GAME PREVIEW

BLAINE, Minn. – After an scoreless draw on Saturday night, the Atlanta Silverbacks (7-11-10, 32 points) need to collect maximum points away to Minnesota United (13-10-5, 49 points) in order to keep their playoff hopes alive.

The Silverbacks will face a challenge against the Loons, who are currently on an eight-game unbeaten run at home, not having lost since the final game of the Spring Season.

Minnesota has been a cut above the rest. In fact, they've scored more goals – 36 – than any other team in the NASL. Only 13 of those 36 goals were scored on their home field, though. What has assured the Loon's postseason spot has been their defense. Playing away from NSC Stadium, the team has given up 20 goals. Only the Carolina RailHawks have conceded more with 25. At home, Minnesota has allowed only four goals through the Fall Season. That's the lowest of any team in the league.

Minnesota, while a great team, isn't unstoppable. It's three losses during the Fall Season came at the hands of the RailHawks, New York Cosmos and – in it's previous match – Indy Eleven. Out of those three, only the Cosmos have a winning record, showing that the Loons do slip up every now and then.

During the two clubs' last meeting, Atlanta took an early lead with a 9th minute goal from Pedro Mendes. The Silverbacks ultimately fell 2-1 at Atlanta Silverbacks Park.

Saturday night is likely to be the toughest game Atlanta has played all season, but three points are absolutely necessary to ensure the season doesn't end on Halloween weekend.

LAST TIME OUT

ATLANTA — The Atlanta Silverbacks (7-11-10, 32 points Combined Table) split points with the Tampa Bay Rowdies (9-9-10, 36 points) in their first visit to Atlanta Silverbacks Park on Saturday. Neither team could crack the other in the scoreless affair, with just one shot — a swerving free kick by Junior Burgos — between both teams.

"Every one of our boys came out with energy and positivity, especially after the sour taste left from our last match (a loss to the New York Cosmos)," Silverbacks coach Gary Smith said. "I think it fair to say that we were the better side, with maybe the exception of the final minutes of the first half. We asked the right questions of Tampa Bay, but the final ball just wasn't there. All in all, this is a good result and we will build off it and prepare to play at Minnesota (next week)."

Atlanta's third and finial match with the Rowdies certainly got off to a fast start, with both teams pushing the pressure early on. For the first 10 minutes, the bulk of the action went in Atlanta's favor. The Silverbacks sent in multiple crosses and Burgos would have tallied early off of a free kick had it not been for Matt Pickens' diving save.

Not to be outdone, the Rowdies continued to push and earned themselves a corner kick in the 15th minute. Freddy Adu's cross met defender Stefan Antonijevic's head, but the big man's shot went just wide of the post. Forward Brian Shriver came close only a few minutes later with a cheeky chip spinning just over the crossbar.

Atlanta was struck a major blow in the 21st minute when the creative Burgos had to be replaced due to injury. Midfielder Michal Mravec substituted on to fill Burgos' void.

For the remaining 24 minutes of the first half, neither team seemed to get a handle on the match. Adu was given multiple free kick opportunities, each fizzling before becoming anything dangerous. The same happened with Atlanta's corner kick opportunities.

To the dismay of both teams, they entered the half scoreless.

The start of the second half started slow, up until the 55th minute when Paul Black made a swerving run into the 18-yard-box. Pedro Mendes followed suit a minute later and the team earned three consecutive corners starting in the 58th minute. The experienced Pickens was able to thwart the dangerous attempts.

Whatever Smith said at halftime had an impact. For the majority of the second half, Atlanta pounced on every Rowdies mistake and quickly countered. Tampa Bay's defense was forced to bail it out time and time again.

Late substitutions of Matt Horth and Shaka Bangura helped to increase pressure on the Rowdies' backline, but the Silverbacks weren't able to knick a goal before the final whistle. The match ended scoreless, keeping Atlanta in playoff contention.

#1 STEWARD CEUS GOALKEEPER



Steward Ceus, a 27-year-old goalkeeper with international appearances for the Haitian national team, was signed on Jan. 14, 2015. He reunites

with head coach Gary Smith, who drafted him as the 37th overall selection in the 2009 MLS SuperDraft. Smith and Ceus were together with the Colorado Rapids from 2009-11. Ceus' MLS debut came late in 2012 when he started the final three matches of the season. He made one regular season appearance for the Rapids in 2013 before moving to Finland to play with Närpes Kraft Fotbollsförening in 2014. Ceus has earned seven caps for the Haitian national team.

#13 CHRISTOPHER CHRISTIAN DEFENDER



On March 17, the Club announced the addition of Christopher Christian after a preseason trial with two appearances in friendlies. With professional experience

in both Europe and Africa after four years as a starting center back with four goals and an assist at Villanova, Christian offers versatility with both athletic and technical ability but also as a seasoned veteran. He played for Polish second-division side Motor Lublin in 2012-13 before joining Ghanaian Premier League side Liberty Professionals in 2013-14

#3 PAUL BLACK DEFENDER — FULL BACK



Before signing with Atlanta in January 2015, the English full back played for Cheltenham Town in England's League Two. Black is seasoned with 132

appearances in the English lower divisions – including 103 matches with League One side Oldham Athletic. The Manchester City youth product joined Oldham after becoming a regular in the starting eleven during the 2006-07 season and serving as captain for the youth squad.

#4 SIMON MENSING

DEFENDER — CENTER BACK



Mensing has featured in both the English League Championship and the Scottish Premier League throughout his 15-year career. Mensing appeared 148 times for

Hamilton Academical, starting with a three-month loan deal in 2007. After netting three goals in five matches, Hamilton signed Mensing permanently, making way for the club's promotion to the Scottish Premier League in 2007-08 as Division One champions. The steady center back served as captain for Scottish club Livingston, appearing in 27 matches with a pair of strikes – including a penalty kick conversion in his debut in 2013.

#10 HANS DENISSEN FORWARD



2013 NASL Best XI selection Hans Denissen joined Atlanta in February 2015 after spending 2014 with the New York Cosmos. Before that, was a member of the

San Antonio Scorpions before that, including an award-winning 2013 campaign during which he tallied 12 league goals. A former Dutch youth international, Denissen started his senior career in 2003 with hometown club Willem II, featuring in both the Eredivisie and Europa League.

#25 FERRETY SOUSA MIDFIELDER



Originally from the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Sousa grew up in Raleigh, N.C. The 5-foot-6 midfielder played for the Carolina RailHawks U-23 team

when they won the USASA national championship in 2011. Before joining the Silverbacks, Sousa most recently played with French side FCM Aubervilliers before participating in the NASL Combine in 2013.

#2 RAUWSHAN MCKENZIE DEFENDER



The 6-foot-1 center back has appeared in 39 MLS matches since 2008, nailing down defensive duties for the Kansas City Wizards (2008-09), Real Salt Lake (2010-

11), Chivas USA (2012) and the Portland Timbers (2013-14). The 28-year-old was originally drafted by the Kansas City Wizards in the 2008 MLS SuperDraft out of Michigan State – where he earned Freshman All-Big-10 team and 1st Team All-Big-10 honors.

#22 PEDRO MENDES

FORWARD

The 25-year-old forward — most remembered for his Goal of the Year-winning right-footed strike from 30 yards out against the Tampa Bay Rowdies — boasts a resume for scoring timely goals.

#23 MICHAL MRAVEC MIDFIELDER



The University of Alabama-Birmingham alumnus spent the last four seasons patrolling the pitch in Europe. After being drafted by Major League Soccer's Sport-

ing Kansas City, he combined for 32 appearances with a trifecta of first-division European clubs: FC Emmen (Holland, 2011-12), MŠK Žilina (Slovakia, 2013) and Podbeskidzie (Poland, 2014). Mravec made his Europa League debut in the 2013-14 campaign as MŠK Žilina challenged NK Olimpija Ljubljana.

#12 SHAKA BANGURA

FORWARD



Sierra Leonean forward Shaka Bangura was re-signed by the Atlanta Silverbacks on Feb. 12, 2015. Bangura appeared in six matches – starting five – with At-

lanta in 2014. Bangura offers a wealth of football experience across the globe, boasting a resume featuring runs in the Indonesia Super League, Cypriot First Division, Thai Premier League and U.S. Soccer's third-tier USL.

#21 CARL COCHRAN JR. GOALKEEPER



Metro Atlanta goalkeeping product C.J. Cochran made the most of his Silverbacks preseason trial, signing his first professional contract with the Club in

March 2015. The 6-foot-4 keeper and Alpharetta native constructed an impressive career at Georgia State, earning Sun Belt and College Sports Madness Independent Defensive Player of the Week honors, TopDrawerSoccer.com Midseason Top 100 Freshmen to Watch honors and two CAA Rookie of the Week honors. Cochran played more than 4,345 minutes with a 23-22-2 record in 48 career starts.

#8 DOMINIC OPPONG MIDFIELDER



A fresh face at defensive midfielder, the 29-yearold Ghanaian-born Oppong featured for FC Edmonton in 37 matches in 2011-12 before joining AC Oulu in the

Finnish second division last year. He made 23 appearances in Finland's Ykkönen, finishing 13-8-6 in fourth place and just three points off a promotion into the first division. He debuted for the Canadian Under-20 Men's National Team in 2005, appearing in all three group-stage matches at the Francophone Games in Niamey, Niger.

#9 JAIME CHAVEZ FORWARD



Chavez, 27, joined the Club in April 2015 and scored 12 goals in all competitions in his first NASL season. He led the team with 31 total appearances, scoring

nine goals in 27 league matches and three goals in four U.S. Open Cup games. Before signing for Atlanta, Chavez played at Cal FC of the USASA. Chavez started his senior career with PDL side Hollywood United Hitmen in 2009, standing as the club's leading scorer in its inaugural season with 10 goals. He remained with the Hitmen the following year, and again led the team in scoring with 11 goals.
