HISTORY vs. SAN ANTONIO: Indy Eleven enters Saturday's tilt in Texas with an even 2W-2L-0D record all-time against the defending NASL champions, a ledger that includes a 1W-1L-0D split in the Alamo City

"Indiana's Team" took the two sides' first meeting of 2015 back on April 18 at Toyota Field in dramatic fashion, as second half goals by Erick Norales and Sergio Peña – the latter on a 45-yard golazo – gave Indy Eleven a 2-1 comeback win. Indy Eleven's only other visit to Texas last August 9 resulted in a 0-2 defeat.

The two sides will close out their season series in Indianapolis on Saturday, October 10.

LAST TIME OUT – ELEVEN SINK ARMADA 3-0:

Riding clinical counter-attacking offense and a third shutout of the 2015 season, Indy Eleven secured a dominant 3-0 victory over Jacksonville Armada FC in front of 9,078 fans at Carroll Stadium. Eleven striker Zach Steinberger paced the home side with his first two goals of the year – both set up by midfielder Don Smart – while Marvin Ceballos came off the bench to punctuate an offensive outburst that overwhelmed the visiting Armada.

Steinberger punched home just nine minutes into the contest, racing through the middle of the field and getting behind the defense. Steinberger started the play in an offside position but was rescued by a hustling Smart, who himself was sprung by a long through ball from midfield by forward Dane Richards.

Indy Eleven was able to absorb pressure and dominate the quality chances throughout the night, outshooting Jacksonville 17-6 despite holding just 41% of the possession on the night. Steinberger's second would come again up route 1 through Richards & Smart, the Houston Dynamo loanee chipping Sierra and following his effort to the goal line to double the Indy advantage.

Ceballos would close things out in stoppage time with a brilliant individual effort, his blast from outside the area giving Sierra no chance and wrapping up an evening that also included goalkeeper Keith Cardona's first win and clean sheet in the professional ranks.

INFIRMARY UPDATE: Indy Eleven's injury woes have cleared up almost entirely, with four members of the central midfield – Brad Ring, Daniel Keller, Dylan Mares and Sergio Pena – all returning from injuries of varying degrees within the last month.

Mares officially made his return after more than a month off last Saturday, his 2-minute cameo against Jacksonville ending a streak of seven games missed due to surgery on his partially torn right meniscus on July 31. Meanwhile, after participating in full training for the last couple of weeks Peña has been cleared to return to game action for the first time since undergoing compartment syndrome surgery on both of his legs in late May.

But the list has not been totally cleared, as forward Charlie Rugg will miss Saturday's match at San Antonio due to a sports hernia injury, while defender Kyle Hyland is doubtful after suffering from flu-like symptoms late in the week.

DIAMONDS AREN'T FOREVER: Indy Eleven interim head coach Tim Regan hadn't tinkered much with his formation since taking over in June, but he's made one minor tweak over the last two games that's appeared to make big dividends. In an effort to get the "Boys in Blue" to play better team defense across the field following a 7-1 defeat at Fort Lauderdale on Aug. 29, Regan eschewed the team's usual diamond midfield formation and went to more of a "flat 4" midfield, utilizing holding mids Brad Ring and Daniel Keller side by side in the middle.

The result has been a pair of improved defensive efforts, the squad conceding more possession on one hand but also limiting chances against Minnesota and Jacksonville over the last two games while creating quality chances in attack primarily through the counter-attack. While no points were earned from the 0-1 loss at Minnesota last Wednesday, the squad responded with perhaps the team's most complete effort of the season last Saturday in a 3-0 win over Jacksonville Armada FC.

BRACE YOURSELF: Zach Steinberger made a good first impression in his opening start up top alongside Dane Richards last Saturday, opening his scoring account in checkers with a brace in the 3-0 win over Jacksonville. Steinberger has made an appearance in seven of the eight contests he's been available for since joining on loan from the Houston Dynamo in late July, including six starting nods – all at attacking midfielder up until last Saturday.

Steinberger joined a shortlist of Indy Eleven players with a brace, marking just the fourth such effort in the team's now 49 regular season contests – and second in 2015:

DOG DAYS OF SUMMER FINALLY OVER: Indy Eleven endured a strenuous – and stressful – three-week stretch to forget from July 18 through Aug. 8, when a pair of losses to Ottawa Fury FC bookmarked a five-game winless stretch. During that rough 21-day patch, “Indiana’s Team” went 0W-1D-4L (the lone draw coming on July 25 vs. New York, 1-1).

A much-needed 11-day break followed, and Indy Eleven rebounded to go 2W-1D-2L during an even more hectic stretch that followed, capping a five-game, 18-day gauntlet with last Saturday’s 3-0 win over Jacksonville.

CARDONA COMES IN: Goalkeeper Keith Cardona followed a rare – but solid – start last Wednesday (Sep. 2) at Minnesota, with his first professional win and shutout just three days later at home against Jacksonville. Cardona kept Indy in the Minnesota game with a career-high four saves but suffered the loss in a 0-1 defeat, but had a relatively easy evening last Saturday, making three saves against Jacksonville to post his career firsts. The New Jersey native is now 1W-0D-4L with a 1.40 GAA in his five starts this season.

The shutout was the third for Indy Eleven this season, with incumbent starter Kristian Nicht (5W-7D-5L, 1.65 GAA) earning the first two on June 13 vs. FC Edmonton (3-0 W) and the team’s previous home game before the Jacksonville against on Aug. 19 vs. Tampa Bay (2-0 W).

SHARING THE SCORING LOAD: Zach Steinberger and Marvin Ceballos became the 12th and 13th players, respectively, to score in checkers last weekend against Jacksonville. The collective baker’s dozen has combined to register 26 goals thus far (the 27th came via own goal by Carolina’s Zach Scott). The 13 different goal scorers ties Indy with Ottawa for the most in the NASL. Meanwhile, this weekend’s opponent San Antonio is tied for the least amount of scorers with nine (tied w/ ATL & JAX).

The even scoring distribution has resulted in Dane Richards, Dylan Mares and Erick Norales leading the squad with three tallies each, placing one goal ahead of seven others on their heels – Wojciech Wojcik, Victor Pineda, Brian Brown, Sergio Pena, Don Smart, Duke Lacroix and Zach Steinberger. Defenders Kyle Hyland and Judson McKinney round out the group of goal-scorers on Indy with one each.

THE FIRST CUT IS THE DEEPEST: Throughout the 2015 combined season, Indy Eleven has allowed the first goal 14 times in 22 games – including its lone meeting against San Antonio back on April 18, when the “Boys in Blue” rebounded across the final half hour to capture a 2-1 win at Toyota Field. All nine of Indy’s losses have come after conceding first, with the squad compiling a 3W-2D-9L record in those 14 contests.

THE WITCHING HALF-HOUR: Indy Eleven bucked its trend of conceding across the final half hour last weekend against Jacksonville, scoring twice after the hour mark to put away its 3-0 win at Carroll Stadium. Indy Eleven has held its own in the first 60 minutes of games with a -1 goal differential (17 GF / 18 GA), but has lost its grip in the final half hour with a -7 mark (10 GF / 17 GA).

INDY ADDS TO ATTACK WITH CUEVAS: After training with the “Boys in Blue” since July, Indy Eleven was finally able to officially add midfielder Daniel Cuevas to its roster on Thursday. The 22-year-old former U.S. Under-20 Men’s National Team standout will be available for selection when Indy travels to San Antonio on Saturday.

The native of Sacramento, Calif., most recently suited up for Mexican second division (Ascenso MX) side Lobos BUAP, where he played for two seasons from 2013-14 while on loan from Liga MX powerhouse Santos Laguna.

The versatile Cuevas, who can play centrally or on the left in the midfield or up top, first got on the radar of the American soccer public in February 2013, when he scored twice in three appearances for the U.S. U-20’s during the CONCACAF qualifying tournament to secure the USA’s spot in that June’s FIFA U-20 World Cup in Turkey. Cuevas would appear off the bench in all three group stage matches during that tournament – alongside new Indy Eleven teammate Victor Pineda – and scored the equalizer in a 1-1 draw with eventual tournament champion France.

HOME COOKIN’: After going winless in its first 12 home games at Carroll Stadium in 2014, Indy Eleven has since gone 6W-4D-3L in its last 13 outings at “The Mike” – starting with last year’s two wins to close out the home slate. Thanks to its 3-0 win over Jacksonville on Sep. 5, Indy has surpassed the .500 mark during its 2015 home slate, its record at Carroll Stadium now sitting at 4W-4D-3L (17 GF / 14 GA).

ROAD WOES CREEPING IN: After going a respectable 2W-1D-2L on the road during the Spring Season, the grueling NASL road trips have started to take their toll on Indy Eleven, which has gone winless (0W-2D-4L) in six away affairs to start the Fall Season (2W-3D-6L overall). Prior to its May 9 loss at Jacksonville, Indy was actually on the cusp of a record-setting performance on the road, that 0-1 defeat derailing the team’s five-game away undefeated streak – which was just one off the NASL’s modern era record.

Indy Eleven’s all-time away mark now stands at 6W-7D-11L (29 GF / 45 GA) following last Wednesday’s loss at Minnesota. Indy Eleven will close out its season with four of eight on the road.

DOWN THE STRETCH THEY COME: Indy Eleven's win against Jacksonville kept the squad within one win of the top half of the Combined Season standings and very much in contention for a spot in The Championship, now sitting tied for 8th place.

Despite averaging just a point per game in the Fall Season, Indy Eleven still sits only five points behind 4th place Tampa Bay for the 4th and final preliminary spot in The Championship. While current in 9th place (due to the goal differential tiebreaker against FC Edmonton) on the combined table heading into Saturday's match, a win over the bottom feeding Scorpions and losses by Fort Lauderdale (@ OTT), Edmonton (vs. TBR) and Carolina (@ MNU) could see the "Boys in Blue" climb as high as fifth place once Week 11 play concludes on Sunday.

RICHARDS' SCORING STREAK ENDS AT

THREE: After a frustrating first stretch of games with Indy Eleven, veteran midfielder/forward Dane Richards found his scoring touch in late August. The Jamaican veteran became just the second player in club history to score in three consecutive games when he finished from 20 yards out in the 16th minute of Indy's 1-7 loss at Fort Lauderdale on Aug. 29, joining a similar run from Kleberon during the team's inaugural season last July/August.

The 31-year-old Richards also scored Indy's lone tally – a 6th minute penalty kick – during its 1-1 draw at Atlanta on Aug. 22, three days after he notched his first goal in checkers against Tampa Bay, the game-winner in a 2-0 victory at Carroll Stadium.

STEINBERGER NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK, BECOMES ELEVEN'S 12th TO MAKE TEAM OF

THE WEEK: After his two-goal performance against Jacksonville last Saturday, Zach Steinberger not only earned his first spot on the NASL's Team of the Week, but was also named the league's Player of the Week, joining Kyle Hyland (Spring Week 9) and Victor Pineda (Spring Week 10) as the only players in Indy Eleven's brief history to earn the honor. ELEVEN GETTING SMART-ER:

With his first two assists of the season last weekend against Jacksonville, midfielder Don Smart rewarded coach Tim Regan's increasing faith in the right winger. After starting just one of his nine appearances in the Spring Season, the Jamaican attacker has now started five times in his nine Fall Season appearances to date, including the last two contests. Smart is now one of only three "Boys in Blue" with multiple assists on the season, joining fellow midfielders Dylan Mares (4) and Dragan Stojkov (2).

PENALTY PHASE CATCHES UP WITH INDY:

Dane Richards' 6th minute conversion from the penalty spot on Aug. 22nd marked Indy Eleven's 3rd goal from the spot in 2015 in four tries, all without seeing their opposition earn even one ... that is, until Aug. 29 at Fort Lauderdale, when everything seemed to go wrong for the "Boys in Blue." After earning the spot kick by bring spun around in the area by Brad Ring, PC stepped up to the spot in the 7th minute to take – and convert – the first spot kick against Indy in 2015, breaking a 19-game run without conceding a PK. Indy Eleven was also on the good side of the whistles inside the area in 2014, when it attempted eight PKs (7 goals), twice as many as its opposition (converted 3 of 4 attempts).

INDY DEFENDERS SEEING RED: Last Saturday's win over Jacksonville marked just the sixth time in 12 Fall Season contests in which interim head coach Tim Regan was able to start his first-choice back four of Kyle Hyland, Erick Norales, Cory Miller & Marco Franco. Indy Eleven saw a defender ejected for the fourth time in eight matches on Aug. 29, when the regular right back Franco was shown a straight red in the 50th minute – following up on center back Erick Norales' similar straight red in the exact same minute the match prior at Atlanta on Aug. 22.

After going 12 games to start the season without seeing a player sent off, the troubling trend for Indy Eleven began with Cory Miller's ejection late at Ottawa on July 19 (two cautions) and continued the next game on July 25 with Norales' on-field incident with New York's Sebastian Guenzatti earning the Honduran international an extra one-game suspension from the league office.

While no "Boys in Blue" will be suspended for Saturday's contest at San Antonio, the squad will likely be without left back Kyle Hyland, who was suffering from flu symptoms late in the week.

REGAN REGIME ROLLS ON: Since taking control of the Indy Eleven sideline, interim head coach and director of soccer operations Tim Regan has steered the "Boys in Blue" to a 5W-3D-6L record, this after a sluggish 1W-4D-3L start to the team's 2015 NASL campaign and an early exit in Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup play.

In an effort to shake Indy Eleven from a slow start to the 2015 season, Indy Eleven President/GM Peter Wilt made changes to his technical staff on June 2, relieving Juergen Sommer of his Head Coach and Director of Soccer Operations duties, removing assistant coach Paul Telfer from his role and giving Kleberson assistant coach duties while the midfielder rehabbed from an Achilles injury.

Regan enjoyed a decorated career at Bradley University before being selected in the 2nd round of the 2003 MLS SuperDraft by the MetroStars, led by future U.S. and Egyptian National Team coach Bob Bradley – the first coach hired by Wilt with MLS' Chicago Fire. Regan appeared in 81 regular season games in North America's top flight with MetroStars (2003-05), Chivas USA (2006), NY Red Bulls (2007) and Toronto FC (2008).

Regan's primary role with Toronto FC in 2008 was as the team's Chief Scout, a role he kept until 2011. Regan also worked with U.S. Soccer as an assistant coach for the U.S. Under-17, U-18 & U-20 National Teams and a Technical Advisor with the Federation in 2011. Prior to joining Indy Eleven as the team's first assistant coach on Nov. 11, 2013, Regan's most recent role was with St. Louis Scott Gallagher, where he served as the famed youth club's Development Academy Director, with duties including coaching the U.S. Soccer Development Academy program's U-17/18 squad.

INTERNATIONALLY KNOWN: Indiana's Team in "The World's Game" saw a slight re-stock in regards to international talent during the offseason, with midfield newcomers Osman Melgares (Honduras) and Dragan Stojkov (Macedonia) taking the international roster slots previously held by Jermaine Johnson and Corby Moore.

One thing that hasn't changed is Indy Eleven's international feel, as now close to half – 12 of 26 – of the team's players following the recent additions of midfielders Dane Richards and Marvin Ceballos were either born outside the United States or carry dual-citizenship:

EVERYTHING OLD IS NEW AGAIN: The biggest question during Indy Eleven's offseason was if the squad would be able to keep the pieces of the roster it wanted into season two, especially after the promising end to the club's inaugural campaign. The team's technical staff went to work immediately in November and went deep into the preseason to secure its returning core, their efforts ending with 14 of the 21 players on the opening day roster having spent at least five games with Indy last season.

But the search for new blood has ramped up since the season began, yielding rookies Daniel Keller and Duke Lacroix in May, Dane Richards and Zach Steinberger in July, Marvin Ceballos in August and Daniel Cuevas just this week.

RECAP @ MNU – SEP. 2: Indy Eleven put itself in position to steal a point – or three – from the finale of its three-game road swing at the National Sports Center Stadium, but Minnesota United FC defender Justin Davis slotted home in the 77th minute to push the Loons to a 1-0 win.

Indy goalkeeper Keith Cardona came up big in the early going with some active forays off his line and a stop of Christian Ramirez's shot in the 13th minute. Cardona would also get some help from the woodwork later in the half, as Yago Silva flashed across the six in the 41st minute to poke on a cross, only to see the chance glance off the left post, keeping things scoreless heading into halftime.

Minnesota would come out the aggressors again in the opening of the second half, but it was Indy Eleven's Dane Richards who had the best chances to move the scoreboard around the hour mark, first seeing Sammy Ndjock go low in the 59th minute to save a 1-v-1 before having the Cameroonian 'keeper stop a counter-attack opportunity five minutes later.

Davis would be a menace in the left side of the area with increasing frequency as the second half wore on, and Indy's inability to keep track of him finally bit the visitors in the 77th minute. Kevin Venegas was able to get off a cross to the far side of the penalty area just as the ball neared the endline, and Davis took his chance calmly, slotting a perfectly-placed, left-footed volley across the face of goal and inside the far right post to put Minnesota up.
