

iami FC Supporters,



Daniel Vega is responsible for defending the Miami FC goal. This man with strong family values and high team spirit, tells us his story, his aspirations, and his vision. Born in Argentina and shaped in the rigorous Argentinian soccer lifestyle, Vega is a safeguard between the posts and a clear reflection of the hard work brought on by Head **Coach Alessandro Nesta** and his Goalkeeping Coach Vincenzo Benvenuto.

THE MIAMI FC CONTINUES TO **CLIMB THE TABLE, WHAT HAS CHANGED?**

I think it's because of the team's hard work and conviction to follow the coach's system. We understood his idea and philosophy early on, it was just a matter of executing it on the field, and well now, we are seeing the results.

AGAINST EDMONTON, YOU LAUNCHED A SPECTACULAR **GOAL KICK THAT ASSISTED IN VINCENZO RENNELLA'S FIRST GOAL FOR THE CLUB. HOW DO** YOU FEEL ABOUT IT?

Well, I am more happy with the result, rather than the play. A lot of the credit has to go to Vincenzo, who continued with the play and ended up scoring. It's a play that we practice several times. I can't take credit for it because it was all teamwork. I'm happy for him and happy I could help him score his first goal.

WHAT MEMORIES DO YOU HAVE FROM YOUR EXPERI-**ENCE PLAYING FOR ARGENTINI-AN-SIDE RIVER PLATE?**

For my career, it was a great experience, but difficult in terms of soccer. Over there, soccer is played under a lot of pressure, much more so than here. But, to tell vou the truth, regardless of everything, I have nothing but good memories from my experience at River Plate.

AS COMPETITIVE AS ARGEN-TINIAN SOCCER IS. WHAT DO YOU THINK ABOUT THE NASL **LEVEL?**

It is a very competitive league where anyone can beat anyone. I like the league, even though we travel a lot, but everything is well-planned from a club side, so that players don't feel it much and rest as much as possible.

WHAT DO YOU LIKE MOST ABOUT THE MIAMI FC?

The companionship among the whole team. We are a tight knit team. There's very good communication among the technical staff and the players. I feel happy every time I get to go out on the field and play with my teammates. We work hard every day

with great responsibility and joy.

WHO INSPIRED YOU TO PLAY SOCCER?

In Argentina, you are born with a ball at your feet, people give you a jersey and make you a fan of a club...soccer is in our blood. Since I was a little boy, I've been playing in goal, even though I didn't want to be a goalkeeper, I ended up doing it and I liked it. The goalkeeper position is one that comes with great responsibilities, but I'm happy to step up to the plate.

WHAT DO YOU LIKE MOST ABOUT YOUR POSITION AS A GOALKEEPER?

I always say that saving a shot is the same feeling a forward gets after scoring a goal. I really enjoy training and I have the pleasure to be trained by Enzo Benvenuto.

We have very good communication and we correct mistakes every day. What I like most about this position is the camaraderie within the three keepers. We get along very well and we help each other out every day to improve individually and as a whole.

WHAT WAS YOUR EXPERIENCE LIKE WITH SOCCER IN CYPRUS?

Well, my first year was very good, but the second year I had a fractured cheekbone that had me out for six or seven months and kept me from playing the entire year. Later, I decided to come to play in Miami for a new club, a new challenge. Honestly, I don't regret it, I am having a blast and I enjoy my job.





HOW DO YOU PREPARE **MENTALLY BEFORE A MATCH?**

The day before a game, I get up and take my son to the kindergarten, eat a good breakfast, and then I go to training. The night before the game, I enjoy spending time at home with my family, eating a healthy meal, and just relaxing. I try not get tense or stressed out, but in every match, every player gets nervous about what's going to happen during the game.

■ FFORTS REWARDED. After a road trip to Indianapolis, ■ the Miami FC returns home inspired and ready for a two-match week at FIU Stadium. First, the last match against Puerto Rico FC, followed by a midweek final clash with the Ottawa Fury FC.

The Miami FC's climb to second place in the Fall Season Standings is validation that the club's efforts are being rewarded and that the ambitious project is developing in a very positive manner.

CHEAT SHEET

The Miami FC is on a six-game unbeaten streak during which eight goals have been tallied and only two allowed. The Orange and Blue have lost only once in its last 11 games and it is the only undefeated team on the road this Fall Season.

Some key additions to the team's roster have made a great impact box-tobox. Not to mention the experienced veterans such as Daniel Vega, Dario Cvitanich and Wilson Palacios, who have been on the squad from the beginning and have kept the team up and running throughout the year.

THE ROOKIES RACE

The trip to Bayamon earlier in September was a success for the Miami FC, as they crushed fellow NASL debutants, Puerto Rico FC. The Miami FC put in one of their best performances of the season, winning out 3-0 in the All-Star Island.

Puerto Rico FC is struggling in its NASL inauguration, similar as the Miami FC was in its inaugural Spring Season. Puerto Rico is currently at the bottom of the table (1-8-6, 11) including earning their worst loss in franchise history against the Miami FC at home.

Right after hosting the Orange and Blue at Juan Ramon Loubriel Stadium, Puerto Rico FC has played out to two scoreless draws against the Ottawa Fury and the Tampa Bay Rowdies, and now hold a home record of 1-4-3.

TOO GOOD TO GO DOWN

The quality of the team's midfield, along with the power and skill of the newest add-ons, have created an immediate improvement for the Miami FC, and has relieved some of the pressure on the squad's defense. Central defenders Rhett Bernstein and Mason Trafford have merged into a solid unit and wall in front of Vega.



The Soccer Bowl is coming up, and the Miami FC has placed itself as a worthy contender that continues to sprint toward clinching one of the four berths without looking back.

This midweek home match against Ottawa Fury FC brings a level of slightly mental distress to the field, as the record against the Fury has been one to be skeptical about this season. The Miami FC fell short to Ottawa in the first match, 2-0, and in the second contest they tied to a scoreless draw.

At this point, the team is looking very different than it was at the beginning, so the current form and a full active roster at the disposal of Alessandro Nesta and the technical staff, can definitely produce a win.

The Orange and Blue have struggled against the Fury before. The Miami FC has made the trip across the border twice, but have not been able to come back home with a win. Now, as Ottawa visit FIU Stadium for the first time, the Miami FC, with home field advantage, looks to pick up the first victory in the series.

ALL ABOUT THE DETAILS

Ottawa Fury FC finished last in the NASL 2015 Spring Season, but came back with a huge turnaround in the fall, playing in

the Championship finals against the NY Cosmos. The Miami FC is in the same position, and with a similar route to the Soccer Bowl lined up.

The Fury opened the 2015 Fall Season by winning six matches and drawing once, against some of the best teams in the league. The Miami FC was off to a slower start this fall winning three, drawing two and losing twice.

But, after a bitter loss to the Strikers, the Miami FC hit their stride and began a wonderful streak of undefeated matches that have kept the Miami FC in the race.

IN FOR THE LONG HAUL

While the defense has been key to the Miami FC's rise in the Fall Season table, the offense has also been on point with several players finding the back of the net, and few of them getting on the NASL leader boards.

The Miami FC sits just a few points behind NY Cosmos, current leaders and 2015 NASL Champions. With just six matches left and a late season clash with New York still on the schedule, the Orange and Blue are in prime position to take the Fall Season Championship. The Miami FC is the only Florida team ranked in the top five of the table—well, top three.

he Miami FC is led by first-time head coach Alessandro Nesta. Nesta is one of the world's most decorated defenders after being a fixture in Serie A and the Italian National Team. After a strong career with the Lazio youth academy, Nesta turned pro at just 16 years old and made his first appearance at 17. He was named the team captain as a 21-year-old, leading the side to a Coppa Italia title and UEFA Cup Final appearance. Nesta would go on to make 193 appearances for Lazio as the club would continually compete for Serie A and Champions League titles. Nesta would leave Lazio in 2002, when he moved to Italian giant's AC Milan. In his first season with the club, he won the Champions League

and the Coppa Italia. For his performance he was named the Serie A Defender of the Year and to the UEFA Team of the Year. His second season would see AC Milan win Serie A while setting a points record. Nesta would play 10 seasons for AC Milan and cement himself as one of the best defenders of all time.

At the tail end of his career Nesta moved to the MLS and got his first taste of US soccer. He would play two seasons with the Montreal Impact, leading them to the 2013 Amway Canadian Championship and the club's first MLS playoff appearance. In 2014 Nesta decided to retire and was chosen to lead the Miami FC in its

inaugural NASL season in

2016.

Whitbread, an Epping, England native, had a successful 14-year playing career. He featured for teams like West Ham, Portsmouth and Leyton Orient, before kicking off his coaching career in 2003. He would go on to make 125 appearances for Leyton Orient, helping them get promoted to the Football League Second Division. The defender also made 134 appearances during his stint with Portsmouth.

Whitbread served as an assistant in England's lower division, including a stint with Leicester City. He took his first head coach position in 2012, crossing the Atlantic to manage the Puerto Rico Islanders. Whitbread would go on to also coach at the international level with Bahrain's U-23 side, before returning to Puerto Rico.

alglish was hired as the second head coach in Fury FC history on Nov. 20, 2015, culminating in a Fall Season championship. The son of Scottish legend Kenny Dalglish, Paul Dalglish came across the pond to begin his managerial career in


2008, following a playing career that spanned more than a decade.

Dalglish's first stop was as the head coach for FC Tampa Bay. After Tampa Bay, Dalglish accepted a job manager of the Austin Aztex for the club's expansion season in the USL PDL. The following year, Dalglish led Austin to the league's best record at 15-1-2 en route to a league championship in a season. The performance earned Dalglish USL PDL Coach of the Year Honors.

The following season, Dalglish became an assistant coach to Jeff Cassar with MLS side Real Salt Lake before returning for a final season with the Aztex prior to signing on with Ottawa Fury FC.




