INDY ELEVEN AT THE MIAMI FC – SATURDAY, JULY 30, 2016

LAST TIME OUT – ELEVEN OUTLASTS EDDIES, 1-0: In a clash of two of the NASL's top teams, Indy Eleven emerged the winner from a hard fought 1-0 result over FC Edmonton last Saturday in front of 8,119 fans at IUPUI's Carroll Stadium.

After being victimized by two early goals the prior weekend at Minnesota, Indy Eleven flipped the script against the "Eddies" via defender Greg Janicki's third tally of the season just 13 minutes in. The chance was created when defender Nemanja Vukovic was tripped up 30 yards from goal to set up Dylan Mares' perfect free kick service to Janicki, who headed home from eight yards to move the scoreboard for the home side.

Edmonton striker Jake Keegan was unlucky not to even things up in the 22nd minute as he ran onto a free ball just 10 yards from goal, but his rising shot just missed the upper right corner. Two minutes later Indy 'keeper Jon Busch spilled Adam Eckersley's well-served cross from the left side, and while Daryl Fordyce was there to pounce on the loose ball he couldn't turn to shoot and the danger was eventually cleared by the Eleven backline.

Edmonton goalkeeper Matt VanOekel made eight saves on the evening, including two in the dying moments of the first half on shots by Eamon Zayed and Vukovic that kept things tight heading into the halftime break.

The first quality look of the second half came at the stroke of the 58th minute when Zayed was played behind the backline, but VanOekel cut off the angle well at his left post, going low to block the shot wide.

Edmonton striker Tomi Ameobi caused panic in the Indy six-yard box in the 62nd minute, but his cutback pass would be overrun by a trio of Eleven defenders and intended target Dustin Correa. Two more chances for the Eleven followed in quick succession, but forward Justin Braun's open header off a Vukovic cross was sent right to VanOekel, who moments later got just enough of Mares' far post shot to push it wide for a corner.

Indy looked like it padded its lead in the 75th minute Don Smart's diagonal ball sprung Braun behind the backline. While Braun's square ball was finished off by Zayed the offside flag went up, negating the goal. Two minutes from time it was Smart almost helping Indy find paydirt again when he sent a pinpoint cross to Zayed, whose header had VanOekel beat but fell just wide of the right post.

Edmonton had two chances deep into stoppage time, but Brad Ring was on the spot to deflect Fordyce's header at the near post out for a corner before clearing VanOekel's desperation header on the ensuing set piece to secure the full three points.

INDY BACK ON TOP (AND ON THE DOORSTEP): With its win over Edmonton last weekend, Indy Eleven climbed back to the top of both the NASL's Combined Season and Fall Season tables – although a midweek triumph by Rayo OKC put the expansion side ahead in the Fall race by a point. The Combined Season top spot is the primary focus for the "Boys in Blue," who are looking for the #1 seed in The Championship that would be guaranteed with a first-place finish on the overall table.

INJURY REPORT: The news keeps getting better for Indy Eleven on the injury front, as center back and captain Colin Falvey trained fully all week and could make his return to the lineup as early as this weekend in Miami. Falvey has missed all five games of the Fall Season to this point while rehabbing from a right hamstring injury. Forward Jair Reinoso (L leg injury) is also back to full tilt in practices and could see his first minutes since mid-May.

Midfielder Duke Lacroix had a much shorter stint on the sideline, but the speedy winger could also return from a sprained ankle suffered two weekends ago early in the game at Minnesota that left him out of consideration last weekend. DF **Neil Shaffer** (R adductor) is the only player considered to be a hard “out” for the visit to South Florida.

“TORRADO WARNNG”: Newcomer Gerardo Torrado is working his way into the Indy Eleven lineup, the legendary Mexican midfielder following up his 45-minute NASL debut on July 16 in the second half at Minnesota with his first start last Saturday, a 60-minute appearance against FC Edmonton. “El Borrego” was ineligible to suit up in Indy’s checkers until the transfer window opened on July 4, and a visit to Mexico to sort out visa paperwork also left him unavailable for the team’s games on July 9 (vs. MNU) and July 13 (vs. FTL) – although he was able to make his unofficial debut on June 26 with a 62-minute runout against Liga MX champs Pachuca in an international friendly at Carroll Stadium.

The June 8 signing of Torrado was a landmark one for the NASL and Indy Eleven, as the 37-year-old midfielder’s credentials include being the second-most capped player in Mexican National Team history (162), three FIFA World Cup appearances (2002, 2006 & 2010) and an 11-year stint with Mexican club powerhouse Cruz Azul – the last 10 of which he served as captain.

START WITH A STREAK: A 3-0 win over Fort Lauderdale on July 13 allowed Indy Eleven to re-write the NASL record book, its 13th straight game without a defeat to start the season (6W-7D-0L) equaling the longest regular season undefeated streak in the league’s modern history alongside the 2011 Carolina RailHawks and 2013-14 New York Cosmos. The “Boys in Blue” saw that run halted three days later with its 0-2 loss at Minnesota United FC.

If you want to get picky, Indy Eleven actually went 15 competitive games without a defeat to start 2016 when counting its two Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup contests (even its penalty kick defeat at the Chicago Fire in the Fourth Round technically went down as a 1-1 draw). While it doesn’t count officially, if you want to throw the team’s 1-0 exhibition win over Liga MX champion C.F. Pachuca onto the compilation as well, we won’t stop you.

OPENING STRONG, FINISHING STRONGER: Indy Eleven usually makes the ends of games exciting, but all the scoring the last three times out have come in the games’ opening half hours.

Eleven bucked its season-long penchant for late-game drama on July 13 by putting up all three of its goals in a 3-0 win over Fort Lauderdale within the first half hour. Three days later, Indy Eleven gave up a goal in the opening 15 minutes of a game for the first time this season – actually, two goals – in its 2-0 loss at Minnesota United FC. Then last weekend Indy Eleven got to work early again, Greg Janicki scoring the lone goal of the game in Indy’s 1-0 win over FC Edmonton just 13 minutes in.

Indy Eleven has now scored 11 of its 21 goals in league play – and earned half of its 28 standings points and a little thing called the Spring Season title – courtesy of finishes past the 70th minute of games, including an incredible 8-0 advantage across the final 15 minutes.

JANICKI'S STRONG PLAY EARNS ANOTHER TEAM OF THE WEEK NOD: Defender Greg Janicki's work on both ends of the field last weekend earned the veteran center back his second nod of 2016 to the NASL's Team of the Week on Wednesday. The Michigan State alum's third goal of the season was the difference-maker in Indy Eleven's 1-0 win over FC Edmonton last week, and his usual stout defending helped the squad to its NASL-best sixth clean sheet of the season.

Janicki has been a rock on the Indy Eleven backline, starting 14 of the team's 15 matches. Janicki's three goals are tied for second on the squad, while he also ranks second across the NASL in interceptions (52) and seventh in clearances (56).

DOING IT WITH DEFENSE: Janicki's contributions on the back line are just part of the reason why Indy Eleven has among the NASL's stingiest teams in 2016. Injuries to captain Colin Falvey and right back Lovel Palmer have seen some shifting since the start of the season, but no matter who has lined up across the back four the result has been the same – a communicative groups that is hard to break down. To that end, Indy Eleven has allowed just one goal in 13 of 15 in NASL games in 2016 – with only the league-leading offense of Minnesota able to score twice on May 21 and July 16. Thanks to last Saturday's 1-0 win over FC Edmonton, Indy Eleven and goalkeeper Jon Busch are tied for NASL lead with six shutouts, including three of the last four outings.

The team's 11 goals conceded are the second fewest in the NASL, behind only FC Edmonton (10). With Busch manning every minute in net, his resulting 0.73 GAA is the second-best among NASL 'keepers (minimum of 540 minutes played) behind only FCE's Matt VanOekel (0.67).

ATTACK AVERAGES OUT: Indy Eleven's offensive output hasn't been that bad either. Indiana's Team is third in the NASL in scoring with 21 goals, behind the duo of New York and Minnesota (26). Meanwhile, Indy's +10 goal differential falls just behind Minnesota's +11 mark as the best in the league.

Indy Eleven's "magic number" this season is two, as when it scores multiple goals the "Boys in Blue" are a perfect 5W-0D-0L ... however, thanks to its defense, two of the team's last three wins have come via 1-0 results (2W-7D-1L when scoring once or nil). The biggest variable in scoring is, no surprise, where the games are played, as Indy is putting up 2.13 at home and just 0.57 goals/game away from "The Mike." Here's the breakdown of Indy Eleven's offensive output during the 2016 NASL season (wins in bold):

LONG AND WINDING ROAD: Indy Eleven was the only NASL team to squeeze at least a point from its first six road contests in league play after going 1W-5D-0L, but that run ended July 16 in a 0-2 loss at Minnesota. Indy Eleven's .500 road record this season has moved its all-time mark in away affairs to 7W-14D-14L (36 GF / 57 GA).

OVER THE HUMP AT HOME: After going winless in its first 12 home games at Carroll Stadium in 2014, Indy Eleven has since gone 14W-6D-5L in its last 25 league outings at "The Mike," with its 3-0 win over Fort Lauderdale on Wednesday finally pulling its career league home record over the .500 mark.

Carroll Stadium has become a fortress in 2016, with the "Boys in Blue" going undefeated (6W-2D-0L) while claiming 20 of 24 possible points and posting a +11 goal differential (17 GF / 6 GA) in its eight league outings at "The Mike" thus far.

SHOTS PILING UP: Indy Eleven is not shy about pulling the trigger, as the squad ranks second in the NASL in total shots with 161. That mark is paced by forwards Eamon Zayed (30) and Justin Braun (29), who rank 3rd and 4th respectively in the category across the NASL. With The Miami FC ranking having the second-most shots faced in the league heading into Saturday night, the shooting range could again be wide open for Indy Eleven, who outshot Miami 15-11 in their first match-up on June 4.

FAMILIAR FOES: The “Boys in Blue” will see two familiar faces when they look across the park at The Miami FC on Saturday night in midfielders Dane Richards and Blake Smith. Richards joined Indy Eleven on loan from MLS’ New York Red Bulls for the 2015 Fall Season and scored three goals across his 15 NASL appearances (13 starts). Smith was another MLS loanee, from the Montreal Impact, in 2014, when he contributed a pair of goals and assists across 19 league appearances (18 starts). Smith was also red-hot for Indy Eleven in its two U.S. Cup appearances that season, tallying two assists and four goals – including the team’s first-ever hat trick in official competition against the Dayton Dutch Lions.

“MIRACLE AT THE MIKE” GIVES INDY SPRING TITLE: Dramatic three-goal wins are few and far between, but Indy Eleven’s 4-1 win over Carolina on June 11 gave Indy the three standings points, four goals and three-goal winning margin it needed to surpass the New York Cosmos at the top of the table and earn the NASL’s Spring title – and The Championship automatic berth in November that comes along with it. Indy Eleven collected the Spring Season trophy from NASL Commissioner Bill Peterson prior to last Saturday’s 1-0 win over Minnesota at Carroll Stadium, and the NASL is expected to announce the date and time of Indy’s first-ever appearance in The Championship, set to take place the weekend of Nov. 4-6, in the coming weeks. The surprise result at “The Mike” included the club’s first-ever hat trick in NASL play by Eamon Zayed (15’, 65’ 85’) and Justin Braun’s third goal in four league matches to close out a memorable Spring

When combined with left back Nemanja Vukovic’s two tallies, the Indy Eleven defense’s five combined goals through the first 15 games has exceeded the output from the club’s midfield corps, with Omar Gordon, Nicki Paterson and recent first-time scorers Dylan Mares and Duke Lacroix all hitting the back of the net once. As to be expected, the forwards are pacing the squad’s scoring attack, with Eamon Zayed (7), Justin Braun (3), Souleymane Youla (1) and Jair Reinoso (1) combining for a dozen tallies.

LARREA LET GO AFTER SPRING: Indy Eleven’s addition of senior internationals Gerardo Torrado and Souleymane Youla in June created a numbers game that unfortunately saw the club unable to pick up the Fall contract option of midfielder Gorka Larrea. The affable Spaniard started four of his eight appearances while fighting injuries in the Spring season and totaled 436 minutes of action – including a yeoman’s 90 minutes in the team’s Spring Season-championship clinching effort on June 11 versus Carolina. The subtraction of Larrea leaves 23 “Boys in Blue” on the roster, counting the on-loan Wojciech Wojcik (USL side OKC Energy FC).

ELEVEN "IRONMEN": Five players – GK Jon Busch, DF Nemanja Vukovic, MF Nicki Paterson and forwards Justin Braun and Eamon Zayed – have appeared in all 15 league matches thus far, with "Vuko" and "Buschy" serving as the only players with 15 starts as well. Busch has played every minute (1,350) of the season to date followed close behind by Vukovic (1,333), with Zayed (1,283), DF Greg Janicki (1,244) and Braun (1,215) not far behind.

A TEAM POSSESSED (SUDDENLY): After enjoying the majority of possession just once in its 10 Spring Season games – and by the slimmest of majorities (51/49) at that on May 28 at JAX – Indy Eleven saw the better of the ball in its first four Fall Season games: July 2 at PRFC (61/39), July 9 vs. MNU (58/42), July 13 vs. FTL (52/48) and July 16 at MNU (63/37). That streak was broken in last week's 1-0 win over FC Edmonton, with the Eddies winning the possession battle 57-43.

PATERSON & VUKOVIC HELPING OUT: It took Indy Eleven until its fourth goal - in its fourth game of the season – to register an assist, but the "Boys in Blue" have helped out on 14 of their last 18 tallies. Midfielder Nicki Paterson collected two helpers on July 13 vs. Fort Lauderdale, his second and third assist of the season tying him with left back Nemanja Vukovic for the team's lead in the category. The duo's 3 assists also places them tied for third across the NASL in the category. Paterson's two-assist effort was the second for Indy this season alongside Vuko's double-helper night on June 11 vs. Carolina.

GUINEAN INTERNATIONAL YOULA MAKES MEMORABLE DEBUT: Souleymane Youla made his first NASL appearance in checkers a memorable one on July 2 at Puerto Rico FC. The 34-year-old Guinean international, signed on June 11, made his 11-minute appearance off the bench count, as his first shot in NASL play, a six-yard header off of Nemanja Vukovic's 92nd minute free kick, allowed Indy to steal a point at the death at Puerto Rico FC – and kept the "Boys in Blue" undefeated on the season. Youla made his competitive debut with Indy on June 15, when he played the final 51 minutes of the Eleven's Fourth Round U.S. Open Cup tie against MLS' Chicago Fire SC.

ZAYED NOTCHES INDY'S FIRST NASL HAT TRICK: Eamon Zayed became the first Indy Eleven player to score multiple goals in 2016 with his brace against New York on April 16, but the Irish-born, Libyan international one-upped himself on June 11 by scoring the first hat trick for the "Boys in Blue" in NASL play.

While Wojciech Wojcik tallied thrice in preseason play against Arizona United back in March and Blake Smith did the deed in U.S. Open Cup play in 2014 against the Dayton Dutch Lions, Zayed became the first to do the honor against NASL competition in the team's 67th league game. Zayed became the fifth member of the "Boys in Blue" to tally a brace in regular season play – and is the only one on that list currently on the roster:

INDY UPSETS LIGA MX CHAMP PACHUCA IN FRIENDLY: Indy Eleven used an early tally by striker Eamon Zayed, a fantastic goalkeeping display by Keith Cardona and plenty of last-ditch defending to down recently-crowned Liga MX Clausura season champion C.F. Pachuca 1-0 in an international friendly June 26.

It was Zayed putting Indy up just seven minutes in with an opportunistic goal, collecting a clumsily played ball by the Tuzos' center backs and before slotting low and left of Alfonso Blanco to put the home side up 1-0. Another poor back pass by Pachuca sprung Zayed on goal in the 26th minute, but the Irishman hurried his chip past an onrushing Blanco, missing just left of the frame to keep things close.

Cardona would get the full shift between the posts, and he came up big on a handful of occasions, most notably a kick save on Erick Sanchez's 15-yard blast in the 82nd minute.

“WOJ” GOES ON LOAN: Indy Eleven announced May 18 that forward Wojciech Wojcik would be loaned to OKC Energy FC. The 23-year-old striker will stay in Oklahoma City for the rest of the USL side's 2016 season through September and report back to Indianapolis for the remainder of the Eleven's NASL campaign. Wojcik had made one appearance off the bench for Indy in 2016, this after he started 13 of 21 appearances during his first season with the club in 2015.

“Woj” has already made a big impression for the USL side, as he is Energy FC's co-leader in goals with three tallies from his 11 appearances (707 mins). Wojcik and the rest of Energy FC – which includes ex-Indy Eleven defender Kyle Hyland – will face off Saturday night against St Louis FC, which features another ex-Eleven player, Mike Ambersley.

INDY KNOCKED OUT OF OPEN CUP BY – CHICAGO IN PKs: Indy Eleven took a Major League Soccer squad into added extra time of a Fourth Round Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup tie for the second time in three seasons, but would ultimately bow out to Chicago Fire SC 3-4 in penalty kicks following a 1-1 draw after the extra 30 minute session at Toyota Park on June 15.

It was the “Men in Red” enjoying the best chances through the scoreless 90 minutes of regulation, but Chicago's speedy attackers were missing the final touch when they weren't testing Indy goalkeeper Jon Busch, who made 7 stops on the night. At the end of the first 15 minute session of added extra time Justin Braun would put the visitors on top with a splendid left-footed finish, giving Indy's sizeable traveling contingent hope of advancing to the Round of 16. However, after missing several good looks throughout, Ghanaian striker David Accam would finally hit home for Fire SC, dekeing two defenders before finishing far past Busch in the 111th minute, setting the stage for PKs.

Indy Eleven would go up 2-0 initially in penalties thanks to makes by Nicki Paterson and Eamon Zayed and a first chance miss from Kennedy Igboananike. However, Chicago 'keeper Matt Lampson would save Indy's next chances by Nemanja Vukovic and Daniel Keller, and Accam would polish off the fourth and final kick for Chicago to push the MLS'ers through to the final 16 team bracket.

ARE YOU EXPERIENCED? The common thread with Indy Eleven's batch of 14 newcomers in 2016 can be summed up in one word – experience. Eleven of the 14 new “Boys in Blue” – including this week's additions of Gerardo Torrado (37) and Souleymane Youla (34) – are in their 30's, while two of the other three – Neil Shaffer (27) and Justin Braun (29) – have served as captain at their previous stop. With the additions of Torrado and Youla this week, Indy Eleven boasts the oldest roster in the NASL. Goalkeeper Jon Busch, now in his 20th professional season in American soccer circles, serves as the oldest of the group at 39 years of age, while second-year forward Duke Lacroix is the youngster at 22.

QUINTET OF ELEVEN ORIGINALS: Three of those players – Brad Ring, Dylan Mares and Cory Miller – are among the five players remaining that spent time with Indy Eleven during its 2014 Inaugural Season. Ring, Mares and midfielder Don Smart were on the opening day roster in April 2014, while Miller and fellow defender Marco Franco would join two weeks apart that August and September, respectively.

QUARTET OF HOOSIER STATE TIES: Four players on the 2016 roster have links to the Hoosier State:

- MF Daniel Keller was born and raised in north suburban Carmel and attended Brebeuf Jesuit H.S. in Indianapolis
- Keller's one-time teammate at the University of Louisville, MF Dylan Mares, was born in South Bend, called Zionsville home and played his last collegiate season in 2013 with Indiana University
- Zionsville was also the former stomping grounds of defender Cory Miller, who moved to Indiana in his teens
- Midfielder Brad Ring may have been born in neighboring Illinois, but he earned his Hoosier State cred with a standout career at Indiana University from 2005-08

OFFSEASON MAKEOVER: Indy Eleven named American coaching veteran Tim Hankinson as the club's second permanent head coach on Dec. 2, and changes to the roster of "Indiana's Team" would be soon to follow. The roster to begin the season was split nearly down the middle between returning players (10) and newcomers (12) – a trend that carried over to Hankinson's coaching staff thanks to the return of Tim Regan to an assistant role and the addition of veteran goalkeeper Jon Busch, who will serve as the squad's goalkeeping coach in addition to the team's first-choice netminder. With the late-Spring Season addition of Gerardo Torrado and Souleymane Youla and recent departure of Gorka Larrea, the roster now includes 13 new "Boys in Blue" ...

Indy Eleven is the latest stop on a now 36-year coaching journey that has seen Hankinson lead teams at nearly every level of the sport in the United States – including two years in the North American Soccer League and nine years in Major League Soccer – and taken him across the globe.

The native of New York City is familiar with the NASL after being named the first head coach of the San Antonio Scorpions in 2012, helping the expansion squad to the league's regular season championship in his first season. Hankinson is now 26W-17D-16L in 59 regular season games in the NASL, the first 44 of which came with San Antonio from 2012-13 (19W-10D-15L)
