### **PREVIEW**

Indy Eleven will take a trip south to Lynn Family Stadium for a second time this month on Wednesday night to battle Louisville City FC in the latest chapter of the Louisville-Indianapolis Proximity Association Football Contest series. The two clubs last faced off in the Derby City on August 8, resulting in a 1-1 draw after Indy forward Tyler Pasher's 59th minute strike neutralized Louisville's early lead, tallied in the 3rd minute by Speedy Williams.

Indy Eleven will enter Wednesday fresh off a bye week and a 1-0 home win against Group F heavyweight Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC back on Aug. 15. Indiana's Team currently boasts the best record in Group E (6W-2L-1D, 19 pts.), and with a road record of 2W-1L-1D in 2020, Lou City's new home will certainly not prove daunting.

Louisville City FC will enter the contest riding a two-game winning streak following a slow start to the restart of the season. After starting 2W-3L-0D to begin 2020, the Kentucky club has collected two wins and a draw since, helping it chase Indy Eleven and Saint Louis FC (4-3-2, 14 pts.) for one of the two playoff spots up for grabs from a crowded Group E.

#### 2020 USL Championship Regular Season Records Table

Indy Eleven: 6W-2L-1D, 19 pts. (+8 GD), 1st in Group E Louisville City FC: 4W-3L-1D, 13 pts. (+3 GD), 3rd in Group E

#### SERIES HISTORY:

Where does one start when it comes to the single most important sporting and cultural series of events in human history? Indy Eleven will take its 2W-4L-4D LIPAFC record dating back to 2015 in all official competitions – USL Championship regular season, the Championship Playoffs, and Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup – across the Ohio River for Wednesday's match, the second trip made by Indiana's Team to the new Lynn Family Stadium in 19 days' time. Some LIPAFC fun facts ...

 Each of their last three meetings in regular season play have resulted in draws. That includes their first 2020 showdown in Butchertown back on August 8, when Tyler Pasher's goal around the hour mark offset Speedy Williams' fast start for the home side, resulting in a 1-1 finish.

 That game marked the fourth straight LIPAFC affair – including last year's playoff contest – in which Pashed tallied a goal.

 After taking two of the first three meetings, Indiana's Team has been winless against its rival the last seven times out dating back to their first USL Championship meeting on May 5, 2018 (1-0 Indy win).

 One of the best rivalries in the Championship is currently on center stage, with Wednesday's meeting marking the second of four donnybrooks in 39 days; the squads head north to Lucas Oil Stadium for their final two Group E affairs on Sept. 5 & 16.

#### LOUVIND Roster Connections

Only one man hath been brave enough to suit up in both colors of the LIPAFC rivalry series, current Indy Eleven forward Ilija Ilic. The 29-year-old Serbian striker was a Lou City FC original, making 75 appearances across the club's first four seasons from 2015-18, including scoring a pair of goals and adding an assist in all six games (five starts) against Indiana's Team. Ilic's "thank you" in his first game against his former side last season came in the form of an assist on Tyler Pasher's goal back at Slugger Field on Aug. 30. The Young Harris College product also got the start at Lou City on August 8, playing an active 74 minutes in the 1-1 draw.

A slight break in the action for Indy Eleven has allowed teams across the league to catch up in various categories – but Indiana's Team is still near the top of the statistical table in the 35-team circuit in several categories, both overall and on a per game basis:

#### USLC's "Save-ior" Evan Newton Unlocks 50 Clean Sheet Club

ith every outing this year, goalkeeper Evan Newton will look to pad his USL Championship career leads in a trio of categories, which currently stand at 50 shutouts, 460 saves, and 69 wins (career record 69W-45L-39D). The 2018 Championship Golden Glove winner (with FC Cincinnati) currently ranks tied for third in clean sheets in 2020 with three, ranking just one behind the duo of TBR's Evan Lauro and ELP's Logan Ketterer.

#### Pasher Picking Up the Pace

Has Tyler Pasher lived up to the lofty expectations heaped upon him prior to the 2020 campaign? Eight goals – and FIVE game-winners – through nine games (eight starts) has us answering with a resounding "OF COURSE HE IS!" Here's everything you need to know about Pasher and his lightning-fast start:

·His eight goals places him atop the Eastern Conference's Golden Boot chart and now two behind league-leader Junior Flemmings of Phoenix Rising FC

- -Pasher places third with 31 shots taken a category led by LOU's Cameron Lancaster on 34 shots (PHX's Solomon Asante is 2nd with 32)
- -Pasher is tied for 2nd with 19 shots on goal alongside Flemmings, the duo placing just one SOG behind PHX's Soloman Asante
- -Has more shots ON TARGET (19) than all but 11 players leaguewide have total shots
- -Resulting shot accuracy of 61.3% is on pace with both Flemmings (63.3%) and Asante (62.5%)
- -His 15 chances created leads Indy and ranks T-12th across the Championship
- Became only the second player in USLC history to score in each of his team's first four games of the season (Toronto FC II's Raheem Edwards accomplished in 2016)
- Became first player in Indy Eleven history to score in four straight regular season matches, breaking the club record he (2019), Kleberson (2014), Dane Richards (2015), and Dane Kelly (2019) shared
- -Had actually scored in seven straight starts dating back to last year's Eastern Conference Semifinal at Nashville (Nov. 2) before being shut out by Sporting KC II on Aug. 1
- Now second all-time on Indy Eleven's scoring chart with 22 goals (behind only Eamon Zayed's 26 tallies across 2016-17)

#### Don't Sleep the Defense ...

Indy Eleven has managed to maintain the defensive effort from last year that was one of the best in the USL Championship. Indy's 0.78 goals against average (7 GA in 9 GP) is tied with Birmingham Legion FC for the 4th lowest in the Championship entering Week 9 action, now pacing even better than last year's single-season club record of 0.85 GAA in regular season action (29 GA in 34 games).

#### ... Attacking Improving, Too

Indy Eleven has ramped up the attacking play this season as well, its 1.67 goals scored per game (11th in the USLC) showing improvement from last year's regular season average of 1.41 goals per game.

#### INDY ELEVEN MOVE MACCA KING. RELEASE YEFERSON CONTRERAS

Indy Eleven recently parted ways with a pair of Boys in Blue, transferring defender Macauley King to El Paso Locomotive FC on Aug. 11 and ending the loan of forward Yeferson Contreras from Colombian side America de Cali on Aug. 18. King started 19 of his 25 appearances with Indiana's Team across 2019-20, including two of three games this season, and contributed a goal and four assists in those contests. Contreras' long appearance with Indy came via a start in this season's opener on March 7 at Memphis 901 FC, his return to the team becoming too complicated after the 21-year-old has returned to his native Colombia for the birth of his first child during the league's spring hiatus in play.

#### FAST START

Indy Eleven's four straight wins to start 2020 made it just the fifth team to open a Championship campaign with four consecutive victories, matching the 2018 editions of Louisville City FC and Real Monarchs SLC for the third best start in league annals.

Prior to 2020, Indy had never managed to start a campaign with even two consecutive wins – although it did start the 2016 season by going 13 games unbeaten (6W-OL-7D). Indiana's Team began all four seasons of its NASL tenure from 2014-17 with two draws, while each of its first two USL Championship campaigns began with a win and a loss – although last year's season opening defeat at Saint Louis FC was followed by four consecutive victories for the Circle City squad.

#### Home Streaks End at 28 & 11

Indy Eleven's last home contest on August saw its remarkable 28-game regular season home undefeated streak (21W-OL-7D) come to an end via a O-1 defeat to Sporting Kansas City II, giving Indiana's Team its first taste of defeat at Lucas Oil Stadium in more than two years (since July 4, 2018, to be exact). The Eleven will have to settle for a share of the second-longest such streak in USL Championship history ...

The most impressive part of this home stretch? The Eleven closed it out with 11 consecutive wins at home, a run that began with a 2-0 victory over Loudoun United last July 20. That also stands as the second-longest stretch in USL history, placing two wins behind Orlando City's record run of 13 during their 2014 campaign.

#### Eleven Adds to Academy Signings with New Trio

Indy Eleven expanded its reach for young talent with the August 5 announcement that three promising players – midfielder Patrick McDonald, forward Matthew Roou, and defender Matthew Senanou – have signed USL Academy contracts with the squad. They will replace a trio of previous USL Academy products – goalkeeper Holden Brown and midfielders Kyle Folds and Emerson Nieto – who were officially released from their contracts the same day.

In joining the club as USL Academy signings, McDonald (Germantown, Wis.; Shattuck-Saint Mary's), Roou (Greensboro, N.C.; NC Fusion), and Senanou (Plainfield, Ill.; Chicago Sockers) will retain their future NCAA eligibility. With the addition of goalkeeper Alex Svetanoff on July 17, Indy Eleven continues to have four USL Academy players on its 25-man roster. Since the start of the 2019 season, Indy Eleven has inked nine players to USL Academy contracts, making it one of the USL Championship's trend-setters when it comes to utilizing the roster mechanism.

#### A Comeback for the Ages

Indy Eleven did itself no favors by going into a 0-2 hole within the first 20 minutes in its season-opener at Memphis 901 FC back on March 7 ... but it did set Indiana's Team up for some club history. The 4-2 win allowed the club to rewrite a few club records, including:

- Most goals scored during the USL Championship era (72 regular season & postseason games)
  - Most goals scored in an away match in club history
  - First win in club history after being down two goals

The win at Memphis broke a 121-game streak (counting regular season and postseason league outings) in which Indy Eleven had failed to notch at least four goals in a game – something the squad has now accomplished twice in its first six games in 2020 (club record of five goals was accomplished in a 5-2 win over Jacksonville Armada FC on Aug. 3, 2016). In fact, the only two other times in which the Eleven scored at least four goals also came during that 2016 NASL campaign – a 4-2 win over Minnesota United FC on May 21, 2016, and the "Miracle at the Mike" 4-1 triumph over the then-Carolina RailHawks (now North Carolina FC) on June 11, 2016.

#### **Sharing Means Caring**

Eight players have registered an assist through as many games – Andrew Carelton with a team-high three (T-7th in USLC); Nick Moon, Karl Ouimette and Ilija Ilic all with two and Tyler Pasher, Carl Haworth, Ayoze, and the recently-departed Macauley King all with one. Of Indy's 15 goals thus far, only two have gone unassisted.

When it comes to pure passes, Indy Eleven defender Neveal Hackshaw won't be passed up on the leaderboard either! The 2019 USL Championship First Team defender and Trinidad & Tobago international currently places second with 634 passes on the season, just 8 distributions behind league-leading Grant Stoneman in San Diego.

#### 13 Old, 11 New ... Baker's Dozen Old, 11 with Youth

With the mid-June addition of defender Felicien Dumas and four new USL Academy Contract signings in place since mid-July, 12 of the 24 currently rostered players are calling Indy home for the first time in 2020. Of those dozen newbies, all but one are age 24 or under, signifying a youth movement by Head Coach Martin Rennie: Matthew Senanou (17), Alex Svetanoff (17), Patrick McDonald (17), Matthew Roou (17), Andrew Carleton (20), Jeremy Rafanello (20), Cam Lindley (23), Felicien Dumas (23), Nick Moon (24), Conner Antley (24). Of the new additions, only 31-year-old Carl Haworth bucked the youth trend, and when you add in 2019 USL First-Team Defender Neveal Hackshaw, nearly half of the roster clocks in at age 24 or younger.

After making his Boys in Blue regular season debut on March 9 in Indy's 2019 season opener against Saint Louis FC, Newton was head coach Martin Rennie's first call between the posts throughout the season, finishing with nine clean sheets and an impressive 0.94 goals against average in 27 starts. 




