HISTORY vs. OTTAWA: Indy Eleven and its “NASL Class of 2014” mate Ottawa Fury FC will renew acquaintances on Sunday afternoon in the Canadian capital. Indy Eleven trails the series against its expansion brethren 1W-0D-3L, but has an even 1-0-1 mark at TD Place. Of the seven goals scored in their last three meetings, five have been tallied in the 84th minute and afterwards.

Ottawa Fury FC used a late goal by midfielder Nicki Paterson to break a scoreless stalemate and give the home side a 1-0 triumph at TD Place. The loss was the last one suffered by Indy Eleven, as Indiana’s Team has rattled off a five-game undefeated streak in NASL play since the setback in Ontario.

The even affair back in May saw very few chances of much quality develop, the teams combining for just 11 shots in the stingy contest. After a dull first half, the proceedings sprang to life early in the second half with chances for Victor Pineda, Wojciech Wojcik and Brian Brown that all went begging. Ottawa would wrestle control of the match back in the final 15 minutes, punctuated with Paterson’s first-time shot from 12 yards out in the 88th minute to give the home side the full three points. The defeat pushed Indy Eleven’s losing streak at the time to three games.

LAST TIME OUT – INDY COMES BACK TO DOWN CAROLINA:

Indy Eleven pushed its undefeated streak to five games last Saturday via a 2-1 comeback win over the Carolina RailHawks, using goals just minutes apart by Wojciech Wojcik and Erick Norales early in the second half to overcome Austin Da Luz's tally towards the end of the first half.

Indy Eleven would force the issue by creating a handful of dangerous chances within the game's opening quarter-hour, but Indy's finishing touch could not be found. Key injuries to midfielders on both sides – Indy's Brad Ring and Carolina's Tiyi Shipalane – saw both removed in the 23rd minute and changed the dynamic of the match, with Carolina seeing more of the ball as the opening half progressed. It would be Shipalane's replacement, Da Luz, moving the scoreboard first with a splendid leaping header off of Nazmi Albadawi's free kick, the 42nd minute tally giving the visitors a 1-0 advantage going into the break.

But Indy Eleven would storm out of the gates again in the second half, and this time it wouldn't take long for the home side to hit paydirt. It was Wojcik tying things up in the 54th minute, notching his second goal in as many weeks by heading home Kyle Hyland's looping cross to the far right post. Then defender Erick Norales took his turn in the 56th minute, slipping past his mark on a dead ball opportunity swung in by Victor Pineda and finishing on the short-hop from the top of the six to put Indy up 2-1. Several squandered chances to boost the lead by the "Boys in Blue" would cause some nervy moments down the stretch, but Indy would hold on for the full three points.

UNBEATEN STREAK DRIVES TO FIVE: With last Saturday's win against Carolina, Indy Eleven matched its longest single-season unbeaten streak of five games (3W-2D-0L). The current run is even with the five-match streak at the end of the 2014 Fall Season, when Indy Eleven went 3W-2D-0L to round out its Inaugural Season – a run that included a 2-1 win at Ottawa on Oct. 26.

That streak carried over to the first four games of the 2015 NASL Spring Season, creating the club's longest unbeaten streak of nine games. Indy isn't the only NASL team streaking at the moment, as Ottawa (7) and New York (11) are also on lengthy runs. Here's the results from Indy Eleven's current run, which features positive results against three of the four teams currently above Indy on the NASL's combined season table:

ELEVEN ADDS VETERAN DANE RICHARDS ON LOAN FROM NY RED BULLS:

Indy Eleven made some noise on the roster front last Friday when it added Jamaican international midfielder Dane Richards on loan from MLS' New York Red Bulls. Richards, who holds a U.S. Green Card and therefore does not count against the team's seven allocated international player slots on the roster, reported to the Circle City on Monday, trained with the squad all week and will travel to Ottawa for Sunday's clash against Fury FC.

The 31-year-old veteran has 24 goals and 26 assists under his belt in MLS play from his stints with NYRB (2007-12, 2015) and Vancouver (2012), and he places 2nd on the Red Bulls' career lists in minutes (11,598), games played (159) and starts (133). Richards hopped overseas from 2013-14, initially signing with English Championship side Burnley for a short stint before joining Norwegian club FK Bodø/Glimt for most of those seasons.

Richards also brings vast international experience to the Circle City, scoring 10 goals in 45 senior appearances for the Jamaican Men's National Team. He broke into the "Reggae Boyz" side as an 18-year-old in 2002, and featured heavily in the 2008 & 2010 Caribbean Championships, the 2009 Gold Cup and 2010 World Cup Qualifying.

MELGARES LOAN ENDS EARLY:

Indy Eleven announced Wednesday that the club and midfielder Osman Melgares mutually agreed to end their loan agreement, sending the 28-year-old back to Honduran First Division side Real Sociedad. Melgares, who occupied an international roster spot, started 4 of 6 league appearances with Indy (317 min) and went the distance in the squad's U.S. Open Cup clash vs. Louisville in May.

REGAN REGIME ROLLS ON ... WITH SOME

HELP: The “Boys in Blue” have helped usher in the Tim Regan era for Indy Eleven with five straight unbeaten matches across NASL and international friendly play for the interim head coach and director of soccer operations. However, Regan will have to share the credit for last weekend’s 2-1 win over Carolina, as assistant coach Kleberon was the man in charge on the Indy sideline during the win. That scenario stemmed from Regan’s ejection from the bench late in Indy’s July 5 match at the New York Cosmos, although Regan was able to address his charges before the match and during halftime.

In an effort to shake Indy Eleven from a slow start to the 2015 season, Indy Eleven President/GM Peter Wilt made changes to his technical staff on June 2, relieving Sommer of his Head Coach and Director of Soccer Operations duties and naming former assistant Regan as the interim man in charge of both roles. In addition, Wilt removed assistant coach Paul Telfer and announced midfielder Kleberon would serve as assistant under Regan while rehabbing from an Achilles injury.

Regan brings impressive credentials on the field and the sidelines into his new dual role, the Orland Hills, Ill.-native enjoying a decorated career at Bradley University before being selected in the 2nd round of the 2003 MLS SuperDraft by the MetroStars, which at the time was under the direction of future United States and Egyptian National Team coach Bob Bradley – the first coach hired by Wilt during his tenure with MLS’ Chicago Fire. Regan would appear in 81 regular season contests across six seasons in North America’s top flight with MetroStars (2003-05), Chivas USA (2006), New York Red Bulls (2007) and Toronto FC (2008).

Regan’s primary role with Toronto FC in 2008 was as the team’s Chief Scout, a role he kept until 2011. Concurrent to that position, Regan also worked with U.S. Soccer as an assistant coach for the U.S. Under-17, U-18 & U-20 National Teams, eventually parlaying that into a Technical Advisor role with the Federation in 2011. Prior to joining Indy Eleven as the team’s first assistant coach on Nov. 11, 2013, Regan’s most recent role was with St. Louis Scott Gallagher, where he served as the famed youth club’s Development Academy Director, with duties including coaching the U.S. Soccer Development Academy program’s U-17/18 squad.

GETTING OFFENSIVE: During its current 5-game undefeated streak Indy Eleven has scored 10 goals, this after the “Boys in Blue” tallied just 6 times goals in their opening 7 games of the 2015 season. The 2-1 win over Carolina last Saturday marked the fourth time in those five games in which Indy has scored multiple goals, a feat it accomplished just once across its first 7 matches (4/18 @ SAS, 2-1 W).

SHARING THE SCORING LOAD: That offensive outbreak has been coming from multiple sources, with seven different “Boys in Blue” hitting the back of the net during the team’s five-game undefeated stretch. Dylan Mares, Wojciech Wojcik and Victor Pineda have each scored twice in the stretch, giving them a share of the team’s scoring lead alongside Erick Norales, Brian Brown and Sergio Pena. In all, nine different Indy Eleven players have combined for 15 goals in 2015 (not counting own goal vs. Carolina on 4/25).

ROAD WARRIORS ARE BACK: After back-to-back losses on the road in May, Indy Eleven returned to its “Road Warrior” form with a 2-1 win in Fort Lauderdale on June 6 and a 1-1 draw at New York during its last road trip on July 5 to kick off the Fall Season. Prior to its May 9 setback at Jacksonville, Indy had been riding a nearly record-length wave of good fortune on the road, that 0-1 loss derailing the team’s five-game away undefeated streak – just one off the NASL’s modern era record.

The July 5 tie at the Cosmos brought Indy Eleven’s all-time away mark to 6W-6D-7L (25 GF / 30 GA). Indy Eleven became adept at gaining results on the road following its slow start last year, as Indiana’s Team is actually over .500 away from Carroll Stadium in the 15 road games played since the start of the 2014 Fall Season (6W-4D-5L).

HOME COOKIN’ IMPROVES WITH BIG WIN: In contrast to its ability to trade blows on the road, Indy Eleven’s struggles at home have been well documented. The squad’s two victories to close out its 2014 Carroll Stadium slate against the NASL’s top two teams across the regular season – Minnesota United FC (2-0 W on Oct. 11) and the eventual champion San Antonio Scorpions (1-0 W on Oct. 18) – left everyone with fuzzy memories heading into year two.

The alarming trend had crept back into “The Mike,” the squad going winless at home (0W-3D-2L) in all competitions to start 2015 – that is, until the “Boys in Blue” righted the ship in a big way with a 3-0 win on June 13 vs. FC Edmonton that was easily the most dominating performance in club history – regardless of the venue. That turnaround continued last weekend with its 2-1 come from behind victory over Carolina – who came into “The Mike” in April and snatched two points near the death by scoring late to force a 1-1 draw. Despite the struggles to start the campaign, Indy Eleven is above .500 (4W-6D-3L) at Carroll Stadium with a +3 goal differential (17 GF/14 GA) over its last 13 regular season home games across all competitions (4W-8D-8L all-time at home).

INDY KEEPS CLIMBING: Is it too early to talk playoff positioning? With 18 games left to play, the obvious answer is ... well, of course! But forgive Indy Eleven fans for being excited about the chase for “The Championship,” as Indiana’s Team has clawed its way into the top half of the NASL’s combined season table in the last month.

While Indy was leapt in the standings midweek by Minnesota, the now 5th-place Eleven (17 pts) gained significant ground on 3rd place Carolina with its win last Saturday and now sits one point behind both the RailHawks and United FC (both on 18 pts.) on the combined table. Since resting at the bottom of the standings heading into its June 6 match up at Fort Lauderdale, Indy has climbed six spots in its last five weeks of action.

WOJ WINS PLAY OF THE WEEK ... AGAIN!: Indy Eleven forward Wojciech Wojcik might get a little spoiled, as the 23-year-old striker saw each of his first two goals voted as the NASL Play of the Week during the opening two weeks of the Fall Season. Both Wojcik’s Indy Eleven account opener on July 5 at New York – a smashing 26th minute volley – and last Saturday’s 54th minute header off of Kyle Hyland’s looping back post cross were runaway winners in the fan voting. “Woj” is just the second Indy Eleven player to claim the award this season, following up on Sergio Pena’s finish from 45 yards out against San Antonio on April 18.

DEATH, TAXES, NORALES ON TEAM OF THE WEEK: Pretty soon they’ll just start calling it the “Erick Norales & Friends Team of the Week!” Indy Eleven defender Erick Norales claimed his fourth straight spot on the NASL Team of the Week – and NASL-best sixth of the 2015 season – this past Wednesday, being recognized for his goal-scoring and defensive efforts in last Saturday’s 2-1 win over Carolina. Joining Norales on the team this week was forward Wojciech Wojcik, the towering striker earning his first-ever placement on the league’s weekly “Best XI” thanks to his goal-scoring exploits against the RailHawks.

Indy Eleven has now seen nine different players earn a spot on the league’s weekly honor roll: DF Jaime Frias (Spring Week 1), FW Brian Brown (Spr 2), MF Sergio Pena (Spr 3), GK Kristian Nicht (Spr 4) DF Kyle Hyland (Spr 9), MF Victor Pineda (Spr 10), Dylan Mares (Spr 11), Wojcik (Fall 2) and Norales (Spr 3, 4, 10 & 11; Fall 1 & 2).

FRANCO INDY’S “IRONMAN”: 23-year-old right back Marco Franco is the only member of Indy Eleven to play all 1080 minutes of league play this season – and also is the only “Boy in Blue” to start all 12 games (although Mares, Rugg & Brown have all appeared in every game). The streak for Franco doesn’t stop there, as the ex-Chicago Fire man has played every minute of Indy Eleven’s last 19 games (including U.S. Open Cup play) dating back to his season-ending six-game starting run that began last September.

MARES ON A ROLL: Indy Eleven midfielder Dylan Mares might not have put his name on the scoresheet in the team’s last two games, but the playmaker continues to create havoc and dangerous chances for the “Boys in Blue”. Mares enjoyed a recent 3-game scoring streak, during which he notched a goal on a penalty kick and an assist on Brian Brown’s opener in the Spring finale on June 13 vs. FC Edmonton, scored his first goal of the season May 30th vs. Tampa Bay and tallied an assist on June 6th at Fort Lauderdale. Mares is now tied for third in the NASL with 4 helpers alongside FC Edmonton’s Lance Laing and Carolina’s Tiyi Shipalane, the trio sitting one assist behind leaders Georgi Hristov of Tampa Bay and Billy Forbes of San Antonio. Mares now has 4 of the team’s 9 assists on the season, is the club’s all-time leader in the category (6) and is also tied for the team lead in scoring this season with a pair of goals.

NICHT’S A KEEPER: Kristian Nicht continued his steady play between the posts for Indy Eleven in last week’s 2-1 win, making three saves – including a crucial low stop in the 45th minute that could have doubled Carolina’s 1-0 lead at the time. The 33-year-old German returned from a fortnight cameo with MLS’ Montreal Impact in early May with a start on May 23 at Ottawa and continues to impress, his 27 saves on the year placing tied for 3rd in the NASL, while his 1.00 goals against average places him T-4th amongst goalkeepers who have logged at least 450 minutes of action this season.

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER: When you're watching an Indy Eleven game, here's a piece of advice – DON'T LEAVE EARLY! Nine of Indy Eleven's 17 points this season have been earned by goals coming in the 85th minute or later. Six of those points came during Indy's current undefeated streak, starting with Kyle Hyland's 98th minute goal that brought the Tampa Bay game on May 30 to a 2-2 draw, while Victor Pineda's 93rd minute goal on June 6 lifted Indy to a 2-1 win at Fort Lauderdale. Here's the rundown of the late game tallies that have earned – and cost – the "Boys in Blue" points:

KLEBERSON GOES UNDER THE KNIFE – AND

TO THE SIDELINE: Midfielder Kleberison underwent successful surgery on May 19 to repair a torn right Achilles tendon, an injury he suffered in training on May 12. The 2002 World Cup champion was close to wrapping up his first day of training on his way back from a hamstring ailment before suffering the non-contact injury. No timetable has been set for his return to action, however, the Brazilian legend will keep plenty busy while he rehabs after assuming assistant coaching duties under new interim head coach Tim Regan on June 2.

RECORD-SETTING WIN: Indy Eleven's 3-0 win in the Spring Season finale over FC Edmonton on June 13 matched or surpassed numerous clubs marks:

- The 3-goal margin of victory was the largest ever for the team in NASL play (defeated Dayton Dutch Lions of then-USL PRO 5-2 in USOC play on 5/28/14)
- The three goals scored is tied for the most in NASL play (6/07/14 @ ATL, 3-3 D)
- Marked the first time Indy Eleven had scored multiple goals in NASL play in three straight games (its 7 goals scored in those three games is the most for squad in a 3-game span)

INTERNATIONALLY KNOWN: Indiana's Team in "The World's Game" saw a slight re-stock in regards to international talent during the offseason, with midfield newcomers Osman Melgares (Honduras) and Dragan Stojkov (Macedonia) taking the international roster slots previously held by Jermaine Johnson and Corby Moore.

One thing that hasn't changed is Indy Eleven's international feel, as now half – 12 of 24 – of the team's players following the addition of midfielder Dane Richards were either born outside the United States or carry dual-citizenship:

EVERYTHING OLD IS NEW AGAIN: The biggest question during Indy Eleven's offseason was if the squad would be able to keep the pieces of the roster it wanted into season two, especially after the promising end to the club's inaugural campaign. The team's technical staff went to work immediately in November and went deep into the preseason to secure its returning core, their efforts ending with 14 of the 24 players on the current roster having spent at least five games with Indy last season. The search for more new blood has yielded the addition of rookies Daniel Keller and Duke Lacroix in May and Dane Richards just this past week, with the promise of more reinforcements on the way.

RECAP @ NYC – JULY 5: Indy Eleven and New York met for the fifth time last Sunday at James M. Shuart Stadium – and for the fifth time the two sides finished even, dueling to a 1-1 draw to start their respective NASL Fall Season slates.

It was the “Boys in Blue” cracking the score sheet first in the 26th minute via Wojciech Wojcik. The goal came when a hard-working Dragan Stojkov deflected a Jimmy Mulligan clearance into the air which Wojcik ran onto and volleyed past Cosmos “keeper Jimmy Maurer for his first goal in an Indy Eleven kit. Indiana’s Team would continue to press the action for the rest of the first half and entered the locker room with the 1-0 lead.

Duke Lacroix looked to be a man on a mission on the night, creating numerous scoring chances throughout, including a pair in the opening minutes of the second half – the first requiring a save from Maurer, the second thwarted when his rounding of Maurer on a breakaway went awry due to a heavy touch.

The Cosmos would capitalize on Indy Eleven’s inability to double the advantage in the 78th minute. Walter Restrepo danced between Indy defenders and put a shot that forced a Kristian Nicht save as his left post. The save deflected back off of Restrepo’s head and rolled into the back of the Indy net to level the game. NYC continued to attack, but an apparent 86th minute goal was wiped away due to a late offside call, negating the best chance for either side down the stretch.

RECAP v. MORELIA (FRIENDLY) – JUNE 28: Indy Eleven squared off with Mexican first division side Monarcas Morelia last Sunday in the club’s [historic inaugural international friendly](#) in front of 6,450 fans at Carroll Stadium. In the end, despite relentless attacking play from both teams up through the final whistle it wouldn’t prove enough to make a mark on the score sheet, the match ending in a scoreless draw.

Indy Eleven came out on the attack first in the 7th minute when a Jaime Frias cross found the head of attacker Wojciech Wojcik, but he could not keep it on frame and the ball sailed over the goal. The “Boys in Blue” would not be done there, though, as they notched threatening attacks through Brian Brown and Brad Ring in the 9th and 24th minutes respectively, but neither of those chances would find the back of the net.

Morelia had a dangerous chance of their own on a counter-attack in the 33rd minute. A ball was slotted by midfielder Mauro Cejas for Carlos Ochoa, but Ochoa’s shot was saved by the outstretched leg of Indy Eleven ‘keeper Kristian Nicht.
