OH CANADA: Indy Eleven will make the first of its three 2015 treks north of the border and into Canada this weekend for Saturday's affair against its "Class of 2014" mate, Ottawa Fury FC. Kickoff for the Saturday matinee is set for 3:00 p.m. ET and can be seen across the United States online via ESPN3.com streaming video and across the world on additional ESPN online platforms.

International travel treated Indy Eleven well last season, as the "Boys in Blue" brought the full three points back across the border from NASL Fall Season wins at FC Edmonton (1-0 W on July 27, 2014) and Ottawa (2-1 W on Oct. 26). Indy Eleven was merely returning the favor against Ottawa, who had previously captured the season series thanks to a pair of wins at IUPUI's Carroll Stadium on May 17 (2-4 L) and August 23 (1-2 L).

ROAD WARRIORS: Indy Eleven had been riding a nearly record-length wave of good fortune on the road ... that was until a 0-1 loss at Jacksonville on May 9 derailed the team's five-game away undefeated streak, just one off the NASL's modern era record. However, Indiana's Team will still have the opportunity to even its all-time away ledger when it travels to Ottawa this Saturday, a record that currently sits at 5W-5D-6L (22 GF / 27 GA).

Indy Eleven became adept at gaining results on the road last year, with the squad going 4W-2D-3L in away affairs during Fall Season play (including a 2-1 win over Ottawa at TD Place on Oct. 26).

LAST TIME OUT – UNITED'S OFFENSIVE FRONT OVERTAKES INDY: Minnesota United FC used second half goals from Justin Davis and Juliano Vicentini to break a deadlock with Indy Eleven in the standings and on the scoreboard in a 3-1 win last Saturday at a sold-out Carroll Stadium.

The Loons would break through first in the 22nd minute via a dead ball opportunity, as midfielder Kalif Alhassan sent a screaming 28-yard free kick past Indy 'keeper Keith Cardona and into the upper right 90 to put the visitors up.

Minnesota carried that lead into the halftime break, but it would not last for long as Indy Eleven capitalized on its own set piece in the 49th minute. Midfielder Dylan Mares sent a well-struck corner kick to the top of the six, from where midfielder Sergio Peña crushed it into the back of the net with a header to even the score 1-1.

From there, possession would go back-and-forth until Minnesota made the most out of an opportunity in the 63rd minute. Pablo Campos' initial effort was saved by a diving Cardona into the left side of the box, but Davis beat his mark to the rebound and finished into an open net to give Minnesota the lead once again at 2-1.

More and more, Indy would build up strength into the attacking third, but United FC would hold strong and eventually double its advantage. The dagger came in the 83rd minute when substitute forward Christian Ramirez played a through ball past Indy defenders to Vicentini, who slotted a low shot into the bottom right corner of goal to bring the score to its final 3-1 finish.

SOMMER SHAKES THINGS UP: Indy Eleven head coach Juergen Sommer looked to shake up a stagnant attack last Saturday night, as he made numerous changes to his starting XI for the match against Minnesota United. Whether it was due to injury or form, the Indy Eleven manager made four changes to the squad that suffered its first defeat the previous weekend in Jacksonville in addition to trying out a new-look 4-5-1 formation:

- Defenders Cory Miller and Kyle Hyland got their first starts of the season, coming in for Greg Janicki and Jaime Frias, respectively
- Dylan Mares was reinserted into the attacking center midfield role, in front of holding mids Sergio Pena and Brad Ring in the middle of the park
- Charlie Rugg was plugged back into the first choice squad, but out wide right for Victor Pineda.
- Rugg was opposite fellow striker Brian Brown, who moved back to replace Osman Melgares on the left flank

Sommer to make last weekend was to reinsert recently reacquired goalkeeper Kristian Nicht back into the first XI. However, the former USMNT 'keeper decided instead to give another week of rest to the German veteran after his whirlwind fortnight with the Montreal Impact, allowing Keith Cardona to make his second straight start between the posts. The former New York Red Bulls Academy product Cardona would bear the brunt of Minnesota's attack, allowing a season-high three goals in the defeat at Carroll Stadium last Saturday. Few will know what Sommer's mindset will be on whom to put between the posts until the line-up sheets come out on Saturday.

GOALS HARD TO COME BY: While Indy Eleven is one of only three teams yet to record a shutout to this point in the season (alongside Carolina and Edmonton), it has also only been shut out one time – a 1-0 loss on May 9 in Jacksonville. Meanwhile, after scoring once in each of its first four games of the season, Ottawa has been kept off the scoreboard in its last two matches (0-1 L @ New York on May 2, 0-0 D v Tampa Bay on May 9), allowing the Canadian club to stew over a 247-minute goalless streak during its bye week last weekend. On the flip side, Ottawa has also been able to keep a pair of clean sheets during the campaign.

STINGY SATURDAY? To the point in the previous note, goals might be hard to come by when Indy and Ottawa clash in the Canadian capital Saturday. Ottawa's four goals on the season currently ranks dead last among the NASL's 11 teams, while Indy Eleven's six tallies places above only Ottawa and Atlanta (5). Meanwhile, both teams have had respectable defensive numbers this season, their eight goals allowed each placing them smack dab in the middle of the NASL table in the category, tied for 6th alongside Jacksonville.

TOP HALF OF TABLE WITHIN REACH WITH

WIN: One look at the NASL table below heading into Spring Season Round 8 shows that, well, a Spring Season title and the automatic berth in The Championship playoff tourney that comes with it is, while mathematically still doable, not a strong likelihood for Indy Eleven. However, a win on Saturday and some help from across the league could see Indy Eleven jump from 9th all the way up to fourth place in a jam-packed middle of the table:

home cookin': In contrast to its ability to trade blows on the road, Indy Eleven's struggles at home in 2014 were well documented, but the squad's two victories to close out its Carroll Stadium slate against the NASL's top two teams across the regular season – Minnesota United FC (2-0 W on Oct. 11) and the eventual champion San Antonio Scorpions (1-0 W on Oct. 18) left everyone with fuzzy memories heading into year two. When factoring in a pair of 1-1 draws against New York and Carolina to open the 2015 slate at "The Mike" and last Saturday's 1-3 defeat to Minnesota, Indy Eleven is nearly .500 (2W-5D-3L) at Carroll Stadium with a -1 goal differential (10 GF/11 GA) over its last 10 home games (2W-7D-8L all-time at home).

RING DONS ARMBAND FOR FIRST TIME: With regular captain Greg Janicki earning a rest to nurse a nagging calf injury, veteran midfielder Brad Ring got the honor of wearing the captain's armband for the "Boys in Blue" last weekend against Minnesota. Ring is the fifth player to wear the "C" in team history, joining Janicki, Kristian Nicht, Kleberson and Erick Norales.

KLEBERSON GOES UNEDR THE KNIFE: Brazilian star midfielder Kleberson underwent successful surgery on Tuesday to repair a torn right Achilles tendon, an injury he suffered in training on May 12. The 2002 World Cup champion was close to wrapping up his first day of neutral training on his way back from a nagging hamstring ailment before suffering the non-contact injury. The 35-year-old midfielder led Indy Eleven in scoring with eight goals last season but had not seen the field yet in 2015. No timetable has been set for his return to action.

INDY HOPES PENN'S LACROIX IS MIGHTIER

THAN THE SWORD: Indy Eleven brought their roster count to 23 this week with the addition of University of Pennsylvania graduate and striker Duke LaCroix. In his time with the Quakers, the 21 year-old New Jersey native racked up a number of illustrious honors, including four All-lvy League Team placements (First Team in 2013 & 2014), the 2011 lvy League Rookie of the Year award and the 2013 lvy League Offensive Player of the Year honor. In all, Lacroix bagged 25 goals and added 15 assist during his UPenn career in 68 games. Lacroix, who spent some time with Indy Eleven during the team's preseason in March, arrived in Indianapolis on Wednesday and is officially available for selection by head coach Juergen Sommer for Saturday's trip to Ottawa.

INDY TO OPEN UP IN OPEN CUP WEDNESDAY:

Indy Eleven will have a busy week in store thanks to its debut in the 2015 edition of the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup next Wednesday, May 27, when the "Boys in Blue" will welcome USL side Louisville City FC for a 7:30 p.m. kickoff at IUPUI's Carroll Stadium. The two squads separated by just 90 minutes of I-65 pavement are familiar with each other after meeting in preseason action back on March 21, when Louisville City defeated Indy Eleven by a 2-1 margin in an exhibition match at Ulndy's Key Stadium.

Indy Eleven went 1-1 during its first Open Cup run last year, defeating the Dayton Dutch Lions (USL PRO) at home 5-2 in the 3rd round on May 28 before suffering a heartbreaking 1-2 extra time loss to MLS' Columbus Crew at the University of Akron on June 17.

Should Indy Eleven advance past Louisville City, the reward is a 4th round road game at MLS outfit Chicago Fire in a match scheduled to take place at Toyota Park in Bridgeview, Ill., on June 16 or 17.

"IRONMAN" CONTEST A TWO-MAN RACE: After Kristian Nicht played every minute of every game last year, perhaps the stakes were raised when it came to which member of the "Boys in Blue" would log the most time in 2015. Not only are defenders Marco Franco and Erick Norales the only two players to play all 540 minutes across the team's first six games in 2015, but they're the only ones to start all six as well. An additional five players (Mares, Rugg, Brown, Peña & Smart) have seen some time in every game to this point.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH: After starting the season without any players of rookie status, Indy Eleven has added two players in as many weeks that carry that title. Defender Daniel Keller, a native of Carmel and product of the University of Louisville, was added on May 11, while forward Duke Lacroix is literally fresh out of the University of Pennsylvania, signing with Indy Eleven on Thursday after leaving the Ivy League institution last week with his Bachelor's degree in sociology.

PENA WINS PLAY OF THE WEEK ... AND THE

INTERNET: From the "No Kidding Department" came news on April 22 that midfielder Sergio Pena's stunning game-winner from distance at San Antonio on May 18 his first goal in 18 appearances for Indy – was the runaway winner for the NASL Play of the Week for Week 3, his tally garnering 64% of the fan vote. The video of the goal on Indy Eleven's YouTube page has more than 81,000 views - thanks in part to outlets like ESPN FC, FOX Soccer and Deadspin featuring the goal on the interwebs.

After his 49th minute header last week against Minnesota, the Honduran holding mid is the lone member of the "Boys in Blue" with multiple goals thus far in 2015.

NORALES GOES BACK TO BACK ON TEAM OF

THE WEEK: Indy Eleven defender Erick Norales gained his second straight nod to the NASL Team of the Week on April 29, this following his Week 4 performance in Indy Eleven's 1-1 draw with the Carolina RailHawks. After his six Team of the Week placements last season tied him for the most in defense across 2014, Norales was one of four defenders to earn multiple distinctions during the first four weeks of play in 2015, joining Roversio (NYC), Stefan Antonijevic (TBR) and Blake Wagner (CAR).

The Honduran also became the first member of the "Boys in Blue" to earn multiple Team of the Week honors in 2015, pushing him past defender Jaime Frias (Week 1), forward Brian Brown (Week 2), midfielder Sergio Pena (Week 3) and now former goalkeeper Kristian Nicht (Week 3) in the category. After the team's bye week for Week 5 action, Week 6 marked the first time Indy Eleven was shut out of the weekly best XI after last Saturday's 0-1 defeat in Jacksonville.

INTERNATIONALLY KNOWN: Indiana's Team in "The World's Game" saw a slight re-stock in regards to international talent during the offseason, with midfield newcomers Osman Melgares (Honduras) and Dragan Stojkov (Macedonia) taking the international roster slots previously held by Jermaine Johnson and Corby Moore.

One thing that hasn't changed is Indy Eleven's international feel, as nearly half - 11 of 23 - of the team's players were either born outside the United States or carry duel-citizenship:

EVERYTHING OLD IS NEW AGAIN: The biggest question during Indy Eleven's offseason was if the squad would be able to keep the pieces of the roster it wanted into season two, especially after the promising end to the club's inaugural campaign. Head Coach/Director of Soccer Ops Juergen Sommer and President/GM Peter Wilt went to work immediately in November and went deep into the preseason to secure its returning core, their efforts ending with 14 of the 23 players on the current roster having spent at least five games with Indy last season. The search for more new blood has vielded the addition of rookies Daniel Keller and Duke Lacroix in recent weeks and you can bet your bottom dollar the search for talent will continue into the summer months.

RECAP AT JAX – **MAY 9:** Indy Eleven tasted defeat for the first time in nine games – and eight months dating back to last September – on May 9 in Jacksonville, as Bochy Hoyos' header in the 49th minute would mark the lone goal in Armada FC's 1-0 win at Community First Park.

The first half saw debutant goalkeeper Keith Cardona under fire for most of the opening half hour, but he and the Indy defense bent but didn't break under the barrage of dead ball opportunities created by the home side. The attack showed signs of life in the final 10 minutes of the stanza, but chances by Wojciech Wojcik and Victor Pineda went for naught and the sides entered the break still at 0-0.

The start of the second half saw Jacksonville nearly score off the whistle on a chance by defender Matt Bahner, who would end up playing provider on the goal four minutes later, as his whipped in cross from the right found the head of Hoyos inside the six. The 0-1 deficit woke up the Indy attack, as the "Boys in Blue" ended the match with an edge in shots (17-16) when it was all said and done, but couldn't take advantage of them as they piled up towards the final whistle.

RECAP VS CAR – APRIL 25: Indy Eleven was five minutes away from sharing the top spot, but a late goal by Carolina RailHawks defender Blake Wagner helped the visitors claim a point from a 1-1 draw at a rainy IUPUI Carroll Stadium on April 25.

The sold out home crowd of 10,524 was encouraged by a 6th minute own goal off RailHawks defender Daniel Scott, but were deflated after Wagner's late heroics cost their Eleven two valuable points in the standings.

The home side was buzzing early, and Indy Eleven's high energy – and high pressure – paid off just six minutes in with an own goal off the foot of Carolina's Daniel Scott. With a perfectly timed through ball over the top, Indy forward Wojciech Wojcik found a streaking Charlie Rugg down the right side. The LA Galaxy loanee's cross into the six would be deflected in by Scott, who was sliding towards the Carolina goal as he tried to clear the ball away.

Indy Eleven's repeated failed chances to double the lead – most notably a trio of shots in quick succession in the 78th minute that were either saved by Carolina netminder Hunter Gilstrap or blocked by defenders – came back to haunt them in the 85th minute, when Tiyi Shipalane's cross from the right went to the opposite side of the area where it found a waiting Blake Wagner. The RailHawks defender gathered calmly and smashed a shot from 12 yards past Kristian Nicht and inside the right post to even the match at 1-1, which is how it would end.

RECAP VS SAS – APRIL 18: Just when Indy Eleven looked destined to claim a third straight 1-1 draw to begin the season last Saturday at San Antonio, late substitute midfielder Sergio Pena came to the rescue, his 45-yard bomb in the 89th minute making the difference in a stunning 2-1 victory at Toyota Field over the defending NASL champion.

Indy's backline bent on a couple of occasions in the first half but did not break, as the squads entered the halftime break still locked at 0-0. San Antonio took advantage of an Indy defensive error in the 52nd minute, when Cesar Elizondo stole a poor pass 40 yards from goal, slalomed through three Indy defenders and played Omar Cummings into the area, where the Jamaican slotted low and to the left of Kristian Nicht to give the home side a 1-0 lead. That advantage would be short-lived however, as Erick Norales nodded home Dylan Mares' free kick at the far left post in the 64th minute, a goal that evened things up at 1-1 and brought considerable life back into the "Boys in Blue".

That would set up Pena's late heroics, as the Honduran midfielder, who entered in the 81st minute, accepted fellow substitute Wojciech Wojcik's laid-off header with his chest 10 yards inside midfield. One touch and one bounce later, Pena let rip one of his trademark long-distance shots, the 45-yard effort finding the space between the bottom of the crossbar and the hands of back-peddling goalkeeper Jon Kempin, allowing Indy to steal the full three points and leap into 2nd place in the NASL Spring Season standings.

RECAP @ **ATL** – **APRIL 4:** Indy Eleven fans got used to holding their breath last season ... and that carried over into its season opener April 4th in Atlanta, which Don Smart tied up in second half stoppage time to earn a 1-1 draw at Silverbacks Park.

Good chances were hard to come by in the first 45 minutes for both sides, but the game opened up shortly after the halftime whistle when Shaka Bangura's late run into the area after a failed Indy clearance allowed him to slot home and put Atlanta up 1-0.

The Silverbacks were content to absorb pressure and counter it out to the end, a plan that seemed destined to work until Greg Janicki picked out Jaime Frias' run down the left flank in the 92nd minute. After chesting down with his first touch his second took him into the penalty area, where he was hacked down to earn the late PK. Smart stutter-stepped and sent 'keeper C.J.
