LAST TIME OUT - TBR 2 : 3 IND (WEDNESDAY): Indy Eleven returned to its late-game dramatics on Wednesday night, Nicki Paterson's 85th minute tally righting the ship after relinquishing a two-goal lead to give the visitors a massive 3-2 win over the Tampa Bay Rowdies in St. Petersburg.

Coach Tim Hankinson turned over his lineup for the midweek match, swapping eight starting spots from the weekend win over Carolina. As Tampa Bay looked to run at the Eleven defense early on, it was instead Indy who got the better of the hosts just before the quarter of an hour when Duke Lacroix blitzed through the Rowdies midfield and nutmegged another defender as he barreled towards the box. The midfielder snapped a low, hard drive towards Rowdies 'keeper Matt Pickens' near post, and the effort was enough to open the scoring.

Tampa Bay sought a way back into the match, and just a few minutes later Rowdies defender Ben Sweat saw a blocked effort cleared downfield for forward Eamon Zayed, and the Irishman struck sweetly on the half volley only to see Pickens produce a fine save. However, things changed right at the 30-minute mark, when Lacroix was again the difference maker, taking a defender one-on-one to the byline and dancing around a challenge to put the ball on a platter for Jair Reinoso. The Colombian forward redirected firmly on the doorstep to give Indy a 2-0 lead.

Tampa Bay would produce a number of efforts on Indy 'netminder Keith Cardona's goal between then and halftime - most notably midfielder Martin Vingaard's rifled shot which bounced off the crossbar and a pair of apparent goals nullified for offside calls - but Indy would hold firm and go in the break up 2-0.

The Rowdies fired out of the gate in the second half, blocked efforts by Juan Guerra and Tom Heinemann coming close in the opening minutes. Joe Cole would pull one back in the 53rd minute off a Georgi Hristov rebound that halved the deficit. Tampa Bay continued their push, and persistent fouling by Indy presented the Rowdies with one too many opportunities. In the 67th minute, it was Cole again who played in a free kick instantly headed back by Greg Janicki. But the Englishman produced a moment of magic and whirled in a dipping effort that beat 'keeper Keith Cardona to the far upper 90 to tie the match.

Indy would continue to absorb pressure, but would find chances of its own on the counter, hitting paydirt through Paterson in the 85th minute. After collecting a cross-field pass from Gerardo Torrado the Scotsman brought the ball down and was given too much space as he took a touch towards goal and beat the ball past Pickens to his right to separate the two sides for the final time.

LAST TIME vs. PRFC | PRFC 1 : 1 IND (JULY 2): The season may have transferred from Spring to Fall, but Indy Eleven's ability to score pivotal late goals transferred well back in early July, when forward Souleymane Youla's 92nd minute tally brought Puerto Rico FC's Inaugural Game to a 1-1 draw. The goal by the Guinean international Youla, making his NASL debut on the evening, offset a 74th minute goal by Hector Ramos that had the 6,474 fans in attendance at the Estadio Juan Ramon Loubriel ready to go home winners following their own team's NASL debut.

Indy Eleven enjoyed a rare night with the majority of the ball, but the 61-39 possession advantage came with a toll as a physical Puerto Rico side came out of the gates ready to establish their home ground, eventually committing 18 fouls on the night. Indy would get the better of the chances in the opening half, but Nemanja Vukovic's 9th minute header that hit paydirt was nullified by the offside flag, Eamon Zayed's 33rd minute shot flashed just wide left and Nicki Paterson's 45th minute free kick missed just wide right. PRFC almost knicked one at the death of the half when Ramos tried to redirect on the doorstep, but a sliding tackle by Cory Miller kept it at 0-0 into the break.

After a slow start to the second half by both sides, Indy Eleven looked to establish a rhythm about 20 minutes in when Vukovic, Justin Braun and Greg Janicki all had shots that narrowly missed. Those chances left the door open for a goal against the run of play by Puerto Rico in the 74th minute, when a counter-attack ended with Ramos touching home Kyle Culbertson's cross from the left to set up another Indy Eleven comeback attempt.

Indy would keep the pressure up in the final 10 minutes through a series of seemingly endless set pieces. Vukovic's short ball to Zayed nearly paid dividends in the 87th minute, but the Irishman's sliding shot missed wide. A minute later substitute defender Lovel Palmer crashed the six to get a head on a Vukovic corner that PRFC goalkeeper David Meves smothered on his line.

Puerto Rico would commit one too many fouls in a dangerous position, setting up one last Vukovic service that deservedly paid off. The left back's free kick from five yards outside the corner of the area was placed perfectly to the six, where the substitute Youla headed home with authority to bring things all square and keep Indy undefeated with five wins and six draws in NASL action.

TABLE SETTING ... INDY-EDMONTON CLASH SET FOR SEMIFINALS; INDY PLAYING SPOILER

FOR 4TH SPOT: A busy Week 16 of action cleared things up for the top of the table, as New York's 4-2 win last Jacksonville on Saturday in combination with a 1-3 defeat for FC Edmonton at Minnesota allowed New York to claim the Fall Season title and the #1 seed in The Championship in November. That means that Indy Eleven will be the #2 seed in the NASL's four-team postseason tournament, while FC Edmonton has secured the #3 seed - and a date at Carroll Stadium against Indy in a November 5th Semifinal clash.

The only piece of the postseason puzzle that remains is who will earn the fourth and final berth - and Indy Eleven has put dents in the hopes of both Carolina and Tampa Bay on that front in the last week. Minnesota is currently in the driver's seat thanks to the goal differential tiebreaker against Rayo OKC - which Indy Eleven ends the regular season against on the road next Sunday.

SHARE OF NASL'S RECORD HOME UNDEFEATED STREAK ON THE LINE: Dominance at home has been the overriding theme of the 2016 season for Indy Eleven - and it has Indiana's Team on the cusp of equaling the longest home undefeated streak in the NASL's modern history on Saturday night. Indy is one of just two teams - along with New York - that is undefeated at home in 2016, its 12W-3D-0L record and +23 goal differential (34 GF/11 GA) helping it claim 39 of a possible 45 points at Carroll Stadium this season.

The team's home undefeated streak at Carroll Stadium stands at 17 games, its last home loss coming over a year ago on Oct. 10, 2015 (1-2 L vs. San Antonio). Should Indy Eleven and New York both earn at least a point from their 2016 home regular season finales this Saturday (New York plays host to The Miami FC) they will equal the league record of 18 games unbeaten at home held by Carolina (2012-14) and New York (2014-15).

After going winless in its first 12 home games at Carroll Stadium in 2014 (0W-5D-7L), Indy Eleven has since gone 20W-7D-5L in its last 32 league outings at "The Mike," a 3-0 win over Fort Lauderdale on July 13 finally pulling its career home record in NASL play over the .500 mark.

WEDNESDAY WIN WIPES AWAY ROAD AGONY:

Indy Eleven's second road win of the season was a long time coming, but Wednesday's 3-2 triumph at Tampa Bay got the "Boys in Blue" off the schnied, snapping its road winless streak at 12 games (which included 6 draws). Indy now sits at 1W-3D-6L on the road during the Fall Season, which contrasts greatly with the undefeated 1W-4D-0L ledger that helped it claim the Spring Season title).

If the mantra to live by is "get a point on the road" then Indy Eleven's 2016 isn't all that bad, the squad getting at least a point from majority of its 15 away affairs via a 2W-7D-6L record (13 GF/20 GA). The team's previous road victory came on April 30 at Rayo OKC (2-1) - where Indy Eleven will end its regular season next Sunday. The club's career away mark is now 8W-16D-19L (45 GF/72 GA).

MILLER OUT FOR SEASON FOLLOWING ANKLE

SURGERY: Janicki's return to the lineup and availability for selection is especially important for the Indy Eleven backline after fellow center back Cory Miller underwent season-ending surgery on Oct. 10, to repair damage in his right ankle suffered on October 2 at FC Edmonton. After gaining just one start in 10 Spring Season opportunities, Miller had filled in more than admirably during the Fall, starting 12 of the team's 17 contests in tandem with Colin Falvey or Janicki at center back.

INJURY REPORT ... **ALL HANDS ON DECK**: Other than Miller, Indy Eleven's injury situation has been nearly erased after Gerardo Torrado and Greg Janicki saw considerable action on Wednesday night. Torrado suffered a left calf strain on Oct. 2 at FC Edmonton, but after sitting out both games last week the Mexican international played 25 minutes on Wednesday - and supplied the gamewinner assist with a fine cross-field look to Nick Paterson. Meanwhile, Janicki trumped his 15-minute cameo at the end of Indy Eleven's scoreless draw at Jacksonville a week prior with a full 90 minute performance on Wednesday at the Rowdies. Janciki had missed the six games prior to the substitute stint at Jacksonville on Oct. 12 due to a plantar fasciitis rupture in his right foot that kept him out since late August.

INDY LOOKING FOR UNDEFEATED ENDING TO

FOUR-GAME GAUNTLET: With Indy Eleven's seeding - and opponent - in the postseason secured, head coach Tim Hankinson's most important task for the rest of the regular season is making sure his roster is set for The Championship Semifinal on November 5. The inevitable "roster rotation" game during its current four-game, 11-day stretch came midweek at Tampa Bay, and a number of the players looking to prove themselves did just that in the 3-2 victory. Wednesday's game featured eight changes from the XI that started last Saturday vs. Carolina, and Hankinson will likely return to the bulk of that lineup for Saturday's match against Puerto Rico FC - with Eamon Zayed (90 minutes on Wednesday) and Marco Franco (82 minutes) likely candidates to earn some rest after playing major minutes in all three games.

THERE WILL BE GOALS: Indiana's Team had gone 18 games without a 0-0 draw - that is until its Oct. 12 stalemate at Jacksonville (its previous scoreless result was back on June 4 at The Miami FC), but three-goal outbursts the last two times out has the goals flowing once again. Indy has been shut out just twice in its last 16 games, while compiling five clean sheets itself in that stretch. The goal-scoring has grown throughout the year:

Spring: 2.30 combined goals/game (15 GF/8 GA in 10 games) Fall: 2.75 combined goals/game (32/23 in 20 games)

And if you want goals, well, they're practically guaranteed at Carroll Stadium as Indy has played 36 games since its last home 0-0 draw (Aug. 6, 2014, vs. Fort Lauderdale).

EAMON ZAYED GIVETH ... The "Boys in Blue" have been getting scoresheet contributions from across the field, with 11 different players recording assists on goals tallied by 13 players - Gerardo Torrado the latest to add himself to the helper list on Wednesday night.

Recent assist binges for Eamon Zayed and Dylan Mares have found the duo sharing the team lead in the category with six helpers apiece - also good for a tie for third across the NASL. The six assists for Mares and Zayed have set a new single-season club record in the category, which Mares set last year with five.

While that trio leads the pack, Nicki Paterson and Nemanja Vukovic are the only players on the squad to notch two assists in a game this season (Paterson on July 13 vs. FTL, Vukovic on June 11 vs. CAR), and each have three helpers on the season to date along with Don Smart.

BOUNCING BACK: Indy Eleven has dealt well with adversity in 2016, as its Oct. 12 draw at Jacksonville marked the sixth time in as many opportunities the "Boys in Blue" gained at least a point following a defeat (now 4W-2D-0L in such games). The team's five-game winless streak from Aug. 20 through Sept. 10 (0W-2D-3L) was by far the longest of the 2016 season, as Indy Eleven had gone no more than two games between wins prior to the start of that streak.

On the flip side, Indy Eleven's 3-2 win at Tampa Bay on Wednesday marked the fifth time Indy has compiled consecutive wins on the season. Indy Eleven will look to equal its season-high winning streak of three games on Saturday, which it first achieved during a run of home games in the front half of August (Aug. 3 v. JAX, Aug. 6 v. OTT & Aug. 13 v. OKC).

EVERY POINT ADDS TO INDY'S NEW RECORD:

How big has Indy Eleven's turnaround been this year? Wednesday win at Tampa Bay was its 14th win in 30 games this season - equal to the number of wins it earned in 57 games across the 2014 & '15 campaigns combined. Indy Eleven set its new single-season points record just 18 games into its 2016 campaign, eclipsing its previous high of 33 (in 2015) with a 2-1 win over Rayo OKC on Aug. 13 that landed Indiana's Team on 34 points

Indy Eleven now has a league-best 15 goals past the 75^{th} minute, one more than New York's haul during "winning time." The Boys in Blue have scored an impressive 36% of their goals in league play (17 of 47) – and earned 24 of 52 standings points and a little thing called the Spring Season title – courtesy of finishes past the 70^{th} minute of games.

With Indy Eleven's fevered fights to the finish, the last 15minute (plus stoppage time) stretch has been the most active with 20 goals scored (15 GF/5 GA).

PERFORMANCE: "Indiana's Team" is now second in the NASL in scoring with 47 goals, behind only New York, who's running away in the category with 54 tallies thus far. When Indy's attack is on, it is really on, as evidenced by the fact the Eleven have notched three of the NASL's nine performances in 2016 featuring 4+ goals and four additional three-goal outbursts (including three of its last five games) ...

The five-goal output on Aug. 3 vs. JAX marked the most goals for Indy in a regular season game in its now 86-game history.

Indy's 2-3 loss at Carolina on Aug. 20 marked its first loss when scoring multiple goals, the Eleven's mark in such games now standing at 11W-0D-1L (3W-10D-5L when scoring once or no goals).

DEFENDERS FINISHING THE JOB: Center back Greg Janicki continued his set piece mastery on Aug. 20, his finish of Dylan Mares' spot-on corner kick service giving the veteran his fourth goal of 2016 - good for a share of 4th place on the team's scoring chart alongside Mares. Indy's surprising haul of eight goals from its defensive unit (Janicki 4, Nemanja Vukovic 3 & Colin Falvey 1) has helped the squad diversify the scoring portfolio described above. **DEFENSE RIGHTING THE SHIP:** The defensive corps is also doing pretty well at their primary gigs, too! Indy Eleven allowed just one goal or less in 12 of its first 13 contests, and while the "Boys in Blue" have conceded multiple tallies eight times in its last 17 outings, they have also notched three clean sheets in their last five outings.

Indy Eleven's 31 goals allowed in 30 games is the third lowest in NASL's Combined Season, behind only the ridiculous pace being set by Edmonton (20) and closer to New York (29). Last Saturday's shutout against Carolina was Indy's - and goalkeeper Jon Busch's - 10th of the season, tied the third most in the league for clubs and goalkeepers, respectively.

GORDON CAPPED WITH "REGGAE BOYZ": Indy Eleven midfielder Omar Gordon earned his second appearance for Jamaica's senior national team on Oct. 11 in the team's 4-2 comeback win over Guyana in the Third Round of the Caribbean Futbol Union's Caribbean Cup. The recently-turned 24-year-old attacker entered early in the second half to help the "Reggae Boyz" rally from a twogoal deficit, Jamaica eventually winning after a 30-minute extra time period.

BRAUN IS BACK: Forward Justin Braun made up for lost time due to injury, as the Salt Lake City native has tallied three goals and two assists in his last six appearances (he earned a rare night off this past Wednesday):

Despite missing five of six August affairs due to a right MCL sprain, Braun still sits second on the squad in goals (7) and third in assists (4).

DIAMONDS ARE FOREVER?: When Indy Eleven's attack looked to grow stale during a recent five-game winless streak, head coach Tim Hankinson did something about it, switching his midfield formation from a somewhat "flat four" to a true diamond in advance of its meeting with Miami FC on Sept. 17. In the six games since then Indy Eleven's attack has shown increased punch, scoring multiple goals in wins over Miami (2-1), New York (3-0), Carolina (3-0) and Tampa Bay (3-2), showing the switch might have been just what the "Boys in Blue" needed ...

SIGNS FROM SINISA: ... but the formation change in midfield was only half about shape - it was also an effort to get playmaker Sinisa Ubiparipovic back on the field and in a spot that plays to his strengths. During Indy Eleven's first 14 Fall Season contests, "Ubi" saw just 16 minutes of action (July 30 at Miami), but the 33-year-old midfielder has started the last six games - his first starts since May 14 - atop the midfield diamond, helping dictate play from the middle of the park and diversify what had become an increasingly flank-dependent attack.

Sinisa's been finding his stride, getting "hockey assists" in back-to-back games against New York and FC Edmonton and notching an actual assist last Saturday on his inchperfect cross to Justin Braun for the GWG against Carolina. After fighting nagging hip and knee injuries early on, Ubiparipovic has one assist in 777 minutes of action this season (13 GP, 11 GS, 12 chances created).

VUKO GETS RARE NIGHT OFF: When it comes to consistency, head coach Tim Hankinson has been able to lean on a steady stable of formidable veterans to log big minutes in 2016. A handful of members of the team's "Over-30 Gang" are at the top of the team's "Ironman" categories of games played, games started and minutes played ... and the new, lone member of the team's "Over-40 Gang," Jon Busch (who turned the big 4-0 on August 18) ain't far behind.

Wednesday night's game at Tampa Bay marked the first minutes missed for left back Nemanja Vukovic since he exited the team's season opener at the Rowdies back on April 2, stopping an impressive streak of 28 consecutive 90-minute performances for the Montenegrin defender. Meanwhile, with his 90-minute run out on Wednesday, forward Eamon Zayed is the only member of the "Boys in Blue" to see the field in each of the team's 30 contests and the new team leader in minutes played ...

AT THE **"BIG** 4-0." BUSCH LEADS **EXPERIENCED SQUAD:** The common thread with Indy Eleven's batch of 14 newcomers in 2016 can be summed up in one word – experience. Eleven of the 14 new "Boys in Blue" are at least 30 years of age, while two of the other three – Neil Shaffer (27) and Justin Braun (29) – have served as captain at their previous stop. With the additions of Gerardo Torrado (37) and Souleymane Youla (34) in June, Indy Eleven now boasts the most experienced roster in the NASL. Goalkeeper Jon Busch, now in his 20th professional season in American soccer circles, serves as the oldest of the group now at 40 years of age after celebrating his birthday on Aug. 18, while second-year forward Duke Lacroix is the youngster at 22 (but not for long ... he turned 23 last Friday).

TORRADO TAKES THE PITCH: Newcomer Gerardo Torrado has settled into his new role in the middle of the Indy Eleven midfield, starting 10 of his 15 appearances since making an impressive NASL debut via a second-half substitute stint at Minnesota on July 16. Torrado earned his first assist for Indy on Wednesday night, as his savvy cross-field pass found a wide open Nicki Paterson for a late game-winner that stopped the team's road woes.

When healthy, the 37-year-old has displayed the organizing, passing and tackling abilities that made him one of the most impactful signings in the NASL's modern era. The June 8 signing of Torrado was a landmark one for the NASL and Indy Eleven, as the midfielder's credentials include being the second-most capped player in Mexican National Team history (162), 11 games played across three FIFA World Cup appearances (2002, 2006 & 2010) and an 11-year stint with Mexican club powerhouse Cruz Azul – the last 10 of which he served as captain. A notable moment for the league came on Aug. 20, when Torrado lined up against longtime "El Tri" teammate Omar Bravo for all 90 minutes at Carolina.

"El Borrego" was ineligible for league play until the transfer window opened on July 4, and a visit to Mexico to sort out visa paperwork left him unavailable for games on July 9 (vs. MNU) and July 13 (vs. FTL). He made his unofficial debut on June 26 with a 62-minute runout against Liga MX champs Pachuca in an international friendly.

"WOJ" LOAN ENDS IN OKC: Forward Wojciech Wojcik recently completed his lengthy loan stint with OKC Energy FC, although since he remained with the USL side past the NASL's roster-freeze date, the 24-year-old striker will not be eligible to suit up for Indy Eleven again in 2016. "Woj" was one of Energy FC's co-leading scorers with four goals in 23 regular season appearances (1,334 minutes) and also made two appearances (23 minutes total) in OKC's pair of USL playoff games. Wojcik made one appearance off the bench for Indy in 2016 against New York during the Spring Season, this after he started 13 of 21 games during his first year with the club.

ZAYED WEARING TWO HATS: Eamon Zayed became the first Indy Eleven player to score multiple goals in 2016 with his brace against New York on April 16, but the Irish-born, Libyan international one-upped himself on June 11 by scoring the first hat trick for the "Boys in Blue" in NASL play. Not one to settle, the man who earned the "Mr. Hat Trick" moniker during his days in Iran registered a second three-goal effort of the season on August 3 against Jacksonville, giving him two of the NASL's three hat trick to this point in 2016 (MNU's Christian Ramirez on July 2 vs. CAR was the other).

While Wojciech Wojcik tallied thrice in preseason play against Arizona United back in March and Blake Smith did the deed in U.S. Open Cup play in 2014 against the Dayton Dutch Lions, Zayed became the first to do the honor against NASL competition in the team's 67th league game. Zayed became the fifth member of the "Boys in Blue" to tally a brace in regular season play – and is the only one on that list currently on the roster:

"MIRACLE AT THE MIKE" GIVES INDY SPRING

TITLE: Dramatic three-goal wins are few and far between, but Indy Eleven's memorable 4-1 triumph over Carolina on June 11 gave Indy the three standings points, four goals and three-goal winning margin it needed to surpass the New York Cosmos at the top of the table and earn the NASL's Spring title - and The Championship automatic berth in November that comes along with it. Indy Eleven collected the Spring Season trophy from NASL Commissioner Bill Peterson prior to last Saturday's 1-0 win over Minnesota at Carroll Stadium, and the NASL is expected to announce the date and time of Indy's first-ever appearance in The Championship, set to take place the weekend of Nov. 4-6, in the coming weeks. The surprise result at "The Mike" included the club's first-ever hat trick in NASL play by Eamon Zayed (15', 65' 85') and Justin Braun's third goal in four league matches to close out a memorable Spring.

START WITH A STREAK: A 3-0 win over Fort Lauderdale on July 13 allowed Indy Eleven to re-write the NASL record book, its 13th straight game without a defeat to start the season (6W-7D-0L) equaling the longest regular season undefeated streak in the league's modern history alongside the 2011 Carolina RailHawks and 2013-14 New York Cosmos. The "Boys in Blue" saw that run halted three days later with its 0-2 loss at Minnesota United FC.

If you want to get picky, Indy Eleven actually went 15 competitive games without a defeat to start 2016 when counting its two Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup contests (even its penalty kick defeat at the Chicago Fire in the Fourth Round technically went down as a 1-1 draw). While it doesn't count officially, if you want to throw the team's 1-0 exhibition win over Liga MX champion C.F. Pachuca onto the compilation as well, we won't stop you.

HANKINSON AT THE HELM: Indy Eleven's offseason began in earnest on December 2, when veteran coach Tim Hankinson was named the second full-time head coach of "Indiana's Team." Indy Eleven is the latest stop on a now 36-year coaching journey that has seen Hankinson lead teams at nearly every level of the sport in the United States – including two years in the North American Soccer League and nine years in Major League Soccer – and taken him across the globe.

The native of New York City is familiar with the NASL after being named the first head coach of the San Antonio Scorpions in 2012, helping the expansion squad to the league's regular season championship in his first season. Hankinson is now 33W-20D-21L in 74 regular season games in the NASL, the first 44 of which came with San Antonio from 2012-13 (19W-10D-15L).

OFFSEASON MAKEOVER: Indy Eleven named American coaching veteran Tim Hankinson as the club's second permanent head coach on Dec. 2, and changes to the roster of "Indiana's Team" would be soon to follow. The roster to begin the season was split nearly down the middle between returning players (10) and newcomers (12) – a trend that carried over to Hankinson's coaching staff thanks to the return of Tim Regan to an assistant role and the addition of veteran goalkeeper Jon Busch, who will serve as the squad's goalkeeping coach in addition to the team's first-choice netminder. With the late-Spring Season addition of Gerardo Torrado and Souleymane Youla and summer departure of Gorka Larrea, the roster now includes 13 new "Boys in Blue" ...

- Hankinson also coached newcomer Omar Gordon during his brief stint last fall with Jamaican Red Stripe Premier League side Montego Bay United.

INDY KNOCKED OUT OF OPEN CUP BY -

CHICAGO IN PKs: Indy Eleven took a Major League Soccer squad into added extra time of a Fourth Round Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup tie for the second time in three seasons, but would ultimately bow out to Chicago Fire SC 3-4 in penalty kicks following a 1-1 draw after the extra 30 minute session at Toyota Park on June 15.

It was the "Men in Red" enjoying the best chances through the scoreless 90 minutes of regulation, but Chicago's speedy attackers were missing the final touch when they weren't testing Indy goalkeeper Jon Busch, who made 7 stops on the night. At the end of the first 15 minute session of added extra time Justin Braun would put the visitors on top with a splendid left-footed finish, giving Indy's sizeable traveling contingent hope of advancing to the Round of 16. However, after missing several good looks throughout, Ghanaian striker David Accam would finally hit home for Fire SC, dekeing two defenders before finishing far post past Busch in the 111th minute, setting the stage for PKs.

Indy Eleven would go up 2-0 initially in penalties thanks to makes by Nicki Paterson and Eamon Zayed and a first chance miss from Kennedy Igboananike. However, Chicago 'keeper Matt Lampson would save Indy's next chances by Nemanja Vukovic and Daniel Keller, and Accam would polish off the fourth and final kick for Chicago to push the MLS'ers through to the Round of 16.

INDY UPSETS LIGA MX CHAMP PACHUCA IN

FRIENDLY: Indy Eleven used an early tally by striker Eamon Zayed, a fantastic goalkeeping display by Keith Cardona and plenty of last-ditch defending to down recently-crowned Liga MX Clausura season champion C.F. Pachuca 1-0 in an international friendly June 26. It was Zayed putting Indy up just seven minutes in with an opportunistic goal, collecting a clumsily played ball by the Tuzos' center backs and before slotting low and left of Alfonso Blanco to put the home side up 1-0. Another poor back pass by Pachuca sprung Zayed on goal in the 26th minute, but the Irishman hurried his chip past an onrushing Blanco, missing just left of the frame to keep things close. Cardona got the full shift between the posts, and he came up big on a handful of occasions, most notably a kick save on Erick Sanchez's 15-yard blast in the 82nd minute.
