LAST TIME OUT - IND 3:0 NYC (SEPT. 24) | Indy Eleven got revenge for its worst loss of the season in impressive fashion, downing the New York Cosmos 3-0 in a dominant performance in front of 9,157 fans at IUPUI's Carroll Stadium. Eamon Zayed, Justin Braun and Dylan Mares all notched a goal and assist in the victory for the "Boys in Blue," which canceled out a loss via a similar scoreline at the Cosmos three-and-half weeks earlier. The victory pushed Indy Eleven's home unbeaten streak to 16 games dating back to last October, drawing even with the Cosmos for the longest such active streak in the NASL.

The early energy from both squads was fitting for a game ripe with postseason implications, but it was Indy's direct play and high pressure that would start to take over the proceedings shortly into the contest, resulting in three strong chances in the opening 10 minutes.

Zayed - Indy's hero in its first meeting at Carroll Stadium against New York back in April - nearly got the opener at the half hour mark, but his shot from 20 yards drifted just high. However, the Irishman contributed to the opening tally just two minutes later, nodding Don Smart's cross from the right endline across the face of goal for Braun to finish up, giving the Eleven a hard-earned 1-0 lead.

That would be the last dangerous chance of a first half that saw Indy Eleven outshoot the Cosmos 7-1, but the home side's efficiency would pick up - and put the game away - in the opening minutes of the second half.

Mares would first play provider in the 48th minute, sending a low ball through the six that Zayed pounded home from the doorstep to double the advantage and tally his 13th goal of the season. Just three minutes later Mares would get one of his own, accepting Braun's square ball from the left on a counter before blasting a low shot just inside the right post from 20 yards out, all but putting things out of reach with 40 minutes to play.

Indy's constant pressure resulted in very few chances of any note from the run of play for New York, but it also resulted in more fouls - and more set pieces. The first shot on goal for the Cosmos came in the 57th minute when Juan Arango's well-driven free kick from 35 yards out snuck through traffic, but Indy netminder Jon Busch read it all the way and pounced on the ball for his first save of the evening. With the "Boys in Blue" able to effectively kill the game from there on out Busch would only be tested once more on the evening, stepping off his line quickly to bat away substitute Jairo Arrieta's header in the 87th minute. The shutout was the eighth this season for Busch and Indy Eleven, and the first in eight games dating back to a 1-0 win over Ottawa on Aug. 6.

LAST TIME vs. FCE | IND 1 : 0 FCE (JULY 23):

In a clash of two of the NASL's top teams, Indy Eleven emerged the winner from a hard fought 1-0 result over FC Edmonton last Saturday in front of 8,119 fans at IUPUI's Carroll Stadium.

After being victimized by two early goals the prior weekend at Minnesota, Indy Eleven flipped the script against the "Eddies" via defender Greg Janicki's third tally of the season just 13 minutes in. The chance was created when defender Nemanja Vukovic was tripped up 30 yards from goal to set up Dylan Mares' perfect free kick service to Janicki, who headed home from eight yards to move the scoreboard for the home side.

Edmonton striker Jake Keegan was unlucky not to even things up in the 22nd minute as he ran onto a free ball just 10 yards from goal, but his rising shot just missed the upper right corner. Two minutes later Indy 'keeper Jon Busch spilled Adam Eckersley's well-served cross from the left side, and while Daryl Fordyce was there to pounce on the loose ball he couldn't turn to shoot and the danger was eventually cleared by the Eleven backline.

Edmonton goalkeeper Matt VanOekel made eight saves on the evening, including two in the dying moments of the first half on shots by Eamon Zayed and Vukovic that kept things tight heading into the halftime break.

The first quality look of the second half came at the stroke of the 58th minute when Zayed was played behind the backline, but VanOekel cut off the angle well at his left post, going low to block the shot wide.

Edmonton striker Tomi Ameobi caused panic in the Indy six-yard box in the 62nd minute, but his cutback pass would be overrun by a trio of Eleven defenders and intended target Dustin Correa. Two more chances for the Eleven followed in quick succession, but forward Justin Braun's open header off a Vukovic cross was sent right to VanOekel, who moments later got just enough of Mares' far post shot to push it wide for a corner.

Indy looked like it padded its lead in the 75th minute Don Smart's diagonal ball sprung Braun behind the backline. While Braun's square ball was finished off by Zayed the offside flag went up, negating the goal. Two minutes from time it was Smart almost helping Indy find paydirt again when he sent a pinpoint cross to Zayed, whose header had VanOekel beat but fell just wide of the right post.

Edmonton had two chances deep into stoppage time, but Brad Ring was on the spot to deflect Fordyce's header at the near post out for a corner before clearing VanOekel's desperation header on the ensuing set piece to secure the full three points.







TABLE SETTING: Indy Eleven's win in its "six-pointer" with New York last weekend was big for the "Boys in Blue," but with the Cosmos winning midweek Indiana's Team is again seven points adrift of the top spots on both the Combined and Fall Season tables (albeit with a game in hand on the leader). Sunday's clash at FC Edmonton won't technically be an "elimination match" to stay in the Fall race, but with both teams sitting on 27 points and only five games remaining after that, it could become one when all is said and done.

INJURY REPORT ... JUST JANICKI: Once again, the only player to be completely ruled out for Sunday's match-up at FC Edmonton is center back Greg Janicki, as the veteran defender continues to be treated for a bout with plantar fasciitis that flared up in late August and has ruled him out of Indy Eleven's last five matches.

After sitting out since early August due to a right knee bone bruise, right back Marco Franco made his return to the field - and the starting XI - last weekend against New York, putting in an impressive 90-minute shift.

DIAMONDS ARE FOREVER?: Head coach Tim Hankinson had seen the signs of Indy Eleven's attack growing stale during a recent five-game winless streak ... so the Indy Eleven gaffer did something about it, switching his midfield formation from a somewhat "flat four" to a diamond in advance of its meeting with Miami FC on Sept. 17. In the two games since the formation tweak the Indy Eleven offense has come back to life in wins over Miami (2-1) and New York (3-0), showing the switch might just have been what the "Boys in Blue" needed ...

SIGNS FROM SINISA: ... but the formation change in midfield was only half about shape - it was also an effort to get playmaker Sinisa Ubiparipovic back on the field - and in a spot that plays to his strengths. During Indy Eleven's first 14 Fall Season contests, "Ubi" saw but 16 minutes of action (July 30 at Miami), but the 33-year-old midfielder has started each of the last two games - his first starts since May 14 - on the top point of the midfield diamond and shown why Indy Eleven was keen to land him from Ottawa Fury FC in the offseason.

Sinisa's been finding his stride the last two outings, playing 66 minutes against Miami and 61 last Saturday against New York. Against the Cosmos, Ubiparipovic helped set up Indy's second goal by finding Dylan Mares open inside the area after a failed corner kick clearance, marking his third chance created since his return. After fighting nagging hip and knee injuries all season long, Ubiparipovic has one assist in 502 minutes of action this season (9 GP/7 GS).

BOUNCING BACK: A veteran Indy Eleven squad has dealt well with adversity in 2016, its 2-1 win over Miami on Sept. 17 marking the fifth time in as many opportunities that the “Boys in Blue” gained at least a point following a defeat (now 4W-1D-0L in such games). The just-ended five-game winless streak was by far the longest of the 2016 season, as Indy Eleven had gone no more than two games between wins prior to the start of the streak on Aug. 20.

On the flip side, last Saturday win over New York marked the fourth time Indy had compiled at least back-to-back wins on the season. Indy Eleven will look to equal its season high streak of three straight wins (Aug. 3 v. JAX, Aug. 6 v. OTT & Aug. 13 v. OKC) Sunday at Edmonton.

BRAUN IS BACK: Forward Justin Braun is making up for lost time in September, as the Salt Lake City native has gone the full 90 minutes and tallied two goals and two assists across the team's last three matches:

Sept. 10 at FTL - goal (93')

Sept. 17 v MIA - assist (Mares, 25')

Sept. 24 v NYC - goal (32') & assist (Mares, 51')

Despite missing five of the team's six August affairs, Braun sits second on the squad in goals (6) and third in assists (4) - which also puts him among the league's best in those categories and others (see next page for full listing of Indy players among the league leaders).

STRIKING DIFFERENCE: Braun's recent reinsertion into the lineup is good news not just for his head coach, Tim Hankinson, but also for his strike mate up top in Indy's preferred 4-4-2 formation, Eamon Zayed. The Irishman had gone eight games scoring just once, his penalty kick conversion on Aug. 20 at Carolina marking the lone goal of Zayed's dozen in NASL play up to that point that did not come with the industrious Braun also on the pitch. With Braun back in full stride in recent weeks Zayed has looked livelier as well, scoring from the run of play once again last Saturday against New York and adding two assists in the last two outings.

When Braun has been on the field this season, Indy's scoring average is at 1.66 goals per 90 minutes (31 goals in 1,676 minutes), a noticeable difference from the 1.20 per 90 minutes clip without him (9 goals in 674 minutes).

STEPPING UP TO "THE MIKE": Indy Eleven is one of just two teams - with New York - that is undefeated at home in 2016, posting a 11W-3D-0L record and +20 goal differential and claiming 36 of a possible 42 points at home following last weekend's drubbing of New York.

The team's undefeated streak at Carroll Stadium actually stands at 16 games dating back to last October, which means Indy Eleven will go a full calendar year with tasting defeat at "The Mike" with its next home game set for Oct. 15. Should Indy and New York both stay unbeaten at home for the rest of the season they'll tie the 18-game modern NASL record held by Carolina (2012-14) and New York (2014-15).

After going winless in its first 12 home games at Carroll Stadium in 2014 (0W-5D-7L), Indy Eleven has since gone 19W-7D-5L in its last 31 league outings at "The Mike," a 3-0 win over Fort Lauderdale on July 13 finally pulling its career home record in NASL play over the .500 mark.

AGONY AWAY: In contrast to its home dominance, a 1-2 defeat on Sept. 10 at Fort Lauderdale left Indy Eleven winless in its last 10 road contests, including a 0W-2D-5L mark during the Fall Season. That also contrasts greatly with its undefeated 1W-4D-0L away ledger that helped it claim the Spring Season title. Indy's road record in 2016 now sits at 1W-6D-5L (9 GF/16 GA, -7 GD), its lone victory coming via a 2-1 result at Rayo OKC on April 30.

The club's all-time away mark sits at 7W-15D-18L (41 GF/68 GA), which includes just one win in 14 visits to Florida (1W-7D-6L), a 2-1 victory over FTL last June 6.

THERE WILL BE GOALS: The anti-soccer argument for many comes down to a lack of scoring ... well, those folks clearly aren't watching Indy Eleven games lately. Indiana's Team has gone 17 games without a 0-0 draw, the last one coming back on June 4 at The Miami FC. While Indy has been shut out just once in its last 12 games, it has also only compiled three clean sheets itself in that stretch. The goal-scoring is growing as the season wears on:

Spring: 2.30 combined goals/game (15/8 in 10 games)

Fall: 2.75 combined goals/game (25/19 in 16 games)

And if you want goals, well, they're practically guaranteed at Carroll Stadium! Indy has played 35 games since its last home 0-0 draw, which came on August 6, 2014, vs. Fort Lauderdale.

THE DOG DAYS ARE OVER: Indy Eleven is "knee-deep" into the last third (or 11 games) of 2016, the stretch starting with less than desired results at New York (0-3 L), vs. Tampa Bay (1-1 D) and at Fort Lauderdale (1-2 L) before bouncing back with a win on Sept. 17 vs. Miami (2-1). If you're looking at the season in thirds, Indy needs to step it up for the rest of the Fall in order to maintain its pace towards the top of the table:

Spring: 4W-6D-0L, 18 pts, 1.80 pts/gm, 1st place

Fall 1st half: 6W-2D-3L, 20 pts, 1.82 pts/gm, 3rd place

What could help Indy down the stretch drive is a slowdown in its schedule. The loss at New York on Aug. 30 marked the Eleven's last midweek game for seven weeks, with their final Wednesday game coming on Oct. 19 at Tampa Bay. ELEVEN (NOT ALWAYS) LEAVING IT LATE: Justin Braun's 88th minute tally on Sept. 10 was Indy Eleven's 12th goal past the 75th minute, again placing it alone atop the NASL in the category, now one ahead of New York's haul in "winning time." While late-game drama was Indy Eleven's "M-O" in the first half of the year, the late goals have somewhat dried up, as the Boys in Blue have scored 38% of their goals in league play (15 of 40) – and earned 21 of 42 standings points and a little thing called the Spring Season title – courtesy of finishes past the 70th minute of games.

Despite Indy Eleven's fevered fights to the finish, the last 15-minute (plus stoppage time) stretch hasn't been the most active when it comes to goal-scoring ... that distinction now belongs to the 16th-30th minutes, when 16 goals have been scored (9 for Indy, 7 against).

EAMON ZAYED GIVETH ... The "Boys in Blue" have been getting scoresheet contributions from across the field, with 11 different players recording assists on goals tallied by 12 players.

Eamon Zayed has gone on an assist binge with 4 helpers in his last 6 games - the latest on Justin Braun's GWG goal last Saturday vs. NYC improving his team lead in the category to six. He's followed closely by Dylan Mares (5) and Justin Braun (4) - both of whom also registered assists last weekend. While that trio leads the pack, Nicki Paterson and Nemanja Vukovic are the only players on the squad to notch multiple assists in a game this season (Paterson on July 13 vs. FTL, Vukovic on June 11 vs. CAR).

ZAYED INDY'S KING OF GOALS, BRAUN CLIMBING THE CHART: After tying Kleberon for Indy Eleven's single-season and career goal-scoring records with his 8th goal of the season on July 30 at Miami, Eamon Zayed claim the marks on his own in style the following game. The Irishman shattered the records with his second hat trick of the season three days later on Aug. 3 against Jacksonville and now sits at 13 after his tally last Saturday vs. New York (for the record, his USOC goal on June 1 vs. Louisville will not count towards the below records, just regular season tallies).

SEEING RED: Eleven defender Cory Miller picked up Indy Eleven's third red card in 12 Fall Season matches on Aug. 31 at New York, his tackle of Jairo Arrieta in the 53rd minute that denied a clear scoring opportunity earning a straight red. Miller's was the first of the three red cards that actually resulted in Indy Eleven playing a man down ...

AWESOME ATTACK INCLUDES RECORD PERFORMANCE: "Indiana's Team" is now second in the NASL in scoring with 40 goals, behind only New York, who's running away in the category with 47 tallies thus far. Something will have to give this weekend, as Indy squares off against by far the league's best defense, the Eddies only allowing 0.54 goals per contest.

When Indy's attack is on, it is really on, as evidenced by the fact the Eleven have notched three of the NASL's seven performances in 2016 featuring at least four goals tallied by a team ...

The five-goal output on Aug. 3 vs. JAX marked the most goals for Indy in a regular season game in its now 83-game history.

Indy Eleven's +13 goal differential is behind only New York's +21 ledger in NASL play.

Indy's 2-3 loss at Carolina on Aug. 20 marked its first loss when scoring multiple goals, the Eleven's mark in such games now standing at 9W-0D-1L. Thanks to its defense, three of its seven Fall Season wins have come via 1-0 results (3W-9D-4L when scoring once or nil).

Indy is putting up 2.21 at home (31 GF/11 GA), in stark contrast to a 0.75 goals/game away from "The Mike" (9 GF/16 GA) Here's the breakdown of Indy Eleven's offensive output during the 2016 NASL season (**wins in bold**, *draws in italics*):

DEFENSE RIGHTING THE SHIP: Indy Eleven's stability at towards the top of the NASL table has come largely part to its defense, although its stout early-season numbers have been slipping as of late.

Indy Eleven allowed just one goal or less in 12 of its first 13 contests, but the "Boys in Blue" have allowed multiple tallies six times in its last 13 games.

However, with just one goal allowed in its last two contests combined - including a shutout last Saturday against New York, snapping an eight-game streak without a clean sheet (Aug. 6 vs. OTT) things are starting to turn around. Indy Eleven's 27 goals conceded are the third fewest across the NASL's Combined Season, behind only the ridiculous pace being set by Edmonton (15) and closer to New York (26).

DEFENDERS FINISHING THE JOB: Center back Greg Janicki continued his set piece mastery on Aug. 20, his finish of Dylan Mares' spot-on corner kick service giving the veteran his fourth goal of 2016. Indy's surprising haul of eight goals from its defensive unit (Janicki 4, Nemanja Vukovic 3 & Colin Falvey 1) has helped the squad diversify its scoring portfolio.

AT THE "BIG 4-0," BUSCH LEADS EXPERIENCED SQUAD: The common thread with Indy Eleven's batch of 14 newcomers in 2016 can be summed up in one word – experience. Eleven of the 14 new "Boys in Blue" are at least 30 years of age, while two of the other three – Neil Shaffer (27) and Justin Braun (29) – have served as captain at their previous stop. With the additions of Gerardo Torrado (37) and Souleymane Youla (34) in June, Indy Eleven now boasts the most experienced roster in the NASL. Goalkeeper Jon Busch, now in his 20th professional season in American soccer circles, serves as the oldest of the group now at 40 years of age after celebrating his birthday on Aug. 18, while second-year forward Duke Lacroix is the youngest at 22.

EVERY POINT ADDS TO INDY'S NEW RECORD: It may be a sign of the struggles of the first two seasons or of the marked improvement in year three (or both), but whatever you want to chalk it up to there's no arguing that Indy Eleven set a new single-season points record just 18 games into its 2016 campaign, eclipsing its previous high of 33 with a 2-1 win over Rayo OKC on Aug. 13 that landed Indiana's Team on 34 points

Two wins across Indy Eleven's final six contests would allow Indiana's Team to equal its win total from its first two years of play combined.

VUKOVIC LEADS "IRONMAN" RACE: When it comes to consistency, head coach Tim Hankinson has been able to lean on a steady stable of formidable veterans to log big minutes in 2016. A handful of members of the team's "Over-30 Gang," led by left back Nemanja Vukovic, are at the top of the team's "Ironman" categories of games played, games started and minutes played ... and the new, lone member of the team's "Over-40 Gang," Jon Busch (who turned the big 4-0 recently on Aug. 18) ain't far behind. After coming out of the team's season opener with 17 minutes left due to a knock, the 32-year-old Vukovic has played every minute of the squad's last 25 contests.

TORRADO TAKES THE PITCH: Newcomer Gerardo Torrado is settling into his new role in the middle of the Indy Eleven midfield, starting 9 of the last 12 games (and coming off the bench in the other three) and displaying the organizing, passing and tackling abilities that made him one of the most impactful signings in the NASL's modern era. A notable moment for the league came back on Aug. 20, when the legendary Mexican international got his first chance to go against a longtime "El Tri" teammate when he locked horns with striker Omar Bravo for all 90 minutes in Carolina's 3-2 win at WakeMed Soccer Park.

The June 8 signing of Torrado was a landmark one for the NASL and Indy Eleven, as the 37-year-old midfielder's credentials include being the second-most capped player in Mexican National Team history (162), three FIFA World Cup appearances (2002, 2006 & 2010) and an 11-year stint with Mexican club powerhouse Cruz Azul – the last 10 of which he served as captain.

"El Borrego" was ineligible for league play until the transfer window opened on July 4, and a visit to Mexico to sort out visa paperwork left him unavailable for games on July 9 (vs. MNU) and July 13 (vs. FTL). He made his unofficial debut on June 26 with a 62-minute runout against Liga MX champs Pachuca in an international friendly at Carroll Stadium. Torrado's NASL debut came via an impressive second half performance on July 16 at Minnesota.

INDY-VIDUAL ACCOLADES: For their contributions to Indy Eleven's pivotal 3-0 win over New York last weekend, Dylan Mares, Justin Braun & Marco Franco were all named to the NASL Team of the Week for Fall Season Week 13. ZAYED WEARING TWO HATS: Eamon Zayed became the first Indy Eleven player to score multiple goals in 2016 with his brace against New York on April 16, but the Irish-born, Libyan international one-upped himself on June 11 by scoring the first hat trick for the "Boys in Blue" in NASL play. Not one to settle, the man who earned the "Mr. Hat Trick" moniker during his days in Iran registered a second three-goal effort of the season on August 3 against Jacksonville, giving him two of the NASL's three hat trick to this point in 2016 (MNU's Christian Ramirez on July 2 vs. CAR was the other).

While Wojciech Wojcik tallied thrice in preseason play against Arizona United back in March and Blake Smith did the deed in U.S. Open Cup play in 2014 against the Dayton Dutch Lions, Zayed became the first to do the honor against NASL competition in the team's 67th league game. Zayed became the fifth member of the "Boys in Blue" to tally a brace in regular season play – and is the only one on that list currently on the roster:

"MIRACLE AT THE MIKE" GIVES INDY SPRING TITLE: Dramatic three-goal wins are few and far between, but Indy Eleven's last meeting against Carolina, a 4-1 win on June 11, gave Indy the three standings points, four goals and three-goal winning margin it needed to surpass the New York Cosmos at the top of the table and earn the NASL's Spring title – and The Championship automatic berth in November that comes along with it. Indy Eleven collected the Spring Season trophy from NASL Commissioner Bill Peterson prior to last Saturday's 1-0 win over Minnesota at Carroll Stadium, and the NASL is expected to announce the date and time of Indy's first-ever appearance in The Championship, set to take place the weekend of Nov. 4-6, in the coming weeks. The surprise result at "The Mike" included the club's first-ever hat trick in NASL play by Eamon Zayed (15', 65' 85') and Justin Braun's third goal in four league matches to close out a memorable Spring.

START WITH A STREAK: A 3-0 win over Fort Lauderdale on July 13 allowed Indy Eleven to re-write the NASL record book, its 13th straight game without a defeat to start the season (6W-7D-0L) equaling the longest regular season undefeated streak in the league's modern history alongside the 2011 Carolina RailHawks and 2013-14 New York Cosmos. The "Boys in Blue" saw that run halted three days later with its 0-2 loss at Minnesota United FC.

If you want to get picky, Indy Eleven actually went 15 competitive games without a defeat to start 2016 when counting its two Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup contests (even its penalty kick defeat at the Chicago Fire in the Fourth Round technically went down as a 1-1 draw). While it doesn't count officially, if you want to throw the team's 1-0 exhibition win over Liga MX champion C.F. Pachuca onto the compilation as well, we won't stop you.

HANKINSON AT THE HELM: Indy Eleven's offseason began in earnest on December 2, when veteran coach Tim Hankinson was named the second full-time head coach of "Indiana's Team." Indy Eleven is the latest stop on a now 36-year coaching journey that has seen Hankinson lead teams at nearly every level of the sport in the United States – including two years in the North American Soccer League and nine years in Major League Soccer – and taken him across the globe.

The native of New York City is familiar with the NASL after being named the first head coach of the San Antonio Scorpions in 2012, helping the expansion squad to the league's regular season championship in his first season. Hankinson is now 31W-19D-20L in 70 regular season games in the NASL, the first 44 of which came with San Antonio from 2012-13 (19W-10D-15L).

“WOJ” ON LOAN: Indy Eleven announced May 18 that forward Wojciech Wojcik would be loaned to OKC Energy FC for the USL side’s 2016 season. While the 24-year-old striker will return to Indy when Energy FC’s season ends, when exactly that will be is in question, as the squad begins play in the USL playoffs this Saturday vs. Rio Grande Valley FC. “Woj” is currently Energy FC’s scoring co-leader with four goals in 22 matches (1,313 mins). Wojcik made one appearance off the bench for Indy against New York during the Spring Season, this after he started 13 of 21 games during his first year with the club.

INDY UPSETS LIGA MX CHAMP PACHUCA IN FRIENDLY: Indy Eleven used an early tally by striker Eamon Zayed, a fantastic goalkeeping display by Keith Cardona and plenty of last-ditch defending to down recently-crowned Liga MX Clausura season champion C.F. Pachuca 1-0 in an international friendly June 26.

It was Zayed putting Indy up just seven minutes in with an opportunistic goal, collecting a clumsily played ball by the Tuzos’ center backs and before slotting low and left of Alfonso Blanco to put the home side up 1-0. Another poor back pass by Pachuca sprung Zayed on goal in the 26th minute, but the Irishman hurried his chip past an onrushing Blanco, missing just left of the frame to keep things close. Cardona got the full shift between the posts, and he came up big on a handful of occasions, most notably a kick save on Erick Sanchez’s 15-yard blast in the 82nd minute.

INDY KNOCKED OUT OF OPEN CUP BY – CHICAGO IN PKs: Indy Eleven took a Major League Soccer squad into added extra time of a Fourth Round Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup tie for the second time in three seasons, but would ultimately bow out to Chicago Fire SC 3-4 in penalty kicks following a 1-1 draw after the extra 30 minute session at Toyota Park on June 15.

It was the “Men in Red” enjoying the best chances through the scoreless 90 minutes of regulation, but Chicago’s speedy attackers were missing the final touch when they weren’t testing Indy goalkeeper Jon Busch, who made 7 stops on the night. At the end of the first 15 minute session of added extra time Justin Braun would put the visitors on top with a splendid left-footed finish, giving Indy’s sizeable traveling contingent hope of advancing to the Round of 16. However, after missing several good looks throughout, Ghanaian striker David Accam would finally hit home for Fire SC, dekeing two defenders before finishing far post past Busch in the 111th minute, setting the stage for PKs.

Indy Eleven would go up 2-0 initially in penalties thanks to makes by Nicki Paterson and Eamon Zayed and a first chance miss from Kennedy Igboananike. However, Chicago ‘keeper Matt Lampson would save Indy’s next chances by Nemanja Vukovic and Daniel Keller, and Accam would polish off the fourth and final kick for Chicago to push the MLS’ers through to the Round of 16.

OFFSEASON MAKEOVER: Indy Eleven named American coaching veteran Tim Hankinson as the club’s second permanent head coach on Dec. 2, and changes to the roster of “Indiana’s Team” would be soon to follow. The roster to begin the season was split nearly down the middle between returning players (10) and newcomers (12) – a trend that carried over to Hankinson’s coaching staff thanks to the return of Tim Regan to an assistant role and the addition of veteran goalkeeper Jon Busch, who will serve as the squad’s goalkeeping coach in addition to the team’s first-choice netminder. With the late-Spring Season addition of Gerardo Torrado and Souleymane Youla and recent departure of Gorka Larrea, the roster now includes 13 new “Boys in Blue” ...
