LAST TIME OUT - OKC 2: 1 IND (OCT. 30): Indy Eleven rounded out the 2016 regular season last Sunday with a 1-2 loss at Rayo OKC. Nicki Paterson's penalty in the 52nd minute separated the two sides, but Sebastian Velasquez's equalizer in the 61st minute was added to by Moises Hernandez's 85th minute tally to give the home side - and last postseason qualifier - all three points.

With an eye towards the postseason, Indy Eleven coach Tim Hankinson elected to rest several starters on the night. The first chance of the match came inside the opening three minutes when OKC winger Pecka cut inside and attempted to test Indy 'keeper Keith Cardona, but the Brazilian saw his effort blocked. Just a couple of minutes later, Velasquez attempted a similar effort from the opposite side, but the Eleven defense blocked the shot.

Indy would take over the run of play midway through the half, with Omar Gordon coming closest just before the whistle when he danced around defender Sebastian Ibeagha and rifled a shot at produced a save from Rayo 'netminder Bryan Byars.

As the second half picked up, Indy Eleven stayed on the offensive and got rewarded just six minutes in thanks to tidy work from Duke Lacroix, whose rifle a shot off he arm of OKC defender Yuma, resulting in a penalty kick. Up to the spot stepped Paterson, who netted his third goal in his last four games by sending Byars the wrong way and finishing low and left to give Indy the 1-0 advantage.

Rayo would fight back though, and after coming close through small opportunities they would find their equalizer thanks to a left-footed effort from Velasquez, who beat Cardona to his right-hand side to level.

Indy Eleven would respond almost instantly after Lacroix created another quality opportunity, but forward Souleymane Youla could not keep his header down and the chance went begging. Indiana's Team continued to press, seeing chances for Jair Reinoso and Omar Gordon would both go wide despite great work from both to open an angle.

Rayo OKC found their eventual winner off a corner, Hernandez rising to meet the delivery from Pecka and just beating a diving Cardona to give Rayo the lead five minutes from time.

Indy's final opportunities would fall to Paterson and Greg Janicki off a corner, but Rayo OKC would hold the pair off and secure the three points, moving the expansion side's undefeated streak to end the regular season at 10 games.

LAST TIME vs. FCE | FCE 2 : 1 IND (OCT. 2): Indy Eleven saw a two-game winning streak snapped in a late 2-1 loss at FC Edmonton. Despite a solid outing from the "Boys in Blue," a 94th minute winner from substitute forward Ben Fisk sealed the win for the hosts.

The first half was an even, end-to-end contest between the two sides with a number of chances falling for both. In the opening five minutes, Eleven 'keeper Jon Busch made two great saves - one on Shamit Shome, one on Shawn Nicklaw - to keep things level. Just minutes later it was Indy's turn at the Eddies goal, but defender Cory Miller struck a half-volley just wide of Edmonton 'netminder Matt VanOekel's post.

The hosts would test Indy once more in the opening half as Shawn Nicklaw was again at the center of the attack, this time finding midfielder Daryl Fordyce, but the Northern Irishman saw his effort collected well by Busch. For the "Boys in Blue," the best first half chance came from midfielder Dylan Mares, who took a pass and turned towards the Edmonton goal, rifling an effort at VanOekel that was tipped off the crossbar, sending the game scoreless into the halftime break.

The second half began quickly for Indy as the visitors looked to pounce straight from the whistle, but it would take ten minutes for a quality chance to fall their way - and forward Eamon Zayed would make the most of it. In an almost carbon copy of Zayed's goal against New York the prior weekend, midfielder Sinisa Ubiparipovic collected the ball at the edge of the area and sprayed a ball wide to Mares, who found his way towards the endline and sent in an early ball across the center of the box. Zayed got a solid foot to it and sent it through the legs of VanOekel for his 14th goal of the 2016 campaign and a 1-0 Indy lead. Heavy pressure would continue to be placed on the Edmonton goal by Indy, but a second chance for Zayed and one for Mares both went begging as they looked to double the lead.

In the 80th minute, the tide turned in favor of the Eddies as Pape Diakite found an equalizer, smashing home a bouncing ball in the box to make it 1-1 down the stretch. The hosts then cranked up the pressure on Indy's goal, but both Busch and his back line were well prepared and helped to repel three more opportunities in front of the net.

Despite those efforts, the damn would break in the last of four minutes of stoppage time as FC Edmonton hit on a breakneck counter attack. Fordyce and Nicklaw combined to race downfield and past a stretched Eleven defense, the latter finding Fisk at the back post where he slotted past Busch at the death to give the Eddies the victory.

UNDEFEATED: Dominance at home has been the

overriding theme of the 2016 season for Indy Eleven, which bodes well heading into Saturday's Semifinal showdown with FC Edmonton.

With a third straight 3-0 win at home in its regular season finale at Carroll Stadium on Oct. 22 vs. Puerto Rico, Indy Eleven finished its home slate undefeated at 13W-3D-0L, posting an impressive +26 goal differential (37 GF/11 GA) along the way en route to claiming 42 of a possible 48 points at Carroll Stadium this season.

The Boys in Blue really hit their home stride down the stretch, finishing with a four-game winning streak that saw them outscore the opposition 11-1, scoring multiple goals each time out and earning clean sheets in the last three, resulting in a current 297-shutout streak at "The Mike" (Miami FC's Enzo Rennella was the last opposing to score, 67' on Sept. 17).

Indy Eleven's home undefeated streak actually stands at 18 games when dating back to last season, tied for the second-longest such streak in the NASL's Modern Era alongside the 2014-15 New York Cosmos and 2012-14 Carolina RailHawks. New York actually broke its own record on Oct. 22 by pushing its current home unbeaten run to 19 games. Indy Eleven's last home loss came over a year ago on Oct. 10, 2015 (1-2 L vs. San Antonio).

After going winless in its first 12 home games at Carroll Stadium in 2014 (0W-5D-7L), Indy Eleven has since gone 21W-7D-5L in its last 33 league outings at "The Mike," a 3-0 win over Fort Lauderdale on July 13 finally pulling its career home record in NASL play over the .500 mark.

INDY SHOWS FIGHT ON ROAD IN OCTOBER:

While Indy Eleven's 2016 road record of 2W-7D-7L (14 GF/22 GA) might not turn any heads, if the old mantra of "earn a point on the road" is true then Indiana's Team was successful more often than not.

Indy actually showed increased signs of life away from Carroll Stadium in the final month of the season, holding second half leads in both its losses at FC Edmonton and Rayo OKC, notching a clean sheet in a 0-0 draw at Jacksonville and stopping a 12-game away winless streak with a gritty 3-2 comeback win at Tampa Bay on Oct. 19.

After a 1-2 loss in its regular season finale at Rayo OKC last Sunday, Indy's career away mark is now 8W-16D-20L (46 GF/74 GA).

INJURY REPORT ... ALL HANDS ON DECK: Other than Miller, Indy Eleven's injury situation has been nearly erased after Gerardo Torrado and Greg Janicki saw considerable action in recent weeks. Torrado suffered a left calf strain on Oct. 2 at FC Edmonton, but after sitting out the following two games the Mexican international played 25 minutes on Oct. 19 at Tampa Bay (and supplied the game-winner assist with a fine cross-field look to Nick Paterson) and made another 30-minute cameo last weekend at Rayo OKC. Meanwhile, Janicki trumped his 15-minute cameo at the end of Indy Eleven's scoreless draw at Jacksonville on Oct. 12 with full 90 minute performances in each of Indy's last three outings. Janciki had missed the six games prior to the substitute stint at Jacksonville due to a plantar fasciitis rupture in his right foot that kept him out since late August.

MILLER OUT FOR SEASON FOLLOWING ANKLE

SURGERY: Janicki's return to the lineup and availability for selection is especially important for the Indy Eleven backline after fellow center back Cory Miller underwent season-ending surgery on Oct. 10, to repair damage in his right ankle suffered on October 2 at FC Edmonton. After gaining just one start in 10 Spring Season opportunities, Miller had filled in more than admirably during the Fall, starting 12 of the team's 17 contests in tandem with Colin Falvey or Janicki at center back.

THERE WILL BE GOALS: Indiana's Team had gone 18 games without a 0-0 draw - that is until its Oct. 12 stalemate at Jacksonville (its previous scoreless result was back on June 4 at The Miami FC). However, the goals flowing once again with a trio of three-goal outbursts followed by a single tally last weekend at Rayo OKC. Indy has been shut out just twice in its last 17 games, while compiling six clean sheets itself in that stretch. The goalscoring has grown throughout the year:

Spring: 2.30 combined goals/game (15 GF/8 GA in 10 games) Fall: 2.77 combined goals/game (36/25 in 22 games)

And if you want goals, well, they're practically guaranteed at Carroll Stadium as Indy has played 37 games since its last home 0-0 draw (Aug. 6, 2014, vs. Fort Lauderdale).

BOYS IN BLUE HEAD INTO POSTSEASON WITH

"UNCLE MO": With Indy Eleven's seeding and opponent in The Championship known for weeks, head coach Tim Hankinson's most important task recently has been to ensure his roster is set for Saturday's Semifinal. After getting contributions from his entire squad en route to compiling three wins and a draw (and a 9-2 scoring advantage with three shutouts) during a crowded fourgame, 11-day stretch that ended on Oct. 22 and not seeing any injuries suffered in last weekend's season finale at Rayo OKC, Hankinson has indeed has a sharp and healthy side entering its first postseason appearance.

TAKING THE LEAD: While Indy Eleven has made a name for itself in 2016 with a slew of comebacks, the Boys in Blue have been out on their front foot plenty as well, going 13W-1D-2L when scoring first.

In fact, Indy has moved the scoreboard first in seven of its last eight matches, the lone exception being its 0-0 draw at Jacksonville on Oct. 12.

What may cause some concern for Indy is that in two of those three games in which it scored first but did not win the opposition was none other than FC Edmonton (1-1 D on May 7 and 1-2 L on Oct. 2). The other game was a 2-3 loss at Carolina on Aug. 20.

INDY CRUSHES CLUB RECORDS FOR WINS.

POINTS: How big has Indy Eleven's turnaround been this year? Indy's Oct. 22nd win over Puerto Rico FC was its 15th win this season - one more than the 14 wins amassed in 57 games across the 2014 & '15 campaigns combined. Indy Eleven set its new single-season points record just 18 games into its 2016 campaign, eclipsing its previous high of 33 (in 2015) with a 2-1 win over Rayo OKC on Aug. 13 that landed Indiana's Team on 34 points.

ONE MORE BOUNCE BACK: Indy Eleven has dealt well with adversity in 2016, as its Oct. 12 draw at Jacksonville marked the sixth time in as many opportunities the "Boys in Blue" gained a result following a defeat (now 4W-2D-0L in such games) ... and it's something Indy hopes to do one more time on Saturday after dropping its season finale last weekend at Rayo OKC. Thankfully Indy Eleven hasn't had to deal much with defeat, as its seven losses (all suffered since mid-July) was tied with New York for the lowest in the NASL in 2016.

EAMON ZAYED GIVETH ... The "Boys in Blue" have been getting scoresheet contributions from across the field, with 11 different players recording assists on goals tallied by 13 players, Gerardo Torrado the latest to add himself to the helper list on Oct. 19 at Tampa Bay.

Recent assist binges for Eamon Zayed and Dylan Mares have found the duo sharing the team lead in the category with six helpers apiece - also good for a tie for fourth across the NASL. The six assists for Mares and Zayed have set a new single-season club record in the category, which Mares set last year with five.

While that trio leads the pack, Nicki Paterson and Nemanja Vukovic are the only players on the squad to notch two assists in a game this season (Paterson on July 13 vs. FTL, Vukovic on June 11 vs. CAR), and each have three helpers on the season to date along with Don Smart.

DEFENSE RIGHTING THE SHIP: After a bit of a midseason lull in the defensive department, Indy Eleven cranked up the heat on the opposition as the season wound down. Indy Eleven allowed just one goal or less in 12 of its first 13 contests, and while the "Boys in Blue" conceded multiple tallies in six of 11 games to follow it has done so just three times in its last outings eight outings - although two of those occasions came on the road while coach Tim Hankinson rotated his backline to allow for some rest leading up to the postseason. In those last eight games, Indy Eleven has also posted four shutouts.

Indy Eleven's 33 goals allowed in 32 games was the third lowest in NASL's Combined Season, behind only the ridiculous pace set by Edmonton (201) and closer to New York (29). Indy Eleven and goalkeeper Jon Busch ended the campaign with 11 clean sheets, good for the third most in the league for clubs and goalkeepers, respectively.

DEFENDERS FINISHING THE JOB: While Indy Eleven has been doing the job defensively, it's defenders have also showed some prowess in the attacking third as well. Center back Greg Janicki continued his set piece mastery on Aug. 20, his finish of Dylan Mares' spot-on corner kick service giving the veteran his fourth goal of 2016 - good for a share of 4th place on the team's scoring chart alongside Mares. Indy's surprising haul of eight goals from its defensive unit (Janicki 4, Nemanja Vukovic 3 & Colin Falvey 1) has helped the squad diversify the scoring portfolio while racking up the second-most goals in the NASL this season.

LATE-GAME MAGIC RETURNS: Indy Eleven knows drama, as Indiana's Team saw seven of its NASL-best 15 goals scored past the 75th minute stand as game-winners in 2016. Those 15 goals past the 75th minute were the most in the NASL, one more than New York's haul during "winning time." In fact, the Boys in Blue have scored an impressive 33% of their goals in league play (17 of 51) and earned 24 of 55 standings points and a little thing called the Spring Season title - courtesy of finishes past the 70th minute of games.

With Indy Eleven's fevered fights to the finish, the last 15minute (plus stoppage time) stretch has been the most active with 21 goals scored (15 GF/6 GA).

Despite missing five of six August affairs due to a right MCL sprain, Braun still sits second on the squad in goals (8) and third in assists (5). Braun is also the runaway leader on the squad with five game-winning goals in 2016.

DIAMONDS ARE FOREVER?: When Indy Eleven's attack looked to grow stale during a recent five-game winless streak in August & September, head coach Tim Hankinson did something about it, switching his midfield formation from a somewhat "flat four" to a true diamond in advance of its meeting with Miami FC on Sept. 17. In the following seven games Indy Eleven's attack showed increased punch, scoring multiple goals in wins over Miami (2-1), New York (3-0), Carolina (3-0), Tampa Bay (3-2) and Puerto Rico (3-0), proving the switch might have been just what the "Boys in Blue" needed ...

SIGNS FROM SINISA: ... but the formation change in midfield was only half about shape - it was also an effort to get playmaker Sinisa Ubiparipovic back on the field and in a spot that plays to his strengths. During Indy Eleven's first 14 Fall Season contests, "Ubi" saw just 16 minutes of action (July 30 at Miami), but the 33-year-old midfielder started seven of Indy's last eight games (rested last Sunday at OKC) - his first starts since May 14 - atop the midfield diamond, helping dictate play from the middle of the park and diversify what had become an increasingly flank-dependent attack.

Sinisa's been finding his stride, getting "hockey assists" in back-to-back games against New York and FC Edmonton and notching an actual assist in two of his last three games - both on Justin Braun game-winners against Carolina and Puerto Rico FC. After fighting nagging hip and knee injuries early on, Ubiparipovic now has three assists in 837 minutes of action this season (14 GP, 12 GS, 13 chances created).

GORDON CAPPED WITH "REGGAE BOYZ": Indy Eleven midfielder Omar Gordon earned his second appearance for Jamaica's senior national team on Oct. 11 in the team's 4-2 comeback win over Guyana in the Third Round of the Caribbean Futbol Union's Caribbean Cup. The recently-turned 24-year-old attacker entered early in the second half to help the "Reggae Boyz" rally from a two-goal deficit, Jamaica eventually winning after a 30-minute extra time period.

VUKOVIC, BUSCH & ZAYED INDY'S

"IRONMEN": When it comes to consistency, head coach Tim Hankinson has been able to lean on a steady stable of formidable veterans to log big minutes in 2016. A handful of members of the team's "Over-30 Gang" are at the top of the team's "Ironman" categories of games played, games started and minutes played ... and the new, lone member of the team's "Over-40 Gang," Jon Busch (who turned the big 4-0 on August 18) ain't far behind.

Depending on your particular credentials for the title of team "Ironman" you could go with either Nemanja Vukovic or Eamon Zayed, each of whom finished atop the squad in appearances (31) and starts (30). However, with his 34-minute cameo off the bench last week, Vukovic may have won the tiebreaker of minutes played, beating out Zayed by 32 minutes in the category ...

AT THE "BIG 4-0." BUSCH **LEADS EXPERIENCED SQUAD:** The common thread with Indy Eleven's batch of 13 newcomers in 2016 can be summed up in one word - experience. Eleven of the 13 new "Boys in Blue" are at least 30 years of age, while two of the other three - Neil Shaffer (27) and Justin Braun (29) - have served as captain at their previous stop. With the additions of Gerardo Torrado (37) and Souleymane Youla (34) in June, Indy Eleven now boasts the most experienced roster in the NASL. Goalkeeper Jon Busch, now in his 20th professional season in American soccer circles, serves as the oldest of the group now at 40 years of age after celebrating his birthday on Aug. 18, while second-year forward Duke Lacroix is the youngster at 23.

INDY-VIDUAL ACCOLADES IN 2016:

While Indy Eleven was shutout of the NASL's weekly honor roll for the final week (Week 18) of the Fall Season, midfielder Duke Lacroix used a goal and assist at Tampa Bay on Oct. 19 to earn his first nod to the NASL's Team of the Week for Fall Week 17, becoming the 13th different Indy player to earn the distinction in 2016. Forward Justin Braun joined him on the Fall Week 17 Best XI, making his fourth appearance of the season.

TORRADO TAKES THE PITCH: Newcomer Gerardo Torrado has settled into his new role in the middle of the Indy Eleven midfield, starting 10 of his 16 appearances since making an impressive NASL debut via a second-half substitute stint at Minnesota on July 16. Torrado earned his first assist for Indy on Oct. 19, as his savvy cross-field pass found a wide open Nicki Paterson for a late gamewinner that stopped the team's road woes.

When healthy, the 37-year-old has displayed the organizing, passing and tackling abilities that made him one of the most impactful signings in the NASL's modern era. The June 8 signing of Torrado was a landmark one for the NASL and Indy Eleven, as the midfielder's credentials include being the second-most capped player in Mexican National Team history (162), 11 games played across three FIFA World Cup appearances (2002, 2006 & 2010) and an 11-year stint with Mexican club powerhouse Cruz Azul – the last 10 of which he served as captain. A notable moment for the league came on Aug. 20, when Torrado lined up against longtime "El Tri" teammate Omar Bravo for all 90 minutes at Carolina.

"El Borrego" was ineligible for league play until the transfer window opened on July 4, and a visit to Mexico to sort out visa paperwork left him unavailable for games on July 9 (vs. MNU) and July 13 (vs. FTL). He made his unofficial debut on June 26 with a 62-minute runout against Liga MX champs Pachuca in an international friendly.

"WOJ" LOAN ENDS IN OKC: Forward Wojciech Wojcik recently completed his lengthy loan stint with OKC Energy FC, although since he remained with the USL side past the NASL's roster-freeze date, the 24-year-old striker will not be eligible to suit up for Indy Eleven again in 2016. "Woj" was one of Energy FC's co-leading scorers with four goals in 23 regular season appearances (1,334 minutes) and also made two appearances (23 minutes total) in OKC's pair of USL playoff games. Wojcik made one appearance off the bench for Indy in 2016 against New York during the Spring Season, this after he started 13 of 21 games during his first year with the club.

ZAYED WEARING TWO HATS: Eamon Zayed became the first Indy Eleven player to score multiple goals in 2016 with his brace against New York on April 16, but the Irish-born, Libyan international one-upped himself on June 11 by scoring the first hat trick for the "Boys in Blue" in NASL play. Not one to settle, the man who earned the "Mr. Hat Trick" moniker during his days in Iran registered a second three-goal effort of the season on August 3 against Jacksonville, giving him two of the NASL's three hat trick to this point in 2016 (MNU's Christian Ramirez on July 2 vs. CAR was the other).

While Wojciech Wojcik tallied thrice in preseason play against Arizona United back in March and Blake Smith did the deed in U.S. Open Cup play in 2014 against the Dayton Dutch Lions, Zayed became the first to do the honor against NASL competition in the team's 67th league game. Zayed became the fifth member of the "Boys in Blue" to tally a brace in regular season play – and is the only one on that list currently on the roster:

HANKINSON AT THE HELM: Indy Eleven's offseason began in earnest on December 2, when veteran coach Tim Hankinson was named the second full-time head coach of "Indiana's Team." Indy Eleven is the latest stop on a now 36-year coaching journey that has seen Hankinson lead teams at nearly every level of the sport in the United States – including two years in the North American Soccer League and nine years in Major League Soccer – and taken him across the globe.

The native of New York City is familiar with the NASL after being named the first head coach of the San Antonio Scorpions in 2012, helping the expansion squad to the league's regular season championship in his first season. Hankinson is now 34W-20D-22L in 76 regular season games in the NASL, the first 44 of which came with San Antonio from 2012-13 (19W-10D-15L).

"MIRACLE AT THE MIKE" GIVES INDY SPRING

TITLE: Dramatic three-goal wins are few and far between, but Indy Eleven's memorable 4-1 triumph over Carolina on June 11 gave Indy the three standings points, four goals and three-goal winning margin it needed to surpass the New York Cosmos at the top of the table and earn the NASL's Spring title - and The Championship automatic berth in November that comes along with it. Indy Eleven collected the Spring Season trophy from NASL Commissioner Bill Peterson prior to last Saturday's 1-0 win over Minnesota at Carroll Stadium, and the NASL is expected to announce the date and time of Indy's first-ever appearance in The Championship, set to take place the weekend of Nov. 4-6, in the coming weeks. The surprise result at "The Mike" included the club's first-ever hat trick in NASL play by Eamon Zayed (15', 65' 85') and Justin Braun's third goal in four league matches to close out a memorable Spring.

START WITH A STREAK: A 3-0 win over Fort Lauderdale on July 13 allowed Indy Eleven to re-write the NASL record book, its 13th straight game without a defeat to start the season (6W-7D-0L) equaling the longest regular season undefeated streak in the league's modern history alongside the 2011 Carolina RailHawks and 2013-14 New York Cosmos. The "Boys in Blue" saw that run halted three days later with its 0-2 loss at Minnesota United FC.

If you want to get picky, Indy Eleven actually went 15 competitive games without a defeat to start 2016 when counting its two Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup contests (even its penalty kick defeat at the Chicago Fire in the Fourth Round technically went down as a 1-1 draw). While it doesn't count officially, if you want to throw the team's 1-0 exhibition win over Liga MX champion C.F. Pachuca onto the compilation as well, we won't stop you.

OFFSEASON MAKEOVER: Indy Eleven named American coaching veteran Tim Hankinson as the club's second permanent head coach on Dec. 2, and changes to the roster of "Indiana's Team" would be soon to follow. The roster to begin the season was split nearly down the middle between returning players (10) and newcomers (12) — a trend that carried over to Hankinson's coaching staff thanks to the return of Tim Regan to an assistant role and the addition of veteran goalkeeper Jon Busch, who will serve as the squad's goalkeeping coach in addition to the team's first-choice netminder. With the late-Spring Season addition of Gerardo Torrado and Souleymane Youla and summer departure of Gorka Larrea, the roster now includes 13 new "Boys in Blue" ...

INDY KNOCKED OUT OF OPEN CUP BY -CHICAGO IN PKs: Indy Eleven took a Major League Soccer squad into added extra time of a Fourth Round Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup tie for the second time in three seasons, but would ultimately bow out to Chicago Fire SC 3-4 in penalty kicks following a 1-1 draw after the extra 30 minute session at Toyota Park on June 15.

It was the "Men in Red" enjoying the best chances through the scoreless 90 minutes of regulation, but Chicago's speedy attackers were missing the final touch when they weren't testing Indy goalkeeper Jon Busch, who made 7 stops on the night. At the end of the first 15 minute session of added extra time Justin Braun would put the visitors on top with a splendid left-footed finish, giving Indy's sizeable traveling contingent hope of advancing to the Round of 16. However, after missing several good looks throughout, Ghanaian striker David Accam would finally hit home for Fire SC, dekeing two defenders before finishing far post past Busch in the 111th minute, setting the stage for PKs.

Indy Eleven would go up 2-0 initially in penalties thanks to makes by Nicki Paterson and Eamon Zayed and a first chance miss from Kennedy Igboananike. However, Chicago 'keeper Matt Lampson would save Indy's next chances by Nemania Vukovic and Daniel Keller, and Accam would polish off the fourth and final kick for Chicago to push the MLS'ers through to the Round of 16.

INDY UPSETS LIGA MX CHAMP PACHUCA IN

FRIENDLY: Indy Eleven used an early tally by striker Eamon Zayed, a fantastic goalkeeping display by Keith Cardona and plenty of last-ditch defending to down recently-crowned Liga MX Clausura season champion C.F. Pachuca 1-0 in an international friendly June 26. It was Zayed putting Indy up just seven minutes in with an opportunistic goal, collecting a clumsily played ball by the Tuzos' center backs and before slotting low and left of Alfonso Blanco to put the home side up 1-0. Another poor back pass by Pachuca sprung Zayed on goal in the 26th minute, but the Irishman hurried his chip past an onrushing Blanco, missing just left of the frame to keep things close. Cardona got the full shift between the posts, and he came up big on a handful of occasions, most notably a kick save on Erick Sanchez's 15-yard blast in the 82nd minute.
