she appeared in 33 games, and scored 2 goals.

SCOUTING REPORT: "Went to Stanford, and then got drafted to Sky Blue afterwards...Coaching Lo'eau has showed me that she's clever, she's got a brain... she's obviously not tall, but she uses her attributes well...she can get on the ball and wants to try and possess, which is exactly what I want in a player...I have been super happy with how she has developed through the preseason ... very fit and on rhythm coming off of Australian season ..."

MF MANDY LADDISH #7

Height: 5' 7" Birth Date: November 3, 1991 Birthplace: Lee's Summit, Missouri College: Notre Dame

Laddish, 26, a midfielder who has won a FIFA U20 Women's World Cup and a U20 CONCACAF women's championship. Laddish also played every single game of her college career at Notre Dame, registering six goals. Laddish was drafted to FC Kansas City in 2014.

SCOUTING REPORT: "She's another player with a tough injury history...was injured all last season for Kansas City and is currently still struggling with the same injury...She is a super talented player...I am really gunning for her because she will be a huge asset for this team when she's fit...So now we are doing everything we possibly can to make that happen ... very technical player, smooth on the ball, good at getting out of tight spaces ..."

MF TAYLOR LYTLE #12

Height: 5' 2" Birth Date: March 31, 1989 Birthplace: Las Cruces, New Mexico College: Texas Tech

Lytle, 28, is a midfielder who signed as a discovery player with Sky Blue FC in 2013, where she appeared in 21 of Sky Blue FC's 22 season games. Lytle was also a member of the USWNT U-23 Four Nations Tournament in Spain, where she scored one goal. Lytle attended Texas Tech University where she scored 14 goals and registered 27 assists — setting a school assist record.

SCOUTING REPORT: "Taylor is a wide player that is super clever. She comes in off the line and tries to find pockets of space to play in...she tends to never give the ball away, which is exactly what I want...her and Kelley work really well together on the same side of the field, and have actually played together for years, so they know exactly what the other will be doing...excited for her and happy that we got her in the trade with Kelley ... shifty player, quick and agile, good touch and well-rounded player."

MF DIANA MATHESON #10

Height: 5' 0" Birth Date: April 6, 1984 Birthplace: Mississauga, Ontario, Canada College: Princeton

Matheson, 33, A key player for the Canadian Women's side, Matheson totals 169 caps for the senior team, scoring 16 goals in international tournaments. Best known for scoring the bronze medal-winning goal for Canada in the 92nd minute against France at the 2012 Olympics, Matheson has scored 23 goals in the NWSL since 2013. Matheson also won gold in the 2011 Pan American Games, and a bronze in the 2016 Rio Olympics.

SCOUTING REPORT: "Another Canadian international that played for me in Seattle, but never actually played because she tore her ACL...knowing what she had been through and what she has done and where she was physically, I know that this is the year that she is going to prove to everyone that she was back...she's got numerous caps for the Canadian national team...and when she is fit, she scores goals in this league...so she is someone we felt that we needed to get in...when she is on the field, she can impact ... veteran presence, very slippery, holds onto ball, strong for her size, makes good decisions."

DF SYDNEY MIRAMONTEZ #17

Height: 5' 7" Birth Date: October 11, 1994 Birthplace: Lenexa, Kansas College: Nebraska

Miramontez, 23, is a defender who signed with FC Kansas City in 2017, where she played in five matches. Later that year, Miramontez was invited to participate in the USWNT U-23's National training camp. Miramontez had a successful career with the University of Nebraska where she started in 48 of her 75 appearances, and scored six goals.

SCOUTING REPORT: "It was her first season in the league last year for Kansas...I coached the U.S. U-23 team last January, and she was a stand-out to me...I thought she has been excellent...she has done really well in preseason and having her, Rachel, and Becky Sauerbrunn as your three stand-out center backs is not a bad collection of center back to pick from ... amazing at playing long balls out of back, very accurate ... reads game quite well defensively ... future starter at centerback."

DF BECCA MOROS #3

Height: 5' 5" Birth Date: May 6, 1985 Birthplace: New York City, New York College: Duke

Moros, 32, has played in the professional game since her drafting in the 2009 WPS College Draft by the Washington Freedom. In 2011, Moros was traded to the New York Flash, where she appeared in 10 games and helped the team win the WPS Women's Soccer Playoffs. Moros was traded to FC Kansas City in 2015, where she helped the team win the 2015 NWSL cup.

SCOUTING REPORT: "She can play multiple positions...predominately an outside back...she was at Kansas City for a couple of year, but prior to playing in the NWSL, she played in Japan for a couple of seasons...and playing in Japan allowed her to play a possession oriented style that seems very natural for her now ,... veteran with quick feet, experienced, good pro."

MF ALEXA NEWFIELD #88

Height: 5' 3" Birth Date: December 3, 1991 Birthplace: Atlanta, Georgia College: North Carolina

Newfield, 26, was drafted by FC Kansas City in the 2016 NWSL College Draft, where she made eight appearances and two starts in her debut season. Newfield has over 38 goals registered during her college career with the Georgia Bulldogs and North Carolina Tarheels. Newfield scored her first goal in the pros in 2017 — a game winner — against the Washington Spirit.

SCOUTING REPORT: "Alexa is another UNC grad who can play multiple positions and is very hard working...another super sub that I think can come off the bench and make impact ... very good at long-range shooting, can play multiple spots in midfield, comfortable with both feet."

DF KELLEY O'HARA #5

Height: 5' 5" Birth Date: August 4, 1988 Birthplace: Fayetteville, Georgia College: Stanford

O'Hara, 29, was traded in 2017 from Sky Blue FC, where she appeared in 75 games, scoring 15 goals. A versatile player, O'Hara has played as both an attacking and defensive player in the NWSL and for the USWNT. With over 100 caps for team USA, O'Hara boasts a 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup gold medal, and a 2011 FIFA Women's World Cup runnerup. O'Hara also won an olympic gold medal in 2012, and was a Herman Trophy winner in 2009 with the Stanford Cardinals.

SCOUTING REPORT: "We traded for Kelley from Sky Blue...I've always thought that she was a player that could play a lot of positions, and the national team did that with her...and she has gotten a lot of time...but I think in the last couple of years she has become a sure outside back on the U.S. team...she is a fantastic trainer and winner...that is the best thing I can say about Kelley is that she wants to win everything from the stupidest game in training to the eleven aside at the end of training...I think her grit and determination is something that is needed in this group...she has impacted well."

FW BRITTANY RATCLIFFE #25

Height: 5' 4" Birth Date: February 7, 1994 Birthplace: Monroe Township, New Jersey College: Virginia

Newfield, 26, was a star at the University of Virginia where she played in almost every college game of her career, scoring 24 goals. Ratcliffe was drafted by the Boston Breakers in the 2016 NWSL College Draft, where she made 15 appearances and two goals in her first year. In 2017, Ratcliffe made the move to the 2014/2015 NWSL cup champions, FC Kansas City, where she appeared in 22 games, and scored one goal.

SCOUTING REPORT: "I see her as a nine, or a wide player...she came from Virginia and played for Kansas City for a couple of years...she is super quick and can get in behind teams...she scored against UCLA in preseason...she offers good pressure and I am happy with her progress ... quick, hard-working, high-press and wants ball back on recovery."

FW AMY RODRIGUEZ #8

Nickname: "A-Rod" Height: 5' 4" Birth Date: February 17, 1987 Birthplace: Lake Forest, California College: USC

Rodriguez, 31, has over 100 caps with the USWNT, and is a two-time Olympic Gold Medalist. Rodriguez also boasts a 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup championship and 3x Algarve Cup winner. Rodriguez also scored the game winning goals to win the 2014 and 2015 NWSL Cup Champion. In 2009, Rodriguez was the number one pick in the WPS College Draft.

SCOUTING REPORT: "Amy is coming back off an ACL injury...is the mother of two...she was my nemesis when I was in Seattle because I traded her away during my first year in Seattle—which is the worst trade in the history of soccer—because she ended up scoring the championship goal against me two years running...so I hope that she does the same this year for me...I am really excited for A-Rod to get back and be healthy ... leader, lethal finisher, scores goals..."

DF BECKY SAUERBRUNN #4

Nickname: "Broon" Height: 5' 7" Birth Date: June 6, 1985 Birthplace: St. Louis, Missouri College: Virginia

Sauerbrunn, 32, is best known as the co-captain of the USWNT team, with over 100 caps for team USA. Sauerbrunn olympic gold at the 2012 London olympics, and a gold medal at the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup, and was a runner-up at the 2011 FIFA Women's World Cup in Germany. Sauerbrunn also led FC Kansas City to back-to-back NWSL cup championships in 2014 and 2015. A product of Virginia, Sauerbrunn was a three-time All-American in college.

SCOUTING REPORT: "She has been voted the defender of the year three out of the five years...Becky is like Ronseal...like you put as a varnish on your wood, and it keeps the wood from getting wet, and you know exactly what you're going to get...Becky Sauerbrunn is Ronseal...You know exactly what you are going to get...she is a great defender ... leader, reads the game well, never out of position."

MF DESIREE SCOTT #11

Nickname: "The Destroyer" Height: 5' 2" Birth Date: July 31, 1987 Birthplace: Winnipeg, Canada College: Manitoba

Scott, 30, is a midfielder for the Canadian Women's National team, owning two olympic bronze medals. While representing Canada, Scott won a Cyprus Women's Cup, a CONCACAF championship, and Pan-American gold medal. Prior to coming to the Utah Royals FC, Scott played for FC Kansas City in the midfield.

SCOUTING REPORT: "Scott is known as the destroyer because she just sits in front of the backline and smashes people...she has a very significant job on our time and to smash other team's players...she is a Canadian international that has been in the league for a couple of years...she played with Kansas in the first year and then left to play in England for two seasons and then came back...she is a very good footballer...she knows what her role is, and knows that her job is to smash people and give the ball to other players...she is like the glue to any team...you always need a Desiree on your team."

GK ABBY SMITH #1

Height: 5' 9" Birth Date: October 4, 1993 Birthplace: Portland, Oregon College: Texas

Smith, 24, was picked fifth in the 2016 NWSL College Draft, by the Boston Breakers, where she made 21 appearances. Smith also wore the US crest for several years as a member of the U-17, U-20, and U-23 teams, and was rostered on the senior side in May 2017 for friendlies against Sweden and Norway. A Plano native, she earned over 72 caps for the Texas Longhorns, where she finished her college career ranked first in the Big 12 Conference for 96 total saves, with a 5.33 saves-per-match. Her 30th career shutout in 2015 set a new school career shut out record.

SCOUTING REPORT: "We got Abby from Boston...I think that if she plays well this year that she will find herself in the national team and in the World Cup...We just have to give her the platform to do that ... athletic 'keeper, well-rounded, good distribution out of the back."

FW KATIE STENGEL #24

Height: 5' 9" Birth Date: February 29, 1992 Birthplace: Viera, Florida College: Wake Forest

Stengel, 25, was selected as the 14th pick of the 2018 NWSL Dispersal Draft. Stengel is another attacking presence who is coming to Salt Lake with 16 goals, including 7 goals with the USWNT youth teams. A 2012 FIFA Women's U20 World Cup champion, Stengel began her professional career in 2014 with the former USL W-league's Angeles Blues. She then joined the female Bundesliga side for Bayern Munich, where she appeared in 20 matches, scoring 9 goals, and winning the league title.

SCOUTING REPORT: "Stengel is a classic, target number nine, that has played for multiple teams in the league and Bayern Munich in Germany...She can score goals in this league...We have been working with her to be a little less active until she gets around goal because she can score goals...she just works so hard ... true hold-up no. 9, likes to link up, good finisher inside box."

FW ELISE THORSNES #20

Pronounced: "TORSE – ness" Nickname: "Thor" Height: 5' 8" Birth Date: August 14, 1988 Birthplace: Leikanger, Norway

Thorsnes, 29, plays as a forward for the Norway WNT, totaling 110 caps, and 17 goals. Thorsnes played in every single game of the 2008 Beijing Olympics, and in the 2009 European Championships. She was also the Toppserien Golden Boot Winner in 2011 and 2013. Thorsnes comes to Salt Lake with three Toppserien championships, four Norweigan cup victories, and three Toppserien Golden Boots.

SCOUTING REPORT: "We call her Thor...scored one of the best goals I have ever seen in training...she is very good...I have seen her play multiple times...and she is so good and can play in so many positions...she can play outside back...she played defense against the U.S. pretty much a year ago in Norway, and she was the best player on the field...she is an accomplished soccer player...I've got high hopes for her...It's always hard for internationals to come into America and get used to how crazy this league is...like my first ever game in the NWSL, I felt it was like a UFC fight...she is probably going to have to get used to that for a little bit, but I am excited for her."

MF ERIKA TYMRAK #15

Height: 5' 6" Birth Date: August 7, 1991 Birthplace: Detroit, Michigan College: Florida

Tymrak, 26, was a two-time All-American for Florida before being drafted to FC Kansas City in the 2013 NWSL College Draft. Tymrak was named the 2013 NWSL Rookie of the year, and received her first call up to the USWNT side in 2013 in a friendly against Mexico. Tymrak played in the midfield for FC Kansas City, helping the team win two back-to-back NWSL cup championships in 2014 and 2015.

SCOUTING REPORT: "Tymrak has been at Kansas City since 2013, and was actually the rookie of the league in her first season...she is someone that has a big year ahead of her...she is looking to step up her level...but she has been working really hard in preseason, and I'm actually really excited for the season that she potentially could have ... used to be a ballet dancer, which is why she is so smooth in her movements ... tricky, technical player ...

CLUB OVERVIEW - 2018:

Real Salt Lake kicks off its 14th Major League Soccer season in 2018, the Utah side buoyed by a passionate fan base boasting nearly 15,000 season ticket holders and an engaged corporate community, achieving local relevance envied by many in the North American professional sports scene. RSL kicks off its ninth full campaign on March 10 at its Rio Tinto Stadium home in Sandy, where the "Claret-and-Cobalt" has enjoyed a most pronounced home-field advantage in Major League Soccer, entering this year posting an impressive 106-26-44 mark in the building since its inaugural game back on October 9, 2008.

New RSL Head Coach **Mike Petke** - now the fourth in the club's history - makes the selections for what is perhaps the deepest roster in RSL annals, welcoming back several key returning players on a roster also bolstered by new faces in the form of both veteran professionals and young Academy products.

After posting an 8-3-4 record over the final 15 matches of last season, Real Salt Lake was among the top teams in Major League Soccer after July 4, accruing the fourth-most points in that span. Long-time Captain **Kyle Beckerman** and MLS goalkeeping icon **Nick Rimando** both return for their 12th seasons with Real Salt Lake, surrounded by a slew of rising talents and veteran mainstays. That group includes the club's 2017 MVP and Golden Boot-winning playmaker **Albert Rusnák**, along with imposing center back **Marcelo Silva** and dynamic winger **Jefferson Savarino**, each of whom joined the squad a year ago, making big impacts in their first MLS seasons. The addition of forward **Alfredo Ortuño** bolsters an attack that saw four players score seven goals last season (Rusnák, Yura Movsisyan, **Joao Plata** and **Luis Silva**).

Additional veteran returnees include defenders **Tony Beltran** (out until at least August due to a knee injury suffered at Colorado last Oct. 15), **Demar Phillips** and **David Horst**, midfielders **Luke Mulholland** and **Sunday Stephen**, along with Homegrown talents **Jose Hernandez** and **Jordan Allen**. 2017 USL Regular Season Championship Shield winners in goalkeeper **Connor Sparrow**, defender **Taylor Peay** and midfielder **Nick Besler** also earned first-team contracts over the last seven months based on their Real Monarchs success.

The club continued to dip into its ever-expanding list of Academy products who have gone on to professional contracts with the additions of 2017 FIFA U-20 World Cup DF **Aaron Herrera** and three-time NCAA champion FW **Corey Baird**. In addition, the back line added Americans with European experience in **Adam Henley** and **Shawn Berry** to a veteran core. In the midfield, an accomplished young dual-national Argentine/Chilean teenager named **Pablo Ruiz** arrives in 2018, as does Croatian midfielder **Damir Kreilach**, former co-Captain of Union Berlin (2.Bundesliga).

In search of hardware, RSL seeks to return to the MLS Cup Playoffs for the first time since 2016 this season, after a remarkable seven-year run from 2008-14 that placed RSL among MLS elite (only LA Galaxy and Seattle Sounders accrued more points in that span). RSL's 13-year MLS history includes an **MLS Cup 2009 title**, the state of Utah's only major professional championship in the last 40 years. Recent campaigns have seen RSL advance to another MLS Cup title game, losing in 2013 via a penalty-kick shootout in Kansas City, where the 2015 squad also dropped a Semifinal match in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup. RSL lost an Open Cup Final at home in 2013, the one-goal loss to D.C. United a bitter reminder of the Club's groundbreaking (and ultimately heartbreaking) run to the CONCACAF Champions League Final in 2011, when RSL became the first-ever - and still only - U.S. side to progress within one goal of the FIFA Club World Cup.

REAL SALT LAKE (MLS) / UTAH ROYALS FC (NWSL) / REAL MONARCHS (USL)

In 2015, RSL expanded its development pyramid with the addition of Real Monarchs SLC, one of several MLSoperated expansion clubs in the now 33-team USL. Former Head Coach **Freddy Juarez** - now an assistant with the first team - had enjoyed success developing homegrown players at the RSL-Arizona Academy in Casa Grande, Ariz., prior to moving to the professional ranks. For 2018, the Monarchs will call the newly-constructed Zions Bank Stadium in Herriman, Utah, home, opening on Sat., March 31 against Portland Timbers 2. Head Coach **Mark Briggs** the reigning USL Coach of the Year based on his success after taking over for Petke last April - returns several key pieces for 2018, including USL MVP Finalist and Golden Boot runner-up **Chandler Hoffman**, dynamic playmaker **Sebastian Velasquez**, and midfield engine **Charlie Adams**.

In August of 2017, Real Salt Lake's vaunted Arizona-based Academy moved north to the Club's primary training center in Herriman, Utah, approximately 20 minutes southwest of Rio Tinto Stadium. The \$78 million facility will now serve as the Club's cornerstone, its daily training home opening in 2018 for both of the club's men's professional teams - Real Salt Lake (MLS) and Real Monarchs (USL) - while centralizing the club's U-19, U-17 and future U-15 development academy youth selections. The Herriman facility also provides adjacencies for an on-site charter school with STEM disciplines (Science/Technology/Engineering/Math) for nearly 300 local boys and girls.

Led by Martin Vasquez - who played 17 years professionally in both the U.S. and Mexico before coaching with LA Galaxy, Chivas USA, Bayern Munich and the U.S. National Team - RSL's Academy setup looks to continue its perennial U.S. Soccer Development Academy success integrating with the club's professional sides. Under his guidance, Vasquez and the RSL Academy have developed a setup that has produced professionals year-after-year for seven years, laying the groundwork for a system that has produced 15 homegrowns for RSL since 2011. The January signing of 3-time Stanford national champion Corey Baird brings RSL's list of Academy products on the current roster to eight, joining DF Danilo Acosta, FW Jordan Allen, DF Justen Glad, MF Jose Hernandez, DF Aaron Herrera, FW Brooks Lennon and MF Sebastian "Bofo" Saucedo. Other past Homegrown signings include Nico Muniz, Donny Toia, Lalo Fernandez, Benji Lopez, Phanuel Kavita, Fito Ovalle and Ricardo Velazco, while former RSL DF Carlos Salcedo was signed to a standard MLS contract.

Since coming to RSL at the beginning of last season as head coach of the Real Monarchs, Petke was stricken with the opportunity to work with someone of Vasquez's background. Now as RSL's boss, he works in lock-step with Vasquez as the two draw up the blueprints to the future of Real Salt Lake.

"He's been at the highest level as a player and a coach. How we're able to have somebody like this at our academy blows my mind. But I'm extremely excited about it," Petke said. "He just has a deep knowledge of the game. And he has that temperament of dealing with kids coming up through the ranks. His knowledge of tactics is spot on. It coincides with how I like to play and how we want to play. And he is able to get the most out of these kids psychologically, physically and tactically. My hat's off to him. I love working with him."

Last December in North Logan, Utah, RSL Owner **Dell Loy Hansen** ceremoniously opened the first of eight planned "regional training centers" across Utah and Arizona to be built in the next two years. Each \$5-6 million RTC houses a classroom, as well as an indoor and outdoor field, dedicated to fulfilling a curriculum based on the club's vision and mission for youth soccer training and education, and the continued development of both recreational and competitive pre-Academy (ages 7-14) initiatives across the InterMountain West.

In January, RSL announced that it would extend its youth development presence in Arizona, as Sereno Soccer Club merged with Legacy Soccer Club under the Claret-and-Cobalt umbrella, with more than 7,000 boys and girls between the ages of 4-18 now composing a Phoenix-based "RSL Arizona" setup. The partnership allows Real Salt Lake to continue its Arizona-based cultivation of talent, as Sereno has long been one of the premier youth soccer clubs in the United States and the top club in Arizona. During its nearly four decades of history, Sereno accounts for over 150 Arizona State Championships, 12 Regional Championships, four National Finalists and 2 National Championships.

The newly-combined RSL-Arizona has developed more than 30 professional players in the men's and women's games' highest levels, while boasting more than 70 players who have represented 14 countries at the youth or senior level amongst its alumni base. Notable Sereno products with ties to Real Salt Lake include current RSL FW **Brooks** Lennon, Real Monarchs SLC Assistant Coach Danny Cruz and former players such as Robbie Findley. Current and former U.S. Women's National Team icons hailing from the Arizona development juggernaut include Julie Ertz and Sydney Leroux, among others.

In 2016, the **RSL Foundation** was established, created with the goals of being active in the community year-round, utilizing the popularity and reach of RSL and the Monarchs in promoting health and wellness for children throughout the region, engaging supporters of soccer to raise funds and volunteer time for various local initiatives. Projects undertaken by and supported with Foundation resources include the Club's "Unified Team" with Utah Special Olympics, state-wide field restorations, referee training and community service.

New for 2018, the RSL pyramid welcomes the highest level of professional women's soccer in the world, as the NWSL Utah Royals FC now call Rio Tinto Stadium home. Led by revered boss Laura Harvey, the most successful head coach in the previous five NWSL seasons, Utah Royals FC boasts several international-caliber players on its inaugural roster - led by U.S.A. women Becky Sauerbrunn, the current Captain of the U.S. Women's National Team, and fellow USA standouts Kelley O'Hara and Amy Rodriguez - as well as Canadian National Team stars Desiree Scott and Diana Matheson, along with Maegan Kelly. Utah's 11 internationals representing 7 countries also include: Katrina Gorry (Australia), Katie Bowen (New Zealand), Gunny Jonsdottir (Iceland), Elise Thorsnes (Norway) and Rachel Corsie (Scotland).

CLUB OVERVIEW - 2018:

Real Salt Lake will soon kick off its 14th Major League Soccer season in 2018, the Utah side buoyed by a passionate fan base boasting nearly 15,000 season ticket holders and an engaged corporate community, achieving local relevance envied by many in the North American professional sports scene. RSL kicks off its ninth full campaign on March 10 at its Rio Tinto Stadium home in Sandy, where the "Claret-and-Cobalt" has enjoyed a most pronounced home-field advantage in Major League Soccer, entering this year posting an impressive 106-26-44 mark in the building since its inaugural game back on October 9, 2008.

New RSL Head Coach **Mike Petke** - now the fourth in the club's history - makes the selections for what is perhaps the deepest roster in RSL annals, welcoming back several key returning players on a roster also bolstered by new faces in the form of both veteran professionals and young Academy products.

After posting an 8-3-4 record over the final 15 matches of last season, Real Salt Lake was among the top teams in Major League Soccer after July 4, accruing the fourth-most points in that span. Long-time Captain **Kyle Beckerman** and MLS goalkeeping icon **Nick Rimando** both return for their 12th seasons with Real Salt Lake, surrounded by a slew of rising talents and veteran mainstays. That group includes the club's 2017 MVP and Golden Boot-winning playmaker **Albert Rusnák**, along with imposing center back **Marcelo Silva** and dynamic winger **Jefferson Savarino**, each of whom joined the squad a year ago, making big impacts in their first MLS seasons. The addition of forward **Alfredo Ortuño** bolsters an attack that saw four players score seven goals last season (Rusnák, Yura Movsisyan, **Joao Plata** and **Luis Silva**).

Additional veteran returnees include defenders **Tony Beltran** (out until at least August due to a knee injury suffered at Colorado last Oct. 15), **Demar Phillips** and **David Horst**, midfielders **Luke Mulholland** and **Sunday Stephen**, along with Homegrown talents **Jose Hernandez** and **Jordan Allen**. 2017 USL Regular Season Championship Shield winners in goalkeeper **Connor Sparrow**, defender **Taylor Peay** and midfielder **Nick Besler** also earned first-team contracts over the last seven months based on their Real Monarchs success.

The club continued to dip into its ever-expanding list of Academy products who have gone on to professional contracts with the additions of 2017 FIFA U-20 World Cup DF **Aaron Herrera** and three-time NCAA champion FW **Corey Baird**. In addition, the back line added Americans with European experience in **Adam Henley** and **Shawn Berry** to a veteran core. In the midfield, an accomplished young dual-national Argentine/Chilean teenager named **Pablo Ruiz** arrives in 2018, as does Croatian midfielder **Damir Kreilach**, former co-Captain of Union Berlin (2.Bundesliga).

In search of hardware, RSL seeks to return to the MLS Cup Playoffs for the first time since 2016 this season, after a remarkable seven-year run from 2008-14 that placed RSL among MLS elite (only LA Galaxy and Seattle Sounders accrued more points in that span). RSL's 13-year MLS history includes an **MLS Cup 2009 title**, the state of Utah's only major professional championship in the last 40 years. Recent campaigns have seen RSL advance to another MLS Cup title game, losing in 2013 via a penalty-kick shootout in Kansas City, where the 2015 squad also dropped a Semifinal match in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup. RSL lost an Open Cup Final at home in 2013, the one-goal loss to D.C. United a bitter reminder of the Club's groundbreaking (and ultimately heartbreaking) run to the CONCACAF Champions League Final in 2011, when RSL became the first-ever – and still only – U.S. side to progress within one goal of the FIFA Club World Cup.

In 2015, RSL expanded its development pyramid with the addition of Real Monarchs SLC, one of several MLSoperated expansion clubs in the now 33-team USL. Former Head Coach **Freddy Juarez** - now an assistant with the first team - had enjoyed success developing homegrown players at the RSL-Arizona Academy in Casa Grande, Ariz., prior to moving to the professional ranks. For 2018, the Monarchs will call the newly-constructed Zions Bank Stadium in Herriman, Utah, home, opening on Sat., March 31 against Portland Timbers 2. Head Coach **Mark Briggs** the reigning USL Coach of the Year based on his success after taking over for Petke last April - returns several key pieces for 2018, including USL MVP Finalist and Golden Boot runner-up **Chandler Hoffman**, dynamic playmaker **Sebastian Velasquez**, and midfield engine **Charlie Adams**.

In August of 2017, Real Salt Lake's vaunted Arizona-based Academy moved north to the Club's primary training center in Herriman, Utah, approximately 20 minutes southwest of Rio Tinto Stadium. The \$78 million facility will now serve as the Club's cornerstone, its daily training home opening in 2018 for both of the club's men's professional teams - Real Salt Lake (MLS) and Real Monarchs (USL) - while centralizing the club's U-19, U-17 and future U-15 development academy youth selections. The Herriman facility also provides adjacencies for an on-site charter school with STEM disciplines (Science/Technology/Engineering/Math) for nearly 300 local boys and girls.

Led by Martin Vasquez - who played 17 years professionally in both the U.S. and Mexico before coaching with LA Galaxy, Chivas USA, Bayern Munich and the U.S. National Team - RSL's Academy setup looks to continue its perennial U.S. Soccer Development Academy success integrating with the club's professional sides. Under his guidance, Vasquez and the RSL Academy have developed a setup that has produced professionals year-after-year for seven years, laying the groundwork for a system that has produced 15 homegrowns for RSL since 2011. The January signing of 3-time Stanford national champion Corey Baird brings RSL's list of Academy products on the current roster to eight, joining DF Danilo Acosta, FW Jordan Allen, DF Justen Glad, MF Jose Hernandez, DF Aaron Herrera, FW Brooks Lennon and MF Sebastian "Bofo" Saucedo. Other past Homegrown signings include Nico Muniz, Donny Toia, Lalo Fernandez, Benji Lopez, Phanuel Kavita, Fito Ovalle and Ricardo Velazco, while former RSL DF Carlos Salcedo was signed to a standard MLS contract.

Since coming to RSL at the beginning of last season as head coach of the Real Monarchs, Petke was stricken with the opportunity to work with someone of Vasquez's background. Now as RSL's boss, he works in lock-step with Vasquez as the two draw up the blueprints to the future of Real Salt Lake.

"He's been at the highest level as a player and a coach. How we're able to have somebody like this at our academy blows my mind. But I'm extremely excited about it," Petke said. Utah's 10 internationals also include Katrina Gorry (Australia), Katie Bowen (New Zealand), Gunny Jonsdottir (Iceland) and Elise Thorsnes (Norway).

HOUSTON DASH HOST UTAH ROYALS FC IN FIRST MEETING BETWEEN BOTH CLUBS



The Houston Dash host the newest franchise in the league on Friday as Utah Royals FC visit BBVA Compass for the first time.

Houston looks to build on an opening day draw with the Chicago Red Stars last Sunday. It was the first game under head coach Vera Pauw, and rookie forward Kimberly Keever scored on her debut. The second-round draft pick was one of four rookies who earned their first start on Sunday. In total, seven players made their debuts with the club, which reflected the substantial turnover in the offseason.

The backline featured several familiar faces as goalkeeper Jane Campbell anchored a defense that included team captain Amber Brooks, two internationals in Rachel Daly and Janine Van Wyk, and Kristie Mewis, who made her first start at outside back for the club.

Orlando's Marta converted a penalty kick later in the first half which prevented Utah from earning their first victory of the season.

The core of Utah's roster played for FC Kansas City last season, including U.S. Women's National Team co-captain Becky Sauerbrunn, USWNT defender Kelly O'Hara, and Canadian midfielders Diana Matheson and Desiree Scott. This will be the first of three meetings this year as Houston visits Rio Tinto Stadium on May 19 and Utah returns to the Bayou City on Aug. 5.

DASH OPEN 2018 REGULAR SEASON WITH 1-1 DRAW WITH CHICAGO



The Houston Dash opened the 2018 NWSL regular season with a 1-1 draw with the Chicago Red Stars this afternoon at BBVA Compass Stadium.

Kimberly Keever, one of three first-year players to start for Houston, scored her first goal as a professional in the 37th minute after she slid toward a low cross from Savannah Jordan at the near post to score Houston's lone goal of the game.

Chicago salvaged a draw when Danielle Colaprico's corner kick found Taylor Comeau in the first minute of second half stoppage time.

Jordan was inches away from her own goal in the 21st minute after her effort went wide of the far post. Veronica Latsko won the ball outside the box, found Linda Motlhalo who found Jordan in stride for Houston's first scoring opportunity of the game.

Meleana Shim forced a save after her free kick went straight to goal, but Red Stars goalkeeper Alyssa Naeher was well positioned to handle her shot.

Houston almost doubled their lead minutes into the second half as Shim found Latsko unmarked inside the box, but her effort was blocked by Naeher who closed down quickly on the rookie.

Houston's fast start to the second half continued in the 50th minute after Rachel Daly's effort from outside the box was redirected by Nichelle Prince, but her effort went wide of the near post.

CAMPBELL NAMED TO USWNT ROSTER FOR APRIL FRIENDLIES

Jane Campbell was named to the U.S. Women's National Team roster for two friendlies in April, U.S. Soccer announced today.

The USWNT will face Mexico in a two-game series that begins in Jacksonville, Florida on April 5. Campbell and the reigning FIFA World Cup Champions travel to Houston on April 7 for the final game of the series at BBVA Compass Stadium.

The goalkeeper earned her first senior cap with the national team last April at BBVA Compass Stadium as the USWNT defeated Russia 5-1. The 22-yearold earned her second senior cap in the USWNT's 6-0 victory over South Korea last October as a second-half substitute. Campbell finished her rookie season with the Dash with three shutouts and 65 saves over 16 games, the most since the club's inaugural season.

Houston Dash defender Rachel Daly was named to the England Women's National Team roster for a pair of upcoming FIFA Women's World Cup Qualifying matches, the English Football Association announced earlier today.

England, currently ranked second in FIFA's most recent world rankings, will face Wales on April 6 in Southampton and will travel to Bosnia and Herzegovina on April 10 as they look to qualify for their fourth consecutive Women's World Cup.

Daly has earned nine caps for the Lionesses, including two appearances in the SheBelieves Cup earlier this year. She earned her first senior cap on June 4, 2014 against Serbia, scoring on her international debut in a 7-0 England victory.

Daly started at right back for the Dash in their 2018 NWSL season opener on Sunday afternoon, providing cover in defense and pushing into the attack along the right flank as the Dash drew Chicago 1-1 to kick off the season.

HOW CHEETAHS INSPIRE THE 2018 DASH

The Houston Dash took the field of BBVA Compass Stadium on Tuesday morning for training in advance of Sunday's season opener against the Chicago Red Stars (4 p.m., TICKETS) only to find a special guest from the Houston Zoo, Kito, getting his own workout in on the field.

Kito is a 10-year-old male cheetah, invited by head coach Vera Pauw to exercise at BBVA Compass Stadium prior to training as an example for her squad for how she wants to set up her tactics and gameplan going into her first season in charge.

"The cheetah stands for a set of characteristics that we are looking to have," Pauw told reporters during the team's media day. "They only run when they have to run; they're not just running around or fooling around. It is a very disciplined animal because they can only run [full speed] for maybe 30 seconds, and then they have to sleep for 18 hours."

The approach – minus the 18 hours of sleep – is one that Pauw hopes will distinguish the Dash within the NWSL and take advantage of the heat during the Houston summer. Let the other team run and wear themselves out, then strike with devastating quickness.

"We should not just run for the sake of running – which was happening a lot and it is happening a lot in the league. We have to be very efficient," Pauw explained. "Soccer is an explosive sport, and it's related to sprint and explosive actions. We brought [Kito] in as a symbol for our style of play."

Disciplined runs aren't the only similarities between the cheetahs and the Dash. Kito and his brother, Kiburi, utilize the practice fields at Houston Sports Park to open their legs and run sprints, and one of the younger cheetahs at the Houston Zoo is even named Dash.

Pauw uses the example of the cheetahs beyond her in-game approach and into the team's practices as well. "Short sessions with a lot of intensity" is how she described their training methods, demanding 100% from everybody in everything they do on the pitch but not over-exerting players before actual

games.

With nearly half of the roster turned over for 2018 as well as a new coach, the Dash have had to be quick learners to grasp the new philosophy while also learning the tendencies and qualities of new teammates. Pauw has been encouraged by their flexibility and even says the team is even ahead of schedule of where she originally mapped out going into the first match.

"The way each of them has been on the pitch has been above any of the expectations so far. I'm pleased, and the team is enjoying it. From here we build a fantastic season."

VERA PAUW



Vera Pauw, 54, joins the Dash after two years with the South African Women's National Team. Pauw led Banyana Banyana to their second consecutive Olympic Games in the 2016 edition in Rio de Janeiro. The Amsterdam native also led the South Africans to the semifinals of the 2014 Confederation of African Football Women's Championship.

In addition to her work on the touchline, Pauw has served on technical advisory boards and as an instructor at numerous coaching functions hosted by FIFA and UEFA since 1994. The former Dutch international defender was the first female to earn the UEFA Pro License from the Royal Dutch Football Association in 2005, passing with the highest rates ever obtained.

Additionally, Pauw was a key component in developing policy that implemented mixed gender football for the most talented players in the country and organizing the structure of the Eredivisie Vrouwen, the Dutch women's first division. Pauw was honored for her contributions to the game in prior to the 2017 UEFA Women's Championship as a Knight of the Royal Dutch Football Association.

Pauw brings more than 15 years of experience as an international manager with stints throughout Europe. Prior to joining South Africa, she spent two years as the technical director and head coach of the Russian Women's National Team in 2011. Pauw served as the head coach of the Netherlands from 2004-2010 and led her home country to its first major tournament, the 2009 UEFA Women's European Championship. The Netherlands entered the tournament as the lowest-ranked teams, and one of the youngest, yet finished in third place, the highest honor until earlier this year when the Oranje won the tournament.

Lisa Cole joins the Dash after two years with the Papua New Guinea U-20 Women's National Team. The former Boston Breakers head coach brings more than 20 years of experience coaching elite youth, college and professional clubs throughout the country.

Dash head coach Vera Pauw served as the head of the FIFA technical study group during the 2016 U-20 FIFA Women's World Cup in Papua New Guinea, which coincided with Cole's tenure with the host nation.




