PREVIEW

Facing each other for the first time this season, Indy Eleven and Louisville City FC are set for another rendition of the storied Louisville-Indianapolis Proximity Association Football Content this Saturday in Louisville. With both squads drawn into a four-team Group E for the revamped 2020 campaign, the four LIPAFc meetings this season carry added importance as they fight for the group's two postseason slots.

Indy Eleven started out red hot to begin the 2020 season, leaving many teams around the league trailing by a large margin since resuming the season on July 11. Indiana's Team is coming off an exhausting five-game stretch over the course of 15 days in which it claimed 9 of 15 possible points (3W-2L-0D), keeping it comfortably atop the Group E standings (5W-2L-0D, 15 pts.), five points clear of second place Saint Louis FC.

While many considered Louisville City to be a Group E favorite, the Kentucky side has struggled to shake the rust off from its quarantine break, getting out of the starting gates slow with a 2W-3L-0D record and six-point haul that leaves it at the bottom of the four-team group. The recently opened Lynn Family Stadium hasn't quite become the fortress LouCity expected, with the Boys in Purple going 1W-3L-0D to begin life in their new home.

2020 USL Championship Regular Season Records Table

Indy Eleven: 5W-2L-0D, 15 pts. (+7 GD), 1st in Group E

SERIES HISTORY:

Where does one start when it comes to the single most important sporting and cultural series of events in human history? Indy Eleven will take its 2W-4L-3D LIPAFc record dating back to 2015 in all official competitions – USL Championship regular season, the Championship Playoffs, and Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup – across the Ohio River for Saturday's match, the first for Indy Eleven at the new Lynn Family Stadium. After taking two of the first three meetings, Indiana's Team has been winless against its rival the last six times out dating back to their first USL Championship meeting on May 5, 2018 (1-0 Indy win).

2019 was an even LIPAFc when it came to regular season meetings, both teams settling for 1-1 draws on June 29 in Indy and August 30 in Louisville before meeting in the Eastern Conference Final on November 9 at IUPUI Carroll Stadium. Indiana's Team had a 1-0 advantage through Pasher's 67th minute goal until deep into second half stoppage time, when Antoine Hoppenot's last-gasp equalizer took the game to added extra time. Magnus Rasmussen and Luke Spencer scored in the extra sessions to earn LCFC a third straight appearance in the USL Championship Final and leave the Eleven looking towards 2020 for its turn to make further club history – and exact some revenge against its rival.

One of the best rivalries in the Championship will be on center stage across the next six weeks, with the teams set to square off four times in 39 days – Saturday and Aug. 26 at Lynn Family Stadium and Sept. 5 & 16 at Lucas Oil Stadium.

#LOUVIND Roster Connections

Only one man hath been brave enough to suit up in both colors of the LIPAFc rivalry series, current Indy Eleven forward Ilija Ilic. The 29-year-old Serbian striker was a Lou City FC original, making 75 appearances across the club's first four seasons from 2015-18, including scoring a pair of goals and adding an assist in all six games (five starts) against Indiana's Team. Ilic's "thank you" in his first game against his former side last season came in the form of an assist on Tyler Pasher's goal back at Slugger Field on Aug. 30.

Table Topper

Even despite a loss the last time out, Indy Eleven remains atop the 35-team USL Championship in points on 15, three more than the squad Indy got its last win against last Wednesday night, Hartford Athletic. While Indy Eleven's seven games played is the most in the league to this point, Indiana's Team is doing plenty with those games, its 2.14 pts/game output ranking third in the Eastern Conference (HFD 2.4, TBR 2.2) and fifth overall (SA 2.5, RNO 2.25).

Fast Start: Indy Eleven's four straight wins to start 2020 made it just the fifth team to open a Championship campaign with four consecutive victories, matching the 2018 editions of Louisville City FC and Real Monarchs SLC for the third best start in league annals.

Prior to 2020, Indy had never managed to start a campaign with even two consecutive wins – although it did start the 2016 season by going 13 games unbeaten (6W-0L-7D). Indiana's Team began all four seasons of its NASL tenure from 2014-17 with two draws, while each of its first two USL Championship campaigns began with a win and a loss – although last year's season opening defeat at Saint Louis FC was followed by four consecutive victories for the Circle City squad.

Newton USLC's Victory & Shutout King (and "Save-ior")

With every outing this year, goalkeeper Evan Newton will look to pad his USL Championship career leads in a trio of categories. Last Wednesday's 1-0 clean sheet triumph at Pittsburgh boosted the Virginia Beach native's league-best marks to 49 shutouts, 455 saves, and 68 wins (career record 68W-45L-38D after Wednesday's victory). The 2018 Championship Golden Glove winner (with FC Cincinnati) is one of 10 Championship goalkeepers with two shutouts to their name in the early going of the 2020 campaign.

Youth Shall Be Served

A common trait amongst pretty much all of those new roster signings is youth, as only Haworth clocked in at over 24 years of age as of 2020's Opening Day back in March. This year's other 11 newcomers range in age from 17-24: Matthew Senanou (17), Alex Svetanoff (17), Patrick McDonald (17), Matthew Roou (17), Andrew Carleton (20), Jeremy Rafanello (20), Yeferson Contreras (20), Cam Lindley (23), Nick Moon (24), Conner Antley (24) and Felicien Dumas (23). When you factor in reigning USL Championship All-First Team Defender Neveal Hackshaw (24), 12 of 25 players are 24 years of age or younger (Macca King just "aged out" of this group upon his 25th birthday on April 10).

Pasher Picking Up the Pace

Has Tyler Pasher lived up to the lofty expectations heaped upon him prior to the 2020 campaign? Six goals – and four game-winning goals – through seven games has us answering with a resounding “OF COURSE HE IS!”

Last Saturday's defeat to Sporting Kansas City marked the end of an impressive streak that saw Pasher score in seven straight starts dating back to the 2019 Eastern Conference Semifinals at Nashville SC. While that streak is over, he can continue another one this weekend as the Canadian scored in all three LIPAFc contests in 2019 – a haul that actually encompassed all the scoring for Indy in last year's installment of the rivalry series.

Pasher's six goals gives him a two-goal lead in the USL Golden Boot standings, ahead of a chasing pack of nine players on four goals each. Pasher also leads the league in shots with 27, placing him three ahead of second-place Cameron Lancaster of Louisville ... with the next closest, Phoenix's Samuel Asante, coming in well behind on 16. Pasher's 16 shots on target are also tops in the league and gives him a marvelous on-target shooting percentage of 59.3%.

Pasher's not only finishing at a high level, but he's looking out for his teammates too – his assist on Carl Haworth's first tally for Indiana's Team back on March 7 at Memphis 901 FC was one of his team-high 12 chances created, which ranks him sixth in the Championship.

The 26-year-old's stunning game-winner at Pittsburgh Riverhounds on July 22 made him the first player in Indy Eleven history to score in four straight games, breaking a mark he previously shared with Kleberson (2014), Dane Richards (2015), Dane Kelly (2019), and ... himself (2019).

More Shots = More Goals

Now into Week 7, Indy Eleven is pacing the USL Championship with 112 shots (23 ahead of second-place Sacramento), that have led to 13 goals, placing it just one tally behind league co-leaders Phoenix Rising & Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC in the category.

As mentioned above, Tyler Pasher's 27 shots are setting the pace both for his team and the league, while Andrew Carleton's 13 shots – 9 of which came in Indy's 0-1 defeat at Saint Louis FC on July 26 – rank him tied for 8th across the league.

SHARING MEANS CARING

If the Indy Eleven attack seems to be coming from all directions across its first seven games, that's because it is. While Tyler Pasher's finishing touch has been fantastic, he's also proven adept at creating for others, his 12 chances created counting as the sixth most in the Championship in 2020. Eight other players in Indy have created at least five chances, led by Nick Moon's nine (T-16th in the Championship) and the central midfield duo of Drew Conner and Tyler Gibson with eight apiece.

Eight players have registered an assist already – Moon, Karl Ouimette and Ilija Ilic with two and Pasher, Carl Haworth, Ayoze, Carleton, and Macauley King all with one. Of Indy's 13 goals thus far, only two have gone unassisted.

When it comes to pure passes, Indy Eleven won't be passed up on the leaderboard, either! Four Indy players rank in the league's top 10 in total passes leading into the weekend – Neveal Hackshaw with 484 (1st), Tyler Gibson with 368 (3rd), Paddy Barrett with 343 (4th) and Karl Ouimette with 332 (6th).

MOON MISSION

The look of excitement mixed with relief that washed over Nick Moon's face was all that needed to be said following his first Indy Eleven – and USL Championship – goal just four minutes into last Wednesday's contest against Hartford. Coming off Macauley King's service along the right flank, the nodded effort also made for the first header scored by Indiana's Team in 2020.

Though he's just tallied his first goal, Moon has been active in setting his teammates to find the back of the net. Two of his nine chances created have turned into assists – both on Pasher finishes in Indy's 4-2 win at Memphis back on March 7 – while a third resulted in Pasher's rebound goal in a 2-1 win over SKC II on July 18. Following his active – and productive – 27-minute stint off the bench against Memphis, the Waukesha, Wisc.-native has been rewarded by head coach Martin Rennie with starting XI nods in Indy's last six contests.

Home Streaks End at 28 & 11

Last Saturday saw Indy Eleven's remarkable 28-game regular season home undefeated streak (21W-0L-7D) come to an end via a 0-1 defeat to Sporting Kansas City II, giving Indiana's Team its first taste of defeat at Lucas Oil Stadium in more than two years (since July 4, 2018, to be exact). The Eleven will have to settle for a share of the second-longest such streak in USL Championship history ...

Eleven Adds to Academy Signings with New Trio

Indy Eleven expanded its reach for young talent with Wednesday's announcement that three promising players – midfielder Patrick McDonald, forward Matthew Roo, and defender Matthew Senanou – have signed USL Academy contracts with the squad. They will replace a trio of previous USL Academy products – goalkeeper Holden Brown and midfielders Kyle Folds and Emerson Nieto – who were officially released from their contracts the same day.

In joining the club as USL Academy signings, McDonald (Germantown, Wis.; Shattuck-Saint Mary's), Roo (Greensboro, N.C.; NC Fusion), and Senanou (Plainfield, Ill.; Chicago Sockers) will retain their future NCAA eligibility. With the addition of goalkeeper Alex Svetanoff on July 17, Indy Eleven continues to have four USL Academy players on its 25-man roster. Since the start of the 2019 season, Indy Eleven has inked nine players to USL Academy contracts, making it one of the USL Championship's trend-setters when it comes to utilizing the roster mechanism.

The New Blue Crew

With the mid-June addition of defender Felicien Dumas and four new USL Academy Contract signings in place since mid-July, 12 of the 26 currently rostered players are calling Indy home for the first time in 2020. That group includes several players that will earn or fight for starters' minutes, including Carl Haworth, Cam Lindley, Andrew Carleton, Yeferson Contreras, Nick Moon and Conner Antley (continue further in the notes for their "mini bios" and visit IndyEleven.com/2020-roster for their full bios). Dumas, Jeremy Rafanello, and the Academy contract crew of Alex Svetanoff, Matthew Roo, Patrick McDonald and Matthew Senanou round out the list of 2020 newcomers for Indiana's Team.

A Comeback for the Ages

Indy Eleven did itself no favors by going into a 0-2 hole within the first 20 minutes in its season-opener at Memphis 901 FC back on March 7 ... but it did set Indiana's Team up for some club history. The 4-2 win allowed the club to rewrite a few club records, including:

- Most goals scored during the USL Championship era (72 regular season & postseason games)
- Most goals scored in an away match in club history
- First win in club history after being down two goals

The win at Memphis broke a 121-game streak (counting regular season and postseason league outings) in which Indy Eleven had failed to notch at least four goals in a game – something the squad has now accomplished twice in its first six games in 2020 (club record of five goals was accomplished in a 5-2 win over Jacksonville Armada FC on Aug. 3, 2016). In fact, the only two other times in which the Eleven scored at least four goals also came during that 2016 NASL campaign – a 4-2 win over Minnesota United FC on May 21, 2016, and the "Miracle at the Mike" 4-1 triumph over the then-Carolina RailHawks (now North Carolina FC) on June 11, 2016.

A Glass Half Two-Thirds Full

For the first time in his three seasons with Indy Eleven, Head Coach Martin Rennie enters a campaign with more familiar faces than new ones, as 16 of the 24 rostered players on Opening Day 2020 were returning from the 2019 edition. With that, the bulk of the production is also back for the Boys in Blue ...

Minutes: The 16 returning players represent 77% of the minutes logged in 2019 (28,516 of 36,822 played, to be exact). Only two Boys in Blue that played over 1,000 minutes last season – Dane Kelly (2,258) and Thomas Enevoldsen (1,716) – are not returning in 2020.

Goals: Players tallying 30 of the 48 goals scored last year return in 2020, including breakout leading goal scorer Tyler Pasher (13). While Kelly and Enevoldsen combined for 15 of the 18 goals lost, Indy does bring back five players other than Pasher who tallied multiple goals last year – Ayoze (3), Karl Ouimette (3), Drew Conner (2), Ilija Ilic (2) and Neveal Hackshaw (2).

Assists: A total of 70% of Indy Eleven's contributed assists (26 of 37) return, including co-leaders Ayoze and Kenney Walker (5 each). Pasher (4), Macauley King (3), Paddy Barrett (3), Ilic (2) and Tyler Gibson (2) are other multi-assist men who are returning from a year ago.

Coaching Staff: Consistency on the sideline is just as important as it is on the field, and to that extent Indiana's Team will be returning 100% of its braintrust. Head Coach Martin Rennie and Goalkeeper Coach Andy Swift are both back for their third seasons on the Eleven sideline, while Assistant Coaches Juan Guerra and Phil Presser return for their second seasons on the Indy bench.

GOALKEEPER

After making his Boys in Blue regular season debut on March 9 in Indy's 2019 season opener against Saint Louis FC, Newton was head coach Martin Rennie's first call between the posts throughout the season, finishing with nine clean sheets and an impressive 0.94 goals against average in 27 starts.
