UTAH ROYALS FC CAPS 2019 SEASON SATURDAY AT HOME AGAINST HOUSTON DASH

URFC Rounds Out Historic Sophomore Season in NWSL

SANDY, Utah (Friday, October 11, 2019) – Utah Royals FC returns home to Rio Tinto Stadium to take on the Houston Dash in the final match of its second season in the National Women's Soccer League on Saturday, October 12 at 7:00 p.m. MT. The match will be broadcast live on KSL TV app and Yahoo Sports!.

In its last match, Utah Royals FC fell 2-1 to the Chicago Red Stars in a match that saw FW Christen Press record the lone goal for Utah, her seventh of the season as MF Gunny Jónsdóttir provided the assist, her fourth of the 2019 campaign.

Friday's match will mark the third time URFC and the Dash have faced one another this year. In the previous two outings, the Dash have defeated Royals FC on both occasions by a score of 2-1. Most recently, Utah was topped in Texas, ending what was a club-high five-game unbeaten streak. Jónsdóttir netted the goal for Royals FC, assisted by MF Erika Tymrak, her first of the season.

URFC enters Friday's match with a 2-2-1 (7 points) all-time record against Houston Dash and in 2019, the Dash remain the only team that Utah has failed to earn a point against.

LAST MATCH RECAP

Utah Royals FC fell 2-1 on the road to the Chicago Red Stars, officially knocking the team out of playoff contention. FW Christen Press scored the lone goal for Utah.

The first half proved to be a battle of the midfield, as the ball spent a majority of the time within the middle-third with both teams sharing a relatively equal amount of possession. The Red Stars were able to break through on a couple occasions, forcing GK Nicole Barnhart to come up big twice.

Chicago was the first to break the stalemate in the 40th minute when Vanessa DiBernardo forced a hard strike from outside the 18-yard-box for the opening goal of the match. Just two minutes later Utah answered back when MF Gunny Jónsdóttir sent in a cross to an oncoming Press who was able to get a head on the ball to level the score.

Once again the match went back-and-forth well into the second half. Utah was millimeters away from taking the lead in the 68th minute when a free kick led to FW Katie Stengel getting a shot on goal, but a goal-line save from Chicago defender Julie Ertz kept it out of the back of the net.

Ultimately it was Chicago who was able to take the lead when Yuki Nagasato rebounded on a save from Barnhart to secure the win for the Red Stars.

LAST TIME VS OPPONENT

Utah Royals FC got a second-half goal from MF Gunny Jónsdóttir, but it wasn't enough to come back from a two-goal deficit, falling 2-1 to the Houston Dash on Friday at BBVA Stadium.

The goal was the first of the year for Jónsdóttir and first since the inaugural NWSL match for Royals FC in Orlando last season.

After going back and forth for 15 minutes, the Dash broke through the stalemate when poor clearance from the defense resulted in a goal from Sofia Huerta.

Huerta added her second of the night in the 62nd minute. Jónsdóttir pulled one goal back in the 75th minute, connecting on a ball from FW Erika Tymrak to make it 2-1. However, Royals FC couldn't find the equalizer and ended its unbeaten streak after five straight matches without a loss.

MATCH STORYLINES

'Cause This is Thriller Night

With 23 of the 24 matches of the 2019 season completed for Utah Royals FC, the Houston Dash remain the only team that Utah has been unable to earn a point against. In the past two matches Houston has taken the upper hand, defeating Royals FC by a score of 2-1 in both instances. The first, on May 11 at Rio Tinto Stadium, saw Rachel Daly score a brace for the Dash, while FW Amy Rodriguez netted the lone goal for Utah. Then, at BBVA Stadium on September 13, Sofia Huerta added her own brace to find the 2-1 victory, MF Gunny Jónsdóttir scored for Royals FC, assisted by MF Erika Tymrak.

It Caught on in a Flash

In the last match for Utah Royals FC FW Christen Press scored her seventh goal of the season, giving her the second-most on the team, behind FW Amy Rodriguez who has scored eight. Press scored the goal using her head, an unusual occurrence for the forward as it was only her second headed goal since 2016. The goal was assisted by MF Gunny Jónsdóttir, bringing her season total to four, the second-most on the squad, behind MF Vero Boquete who has assisted on five goals.

Who You Gonna Call?

With the last game of the season GK Nicole Barnhart still leads the league in shutouts with 10. North Carolina Courage goalkeeper Stephanie Labbe sits in second with eight clean sheets. The team's clean sheets meet a record for the second-most in league history set by Barnhart herself back in 2014 on the way to the NWSL Championship with FC Kansas City. Currently Portland Thorns FC goalkeeper Adrianna Franch holds the title for the most single-season shutouts with 11, should the team shutout Houston Dash on Saturday, Barnhart will tie the record.

They Put a Spell on You

With just one game remaining the race for the URFC Golden Boot has drawn incredibly close with just one goal separating FW's Christen Press and Amy Rodriguez. Currently Rodriguez has netted eight goals in 23 games, the second-most in a single season during her NWSL career. Meanwhile, Press has scored seven goals in 13 games and has also added two assists. Press previously recorded the most goals for her former club, the Chicago Red Stars, in 2014 and 2017, while Rodriguez did so with FC Kansas City in 2014. Last season the award went to FW Katie Stengel who scored six goals in the club's inaugural season and Rodriguez finished in second with five goals.
