PREVIEW

Indy Eleven welcomes its final non-Group E opponent in Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC to Lucas Oil Stadium this Saturday in what is sure to be a hotly contested match. Both clubs last met on July 22 in a thrilling back-and-forth contest at Highmark Stadium that nearly ended scoreless, that is until an at-the-death strike seven minutes into second-half stoppage time from Eleven forward Tyler Pasher snapped Pittsburgh's 25-game home unbeaten run.

Pittsburgh boasts the best attack in the Eastern Conference, having bagged 18 goals heading into the Week 8 slate, four more than second place Indy Eleven (14). Riverhounds SC comes into Saturday's fixture having won two on the bounce, scoring eight goals and conceding one in victories over New York Red Bulls II (4-1) and Philadelphia Union II (4-0).

Indiana's Team welcomes the visiting Riverhounds on its second-annual Racing Indy Night, an evening celebrating the Greatest Spectacle in Racing - the Indianapolis 500. Look for Indy Eleven to put on a spectacle of its own in a meeting between two of the USL Championship's in-form outfits.

SERIES HISTORY:

Deuces are wild for Indy Eleven and Pittsburgh, who have split their series in USL Championship action down the middle with 2W-2L-2D records (7 GF/9GA). Indy Eleven evened up the series in memorable fashion on July 22 at Highmark Stadium, where Tyler Pasher scored a 97th minute stunner that gave Indiana's Team a 1-0 win ... and Pasher the #1 slot on SportsCenter's Top Ten highlight reel.

If previous history is any indication you can expect this one to be decided late, as five of their seven all-time meetings across all competitions have seen either an equalizer (1) or game-winner (4) scored past the 80th minute.

#INDvPIT Roster Connections

Only one player across both rosters has suited up for Wednesday's opposite side – the man everyone's talking about, Eleven forward Tyler Pasher. The Ontario native made his USL Championship debut with Riverhounds SC during their 2015 season, when he scored twice in 21 appearances for the Mark Steffens-managed side.

Rennie & Pasher Earn USL Championship July Honors

Indy Eleven wasn't in search of validation for its hot start to the 2020 season – but it got some anyways this week when Martin Rennie and Tyler Pasher were named the USL Championship's Coach and Player of the Month for July (and including Weeks 1 & 2 from March) on Wednesday and Thursday, respectively.

Rennie helped Indiana's Team adapt to the COVID-19 hiatus successfully, resulting in a league best five victories from its first six games to start the campaign. Pasher scored in each of his first four games en route to compiling a league-best six goals (and one assist) through the end of July.

Get to the Point (per Game)

Eluding to the hot start mentioned above, Indy Eleven enters the weekend of Week 8 play with the second-most points in the 35-team USL Championship after being passed by Tampa Bay Rowdies on Wednesday night. With teams having played anywhere from three to eight games thus far, perhaps points per game would be the more accurate portrayal of performances – and Indy is solidly near the top of that table, too. Either way you measure it, this weekend's clash at Lucas Oil Stadium is a "Top Ten" affair.

Newton USL's Victory & Shutout King (and "Save-ior")

With every outing this year, goalkeeper Evan Newton will look to pad his USL Championship career leads in a trio of categories, which currently stand at 49 shutouts, 457 saves, and 68 wins (career record 68W-45L-39D). The 2018 Championship Golden Glove winner (with FC Cincinnati) currently ranks tied for fourth in clean sheets in 2020 with two, ranking behind TBR's Evan Lauro (4), SAC's Rafael Diaz (3) and SA's Dayne St. Clair (3).

Eleven Transfers Macca King to El Paso

On Tuesday, Indy Eleven parted ways with defender Macauley King, transferring the second-year professional to El Paso Locomotive FC. "Macca" started 19 of his 25 appearances with Indiana's Team across 2019-20, including two of three games this season, and contributed a goal and four assists in those contests. With the transaction, Indy Eleven now carries 25 players on its roster heading into its second clash of the season against Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC.

Pasher Picking Up the Pace

Has Tyler Pasher lived up to the lofty expectations heaped upon him prior to the 2020 campaign? Seven goals – and FOUR game-winners – through eight games (seven starts) has us answering with a resounding “OF COURSE HE IS!” Here’s everything you need to know about Pasher and his lightning-fast start.

- His seven goals places him atop the USL Championship Golden Boot chart alongside Phoenix’s Junior Flemmings
- o Pasher also leads the league in shots (29) and shots on goal (17)
- Has more shots ON TARGET (17) than all but six players leaguewide have total shots (and a resulting shooting accuracy of 59%)
- o His 15 chances created leads Indy and ranks 6th across the Championship
- Became only the second player in USLC history to score in each of his team’s first four games of the season (Toronto FC II’s Raheem Sterling accomplished in 2016)
- Became first player in Indy Eleven history to score in four straight regular season matches, breaking the club record he (2019), Kleberson (2014), Dane Richards (2015), and Dane Kelly (2019) shared
- o Had actually scored in seven straight starts dating back to last year’s Eastern Conference Semifinal at Nashville (Nov. 2) before being shut out by Sporting KC II on Aug. 1
- Now second all-time on Indy Eleven’s scoring chart with 21 goals (behind only Eamon Zayed’s 26 tallies across 2016-17)

Attacking Improving

Indy Eleven has ramped up the attacking play this season, its 1.75 goals scored per game a marked improvement from last year’s regular season average of 1.41 goals per game. Saturday’s meeting will pit two of the league’s top scoring teams together – and while a high-scoring duel didn’t take place the last time these two met in July, the potential is still there for some late summer fireworks at Lucas Oil Stadium

DON'T SLEEP THE DEFENSE, EITHER

While Indy’s offense has improved from 2019, the club has also managed to maintain the defensive effort from last year that was one of the best in the USL Championship. Indy enters Saturday’s match as one of 11 teams in the Championship with a sub-1.00 goals against average, its 0.88 goals against average (7 GA against in 8 games) pacing just a tick above last year’s 0.85 GAA in regular season action (29 GA in 34 games).

SHARING MEANS CARING

Eight players have registered an assist through as many games – Nick Moon, Andrew Carleton, Karl Quimette and Ilija Ilic all with two and Tyler Pasher, Carl Haworth, Ayoze, and the recently-departed Macauley King all with one. Of Indy’s 14 goals thus far, only two have gone unassisted.

When it comes to pure passes, Indy Eleven won’t be passed up on the leaderboard, either! Four Indy players rank in the league’s top 10 in total passes leading into the weekend – Neveal Hackshaw with 566 (1st), Tyler Gibson with 416 (4th), Paddy Barrett with 391 (7th), and Karl Quimette with 366 (8th).

FAST START

Indy Eleven’s four straight wins to start 2020 made it just the fifth team to open a Championship campaign with four consecutive victories, matching the 2018 editions of Louisville City FC and Real Monarchs SLC for the third best start in league annals.

Prior to 2020, Indy had never managed to start a campaign with even two consecutive wins – although it did start the 2016 season by going 13 games unbeaten (6W-0L-7D). Indiana’s Team began all four seasons of its NASL tenure from 2014-17 with two draws, while each of its first two USL Championship campaigns began with a win and a loss – although last year’s season opening defeat at Saint Louis FC was followed by four consecutive victories for the Circle City squad.

13 OLD, 12 NEW ... BAKER’S DOZEN OLD, 12 WITH YOUTH

With the mid-June addition of defender Felicien Dumas and four new USL Academy Contract signings in place since mid-July, 12 of the 25 currently rostered players are calling Indy home for the first time in 2020. Of those dozen newbies, all but one are age 24 or under, signifying a youth movement by Head Coach Martin Rennie: Matthew Senanou (17), Alex Svetanoff (17), Patrick McDonald (17), Matthew Roou (17), Andrew Carleton (20), Jeremy Rafanello (20), Yeferson Contreras (20), Cam Lindley (23), Felicien Dumas (23), Nick Moon (24), Conner Antley (24). Of the new additions, only 31-year-old Carl Haworth bucked the youth trend, and when you add in 2019 USL First-Team Defender Neveal Hackshaw, nearly half of the roster clocks in at age 24 or younger.

Home Streaks End at 28 & 11

Indy Eleven's last home contest on August saw its remarkable 28-game regular season home undefeated streak (21W-0L-7D) come to an end via a 0-1 defeat to Sporting Kansas City II, giving Indiana's Team its first taste of defeat at Lucas Oil Stadium in more than two years (since July 4, 2018, to be exact). The Eleven will have to settle for a share of the second-longest such streak in USL Championship history ...

The most impressive part of this home stretch? The Eleven closed it out with 11 consecutive wins at home, a run that began with a 2-0 victory over Loudoun United last July 20. That also stands as the second-longest stretch in USL history, placing two wins behind Orlando City's record run of 13 during their 2014 campaign.

Eleven Adds to Academy Signings with New Trio

Indy Eleven expanded its reach for young talent with the August 5 announcement that three promising players – midfielder Patrick McDonald, forward Matthew Roo, and defender Matthew Senanou – have signed USL Academy contracts with the squad. They will replace a trio of previous USL Academy products – goalkeeper Holden Brown and midfielders Kyle Folds and Emerson Nieto – who were officially released from their contracts the same day.

In joining the club as USL Academy signings, McDonald (Germantown, Wis.; Shattuck-Saint Mary's), Roo (Greensboro, N.C.; NC Fusion), and Senanou (Plainfield, Ill.; Chicago Sockers) will retain their future NCAA eligibility. With the addition of goalkeeper Alex Svetanoff on July 17, Indy Eleven continues to have four USL Academy players on its 25-man roster. Since the start of the 2019 season, Indy Eleven has inked nine players to USL Academy contracts, making it one of the USL Championship's trend-setters when it comes to utilizing the roster mechanism.

A Comeback for the Ages

Indy Eleven did itself no favors by going into a 0-2 hole within the first 20 minutes in its season-opener at Memphis 901 FC back on March 7 ... but it did set Indiana's Team up for some club history. The 4-2 win allowed the club to rewrite a few club records, including:

- Most goals scored during the USL Championship era (72 regular season & postseason games)
- Most goals scored in an away match in club history
- First win in club history after being down two goals

The win at Memphis broke a 121-game streak (counting regular season and postseason league outings) in which Indy Eleven had failed to notch at least four goals in a game – something the squad has now accomplished twice in its first six games in 2020 (club record of five goals was accomplished in a 5-2 win over Jacksonville Armada FC on Aug. 3, 2016). In fact, the only two other times in which the Eleven scored at least four goals also came during that 2016 NASL campaign – a 4-2 win over Minnesota United FC on May 21, 2016, and the “Miracle at the Mike” 4-1 triumph over the then-Carolina RailHawks (now North Carolina FC) on June 11, 2016.

GOALKEEPER

After making his Boys in Blue regular season debut on March 9 in Indy's 2019 season opener against Saint Louis FC, Newton was head coach Martin Rennie's first call between the posts throughout the season, finishing with nine clean sheets and an impressive 0.94 goals against average in 27 starts. After earning back-to-back clean sheets in early May against North Carolina FC and the Tampa Bay Rowdies, Newton tied and surpassed Odisnel Cooper's record of 40 career USL Championship career shutouts and eventually ended the season with 47 career clean sheets – a mark that could have been improved upon were his season not ended due to injury in September.

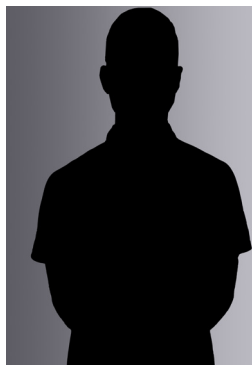
GOALKEEPER

After missing most of 2018 recovering from a shoulder injury, Farr experienced his first professional minutes with Indy Eleven in 2019 – beginning with a surprise early substitute appearance in Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup action on May 15 that saw him shut down Lansing Ignite FC for the final 70 minutes of a 1-0 win. Farr would go on to make 12 appearances (10 starts) in USL Championship action, starting 10 games and posting an incredibly efficient and impressive five clean sheets, 80 percent save rate and 0.66 goals against average. Farr second stint in place of the injured Newton include the final three starts of the regular season and stints between the posts for all three USL Championship Playoff contests, during which he shut out New York Red Bulls II and Nashville SC and blanked Louisville City FC deep into stoppage time of the Eastern Conference Final, an eventual 3-1 defeat.

A USL Academy signing midway through the 2019 season, Brown served as the primary back-up goalkeeper behind Jordan Farr when regular starter Evan Newton was injured, a stint that included the final three regular season games and all three USL Championship Playoffs contests. Brown will spend the first half of the 2020 USL Championship season with Indy before attending the University of Virginia in the fall.

In his three seasons with Zionsville High School, Brown made 68 saves and tallied 17 shut outs in 31 varsity appearances. In 2018, Brown signed with the Indiana Fire Academy, starting in eight of his 12 appearances for the Academy's Under-18/19 squad.

After earning a USL Championship All-League Second Team accolade in his first season with Indy Eleven in 2018, Ayoze continued his all-around stellar play with Indiana's Team in 2019. Ayoze notched three goals and a team co-leading five assists in 31 starts en route to playing the third most minutes (2,839) among his teammates. 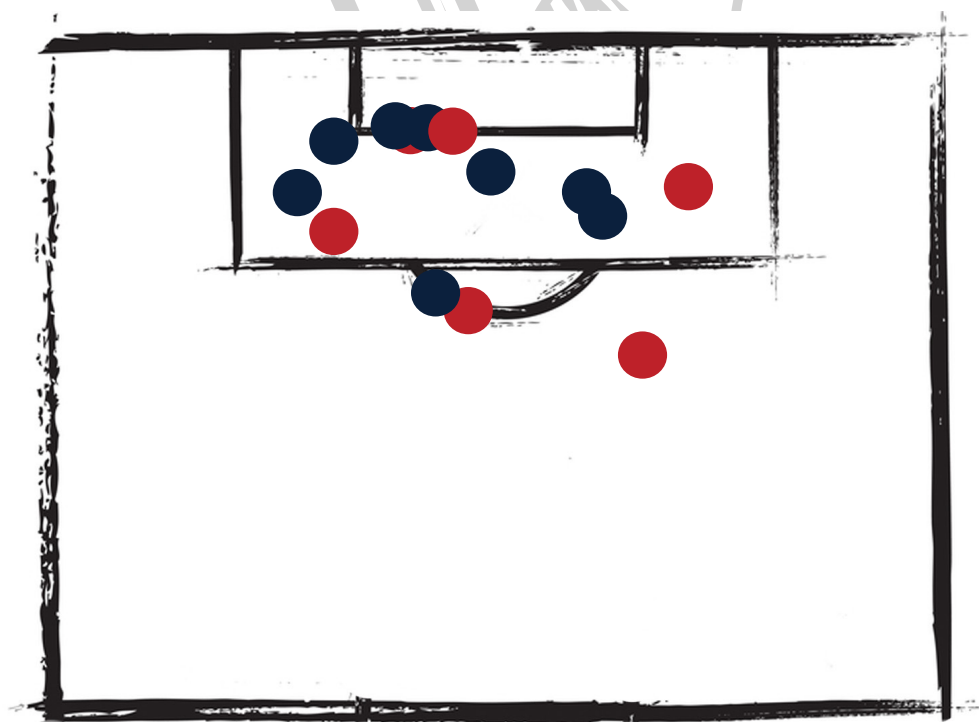
