LAST TIME OUT - ELEVEN CONTROLLED BY COSMOS IN MIDWEEK DEFEAT: Indy Eleven's chance to pull even with the New York Cosmos atop the NASL standings went the way of the home side instead on Wednesday, as New York dominated the proceedings from the get-go in a 3-0 win at Shuart Stadium on the Hofstra University campus.

Although Indy's Souleymane Youla got off the game's first good look three minutes in, it was all Cosmos in the first half. Forward Jairo Arrieta did the heavy lifting on New York's eighth minute opener by drawing three Indy defenders at the top of the area before flicking a short pass to Ruben Bover, who took one touch before firing a low shot that squeezed between a diving Jon Busch and the right post.

The Cosmos' second came in the 17th minute, created a minute earlier when Danny Szetela went down in the area after absorbing contact on a Nemanja Vukovic challenge. Juan Arango would take the ensuing spot kick, sending Busch the wrong way and finishing into the right side of goal to double the lead at 2-0.Busch did well to keep the score right there just before the half hour mark by stopping Arrieta on back-to-back shots, first stoning the Costa Rican with a kick save on his effort near the spot before stopping chipped follow doorstep. а up on the

Indy Eleven would finally get some good looks down the stretch of the first half, a free kick from 30 yards in the 43rd minute by Vukovic looking dangerous but missing just wide right. The final play of the half saw captain Colin Falvey intercept a pass at the midfield stripe and carry all the way to the 18 before squaring for Souleymane Youla, whose low shot was sent right to Cosmos 'keeper Jimmy Maurer .

Indy Eleven came out of the locker room at halftime the aggressor, but the tide would turn in the 53rd minute when Cory Miller was shown a straight red card, his last-defender tackle that ended Arango's run ending the Indy center back's night early.

The play also resulted in a point to the penalty spot, but Arango's second PK attempt of the night soared over frame, keeping Indy Eleven within arm's reach. Arango would also be denied on another Busch kick save in the 65th minute and missed on a header in the 70th that he pushed just inches left. However, the Cosmos midfielder's second tally would finally come in the 73rd minute, this time his header off a Bover cross skipping past Busch and into the left side of goal to lift the score to 3-0.

LAST TIME vs. ROWDIES, TBR 0:0 IND (APR 2): For the third season opener in as many years, Indy Eleven would earn a point from its NASL season opener, this time securing a road point from a 0-0 draw with the Tampa Bay Rowdies at Al Lang Stadium. The new look Eleven squad featured ten "Boys in Blue" making their Indy debut, including goalkeeper Jon Busch, who made three saves in securing the clean sheet.

"There's no question that defensively we're a very solid unit. I feel like in all games this year we'll be able to defense well and stay in games until the very end certainly," said Indy Eleven head coach Tim Hankinson after the match. "Certainly the possession tonight was a lot better than we've seen in our preseason games, so I'm pleased with that, and the patience we showed was very solid. That's the way you have to play on the road, so the point tonight was a very well taken point."

The first half was dominated by the defenses as just one of the teams' five combined shots would force a save, Busch doing the deed five minutes in with an easy grab of Tamika Mkandawire's header 10 yards straight out from goal. That's not to say Busch wasn't active, as he darted off his line on several occasions to frustrate the Rowdies attack, most notably sliding in to thwart a couple of through balls intended for runs by new Tampa Bay striker Tommy Heinemann

The sides finally traded solid chances early in the second half, Busch going low to stop Heinemann's shot from space in the 52nd minute and Indy midfielder Sinisa Ubiparipovic seeing his dipping effort from 25 yards miss just high four minutes later

The visitors looked more and more content to secure their road point as the half continued, but a flurry in the 78th minute would almost see the Eleven sneak into the lead. However, Rowdies goalkeeper Matt Pickens came up big, first steering aside a corner kick that somehow got through traffic in the six yard box before making his only save of the night on Indy forward Eamon Zayed's volley from the right side of the area

The physicality of the Eleven defense would pay off time after time, as solid challenges and timely slide tackles throughout the evening helped keep Tampa off the board. However, Busch was called into service one last time in the 92nd minute when Eric Avila's sidewinding shot from outside the area was hit with pace, but right at the Indy netminder in the center of goal.

TABLE SETTING: Indy Eleven had a golden opportunity to pull even in points with league-leading New York atop both the Fall and Combined Season standings on Wednesday night, but the Cosmos instead extended their grip on the top spots via their 3-0 win. Indy will now face a motivated Tampa Bay squad that the "last team out" out of The Championship chase at the moment, sitting six points behind Minnesota for the 4th spot on the Combined table, albeit it with a game in hand on the "Loons."

While a Fall Season trophy to match its Spring one would be nice, all that matters now to Indy Eleven now is the #1 seed in The Championship, awarded to the Fall/Spring champ with the highest Combined Season point total.

INJURY REPORT: After missing out on much of the action in August, Indy Eleven is on the cusp of getting two important performers back in forward Justin Braun (R MCL sprain suffered on 6/30 @ MIA) and Marco Franco (bone bruise on 8/06 v. OTT). Both players returned to training on Friday, although their status for Saturday's match versus Tampa Bay remains in question. Also a question mark for the weekend is center back Greg Janicki, as the veteran defender looks to overcome a bout of plantar fasciitis that flared up on Sunday in Ottawa and ruled him out of Wednesday's contest at New York.

SEEING RED MEANS CHANCE FOR KELLER:

Indy Eleven defender Cory Miller picked up Indy Eleven's third red card in 12 Fall Season matches on Wednesday night, his tackle of Jairo Arrieta in the 53rd minute that denied a clear scoring opportunity earning a straight red. Miller's was the first of the three red cards that actually resulted in Indy Eleven playing a man down ...

- Lovel Palmer, July 9 vs. MNU: came during postgame incident that penalized neither team
- Greg Janicki, Aug. 3 vs. JAX (89'): part of offsetting ejections (Alhassane Keita) that saw both teams reduced to 10 men for stoppage time

With Miller suspended and Janicki injured, second-year man Daniel Keller is likely to take the vacated center back spot alongside captain Colin Falvey. After playing 1,000 minutes across 16 games during his rookie season last year, the Carmel native has assumed a backup role in 2016, making his second appearance of the regular season Wednesday night by playing the final 35 minutes.

HOME SWEET HOME: While Indy Eleven incurred the wrath of a red-hot team at home Wednesday at New York, it's not doing too shabby at home itself these days, to say the least. Indy Eleven is the only other NASL team outside of New York that is undefeated at home in 2016, posting a 9W-2D-0L record – including eight straight wins – at Carroll Stadium heading into Saturday's game against Tampa Bay. During the stretch, Indy has claimed 29 of 33 possible points and posted an impressive +16 goal differential (25 GF / 9 GA). When combined with two wins to round out the schedule at "The Mike" last year, Indy Eleven is now undefeated its last 13 home games.

After going winless in its first 12 home games at Carroll Stadium in 2014 (0W-5D-7L), Indy Eleven has since gone 16W-6D-5L in its last 27 league outings at "The Mike," a 3-0 win over Fort Lauderdale on July 13 finally pulling its career home record in NASL play over the .500 mark.

ROAD WOES CONTINUE: Meanwhile, away from "The Mike" the story is a little more complicated. Wednesday's 0-3 defeat at New York left Indy Eleven winless in its last nine road contests, including a 0W-2D-4L mark during the Fall Season, contrasting greatly with its undefeated 1W-4D-0L away ledger that helped it claim the Spring Season title. Its lone road win of the 2016 season came via a 2-1 result at Rayo OKC on April 30.

While Indy Eleven is not claiming the road points it did in the Spring, one encouraging sign is that it is scoring more goals. After scoring just three goals away from "The Mike" and being shut out three times in five road games during the Spring Season, Indy has tallied five times in six "roadies" in the Fall.

Indy's road record in 2016 now sits at 1W-6D-4L (8 GF/14 GA, -6 GD), moving its all-time mark in away affairs to 7W-15D-17L (40 GF/66 GA).

THE DOG DAYS ARE OVER (AFTER SATURDAY): Indy Eleven started the last third (or 11 games) of its 2016 regular season Wednesday at New York, the disappointing 0-3 defeat pushing Indy Eleven's points per game average for the Fall just below its Spring title-earning clip:

Spring: 4W-6D-0L, 18 pts, 1.80 pts/gm, 1st place Fall: 6W-2D-4L, 20 pts, 1.67 pts/gm, 3rd place

What could help Indy down the stretch drive is a slowdown in its schedule. The loss at New York marked the Eleven's last midweek game for seven weeks, with their final Wednesday game coming on Oct. 19 at Tampa Bay. With just one game per week for the next month-and-a-half, the schedule continuity could bring with it the chance to get back to full health in addition to build some momentum for the postseason.

Saturday's match vs. Tampa Bay will mark the end of a three-game, seven-day gauntlet for Indiana's Team. After getting out of the first two similar stretches with six points (thanks to a pair of home wins each time), the best possible outcome for Indy Eleven's "end of summer" run leading into Labor Day weekend is a four-point haul.

The five-goal output on Aug. 3 vs. JAX marked the most goals for Indy in a regular season game in its now 78-game history.

Indy Eleven's +10 goal differential is behind only New York's +21 ledger in NASL play – with half the difference coming via a "six-point swing" thanks to New York's 3-0 win over the Boys in Blue on Long Island on Wednesday.

Indy's 2-3 loss at Carolina on Aug. 20 marked its first loss when scoring multiple goals, the Eleven's mark in such games now standing at 7W-0D-1L. Thanks to its defense, three of its six Fall Season wins have come via 1-0 results (3W-8D-3L when scoring once or nil).

Indy is putting up 2.27 at home (25 GF/9 GA), in stark contrast to a 0.73 goals/game away from "The Mike" (8 GF/14 GA) Here's the breakdown of Indy Eleven's offensive output during the 2016 NASL season (**wins in bold**, *draws in italics*):

DOING IT WITH DEFENSE: Indy Eleven's stability at towards the top of the NASL table has come largely part to its defense, although its stout early-season numbers have been slipping as of late.

Indy Eleven allowed just one goal or less in 9 of its 10 Spring Season contests, but during the Fall Season the "Boys in Blue" have allowed multiple tallies five times in 12 games, including a pair of three-goal concessions during its recently ended road trip at Carolina (2-3 L on Aug. 20) and New York (0-3 L on Wednesday).

Even with its recent struggles, Indy Eleven's 23 goals conceded are still tied for the second fewest in the NASL's Combined Season, alongside New York and behind only FC Edmonton's somewhat ridiculous "GA" of 10.

DEFENDERS FINISHING THE JOB: Center back Greg Janicki continued his set piece mastery on Aug. 20, his finish of Dylan Mares' spot-on corner kick service giving the veteran his fourth goal of 2016, tying him for second on the team's scoring chart with Justin Braun. Indy's surprising haul of eight goals from its defensive unit (Janicki 4, Nemanja Vukovic 3 & Colin Falvey 1) has helped the squad diversify its scoring portfolio and is one more than the club's cadre of talented midfielders. As to be expected, the forwards are pacing the squad's scoring attack, with Eamon Zayed (12), Braun (4), Souleymane Youla (1) and Jair Reinoso (1), combining for 18 tallies – good for nearly one tally a game.

SHARING THE SHARING: The "Boys in Blue" have been getting scoresheet contributions from across the field, with 10 different players recording assists on goals tallied by 12 players.

Dylan Mares' four-assist binge in a six-game stretch from July 23 through Aug. 20 gave him the lead in the category, but he's followed closely by Nicki Paterson, Nemanja Vukovic and Eamon Zayed, the latter getting his third helper of the season on Sunday at Ottawa on Brad Ring's tally. Paterson (July 13 vs. FTL) and Vukovic (June 11 vs. CAR) are the only two players with two assists in a game this season for Indy. Mares' latest assist on Aug. 20 at Carolina also padded his lead in the career category for Indiana's Team, placing him three ahead of Don Smart – who was the recipient of Mares' game-winning service against Fury FC on August 6.

EVERY POINT ADDS TO INDY'S NEW RECORD: It may be a sign of the struggles of the first two seasons or of the marked improvement in year three (or both), but whatever you want to chalk it up to there's no arguing that Indy Eleven set a new single-season points record just 18 games into its 2016 campaign, eclipsing its previous high of 33 with a 2-1 win over Rayo OKC on Aug. 13 that landed Indiana's Team on 34 points

VUKOVIC LEADS "IRONMAN" RACE: When it comes to consistency, head coach Tim Hankinson has been able to lean on a steady stable of formidable veterans to log big minutes in 2016. A handful of members of the team's "Over-30 Gang," led by 32-year-old left back Nemanja Vukovic, are at the top of the team's "Ironman" categories of games played, games started and minutes played ... and the new, lone member of the team's "Over-40 Gang," Jon Busch (who turned the big 4-0 recently on Aug. 18) ain't far behind ...

AT THE "BIG 4-0," BUSCH LEADS

EXPERIENCED SQUAD: The common thread with Indy Eleven's batch of 14 newcomers in 2016 can be summed up in one word – experience. Eleven of the 14 new "Boys in Blue" – including June's additions of Gerardo Torrado (37) and Souleymane Youla (34) – are in (at least) their 30's, while two of the other three – Neil Shaffer (27) and Justin Braun (29) – have served as captain at their previous stop. With the additions of Torrado and Youla in June, Indy Eleven boasts the most experienced roster in the NASL. Goalkeeper Jon Busch, now in his 20th professional season in American soccer circles, serves as the oldest of the group now at 40 years of age after celebrating his birthday on Aug. 18, while second-year forward Duke Lacroix is the youngster at 22.

TORRADO TAKES THE PITCH: Newcomer Gerardo Torrado is settling into his new role in the middle of the Indy Eleven midfield, starting 6 of the last 8 games (and coming off the bench in the other two) and displaying the organizing, passing and tackling abilities that made him one of the most impactful signings in the NASL's modern era. A notable moment for the league came back on Aug. 20, when the legendary Mexican international got his first chance to go against a longtime "El Tri" teammate when he locked horns with striker Omar Bravo for all 90 minutes in Carolina's 3-2 win at WakeMed Soccer Park.

The June 8 signing of Torrado was a landmark one for the NASL and Indy Eleven, as the 37-year-old midfielder's credentials include being the second-most capped player in Mexican National Team history (162), three FIFA World Cup appearances (2002, 2006 & 2010) and an 11-year stint with Mexican club powerhouse Cruz Azul – the last 10 of which he served as captain.

"El Borrego" was ineligible for league play until the transfer window opened on July 4, and a visit to Mexico to sort out visa paperwork left him unavailable for games on July 9 (vs. MNU) and July 13 (vs. FTL). He made his unofficial debut on June 26 with a 62-minute runout against Liga MX champs Pachuca in an international friendly at Carroll Stadium. Torrado's NASL debut came via an impressive second half performance on July 16 at Minnesota.

INDY-VIDUAL ACCOLADES: Thanks in part to his goal-scoring exploits against Ottawa last Sunday, midfielder Brad Ring earned his first spot on the NASL Team of the Week in 2016 on Wednesday. Ring became the 11th member of the "Boys in Blue" to earn a spot on the league's weekly best XI ... see the full list below:

Not one to settle, the man who earned the "Mr. Hat Trick" moniker during his days in Iran registered a second three-goal effort of the season on August 3 against Jacksonville, giving him two of the NASL's three hat trick to this point in 2016 (MNU's Christian Ramirez on July 2 vs. CAR was the other).

While Wojciech Wojcik tallied thrice in preseason play against Arizona United back in March and Blake Smith did the deed in U.S. Open Cup play in 2014 against the Dayton Dutch Lions, Zayed became the first to do the honor against NASL competition in the team's 67th league game. Zayed became the fifth member of the "Boys in Blue" to tally a brace in regular season play – and is the only one on that list currently on the roster:

"MIRACLE AT THE MIKE" GIVES INDY SPRING

TITLE: Dramatic three-goal wins are few and far between, but Indy Eleven's last meeting against Carolina, a 4-1 win on June 11, gave Indy the three standings points, four goals and three-goal winning margin it needed to surpass the New York Cosmos at the top of the table and earn the NASL's Spring title - and The Championship automatic berth in November that comes along with it. Indy Eleven collected the Spring Season trophy from NASL Commissioner Bill Peterson prior to last Saturday's 1-0 win over Minnesota at Carroll Stadium, and the NASL is expected to announce the date and time of Indy's first-ever appearance in The Championship, set to take place the weekend of Nov. 4-6, in the coming weeks. The surprise result at "The Mike" included the club's first-ever hat trick in NASL play by Eamon Zayed (15', 65' 85') and Justin Braun's third goal in four league matches to close out a memorable Spring.

START WITH A STREAK: A 3-0 win over Fort Lauderdale on July 13 allowed Indy Eleven to re-write the NASL record book, its 13th straight game without a defeat to start the season (6W-7D-0L) equaling the longest regular season undefeated streak in the league's modern history alongside the 2011 Carolina RailHawks and 2013-14 New York Cosmos. The "Boys in Blue" saw that run halted three days later with its 0-2 loss at Minnesota United FC.

If you want to get picky, Indy Eleven actually went 15 competitive games without a defeat to start 2016 when counting its two Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup contests (even its penalty kick defeat at the Chicago Fire in the Fourth Round technically went down as a 1-1 draw). While it doesn't count officially, if you want to throw the team's 1-0 exhibition win over Liga MX champion C.F. Pachuca onto the compilation as well, we won't stop you.

HANKINSON AT THE HELM: Indy Eleven's offseason began in earnest on December 2, when veteran coach Tim Hankinson was named the second full-time head coach of "Indiana's Team." Indy Eleven is the latest stop on a now 36-year coaching journey that has seen Hankinson lead teams at nearly every level of the sport in the United States – including two years in the North American Soccer League and nine years in Major League Soccer – and taken him across the globe.

The native of New York City is familiar with the NASL after being named the first head coach of the San Antonio Scorpions in 2012, helping the expansion squad to the league's regular season championship in his first season. Hankinson is now 29W-18D-19L in 66 regular season games in the NASL, the first 44 of which came with San Antonio from 2012-13 (19W-10D-15L).

"WOJ" GOES ON LOAN: Indy Eleven announced May 18 that forward Wojciech Wojcik would be loaned to OKC Energy FC. The 23-year-old striker will stay in Oklahoma City for the rest of the USL side's 2016 season through September and report back to Indianapolis for the remainder of the Eleven's NASL campaign. Wojcik had made one appearance off the bench for Indy in 2016, this after he started 13 of 21 appearances during his first season with the club in 2015.

"Woj" has made a big impression for the USL side, as he is Energy FC's scoring leader with four goals during his 19 appearances (1,186 mins) – including the game-winner in OKC's 1-0 "Oklahoma Derby" victory over the Tulsa Roughnecks last Saturday. **INDY UPSETS LIGA MX CHAMP PACHUCA IN FRIENDLY:** Indy Eleven used an early tally by striker Eamon Zayed, a fantastic goalkeeping display by Keith Cardona and plenty of last-ditch defending to down recently-crowned Liga MX Clausura season champion C.F. Pachuca 1-0 in an international friendly June 26.

It was Zayed putting Indy up just seven minutes in with an opportunistic goal, collecting a clumsily played ball by the Tuzos' center backs and before slotting low and left of Alfonso Blanco to put the home side up 1-0. Another poor back pass by Pachuca sprung Zayed on goal in the 26th minute, but the Irishman hurried his chip past an onrushing Blanco, missing just left of the frame to keep things close.

Cardona would get the full shift between the posts, and he came up big on a handful of occasions, most notably a kick save on Erick Sanchez's 15-yard blast in the 82nd minute.

INDY KNOCKED OUT OF OPEN CUP BY – CHICAGO IN PKs: Indy Eleven took a Major League Soccer squad into added extra time of a Fourth Round Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup tie for the second time in three seasons, but would ultimately bow out to Chicago Fire SC 3-4 in penalty kicks following a 1-1 draw after the extra 30 minute session at Toyota Park on June 15.

It was the "Men in Red" enjoying the best chances through the scoreless 90 minutes of regulation, but Chicago's speedy attackers were missing the final touch when they weren't testing Indy goalkeeper Jon Busch, who made 7 stops on the night. At the end of the first 15 minute session of added extra time Justin Braun would put the visitors on top with a splendid left-footed finish, giving Indy's sizeable traveling contingent hope of advancing to the Round of 16. However, after missing several good looks throughout, Ghanaian striker David Accam would finally hit home for Fire SC, dekeing two defenders before finishing far post past Busch in the 111th minute, setting the stage for PKs.

Indy Eleven would go up 2-0 initially in penalties thanks to makes by Nicki Paterson and Eamon Zayed and a first chance miss from Kennedy Igboananike. However, Chicago 'keeper Matt Lampson would save Indy's next chances by Nemanja Vukovic and Daniel Keller, and Accam would polish off the fourth and final kick for Chicago to push the MLS'ers through to the final 16 team bracket. **QUARTET OF HOOSIER STATE TIES:** Four players on the 2016 roster have links to the Hoosier State:

- MF Daniel Keller was born and raised in north suburban Carmel and attended Brebeuf Jesuit H.S. in Indianapolis
- Keller's one-time teammate at the University of Louisville, MF Dylan Mares, was born in South Bend, called Zionsville home and played his last collegiate season in 2013 with Indiana University
- Zionsville was also the former stomping grounds of defender Cory Miller, who moved to Indiana in his teens
- Midfielder Brad Ring may have been born in neighboring Illinois, but he earned his Hoosier State cred with a standout career at Indiana University from 2005-08

QUINTET OF ELEVEN ORIGINALS: Three of those players – Brad Ring, Dylan Mares and Cory Miller – are among the five players remaining that spent time with Indy Eleven during its 2014 Inaugural Season. Ring, Mares and midfielder Don Smart were on the opening day roster in April 2014, while Miller and fellow defender Marco Franco would join two weeks apart that August and September, respectively.

OFFSEASON MAKEOVER: Indy Eleven named American coaching veteran Tim Hankinson as the club's second permanent head coach on Dec. 2, and changes to the roster of "Indiana's Team" would be soon to follow. The roster to begin the season was split nearly down the middle between returning players (10) and newcomers (12) – a trend that carried over to Hankinson's coaching staff thanks to the return of Tim Regan to an assistant role and the addition of veteran goalkeeper Jon Busch, who will serve as the squad's goalkeeping coach in addition to the team's first-choice netminder. With the late-Spring Season addition of Gerardo Torrado and Souleymane Youla and recent departure of Gorka Larrea, the roster now includes 13 new "Boys in Blue" ...
