# **GELEHRTER'S GREAT FINDS**

Each week, Tommy Gelehrter - the voice of the Orange & Blue - researches notes for his broadcast. Going forward, some of his gems will be featured in the weekly game notes.

FC Cincinnati is 7-0-2 in games that Emmanuel Ledesma has at least a goal or an assist. They are 4-0-1 in the five matches in which Ledesma is involved with multiple goals.

### THE START OF A RIVALRY BEFORE THE FIRST KICK OF THE SERIES

- Saturday's game is the first-ever between Cincinnati and Nashville in what is already considered a rivalry
- The teams will meet twice more this season: Aug. 4 at Nippert Stadium before closing the regular season on Oct. 13 at First Tennessee Park
- Next year outside of potential preseason exhibitions and U.S. Open Cup matches - the teams will take a hiatus in the newly formed classico as Cincinnati ascends to Major League Soccer
- However, one year later in 2020, Nashville will come into MLS and the teams will be able to re-energize the rivalry in the country's top league

### **SECOND HALF STARTS NOW**

- Saturday's game at Nashville brings on the second half of Cincinnati's 2018 34-game USL campaign
- Through 17 games, FCC has a 10-3-4 record for a .706 winning percentage
- In 2016, the club posted its best midseason winning percentage with a .733 mark from a 9-2-4 record through 15 games in the 30-game season
- In 2017, Cincinnati had a .469 winning percentage through 16 games of its 32-game schedule - a 5-6-5 record

### JULY 18 GAME MOVES TO THE DUECE

- FC Cincinnati's home game at Nippert Stadium against the Charlotte Independence on Wednesday, July 18, will now be televised on ESPN2
- To accommodate the network change, the game will now kick off at 8 p.m.
- The Queen Cities Cup contest was originally scheduled to air on ESPNews at 7:30 p.m. that night.
- The July 18 game will be the second meeting between the teams this season. On May 12, FCC traveled to Matthews, N.C., and fell 4-1 for their first road loss of the season.

### 2019 COMING SOON

- FC Cincinnati started accepting \$50 deposits on new 2019 season tickets this week
- The holders of the club's current 18,000 season tickets do not need to put deposits down for 2019 season tickets as they will receive standard renewal information in early August
- New fans who wish to secure season tickets in 2019 are encouraged to place deposits as certain seating sections are already at capacity, while others are reaching capacity

### **INTERNATIONAL FRIENDLY SET FOR JULY 28**

- FC Cincinnati will face La Liga's RCD Espanyol in an international friendly, presented by Cincinnati Bell, on Saturday, July 28
- Kickoff at Nippert Stadium is set for 7:30 p.m.
- In addition to the game, FCC will celebrate its 2019 entry into MLS with a commemorative poster giveaway to fans in attendance. The club is also planning a special halftime program with guest speakers and a video presentation.
- Espanyol is a Barcelona-based club that was founded in 1900 and has won Copa del Rey – Spain's national cup championship – four times, most recently in 2006. The club has earned a pair of runner-up finishes in UEFA Europa League play, most recently in 2007. In 2017-18, one of Espanyol's signature wins came when the club defeated UEFA Champions League winners Real Madrid.

 Tickets to the game start at \$15 and are now on sale to the general public via fccincinnati.com/tickets or by calling 513-977-KICK (5425).

### **GOAL-SCORING TEAR** ...

- FC Cincinnati not only holds the USL lead in goals (35), but has also been on fire as the weather has heated up
- FCC has tallied multiple goals in every USL game in June, scoring 12 goals in five games (2.20 per game)
- After notching three goals in its first four games overall, FCC has posted a multiple-goal game in 10-of-12 USL games since
- Included in that total are five two-goal games, three three-goal games and three four-goal games in league play
- Cincinnati also totaled seven goals in three U.S. Open Cup games
- In USL play, FCC has been shut out just twice this season both times by Louisville City FC: April 7 (1-0 at Nippert Stadium) and May 26 (2-0 at Nippert Stadium).

### ... AND KEEPING IT CLEAN IN JUNE

- In June, the FCC goalkeepers allowed just six goals in six USL games in June, but posted three shutouts in league play - and four overall - in league play
- Evan Newton shut out North Carolina FC on June 9 on the road, Richmond Kickers on June 16 at Nippert Stadium and Ottawa Fury FC at Nippert Stadium on June 30
- Spencer Richey stood tall in a 0-0 draw against MLS' Minnesota Whitecaps FC in the fourth round of the U.S. Open Cup on June 6, but ultimately fell in penalty kicks
- Overall, when FCC returns home to Nippert Stadium on July 14 against the Tampa Bay Rowdies, Cincy will bring a 141-minute shutout streak into the game

### **GOAL-DEN DUO**

- The duo of Danni Konig and Emmanuel Ledesma have combined for 16 goals this season, the most between any two teammates in the USL
- With eight goals apiece, both Konig and Ledesma are tied for third in the league in goals
- Both sits one goal back of the league leaders Kharlton Belmar (Swope Park Rangers) and Thomas Enevoldsen (Orange County SC) - who each have nine

### LEDESMA'S LEADING THE WAY

- Emmanuel Ledesma is the only player in the USL this season who is ranked in the top five in both goals and assists
- Ledesma comes into the weekend tied for third in goals (8) and tied for the USL lead in assists (8)
- Ledesma is one of only two players who are ranked in the top 10 in both goals and assists, joining Orange County SC's Thomas Enevoldsen - who is tied for first in goals (9) and tied for ninth in assists (4).

### NAZ HAS BEEN NASTY OF LATE

- Since returning to USL play on May 19 from a three-game absence with rib injury, Nazmi Albadawi has been a terror for opponents
- Six of his seven goals on the season have come in the last eight league games and he comes into July on a four-game goal-scoring streak
- After netting his first goal of the season at Bethlehem on April 15, the game-tying goal, he returned to the field against his former - and hometown club North Carolina FC on May 19 where he had a brace
- He also set up Danni Konig's game-winning goal at New York, although he was not credited with an assist
- He also comes into the week having netted goals in each of the last four games (vs. Bethlehem Steel FC on June 13, vs. Richmond Kickers on June 16, at Toronto FC II on June 27 and vs. Ottawa on June 30)
- 23 of his 25 shots have come in the last eight USL games, as have 11-of-14 shots on target



- With his game-winning goal at North Carolina on June 9 putting FCC up 1-0 in the 37th minute - Danni Konig netted his 17th career goal with the Orange and Blue to take the club's career lead in goals - all in 13 months since joining the club
- He now sits alone at the top of both the club's all-time and USL career goal-scoring charts with 19 goals
- In USL play, Konig is two ahead of Sean Okoli (16), while Djibi tallied 16 goals in both USL and U.S. Open Cup play combined
- Konig's 19 strikes at FC Cincinnati breakdown like this: Five (5) game-winners ... Two (2) penalty kicks ... Seven (7) in the first half ... 12 in the second half ... Two (2) have come in second-half stoppage time, each time a crucial, match-tying goal ... 13 have been scored at Nippert Stadium ... additionally, he has only one multiple-goal match with FCC: his first two goals in Cincinnati, May 20, 2017 versus Bethlehem Steel FC

### **STILL AT THE TOP**

- FC Cincinnati enters the weekend atop the Eastern Conference standings for the ninth week in the last 10 and the entire month of June
- FCC has 34 points from 17 games and holds a six-point lead over second-place Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC (28 points in 15 games)
- Cincinnati's 34 points are third-most in the USL overall, behind a pair of Western Conference clubs: Real Monarchs SLC (37 pts.) and Phoenix Rising FC (35 pts.)
- Additionally, Cincy's 2.00 points per game are second-best in the USL behind Real Monarchs SLC (2.17) ... they are the only two teams in the USL who are averaging at least 2.00 points per game

### ROAD WARRIORS THUS FAR ...

- FC Cincinnati has played nine of its first 17 games of the season away from Nippert Stadium and has posted a 6-1-2 record on the road so far this year
- Away from home, the Orange and Blue have out-scored their hosts 17-11 on the season, averaging 1.88 goals on the road
- Defensively, FCC is holding its hosts to 1.22 goals per game with three shutouts (at Charleston Battery on March 15, at Indy Eleven on March 31 and at North Carolina on June 9)
- Of Cincinnati's 34 points on the season, 20 of them have come away from Nippert Stadium ... FCC has taken 20-of-27 available points away from home this season

### ... BUT WILL BE HOMEBODIES THIS SUMMER

- While FCC has spent considerable time on the road so far this season, that is soon to be changing
- Between now and mid-August, Cincinnati plays six of its next seven games in front of the record-setting, raucous crowds at Nippert Stadium
- Included in that run are six straight league home games between July 14 and August 18
- After Saturday's contest at Nashville, the Orange and Blue won't play a road game again until Aug. 22 when they start a two-game road trip to Atlanta and Tampa Bay (Aug. 22, Aug. 25)

### **ROAD RUN IN PERSPECTIVE**

- So far this season, Cincinnati has posted a 6-1-2 road record in USL play, collecting points in 8-of-9 games ... FCC has earned 20 points on the road so far
- In 2017, Cincinnati went 4-8-4 in the club's 16-game USL road schedule and collected points in half the team's games – 8-of-16 – for just 16 points on the road all season
- In 2016 the club's first year Cincinnati went 7-5-4 away from home, collecting points in 11-of-16 games for 25 points
- FCC is on pace to shatter its best road performance this year, already one win shy of the club's record for road wins in a season (7) and five points back of its best point collection (2016) with still 8 of its 17 total USL road games left to play

### **SPREADING THE WEALTH**

- Nine different FCC players have netted goals in 2018, led by eight goals each from Emmanuel Ledesma and Danni Konig
- Nazmi Albadawi has added seven goals, while Corben Bone and Kenney Walker all follow right behind with three goals apiece
- Emery Welshman and Jimmy McLaughlin have each netted a pair, while Russell Cicerone and Blake Smith each have scored single goals
- FC Cincinnati's 35 goals so far this season are first in USL

### **TROUBLESOME TANDEM**

- The front-running duo of Danni König and Emmanuel Ledesma has created havoc for opposing back lines since late-April
- Since uniting as a forward tandem at the start of the second half against Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC on April 21, the pair has combined for 16 goals and eight assists in the 13 games since
- Additionally, three of Konig's last seven goals have been set up Ledesma
- In fact, in those 13 games, one or both players has been kept off the scoresheet just twice since April 21 - a 2-0 loss to Louisville on May 26 and the 2-2 draw against Bethlehem Steel FC on June 13, the latter of which Ledesma missed because of a yellow-card accumulation suspension

### LEDESMA LIGHTING IT UP

- Emmanuel Ledesma has turned heads in his first USL season after a year of standout play in the NASL with the New York Cosmos in 2017
- In 16 appearances for FC Cincinnati this year, Ledesma leads the team in both categories and ranks third in the USL in goals (8) and is tied for the USL lead in assists (8)



- In the last 11 games he's played, Ledesma has scored all eight of his goals and recorded seven assists overall as FCC went 8-2-1 in that run
- Ledesma has been voted to the USL Team of the Week five times this season (Weeks 7, 8, 10, 12 - bench and 14) and was the league's Player of the Week for Week 10

### **GOALKEEPER UNION SO FAR THIS SEASON**

- Because of injury, FCC have used two different goalkeepers through the first 16 games of the season
- Even Newton (7-2-4) started the first five games before a hip injury sidelined him for four games ... Newton returned to the field for the Orange & Blue's USOC Second-Round game against Detroit City FC on May 16, and then returned to the USL field against North Carolina FC on May 19, starting the last eight league games
- In Newton's steed, Spencer Richey (3-1-0) stepped into goal for the four USL games if Newton's injury absence
- Between the two 'keepers, Cincinnati have posted six shutouts: five by Newton and one by Richey.
- Newton is tied for eighth in the USL in shutouts, and his 33 saves are tied for 15th in the league overall, despite missing four games

### **CORBEN'S CUTTING UP THE MIDFIELD**

- Corben Bone has been one of FCC's top players so far this season, with two-way play in the midfield
- An original Orange & Blue member, Bone is tied for fourth on the team in goals (3) and is third in assists (3)
- He also leads all Cincinnati players in minutes played (1,343) and is one of just two players who has appeared in all 17 games
- So far this season, he has completed 19 key passes and posted an 83.6 percent pass completion rate - the second-highest mark on the squad among players who've started at least half the games
- In one of his best games this season, Bone not only what proved to the game-winning goal at Indy on May 2, but also set up Jimmy McLaughlin's late first-half goal to bring FCC back level

### **CAREER YEAR AHEAD?**

- Corben Bone's three goal and three assists through 17 USL games has matched and out-paced his entire 2017 season total
- Last year, in 29 appearances, Bone scored two goals and added three assists

### **SMITH SURGING FORWARD**

- Blake Smith is the squad's top-scoring defender this season, netting one goal and adding four assists in 17 USL appearances from his left back position
- Smith tallied the team's season-opening goal in FCC's 1-0 road win at Charleston on March 17 and then picked up his first assist on Emmanuel Ledesma's eventual game-winning goal against Atlanta
- At New York Red Bulls II on June 2, Smith set up Ledesma's game-tying goal in the second half and then put in the lofted cross against Bethlehem that Russell Cicerone headed home on June 13 ... on June 30, Danni Konig headed in his cross to put FCC up 1-0 early against Ottawa
- Smith has missed three games this season two games in April and one in May - with ankle injuries
- His four assists this season are second-most on the team, behind Ledesma's league-leading eighth and he's tied for ninth in the USL in helpers

### **ONE FIRST AFTER ANOTHER FOR CICERONE**

- After a trio of successful appearances in U.S. Open Cup play, right-sided midfielder Russell Cicerone Made his debut in USL play for Cincinnati on June 9 at North Carolina ... he started and played 73 minutes in his league debut ... Cicerone finished the day with two shots - including one on target and a team-best three crosses
- Four days later on June 13, he started his second straight game and added another first: his first USL goal ... against Bethlehem, he headed in a Blake

Smith cross to then put FCC up 2-1, a lead which they surrendered a minute later

 It was his first professional goal after not seeing time with Timbers 2 in his first pro season in 2017.

### WALKER HITS SCORING STRIDE EARLY ON

- Kenney Walker was a key factor in the FCC attack at the start of the season as the team's overhauled roster continued to gel ... in a four-game span, he registered three goals and one secondary assist
- After missing the team's third and fourth games after an in-game collision at Indy on March 31, he returned to the field on April 21 against Pittsburgh as a substitute and was integral to the team's success as the team headed in to May
- Against Pittsburgh, his second-half goal proved to the game's equalizer in the 2-2 draw
- On April 28 at Ottawa, Walker had a wonder-strike from just in front of the midfield line that earned him SportsCenter's No. 1 Play of the Day honors and then ultimately USL's April Goal of the Month award
- At Indy on May 2, Walker's successful PK attempt seven minutes in put FCC ahead early
- On May 2 against Atlanta, his long, angled through ball to Emmanuel Ledesma set up Danni Konig's opening goal

### **RYAN HAS HIS TOUCH**

- Richie Ryan dropped right into place in the Orange & Blue's central midfield after joining the club from Miami FC this winter
- The Irishman leads the club (regular players) in passing percentage with an 87.7 percent mark, while his 854 passes are also tops on the squad
- Additionally, his 62.7 passes per 90 minutes are tops in Cincy
- Overall, he has seven key passes so far this season from his deep-lying position
- However, after exiting the Orange and Blue's midweek game at Toronto last Wednesday, Ryan missed last Saturday's game with a lower-leg injury and is expected to miss several weeks

### **CENTERS OF ATTENTION**

- Cincinnati has used four different center backs this season in league play: captain Dekel Keinan (14 starts, 1206 minutes), Forrest Lasso (12 starts, 1134 minutes), Paddy Barrett (7 starts, 630 minutes) and Sem de Wit (1 start, 90 minutes)
- They have played in five different combinations so far this season: Keinan-Lasso ... Keinan-Barrett ... Lasso-Barrett ... Keinan-de Wit ... Lasso-de Wit
- The only combination that has yet to happen is Barrett-de Wit

### LAHOUD GETTING IN HIS GROOVE

- Michael Lahoud, acquired on April 18 after two seasons at NASL club Miami FC, has gotten himself integrated into the squad quickly
- In USL play, he has made 10 appearances including seven starts ... overall, he has 13 appearances and 10 starts ... he's collected two assists so far in USL action
- Lahoud made his Cincinnati debut at Indy on May 2 with a start in the midfield ... in his FCC debut, the Sierra Leone international played a full 90-minute shift against the Eleven, picking up an assist on Corben Bone's game-winning goal ... he finished the game with an 87 percent passing completion rate, converting 40-of-46 passes
- He came on as a substitute for Jimmy McLaughlin against Atlanta three nights later on May 5 - posting an 81.3 percent passing rate - before again starting at Charlotte on May 12, where he had a 92.5 percent passing mark in 90 minutes
- On June 30, when he slotted into the deep-lying midfield spot in place of Richie Ryan, he completed 97.1 percent of his passes (66-of-68) against Ottawa
- He also started all three USOC games in the deep central midfield, including captaining the team at Pittsburgh in the third round on May 23 ... against



Detroit City on May 16, he had a 91.4 percent passing rate with a team-high 93 passes

Before coming to Cincinnati, Lahoud played alongside current FCC teammates Richie Ryan and Blake Smith with Miami FC, making 52 appearances (50 starts) with one goal and five assists ... he was also the NASL 2016 Humanitarian of the Year

 Lahoud also played six seasons in MLS, first drafted by Chivas USA in 2009 before being traded to Philadelphia in 2012

### **GIBSON GETTING GOING**

- After a preseason injury which required surgery, Tyler Gibson is in the final stages of his rehabilitation
- Two weeks ago, he fully rejoined training sessions at Nippert Stadium
- In addition, he's been working with fitness coach Austin Berry after the session for added conditioning work
- On Feb. 4 in Florida, Gibson broke his left fibula, tore the deltoid ligament
   and the ligament between his fibula and tibia

### **ATTENDANCE LEADERS**

- Entering the week, FC Cincinnati led the USL in both total and average attendance so far in 2018
- FCC's home attendance average of 24,953 is already an 18 percent increase over the team's 2017 average of 21,199 on the season ... it's more than double the USL's second-place team in average attendance, Sacramento Republic FC (11,444)
- The team's total attendance of 199,623 through its first eight home games was also tops in the league ... it more than doubled second-highest team (Sacramento Republic FC), which has welcomed 91,553 fans to eight games
- Between U.S. and Canadian-based professional teams, the Orange and Blue's average ranks fourth highest overall, behind Atlanta United (MLS -50,426), Seattle Sounders FC (MLS - 40,567) and Toronto FC (MLS - 26,302)

### **THE ORIGINAL GUARD**

- Three players from FC Cincinnati's inaugural season in 2016 are still members of the Orange & Blue this season
- Corben Bone, Jimmy McLaughlin and Kenney Walker all joined the team in the winter of 2015, ahead of the 2016 season
- All three rank in the club's top five in career minutes played, as well

### **U.S. OPEN CUP RUN, 2018 EDITION**

- FC Cincinnati advanced to the fourth round of the U.S. Open Cup for the second straight year
- The team's run in the 2018 edition of the cup began with a 4-1 after extra time win over NPSL's Detroit City FC on May 16 at Cincinnati's Gettler Stadium ... Emery Welshman factored in all four goals, netting a hat trick and setting up Corben Bone's game-winning goal in the extra session
- On May 23, Cincinnati traveled to USL foe Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC who were previously undefeated at Highmark Stadium and had yet to allow a goal at home - and came away with a 3-1 win to advance to the Fourth Round
- On June 6, FCC and MLS' Minnesota United FC played to a 0-0 draw after extra time at Nippert Stadium, but MNUFC advanced in penalties, 3-1, to move on to the Round of 16.

### M-L-YES!

- On May 29, Major League Soccer announced that FC Cincinnati would be joining MLS as an expansion team in 2019
- At an announcement at Cincinnati's Rhinegeist Brewery, MLS Commissioner Don Garber welcomed the Carl H. Lindner III-led ownership group into the nation's top soccer league

### MISCELLANEOUS MLS NOTES

- FCC is 1-1-2 all-time against MLS teams in formal (non-preseason) competition
- Cincinnati has never lost to an MLS team in regulation as the one loss (vs. New York Red Bulls in 2017 U.S. Open Cup semifinals) came in extra time, and the two ties went to penalties (vs. Chicago Fire in the 2017 U.S. Open Cup Round of 16 and vs. Minnesota United FC in 2018 U.S. Open Cup Fourth Round) ... FCC advanced past Chicago, but Minnesota advanced

### BUSY BYE WEEKEND FOR THE KEEPERS BRINGS ENGAGED NUMBERS UP

- With the team's bye weekend on June 23, the FCC goalkeepers made the most of it
- Both Evan Newton and Spencer Richey proposed to their longtime girlfriends that weekend ... both women accepted the proposals
- Newton became engaged to his girlfriend, Kelly, in Cincinnati on Wednesday, June 20, while Richey proposed to his now-fiancé Elizabeth in Nashville on Friday, June 22.
- Those two new engagements bring the club's total current engagements to five: Nazmi Albadawi, Matt Bahner, Newton, Richey and Blake Smith ... additionally former FCC player and current fitness coach Austin Berry is also engaged.

Alan Koch is in his second season as the head coach at FC Cincinnati. In 2017 Koch led the Orange and Blue to semifinal game of the U.S. Open Cup, guiding the team to wins over MLS sides Columbus Crew and Chicago Fire - a thrilling win in penalty kicks - as well as a victory over NASL Fall Champions, Miami FC. In USL action, FCC advanced to playoffs for the second consecutive season.

Koch joined FCC as the Director of Scouting and Analytics and Assistant Coach in December of 2016, before being named the club's second head coach the following February.

Koch spent two seasons as the head coach of Vancouver Whitecaps FC 2, taking the team from eight wins in 2015 to 12 victories this season with a sixth-place finish in the standings. In 2016, WFC2 won their first-ever playoff match against Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC, logging a come-from-behind 2-1 decision before posting a 3-2 win over Oklahoma City Energy FC to advance to the Western Conference final. In the conference chamionship, WFC2 fell to USL Cup finalists, Swope Park Rangers.

Koch is originally from Durban, South Africa and matriculated from Westville Boys High School.

Prior to joining the Whitecaps he coached at Simon Fraser University (SFU) for seven seasons, compiling a record of 126-21-7 and becoming the quickest coach in program history to reach 100 victories.

During his tenure at SFU, his teams won four Great Northwest Athletic Conference (GNAC) championships, two Division II regional titles and advanced to the NCAA Division II Final Four twice. He was voted the Conference Coach of the Year six consecutive years and led his team to a NCAA Top 10 ranking every year.

An All-American at SFU, Koch played professionally in the South African first division with Reservoir Hills United. He also signed with Preussen Krefeld in the German fourth division, adding a stint with Limerick FC in Ireland's first division. Before beginning his professional career, Koch was a member of the South African Olympic Team and captained the South African Schoolboys team.

Koch graduated with his bachelor's degree from SFU in 2000 and completed his master's degree in human resources from Midwestern State University in 2005. Koch and his wife, Amy, and daughter, Aurora, currently reside in North Vancouver, British Columbia.

Koch holds an NSCAA Premier Diploma with distinction, a Canadian "B" license, various South African licenses, a UEFA "B" badge and has completed both his UEFA "A" through the Irish Football Association and the Canadian "A" license.
