INDY ELEVEN STARTS "TAKE TWO" ON THE

ROAD IN ATLANTA: Indy Eleven will start off the second chapter of its NASL story on Saturday, April 4, when it renews its entertaining series against the Atlanta Silverbacks. Kickoff from Atlanta Silverbacks Park in Atlanta is set for 7:30 p.m. ET, and the match can be viewed across the nation — and the world — on ESPN3.com and other ESPN online platforms.

Indy Eleven and Atlanta wrapped up their series in 2014 all even at 1-1-1, and it can be argued that the combined three-game set against Atlanta provided more action and entertainment than against any other opponent during Indy's inaugural season. Silverbacks Park will not daunt the "Boys in Blue," who went undefeated in Georgia last year with a win and a draw.

CAN ELEVEN CARRY OVER MOMENTUM? After taking awhile to adapt to the talent and playing level in the NASL in 2014, Indy Eleven fans and players alike didn't want the season to end last fall after Indiana's Team went undefeated across the final five games, its longest such stretch of the inaugural campaign last year. The 3W-2D-0L run was no fluke, as Indy Eleven defeated the league's regular season champion, Minnesota United FC, and eventual Soccer Bowl trophy hoister, the San Antonio Scorpions, at home in addition to garnering positive away results against New York, Ottawa and Tampa Bay ...

2014 MATCH SUMMARIES vs ATLANTA

ATL 3:3 IND – June 13, 2014: Three goals in a four-minute span in the opening 15 minutes gave Atlanta a 2-1 lead. A red card shown to Indy Eleven defender Fejiro Okiomah while being a goal down should have doomed the visitors, but the fourth penalty kick of the match – a conversion by late-game substitute Kleberson in the 88th minute – gave Indiana's Team a well-earned point from the Spring Season finale for both sides.

IND 2:4 ATL – Aug. 2, 2014: The Boys in Blue would fall behind 2-0 by the midway point in the first half (Junior Burgos 5', Pablo Cruz 21') and could never catch up in a disappointing loss at Carroll Stadium. PK conversions by Kleberson (43', 55') would draw Indy Eleven back to within one goal on two occasions, but a mistaken-identity red card to Sergio Pena in the 65th minute would dig Indy's hole even further, while Junior Sandoval's 83rd minute tally iced the result for the Silverbacks.

ATL 1:2 IND – Sept. 6, 2014: Indy Eleven raced out to a 2-0 lead before holding on for dear life to the full three points in a result that snapped a six-game winless streak. Jermaine Johnson's tally at the quarter-hour mark would give Indy Eleven the lead, while Blake Smith's finish off a textbook counter-attack would double the advantage in the 37th minute. Blair Gavin's goal off a set-piece opportunity at the death of the first half and a save of Kleberson's fourth PK attempt of the season against Atlanta five minutes into the second half could have deflated Indy Eleven, but the visitors would see out the result across a second half that saw goalkeeper Kristian Nicht stand tall on numerous occasions.

DOING IT WITH "D": So what's was the secret to Indy Eleven's end-of-season success last year? A record-setting defense ... after giving up multiple goals in six of its first nine games in Fall Season play (10 GF/18 GA), Indy Eleven righted the ship defensively, doing so just twice across its last nine games (11 GF/8 GA).

That run, during which Indy compiled a 4W-3D-2L record, included shutouts in three straight contests, which helped Indy Eleven and Kristian Nicht to a 397-minute shutout streak that broke the NASL record for the longest by a team and goalkeeper, respectively [Sept. 27 vs Carolina (53') through Oct. 26 at Ottawa (90+')].

FAMILIAR FOES: Opposing center backs Greg Janicki and Rauwshan McKenzie may be new to their respective clubs, but the duo is plenty familiar with each other after suiting up for Michigan State between 2004-06. While the duo will be focused on securing three points, they could also be asking for updates from the bench on the Spartans' Final Four match-up against Duke in Indy, which will begin during Saturday's warm-ups at Silverbacks Park.

INFIRMARY UPDATE: The injury bug that plagued midfielder Kleberson throughout Indy Eleven's opening season last year has transferred to season two, as the Brazilian World Cup champion will be out for at least Indy Eleven's 2015 season opener at Atlanta on Saturday with left hamstring tightness. Also on the "OUT" list for Saturday is new defender Judson McKinney, who will undergo a procedure this week to clean up a bone chip and Osteochondritis dissecans in his left ankle.

Midfielder Victor Pineda was listed as "QUESTIONABLE" on Thursday's report, but did train with the squad in Atlanta on Friday.

THE ROAD WELL TRAVELED: Indy Eleven became adept at gaining results on the road in 2014, with the squad going 4W-2D-3L in away affairs during Fall Season play. When factoring in its 0W-2D-2L mark during the Spring Season, Indy Eleven finished its inaugural season with a 4W-4D-5L (19 GF / 24 GA) road record overall last year.

On the flip side, the squad finished its home slate with a 2-7-5 record, during which Indy was outscored 16-22 in regular season play. However, since snapping a five-game home losing streak with a scoreless draw on Aug. 6 vs. Fort Lauderdale, Indy went 2-2-3 at Carroll Stadium with a +1 goal differential (7 GF/6 GA).

EVERYTHING OLD IS NEW AGAIN: The biggest question during Indy Eleven's offseason was if the squad would be able to keep the pieces of the roster it wanted into season two, especially after the promising end to the club's inaugural campaign. Head Coach/Director of Soccer Ops Juergen Sommer and President/GM Peter Wilt went to work immediately in November and went deep into the preseason to secure its returning core, their efforts ending with 14 of the 21 players on Saturday's opening day roster having spent at least five games with Indy last season. On the opposite side, Atlanta's massive overhaul in the offseason will see just four players return from last season's closing roster.
