BREAKING DOWN THE UNBEATEN STREAK

With FC Cincinnati now unbeaten in their last 18 games (14-0-4), it's an appropriate time to take a closer look at their dominance since the start of June

- The Orange & Blue went 1161 minutes without trailing between June 13th and September 1st before going down 1-0 to Pittsburgh at home two weeks ago.
- During the 18 match unbeaten streak, the club has led for 846 minutes (52.2%), been tied with their opponent for 621 minutes (38.3%) and only trailed five times for a total of 130 minutes (8.0%).
- The team has scored two or more goals in 14 times during the unbeaten streak

A CLOSER LOOK AT THE SEVEN CONSECUTIVE WINS

- During FC Cincinnati current seven match winning streak, they have recorded a clean sheet three times and allowed just four goals in the other four games. The Orange & Blue are outscoring their opponents 18-6 over that stretch
- Eight different FC Cincinnati players have scored during the win streak:
- Corben Bone – 5
- Emmanuel Ledesma – 4
- Fanendo Adi, Nazmi Albadawi – 2
- Fatai Alashe, Dekel Keinan, Forrest Lasso, Emery Welshman – 1

LEDESMA BREAKS USL SINGLE-SEASON ASSIST RECORD

- Midfielder Emmanuel Ledesma eclipsed the USL single-season assist record when he recorded three assists over Toronto FC II on Sept. 16
- The Argentine has 15 assists on the year and is just two goals shy of becoming the first player in USL history to record at least 15 goals and 15 assists in a single season.
- Ledesma is currently the only player in USL to have registered at least 10 goals and 10 assists this season
- Ledesma tied the previous single-season record when he recorded his 12th assist of the season at Louisville City FC on Sept. 11 ... that total was met twice previously: Chris Wehan (Reno 1868 FC, 2017) and Matthew Dallman (Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC, 2013)

BONE, LEDESMA HIGHLIGHT TWO-WIN WEEK

- Corben Bone and Emmanuel Ledesma were named to the USL Team of the Week for their performances in Week 27 ... Bone recorded three goals - including a pair of game-winning goals - on four shots in 159 minutes of match action, while Ledesma tallied four assists - including a pair of game-winning assists - to surpass the USL's all-time single-season assist record
- Bone opened the week by recording the game-winning goal in FCC's 1-0 victory over Louisville City FC on Tuesday, Sept. 11
- On Sunday in FCC's come-from-behind victory over Toronto, Bone recorded his first brace in his three-year FC Cincinnati career
- Ledesma kicked off the week by tying the all-time USL single-season assist record when he provided the game-winning assist on Bone's goal in the latest edition of the River Cities Cup.
- FCC's leading scorer went on to eclipse the record by registering his second three-assist performance of 2018 on Sunday

MCLAUGHLIN RETURNS TO PLAY FORMER SIDE

- Pennsylvania native Jimmy McLaughlin is set to play against a former team

when FC Cincinnati plays Penn FC on Saturday evening

- In parts of four seasons from 2012-15, McLaughlin made 78 appearances and recorded 14 goals in 4,302 minutes of USL regular-season play with the Harrisburg City Islanders
- McLaughlin also made an appearance for Harrisburg in the third round of the 2014 U.S. Open Cup ... McLaughlin played all 90 minutes and tallied two goals in the City Islanders' 4-2 win over the Baltimore Bohemians

FCC SEEKS TO EXTEND CLUB-RECORD SEVEN-GAME WINNING STREAK

- FC Cincinnati claimed its seventh consecutive USL win – the longest winning streak in club history – when the Orange and Blue defeated Toronto FC II, 4-3, on Sept. 16
- Real Monarchs SLC hold the USL's all-time longest winning streak of nine matches, which they achieved in 2017
- FCC previously won four consecutive games, two of which were U.S. Open Cup contests, in May 2017
- During the current streak, FCC has outscored its opposition 18-6 and has posted three clean sheets

FCC CINCINNATI ON LONGEST UNBEATEN RUN IN CLUB HISTORY

- FCC enters Saturday's match riding a 18-game unbeaten run during which time FCC is 14-0-4 in USL play ... this is the longest undefeated run in club history
- Should FC Cincinnati win or draw against Penn FC, they will have the second-longest unbeaten streak in USL history ... the Richmond Kickers set the USL's longest unbeaten run when they went unbeaten in 22 consecutive matches in 2013
- FC Cincinnati recently completed its third-consecutive unbeaten month, having posted an unbeaten record in June (4-0-2), July (3-0-1), and August (4-0-1) ... overall, FCC has tallied seven unbeaten months in club history
- During the run, FCC is 9-0-2 at home and 5-0-2 on the road
- The club's previous longest undefeated run was 11 games in the first half of the 2016 season (7-0-4)

ORANGE AND BLUE CLINCH PLAYOFF BERTH

- FC Cincinnati became the first team to clinch a berth in the 2018 USL Cup Playoffs with a 2-1 win over Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC on Sept. 1
- Furthermore, the Orange and Blue secured a home playoff match after defeating Louisville City FC, 1-0, on Sept. 11
- Following the 4-3 victory over Toronto FC II on Sept. 16, the Orange and Blue ensured a finish of no worse than second place in the Eastern Conference, securing two straight home USL Cup Playoffs matches should the club advance
- FCC has now earned a spot in the USL Cup Playoffs in each of its three seasons in the league: 2016, 2017 and 2018 ... the 2018 postseason is set to begin on Saturday, October 20

FCC CINCINNATI SUPPORTING CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

- This September, FC Cincinnati is working with several local non-profit organizations to bring greater visibility to their respective efforts in the childhood cancer field
- At each of the team's three home games in September, FCC will host different organizations as the club's Community Outreach Partner, which is presented by Home City Ice
- Cincinnati will also host The Cure Starts Now for FCC's match against Indy Eleven on Sept. 29 ... The Cure Starts Now focused on research to find a cure for DIPG, a rare form of pediatric brain cancer
- FCC welcomed the Dragonfly Foundation for the club's match against Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC on Sept. 1 ... The Dragonfly Foundation helps pediatric cancer patients find strength, courage and joy throughout treatment and recovery in the form of support and comfort services
- The Orange and Blue also hosted Cancer Free Kids for the match against Toronto FC II on Sept. 16 ... Cancer Free Kids seeks to eradicate cancer as a life-threatening disease in children by funding promising research that might



otherwise go un- or under-funded

- In addition to the club's community partners, goalkeeper Evan Newton, FCC and Cincy Shirts have collaborated on a fundraising effort for Cincinnati Children's Hospital ... specially designed t-shirts – featuring Newton's silhouette a making heart-shaped hands symbol while diving for a save – are available for purchase through Cincy Shirts ... all profits from the sale of the special-edition shirts will be donated to Cincinnati Children's Hospital

DAMET, STERN RECEIVE CONTRACT EXTENSIONS

- FCC assistant coach Yoann Damet and goalkeepers coach Jack Stern signed contract extensions through the 2020 MLS season on Sept. 5
- Damet is currently in his second season in Cincinnati after joining Koch's staff ahead of the 2017 campaign
- Prior to arriving in the Queen City, Damet spent three years with the Montreal Impact as its U-18 head coach after working with the club's U-12, U-16 and U-18 squads in various coaching roles ... in addition, Damet was tasked with creating the Pre-Academy programs from U-8 through U-12 age groups as the Impact's Pre-Academy coordinator
- Stern is currently in his first season in Cincinnati, joining Koch's staff in December 2017 as the club's goalkeepers coach after four seasons with the Montreal Impact
- Stern started in Montreal as the Head of Academy Goalkeeping and in three seasons and helped produce the Impact's MLS and USL goalkeepers, as well as members of the Canada National Team at both the senior and youth levels ... in his final season in Montreal in 2017, Stern was elevated to the club's Head of Goalkeeping and served as the first team's goalkeepers coach

KONATE, LAHOUD RETURN FROM INTERNATIONAL DUTY

- Defender Pa Konate and midfielder Michael Lahoud were called in to their respective national teams for Africa Cup of Nations qualifiers
- Lahoud and Sierra Leone played and fell to Ethiopia, 1-0, on Sunday, Sept. 9, at Hawassa International Stadium in Awassa, Ethiopia ... Lahoud did not make an appearance
- Lahoud has four caps for Sierra Leone, which is competing in Group F of Africa Cup of Nations Qualifying with Ghana, Kenya and Ethiopia ... Sierra Leone now has a 1-1-0 record in group play
- Konate, who has previously represented his native Sweden at the senior international level, used his one-time FIFA nationality switch to play for his ancestral Guinea, where his father was born
- Guinea hosted and defeated the Central African Republic, 1-0, on Sept. 9 in Conakry ... Konate did not make an appearance
- Guinea is in Group H of qualifying and has a 2-0-0 record in group play, which also includes Central African Republic, Ivory Coast and Rwanda

FC CINCINNATI SETS SINGLE-SEASON ATTENDANCE RECORD

- After drawing a crowd of 27,142 on Saturday, Aug. 18 against Charleston, FC Cincinnati set the club's single-season attendance record at 352,709 with three regular-season home matches still remaining
- In the club's most recent match, FCC drew a crowd of 27,725 on Saturday, Sept. 16 against Toronto FC II. FC Cincinnati's single-season attendance mark improved to 405,719 with one regular-season home match still remaining
- The Orange and Blue surpassed their own USL single-season attendance high of 339,181 set in 2017

FCC SETS CLUB RECORD FOR SINGLE-MATCH GOAL TOTAL

- FC Cincinnati made history on Aug. 22 at Atlanta when the club tallied five goals in a USL match for the first time in its three-year history
- FC Cincinnati has scored four goals on six separate occasions, most recently on Sept. 16 against Toronto FC II

ALASHE RECORDS FIRST GOAL AS AN FC CINCINNATI PLAYER

- Fatai Alashe recorded his first goal in just his second appearance as an FC Cincinnati player on Aug. 22 at Atlanta

HEAD COACH ALAN KOCH

USL Midseason Coach of the Year (fan vote)

- The goal was Alashe's first professional goal since Oct. 1, 2016, which came as a member of the San Jose Earthquakes (MLS) vs. Real Salt Lake
- Alashe netted five goals over four seasons with the Earthquakes

KÖNIG SCORES FASTEST GOAL IN FC CINCINNATI HISTORY

- Danni König set the record for fastest goal in club history when he scored 28 seconds into the match against Nashville on Aug. 4
- König's first-minute goal was the fourth goal to be scored within the first five minutes of play for the Orange and Blue across all competitions
- Emmanuel Ledesma scored from the penalty spot in the second minute when FCC defeated the Tampa Bay Rowdies, 2-1, on Aug. 25
- 1st minute - Danni König vs. Nashville SC (Aug. 4, 2018)
- 2nd minute - Emmanuel Ledesma at Tampa Bay Rowdies (Aug. 25, 2018)
- 3rd minute - Djiby Fall against Richmond Kickers (July 9, 2017)
- 4th minute - Djiby Fall against Charleston Battery (June 17, 2017)
- 5th minute - Austin Berry against New York Red Bulls II (Sept. 16, 2017)

CLEANING UP IN THEIR OWN END

- FC Cincinnati comes into Saturday's match against Penn FC allowing just eight goals in the last 13 matches ... FCC allowed just one goal throughout July
- With 12 clean sheets through 29 games, FC Cincinnati has already eclipsed



its 2017 mark of seven shutouts and the current mark is the club's single-season record, surpassing 10 shutouts in 2016

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- FC Cincinnati claimed the club's fifth consecutive win at Nippert Stadium when it defeated New York Red Bulls II (July 21)
- FCC is currently on a four-match home winning streak dating back to the 1-0 win over Penn FC on Aug. 12.
- The Orange and Blue's most recent home winning streaks are the two longest in club history:
- 5 wins - June 16-July 21, 2018
- 4 wins - Aug. 12-Sept. 16, 2018
- 3 wins - June 24-July 27, 2017, June 11-July 2, 2016
- 2 wins - four times

FC CINCY SETS SECOND-LONGEST SHUTOUT STREAK IN CLUB HISTORY

- FC Cincinnati's shutout stretch of 399 minutes across all competitions was snapped against New York Red Bulls II (July 21)
- The streak is now the second-longest such streak in club history:
- 405 minutes (includes playoff match) - Sept. 5-Oct. 1, 2016
- 399 minutes - June 27-July 21, 2018
- 343 minutes - May 7-June 4, 2016

FCC DUO ON CARD WATCH

- Dekel Keinan and Blake Smith enter Saturday's game on card watch
- Keinan has received seven cards on the year, while Smith has received four cards this season
- If either player picks up a yellow card, he will be forced to miss a game while sitting out a one-game yellow-card suspension
- Both players have already sat out one game ... Keinan missed the June 2 game at New York Red Bulls while serving his suspension after his fifth yellow card, whereas Smith missed the Sept. 1 game vs. Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC while serving his suspension for picking up a red card in the previous match

MID-SEASON LEAGUE HONORS FOR ORANGE AND BLUE

- The USL conducted fan polling for its midseason awards and a pair of FC Cincinnati talents were honored
- Emmanuel Ledesma was voted the league's midseason Most Valuable Player, earning 55 percent of the fan vote among five players ... Phoenix Rising FC's Solomon Asante finished second in voting with 21 percent
- Head coach Alan Koch was voted the midseason Coach of the Year ... Koch recorded 49 percent of the vote, besting Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC skipper Bob Lilley (19 percent)

HISTORIC TRIO OF GOAL SCORERS

- So far in 2018, Danni König, Emmanuel Ledesma and Nazmi Albadawi have combined for 30 of FC Cincinnati's 60 goals ... that is more than five USL clubs have scored this season
- Should Albadawi find the net one more time, it will mark the first time three FC Cincinnati goal scorers have reached double digits in a same single season
- Additionally, this is the first time in club history the Orange and Blue have four goal scorers with 8+ goals in a same single season
 - **2016:** Sean Okoli (16), Andrew Wiedeman (7), Jimmy McLaughlin (4)
 - **2017:** Djiby (12), Danni König (11), Jimmy McLaughlin (5)
 - **2018:** Emmanuel Ledesma (11), Danni König (10), Nazmi Albadawi (9)

2019 COMING SOON

- FC Cincinnati started accepting \$50 deposits on new 2019 season tickets on July 2 and the Season Ticket Members' renewal process began on Aug. 12
- The holders of the club's current 18,000 season tickets do not need to put deposits down for 2019 season tickets and instead will follow the normal

renewal process

- New fans who wish to secure season tickets in 2019 are encouraged to place deposits as certain seating sections are already at capacity, while others are reaching capacity
- This season, FCC sold out of its season ticket inventory in mid-June and the club expects to reach capacity for 2019 season tickets at some point

GOAL-SCORING TEAR ...

- FC Cincinnati ranks third in the USL in goals with 60 - two back of league leader New York (62 in 29 games) but has also been hot as the weather has heated up
- Since June 2, Cincinnati has posted multiple goals in 14-of-18 USL games, including every game in June ... since June 2, FCC has scored 40 goals in 18 games, a 2.22 goals per game average
- After notching three goals in its first four games overall, FCC has posted a multiple-goal game in 19-of-25 USL games since
- Included in that total are 10 two-goal games, four three-goal games, four four-goal games, and one five-goal game in league play
- Cincinnati also totaled seven goals in three U.S. Open Cup games
- In USL play, FCC has been shut out just three times this season - both meetings by Louisville City FC (1-0 on April 7 at Nippert Stadium and 2-0 on May 26 at Nippert Stadium) - and at Nashville SC (0-0 on July 7 in Nashville at Nissan Stadium)

KEEPING IT CLEAN

- Since June 2, the FCC goalkeepers have allowed just 14 goals in 18 USL games and have posted nine shutouts in league play - and 10 overall
- Evan Newton shut out North Carolina FC on June 9 on the road, Richmond Kickers on June 16 at Nippert Stadium, Ottawa Fury FC at Nippert Stadium on June 30, at Nashville SC on July 7 at Nissan Stadium, Tampa Bay Rowdies on July 14 at Nippert Stadium and Charlotte Independence on July 18 at Nippert Stadium
- Spencer Richey stood tall in a 0-0 draw against MLS' Minnesota United FC in the fourth round of the U.S. Open Cup on June 6, but ultimately fell in penalty kicks. Richey recorded consecutive USL shutouts for the first time when he blanked Penn FC (August 12) and Charleston (August 18) in a pair of home contests

GIBSON MAKES USL DEBUT

- After being sidelined for nearly six months due to a preseason injury which required surgery, Tyler Gibson made his USL debut for FC Cincinnati on August 4 against Nashville SC
- Gibson entered the match in place of Kenney Walker in the 67th minute ... in 23 minutes of action, Gibson was a perfect 3-of-3 in duels and recorded 24 touches
- The Knoxville, Tenn. native made a second USL appearance at Louisville City FC on Sept. 11
- Gibson appeared for a second consecutive match for the first time as an FC Cincinnati player when he appeared against Toronto FC II on Sept. 16
- Gibson made his FC Cincinnati debut across all competitions on July 28 in the club's international friendly against RCD Espanyol
- On Feb. 4 in Florida, he broke his left fibula, tore the deltoid ligament and the ligament between his fibula and tibia

THREE ADDITIONS BOLSTER FC CINCINNATI

- In the summer international transfer window, FC Cincinnati fine-tuned its roster for the stretch run of the 2018 season
- Forward Fanendo Adi, midfielder Fatai Alashe, and defender Pa Konate have been added to the roster
- Adi - who joins FC Cincinnati from Major League Soccer's Portland Timbers - will play for the Orange and Blue for the remainder of the 2018 USL season, before becoming FCC's first ever Designated Player in MLS in 2019
- Alashe - who comes in to FC Cincy from Major League Soccer's San Jose Earthquakes - will also join FC Cincinnati for the remainder of the 2018 USL





- season and will be part of the club's inaugural MLS roster in 2019
- Konate - who joins the Orange and Blue from Serie A's S.P.A.L. - is on loan to FC Cincinnati for the remainder of the 2018 USL season, with an option to purchase for the 2019 MLS season
- With the transactions, FC Cincinnati's roster currently stands at 25 active players with five USL spots open to sign or add additional players

PA-MODOU KAH JOINS FCC TECHNICAL STAFF

- FC Cincinnati added former Norway international and MLS center back Pa-Modou Kah to its technical staff as a member of the scouting staff on August 8
- Kah joins FC Cincinnati from Vancouver Whitecaps FC, where he was an assistant coach with the club's MLS team and was the head coach of its Under-18 squad
- The center back played in four MLS seasons with Portland (2013-14) and Vancouver (2015-16), totaling 70 appearances, including 68 starts
- Kah played for Whitecaps FC 2 (2016) where he served as a player-coach under current FCC head coach Alan Koch

FCC PLAY THIRD EVER INTERNATIONAL FRIENDLY

- FC Cincinnati played La Liga's RCD Espanyol in an international friendly, presented by Cincinnati Bell, on Saturday, July 28
- Russell Cicerone scored the first ever goal by an FC Cincinnati player in an international friendly after finishing a feed from Emery Welshman
- Tyler Gibson and Mark Village made their FC Cincinnati debuts across all competitions ... the pair entered the game at the start of the second half and logged 27 minutes of playing time
- FCC celebrated its 2019 entry into MLS with a commemorative poster giveaway to fans in attendance ... the club also held a special halftime program with guest speakers and a video presentation
- Espanyol is a Barcelona-based club that was founded in 1900 and has won Copa del Rey - Spain's national cup championship - four times, most recently in 2006. The club has earned a pair of runner-up finishes in UEFA Europa League play, most recently in 2007. In 2017-18, one of Espanyol's signature wins came when the club defeated UEFA Champions League winners Real Madrid

CENTER BACKS COMBINE FOR TWO GOALS...AGAIN

- For a second consecutive match, two FC Cincinnati center backs scored for the Orange and Blue against New York Red Bulls II (July 21)
- Forrest Lasso found the scoresheet via a header off an Emmanuel Ledesma corner kick in the 17th minute of action
- In the 38th minute, Paddy Barrett scored his first FC Cincinnati goal on a header following a long pass from Ledesma on a free kick from just outside the center circle
- Just three days earlier Dekel Keinan and Forrest Lasso scored the first two goals by FC Cincinnati center backs for the 2018 USL season
- Through 28 USL matches, five goals have been scored by FC Cincinnati center backs

LEDESMA'S LEADING THE WAY

- Emmanuel Ledesma is one of only two players in the USL this season who is ranked in the top 10 in both goals and assists ... Ledesma is joined by Orange County SC's Thomas Enevoldsen who is tied for second in goals (16) and is tied for fifth in assists (9)
- Ledesma comes into the weekend tied for 10th in goals (13) and first in assists (15)

NAZ HAS BEEN NASTY OF LATE

- Since returning to USL play on May 19 from a three-game absence with rib injury, Nazmi Albadawi has been a terror for opponents
- eight of his nine goals on the season have come in the last 20 league games (which includes 19 starts)

- After tallying his first goal of the season at Bethlehem on April 15, the game-tying goal, he returned to the field against his former - and hometown - club North Carolina FC on May 19 where he had a brace
- He also set up Danni König's game-winning goal at New York on June 2, although he was not credited with an assist
- He saw his four-game goal-scoring streak snapped at Nashville on July 7 after netting goals in each of four prior games (vs. Bethlehem Steel FC on June 13, vs. Richmond Kickers on June 16, at Toronto FC II on June 27 and vs. Ottawa on June 30)
- He added his second brace of the season at Atlanta on August 22

KING KÖNIG

- In just over a year since joining the club, Danni König has emerged as FC Cincinnati's most prolific goal scorer
- König is the club's all-time leading goal scorer (both all competitions and USL games only), netting 21 goals in 48 appearances for the Orange and Blue since May 2, 2017 ... all of his goals have come in USL regular-season play
- With his game-winning goal at North Carolina on June 9 - putting FCC up 1-0 in the 37th minute - Danni König netted his 17th career goal with the Orange and Blue to take the club's career lead in goals
- On the club's USL goal list, König is five ahead of Sean Okoli (16), while Djiby tallied 16 goals in all competitions to share second place with Okoli on that chart
- König's 21 strikes at FC Cincinnati breakdown like this:
 - Five (5) game-winners
 - Two (2) penalty kicks
 - Eight (8) in the first half
 - 13 in the second half
 - Two (2) have come in second-half stoppage time, each time a crucial, match-tying goal
 - 14 have been scored at Nippert Stadium
 - He has only one multiple-goal match with FCC: his first two goals in Cincinnati, May 20, 2017 versus Bethlehem Steel FC

STILL AT THE TOP OF THE EAST

- FC Cincinnati enters the weekend atop the Eastern Conference standings for the 20th week in the last 21 - and for every week since the start of June
- FCC has 66 points from 29 games and holds a 16-point lead over second-place team Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC (50 points in 28 games)
- Cincinnati's 66 points are the most in the USL overall, leading Western Conference leaders Orange County SC (57 pts. in 30 games) by nine points
- FC Cincinnati (2.28 points per game) is the only club in the USL who is averaging more than 2.00 points per game

ROAD WARRIORS EARLY ON ...

- FC Cincinnati played 10 of its first 20 games of the season away from Nippert Stadium and has posted a 9-1-3 record on the road so far this year
- Away from home, the Orange and Blue have out-scored their hosts 25-13 on the season, averaging 1.92 goals on the road
- Defensively, FCC is holding its hosts to 1.00 goals per game with five shutouts: at Charleston Battery on March 15, at Indy Eleven on March 31, at North Carolina on June 9, at Nashville SC on July 7 and at Louisville City FC on September 11
- Of Cincinnati's 66 points on the season, 30 of them have come away from Nippert Stadium ... FCC has taken 30-of-39 available points away from home this season and has claimed points in 12-of-13 games on the road

... BUT HOMEBODIES OVER THE SUMMER

- While FCC has spent considerable time on the road so far this season, that changed over the summer
- Between mid-July through mid-August, Cincinnati played six straight USL games - from July 14 through August 18 - in front of the record-setting, raucous crowds at Nippert Stadium



- The Orange and Blue played their first road game since July 7 when they began a two-game road trip in Atlanta (Aug. 22) followed by Tampa Bay (Aug. 25)
- After an 0-1-1 start at home in 2018, FCC is now 11-2-3 at Nippert Stadium this year with the two losses both coming to Louisville City FC (April 7 and May 26)

ROAD RUN IN PERSPECTIVE

- So far this season, Cincinnati has posted an 9-1-3 road record in USL play, collecting points in 12-of-13 games ... FCC has earned 30 points on the road so far
- In 2017, Cincinnati went 4-8-4 in the club's 16-game USL road schedule and collected points in half the team's games – 8-of-16 – for just 16 points on the road all season
- In 2016 – the club's first year – Cincinnati went 7-5-4 away from home, collecting points in 11-of-16 games for 25 points
- FCC is on pace to shatter its best road performance this year ... the club set a new club record for road wins in a season (9) and road points in a season (30) with still 4 of its 17 total USL road games left to play

SPREADING THE WEALTH

- Fourteen different FCC players have netted goals in 2018, led by 13 goals from Emmanuel Ledesma and 10 goals from Danni König
- Nazmi Albadawi has added nine goals, Corben Bone has tallied eight times, while Emery Welshman, Kenney Walker and Forrest Lasso have registered three goals
- Jimmy McLaughlin, Dekel Keinan, and Fanendo Adi have each netted a pair, while Fatai Alashe, Russell Cicerone, Blake Smith and Paddy Barrett each have scored single goals
- FC Cincinnati's 60 goals so far this season are third most in the USL

TROUBLESOME TANDEM

- The front-running duo of Danni König and Emmanuel Ledesma has created havoc for opposing back lines since late-April
- Since uniting as a forward tandem at the start of the second half against Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC on April 21, the pair has combined for 22 goals and 15 assists in the 24 games since
- Additionally, three of König's goals have been set up Ledesma
- In fact, in those 24 games, both players have been kept off the scoresheet just five times since April 21: the 2-0 loss to Louisville on May 26, the 2-2 draw against Bethlehem Steel FC on June 13 (which Ledesma missed because of a yellow-card accumulation suspension), the 0-0 draw at Nashville SC on July 7, the 2-0 win over Charlotte on July 18 (which König did not see action in), and the 5-1 win at Atlanta on Aug. 22 (which König did not see action in and Ledesma missed because of a yellow-card accumulation suspension)

MANU-V-P

- Emmanuel "Manu" Ledesma has turned heads in his first USL season after a year of standout play in the NASL with the New York Cosmos in 2017 and is now having an MVP-caliber season for Cincinnati
- In 27 appearances for FC Cincinnati this year, Ledesma is tied for 10th in the USL in goals (13) and leads the USL in assists (15) - and leads both categories for all FC Cincinnati players
- With three assists against Toronto FC II on Sept. 16, Ledesma broke the USL single-season assist record of 12, which was met twice previously: Chris Wehan (Reno 1868 FC, 2017) and Matthew Dallman (Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC, 2013)
- He was the USL June Player of the Month after earning a runner-up finish in the May USL Player of the Month voting ... additionally, USL fans voted him the overwhelming USL Midseason Most Valuable Player
- In the last 24 games he's played, Ledesma has scored all 13 of his goals and recorded 14 assists overall as FCC went 18-2-4 in that run
- Ledesma has been voted to the USL Team of the Week six times this season

(Weeks 7, 8, 10, 12 - bench, 14 and 27) and was the league's Player of the Week for Week 10 and June's Player of the Month

GOALKEEPER UNION SO FAR THIS SEASON

- Because of injury, FCC have used two different goalkeepers through the first 29 games of the season
- Evan Newton (10-2-6) started the first five games before a hip injury sidelined him for four games ... Newton returned to the field for the Orange and Blue's USOC Second-Round game against Detroit City FC on May 16, and then returned to the USL field against North Carolina FC on May 19, starting 12 of the last 16 league games
- In Newton's stead, Spencer Richey (10-1-0) stepped into goal for the four USL games in Newton's injury absence and started the Orange and Blue's match against New York Red Bulls II (July 21) ... Richey then made three consecutive starts against Penn FC (August 12), Charleston Battery (August 18), and at Atlanta United 2 (August 22)
- Between the two 'keepers, Cincinnati have posted 12 USL shutouts: eight by Newton and four by Richey ... FCC ranks sixth in the USL in shutouts, three back of league leader Pittsburgh (15)
- Newton is tied for ninth in the USL in shutouts, and his 50 saves are tied for 22ns in the league overall, despite not playing in 11 games

CORBEN'S CUTTING UP THE MIDFIELD

- Corben Bone has been one of FCC's top players so far this season, with some career-best two-way play in the midfield
- An original Orange and Blue member, Bone ranks fourth on the team in goals (8) and is tied for second in assists (4)
- He also leads all Cincinnati players in minutes played (2,267) and appearances (28)
- So far this season, he has completed 31 key passes and posted an 84.1 percent pass completion rate - the second-highest mark on the squad among players who've started more than half the team's games
- In one of his best games this season, Bone not only scored what proved to be the game-winning goal at Indy on May 2, but also set up Jimmy McLaughlin's late first-half goal to bring FCC back level
- On his birthday, Bone notched his first brace as an FC Cincinnati player against Toronto FC II on Sept. 16.

CORBEN'S CAREER YEAR

- Corben Bone's eight goals and four assists - through 29 USL games - has already out-paced his entire 2017 season total
- Last year, in 29 appearances, Bone scored two goals and added three assists ... in 2016, Bone collected a career-high five assists

SMITH SURGING FORWARD

- Blake Smith is the squad's top-scoring defender this season, netting one goal and adding four assists in 25 USL appearances from his left back position
- Smith tallied the team's season-opening goal in FCC's 1-0 road win at Charleston on March 17 and then picked up his first assist on Emmanuel Ledesma's eventual game-winning goal against Atlanta
- At New York Red Bulls II on June 2, Smith set up Ledesma's game-tying goal in the second half and then put in the lofted cross against Bethlehem that Russell Cicerone headed home on June 13 ... on June 30, Danni König headed in his cross to put FCC up 1-0 early against Ottawa
- Smith has missed three games due to injury this season - two games in April and one in May - with separate ankle injuries
- His four assists this season are tied with Corben Bone and Emery Welshman for second-most on the team, behind Ledesma's league-leading 15

ONE FIRST AFTER ANOTHER FOR CICERONE

- After a trio of successful appearances in U.S. Open Cup play, right-sided midfielder Russell Cicerone Made his debut in USL play for Cincinnati on June 9 at North Carolina ... he started and played 73 minutes in his league





debut ... Cicerone finished the day with two shots - including one on target - and a team-best three crosses

- Four days later on June 13, he started his second straight game and added another first: his first USL goal ... against Bethlehem, he headed in a Blake Smith cross to then put FCC up 2-1, a lead which they surrendered a minute later
- It was his first professional goal after not seeing time with Timbers 2 in his first pro season in 2017
- Cicerone added the first ever goal scored by an FC Cincinnati player in an international friendly when he scored on July 28 against RCD Espanyol
- He notched his first FC Cincinnati assist on August 22 at Atlanta

WALKER HITS SCORING STRIDE EARLY ON

- Kenney Walker was a key factor in the FCC attack at the start of the season as the team's overhauled roster continued to gel ... in a four-game span, he registered three goals and one secondary assist
- After missing the team's third and fourth games after an in-game collision at Indy on March 31, he returned to the field on April 21 against Pittsburgh as a substitute and was integral to the team's success as the team headed in to May
- Against Pittsburgh, his second-half goal proved to be the game's equalizer in the 2-2 draw
- On April 28 at Ottawa, Walker had a wonder-strike from just in front of the midfield line that earned him SportsCenter's No. 1 Play of the Day honors and then ultimately USL's April Goal of the Month award
- At Indy on May 2, Walker's successful PK attempt seven minutes in put FCC ahead early
- On May 2 against Atlanta, his long, angled through ball to Emmanuel Ledesma set up Danni König's opening goal
- On the season, Walker has scored three goals and added two assists

RYAN HAS HIS TOUCH

- Richie Ryan dropped right into place in the Orange and Blue's central midfield after joining the club from Miami FC this winter
- The Irishman ranks second in passing percentage among regular players with an 87.7 percent mark, while his 854 passes rank seventh on the squad despite having missed 13 consecutive matches
- Additionally, his 62.7 passes per 90 minutes are tops among regular players in Cincy
- Overall, he has nine key passes so far this season from his deep-lying position
- However, after exiting the Orange and Blue's midweek game at Toronto on June 27, Ryan has missed the last 12 games with a lower-leg injury and is expected to miss several weeks overall

CENTERS OF ATTENTION

- Cincinnati has used four different center backs this season in league play: captain Dekel Keinan (20 starts, 1,746 minutes), Forrest Lasso (24 starts, 2,214 minutes), Paddy Barrett (13 starts, 1,170 minutes) and Sem de Wit (1 start, 90 minutes)
- They have played in five different combinations so far this season: Keinan-Lasso ... Keinan-Barrett ... Lasso-Barrett ... Keinan-de Wit ... Lasso-de Wit
- The only combination that has yet to happen is Barrett-de Wit

LAHOUD GETTING IN HIS GROOVE

- Michael Lahoud, acquired on April 18 after two seasons at NASL club Miami FC, has gotten himself integrated into the squad quickly
- In USL play, he has made 20 appearances - including 14 starts ... overall, he has 23 appearances and 17 starts in all competitions ... he's collected two assists so far in USL action and his 89.5 passing percentage is the best on the team among all players regardless of playing time
- Lahoud made his Cincinnati debut at Indy on May 2 with a start in the midfield ... in his FCC debut, the Sierra Leone international played a full 90-minute shift against the Eleven, picking up an assist on Corben Bone's game-winning goal ... he finished the game with an 87 percent passing completion rate, converting 40-of-46 passes
- He came on as a substitute for Jimmy McLaughlin against Atlanta three nights later on May 5 - posting an 81.3 percent passing rate - before again starting at Charlotte on May 12, where he had a 92.5 percent passing mark in 90 minutes
- On June 30, when he slotted into the deep-lying midfield spot in place of Richie Ryan, he completed 97.1 percent of his passes (66-of-68) against Ottawa
- He also started all three USOC games in the deep central midfield, including captaining the team at Pittsburgh in the third round on May 23 ... against Detroit City on May 16, he had a 91.4 percent passing rate with a team-high 93 passes
- Before coming to Cincinnati, Lahoud played alongside current FCC teammates Richie Ryan and Blake Smith with Miami FC, making 52 appearances (50 starts) with one goal and five assists ... he was also the NASL 2016 Humanitarian of the Year
- Lahoud also played six seasons in MLS, first drafted by Chivas USA in 2009 before being traded to Philadelphia in 2012

- FC Cincinnati has seen an increase in average attendance and total attendance for USL regular season matches in each of the club's three seasons

FC CINCINNATI CELEBRATES THIRD ANNIVERSARY OF CLUB'S FOUNDING

- Sunday, Aug. 12 marked the third anniversary of the club's creation
- In three seasons, FC Cincinnati has amassed a 47-19-24 record in USL regular season play
- FCC has qualified for the USL Cup Playoffs in each of its three USL seasons ... The Orange and Blue secured a playoff berth for a third consecutive season when they defeated Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC, 1-0, on Sept. 1
- Cincinnati is currently on pace to secure the Eastern Conference's top seed in the 2018 USL Playoffs
- In 2017, the Orange and Blue made a run to the U.S. Open Cup semifinals, becoming the first non-MLS team to reach the semifinals since the Richmond Kickers did so in 2011



ATTENDANCE LEADERS

- FC Cincinnati leads the USL in both total and average attendance so far in 2018
- FCC's home attendance average of 25,357 is more than a 19 percent increase over the team's 2017 average of 21,199 on the season ... it's more than double the USL's second-place team in average attendance, Sacramento Republic FC (11,386)
- The team's total attendance of 405,719 through 16 home games is also tops in the league, and is currently the USL single-season attendance record ... it has more than doubled the second-highest team (Sacramento Republic FC), which has welcomed 159,398 fans to 14 games
- Between U.S. and Canadian-based professional teams, the Orange and Blue's average ranks fourth highest overall, behind Atlanta United (MLS - 50,863), Seattle Sounders FC (MLS - 40,706) and Toronto FC (MLS - 27,156)

- On May 23, Cincinnati traveled to USL foe Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC - who were previously undefeated at Highmark Stadium and had yet to allow a goal at home - and came away with a 3-1 win to advance to the Fourth Round
- On June 6, FCC and MLS' Minnesota United FC played to a 0-0 draw after extra time at Nippert Stadium, but MNUFC advanced in penalties, 3-1, to move on to the Round of 16

- On May 29, Major League Soccer announced that FC Cincinnati would be joining MLS as an expansion team in 2019
- At an announcement at Cincinnati's Rhinegeist Brewery, MLS Commissioner Don Garber welcomed the Carl H. Lindner III-led ownership group into the nation's top soccer league

- FCC is 1-1-2 all-time against MLS teams in formal (non-preseason) competition
- Cincinnati has never lost to an MLS team in regulation as the one loss (vs. New York Red Bulls in 2017 U.S. Open Cup semifinals) came in extra time, and the two ties went to penalties (vs. Chicago Fire in the 2017 U.S. Open Cup Round of 16 and vs. Minnesota United FC in 2018 U.S. Open Cup Fourth Round) ... FCC advanced past Chicago, but Minnesota advanced

- With the team's bye weekend on June 23, the FCC goalkeepers made the most of it: both Evan Newton and Spencer Richey proposed to their longtime girlfriends that weekend ... both women accepted the proposals
- Newton became engaged to his girlfriend, Kelly, in Cincinnati on Wednesday, June 20, while Richey proposed to his now-fiancé Elizabeth in Nashville on Friday, June 22

ALAN KOCH
HEAD COACH

Alan Koch is in his second season as the head coach at FC Cincinnati. In 2017 Koch led the Orange and Blue to semifinal game of the U.S. Open Cup, guiding the team to wins over MLS sides Columbus Crew and Chicago Fire - a thrilling win in penalty kicks - as well as a victory over NASL Fall Champions, Miami FC. In USL action, FCC advanced to playoffs for the second consecutive season.

Koch joined FCC as the Director of Scouting and Analytics and Assistant Coach in December of 2016, before being named the club's second head coach the following February.

Koch spent two seasons as the head coach of Vancouver Whitecaps FC 2, taking the team from eight wins in 2015 to 12 victories this season with a sixth-place finish in the standings. In 2016, WFC2 won their first-ever playoff match against Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC, logging a come-from-behind 2-1 decision before posting a 3-2 win over Oklahoma City Energy FC to advance to the Western Conference final. In the conference championship, WFC2 fell to USL Cup finalists, Swope Park Rangers.

Koch is originally from Durban, South Africa and matriculated from Westville Boys High School.

Prior to joining the Whitecaps he coached at Simon Fraser University (SFU) for seven seasons, compiling a record of 126-21-7 and becoming the quickest coach in program history to reach 100 victories.

During his tenure at SFU, his teams won four Great Northwest Athletic Conference (GNAC) championships, two Division II regional titles and advanced to the NCAA Division II Final Four twice. He was voted the Conference Coach of the Year six consecutive years and led his team to a NCAA Top 10 ranking every year.

An All-American at SFU, Koch played professionally in the South African first division with Reservoir Hills United. He also signed with Preussen Krefeld in the German fourth division, adding a stint with Limerick FC in Ireland's first division. Before beginning his professional career, Koch was a member of the South African Olympic Team and captained the South African Schoolboys team.

Koch graduated with his bachelor's degree from SFU in 2000 and completed his master's degree in human resources from Midwestern State University in 2005. Koch and his wife, Amy, and daughter, Aurora, currently reside in North Vancouver, British Columbia.

Koch holds an NSCAA Premier Diploma with distinction, a Canadian "B" license, various South African licenses, a UEFA "B" badge and has completed both his UEFA "A" through the Irish Football Association and the Canadian "A" license.
