On the heels of a 3-1 loss to Louisville on Sept. 5, Indy's win over SKCII last week provided a big morale boost, especially with it coming without the services of leading scorer Tyler Pasher. No other player outside the Canadian had scored in five games dating back to Aug. 1, but young forwards Nick Moon and Jeremy Rafanello stepped up to shoulder the attacking load and notched their second and first goals of the season, respectively, to secure the win. While its almost-league-record home undefeated and winning streaks were snapped earlier this summer, Indy still has an impressive home mark of 5W-2L-OD this season, an advantage it hopes will carry over against its rivals.

Louisville City FC has been one of the best teams – if not the best – in the USL Championship since the calendar flipped to August, putting the three-time defending Eastern Conference champs in prime position to take one of Group E's two playoff spots up for grabs. LCFC improved its standing on that front thanks to a convincing 3-0 win over Saint Louis FC last Saturday, pushing its unbeaten streak to seven games (5W-OL-2D) in the process.

With four games remaining in the regular season for all four Group E sides, the hunt for one of the two available playoff spots is very much still on for every contestant. Louisville (23) and Indy (22) currently sit atop the standings, but Saint Louis (18) and SKCII (13) can still turn their season around and make a push to the postseason. Indy enters Week 13 with a "magic number" of nine points, meaning wins in three of its last four would secure extra soccer for Indiana's Team.

#### 2020 USL Championship Regular Season Records Table

Indy Eleven: 6W-4L-1D, 19 pts. (+5 GD), 2nd in Group E Sporting Kansas City II 4W-6L-1D, 13 pts. (-3 GD), 4th in Group E

#### Series History

Where does one start when it comes to the Louisville-Indianapolis Proximity Association Football Contest – the single most important sporting and cultural series of events in human history? Unfortunately for Indy Eleven, it has to begin with the squad desperately seeking some success against its archrival, as Indiana's Team is just 2W-6L-4D in the series in all official competitions – USL Championship regular season, the Championship Playoffs, and Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup – dating back to their first meeting of the "modern era" in 2015:

•After taking two of the first three meetings, Indiana's Team has been winless against its rival the last nine times out dating back to their first USL Championship meeting – a 1-nil Indy victory at Lucas Oil Stadium on May 5, 2018

•The last meeting just 11 days ago saw Louisville post a 3-1 win at Lucas
Oil Stadium, the visitors blitzing out of the gates with three first half tallies.
Indy's attempt at a comeback was led by Tyler Pasher's PK conversion just
before halftime

-That result was the first loss suffered to LCFC at home in regular season play – and marked the first time in 40 USL Championship regular season games in which Indy Eleven suffered a home defeat by multiple goals.

-LCFC posted the same scoreline in last year's Eastern Conference Final at Carroll Stadium, meaning LouCity is the only team to beat the Eleven by multiple goals at home in the USLC era (the lone two instances in Indy's now 43 home games across USLC regular season and postseason play)

•The middle meeting to this point on Aug. 25 saw LCFC captain Paolo DelPiccolo's 61st minute tally stand as the lone score in Indy's 0-1 defeat at Lynn Family Stadium.

·That result snapped a three-game regular season streak of 1-1 draws between the rivals, which included their first 2020 showdown in Butchertown back on August 8. In that one, Pasher's 59th minute goal Speedy Williams' fast start for the home side in the 3rd minute.

Pasher has scored a goal in five of the last six LIPAFC contests since the start of their 2019 series. Those five strikes account for nearly half of Indy's 11 all-time tallies against Lou City (11 GF/20 GA).

#### INDvLOU Roster Connections

Only one man hath been brave enough to suit up in both colors of the LIPAFC rivalry series, current Indy Eleven forward Ilija Ilic. The 29-year-old Serbian striker was a Lou City FC original, making 75 appearances across the club's first four seasons from 2015-18, including scoring a pair of goals and adding an assist in all six games (five starts) against Indiana's Team.

llic's "thank you" in his first game against his former side last season came in the form of an assist on Tyler Pasher's goal back at Slugger Field just over a year ago on Aug. 30. The Young Harris College product got the start in the 2020 LIPAFC opener at LCFC on Aug. 8, playing an active 74 minutes in the 1-1 draw, before coming off the bench in their last two contests (12 min. on 8/26 @ LOU and 14 min. vs LOU on 9/05).

#### USL Championship Sets Postseason Structure

United Soccer Leagues announced Monday that its Championship Playoffs structure will see 16 teams participate in a regionalized single-elimination bracket, with the four group winners in each conference earning hosting rights for the Eastern and Western Conference Quarterfinals.

For Indy Eleven, this confirms what has been known since the announced restart of the league in July – the Group E winner will host the runner-up in Group F, and vice-versa, to start the postseason, putting paramount importance on winning the group. What we did not know was, following the opening round, hosting rights will be determined by regular season record.

#### Table Setting, Part I

With the postseason format now firmly in place, it's time to talk what Indy Eleven needs to do to secure one of Group E's two spots with four games remaining. The answer is two-fold:

still plenty (refer to the Group E table on the cover page, please) don't lose to Saint Louis FC down the stretch!

The good news is that Indiana's Team has a four-point cushion on Saint Louis for the #2 spot, putting its "magic number" of points needed to lock up a spot at nine heading into Wednesday's LIPAFC tilt (STLFC's max points possible is 30, thus Indy needs nine to hit 31 points). Indy will grab the popcorn and root for a Sporting KC II win (or at least a draw) this Saturday, when the Kansas side travels across the Show Me State to take on Saint Louis at 8:00 p.m. ET.

#### Table Setting, Part II

After a red-hot start to the season, Indy Eleven has managed to maintain top-third positions both across the 35-team USL Championship and 17-team Eastern Conference in most statistical categories as its season enters the final quarter of play. #### USLC's "Save-ior" Evan Newton First Member of 50 Clean Sheet Club

With every outing this year, goalkeeper Evan Newton will look to pad his USL Championship career leads in a trio of categories, which currently stand at 50 shutouts, 470 saves, and 70 wins (career record 70W-47L-39D). This season, Newton has collected a sturdy 7W-3L-1D record, 1.00 GAA and three clean sheets, the latter figure tied for 7th across the USL Championship.

#### Time to Talk Pasher for MVP

Has Tyler Pasher lived up to the lofty expectations heaped upon him prior to the 2020 campaign? NINE goals – and FIVE game-winners – through 11 games has us answering with a resounding "OF COURSE HE IS!" Here's everything you need to know about Pasher's MVP-caliber 2020 campaign:

Nine goals place him fourth on the Championship's Golden Boot chart, his absence from the field last Wednesday allowing PHX's Rufat Dadashov and former teammate Dan Kelly (now with CLT) to hop above him on 10 tallies. All three continue to chase PHX talisman Junior Flemmings and his 12 finishes.

Pasher is fifth in the league – and third in the Eastern Conference – with 35 shots (six behind LOU's Cameron Lancaster)

Pasher is also tied for third across the USLC with 20 shots on goal, behind only the PHX duo of Flemmings (25) and Solomon Asante (22)

·His 18 chances created leads Indy and ranks T-25th across the Championship (T-11th in the Eastern Conference)

·Became only the second player in USLC history to score in each of his team's first four games of the season (Toronto FC II's Raheem Edwards accomplished in 2016)

·Became first player in Indy Eleven history to score in four straight regular season matches, breaking the club record he (2019), Kleberson (2014), Dane Richards (2015), and Dane Kelly (2019) shared

-Had actually scored in seven straight starts dating back to last year's Eastern Conference Semifinal at Nashville (Nov. 2) before being shut out by Sporting KC II on Aug. 1

Now second all-time on Indy Eleven's scoring chart with 23 goals (behind only Eamon Zayed's 26 tallies across 2016-17)

#### "Moon Landings" Equal Fast Starts

Forward Nick Moon became the second player to notch multiple goals on the season for Indy Eleven last Wednesday, when he scored the second-fastest goal of the campaign in the sixth minute of a 2-1 win over Sporting Kansas City II. Who scored the quickest goal? That would also be Moon, who hit the back of the net in the fourth minute of the Eleven's 4-1 win over Hartford Athletic on July 29.

#### Diversify Your (Scoring) Portfolio

Until last Wednesday night, no one other than Tyler Pasher had scored for Indiana's Team since said win over Hartford, which saw Matt Watson cap the scoring in the 87th minute. In the five games that followed, Pasher supplied all the offense via three goals – a 458-minute streak that Moon broke with his early goal against SKCII.

Moon was joined by another fresh-faced forward in the scoring column last Wednesday, as 20-year-old Jeremy Rafanello opened his Indy Eleven account with the eventual game-winner in the 63rd minute. The New Jersey native became the tenth different Eleven player to tally this season.

#### **Sharing Means Caring**

Wingers Ayoze and Carl Haworth joined Indy's "multi-assist club" last Wednesday courtesy of services to Nick Moon and Jeremy Rafanello. Eight players have notched at least one helper this season – Andrew Carleton with a team-high three (T-14th in USLC, T-6th in East); Ayoze, Haworth, Moon, Ilija Ilic, and Karl Ouimette all have two, while and Tyler Pasher and the recently-departed Macauley King have one. Of Indy's 18 goals thus far, only three have gone unassisted.

#### Hackshaw Won't be Passed Up

Despite missing last Wednesday's game against Sporting KC II, Neveal Hackshaw still places second across the USL Championship with 745 passes on the season, behind only San Diego defender Grant Stoneman (860). The absence of Hackshaw from the lineup last week marked the first missed minutes of the season for the 2019 USL Championship First Team defender and Trinidad & Tobago international. "Hack" is now tied with Evan Newton and Karl Ouimette for second on the team's minutes played chart on 990, behind only last year's "Ironman," Tyler Gibson (1,058).

#### Home Streaks End at 28 & 11

Indy Eleven's 0-1 defeat to Sporting Kansas City on August 1 marked the end of its remarkable 28-game regular season home undefeated streak (21W-OL-7D), giving Indiana's Team its first taste of defeat at Lucas Oil Stadium in more than two years (since July 4, 2018, to be exact). Due to that result, the Eleven settled for a share of the second-longest such streak in USL Championship history ...

33 games | Richmond Kickers | 2012-14

28 games | Indy Eleven | 2018-2020

28 games | Charleston Battery | 2014-16

The most impressive part of this home stretch? The Eleven closed it out with 11 consecutive wins at home, a run that began with a 2-0 victory over Loudoun United last July 20. That also stands as the second-longest stretch in USL history, placing two wins behind Orlando City's record run of 13 during their 2014 campaign.

Indy's victory last week over Sporting Kansas City II pushed the squad's record at the corner of Capitol & South to 26W-6L-9D since the start of the 2018 USL Championship season.

#### Forward Josh Penn Back Home Again

After blazing a trail as Indy Eleven's first USL Academy contract signing in 2019, forward Josh Penn became the first such product to sign with Indiana's Team as a professional when he officially rejoined the squad on Aug. 25. At the time of his USL Academy Contract signing on February 21, 2019, Penn was the youngest player ever signed by the Eleven at the age of 18 years, three months and 27 days – a record since surpassed by most of the club's eight Academy Contract signings over the last 18 months.

During his first stint with Indy Eleven, the native of Naperville, Ill., started two of his five appearances and took a pair of shots in 157 minutes of USL Championship regular season action. Penn departed last summer to join perennial NCAA powerhouse Indiana University, helping a young Hoosiers squad to a 15W-3L-4D record and the Big Ten Conference's regular season and postseason tournament titles with his six goals and two assists, the former placing second on the squad.

#### Eleven Move Macca King, Release Yeferson Contreras

Indy Eleven recently parted ways with a pair of Boys in Blue, transferring defender Macauley King to El Paso Locomotive FC on Aug. 11 and ending the loan of forward Yeferson Contreras from Colombian side America de Cali on Aug. 18. King started 19 of his 25 appearances with Indiana's Team across 2019-20, including two of three games this season, and contributed a goal and four assists in those contests. Contreras' long appearance with Indy came via a start in this season's opener on March 7 at Memphis 901 FC, his return to the team becoming too complicated after the 21-year-old has returned to his native Colombia for the birth of his first child during the league's spring hiatus in play.

#### Eleven Adds to Academy Signings with New Trio

Indy Eleven expanded its reach for young talent with the August 5 announcement that three promising players – midfielder Patrick McDonald, forward Matthew Roou, and defender Matthew Senanou – have signed USL Academy contracts with the squad. They will replace a trio of previous USL Academy products – goalkeeper Holden Brown and midfielders Kyle Folds and Emerson Nieto – who were officially released from their contracts the same day.

In joining the club as USL Academy signings, McDonald (Germantown, Wis.; Shattuck-Saint Mary's), Roou (Greensboro, N.C.; NC Fusion), and Senanou (Plainfield, Ill.; Chicago Sockers) will retain their future NCAA eligibility. With the addition of goalkeeper Alex Svetanoff on July 17, Indy Eleven continues to have four USL Academy players on its 25-man roster. Since the start of the 2019 season, Indy Eleven has inked nine players to USL Academy contracts, making it one of the USL Championship's trend-setters when it comes to utilizing the roster mechanism.





# **NEWS & NOTES**

#### Blue Debuts in 2020

Of the 12 newcomers to the squad on the current roster (and yes, we're counting Josh Penn ... see above), seven have made their debut for Indiana's Team. All but two of those new signings – Carl Haworth (31) & Conner Antley (25) – are age 24 or younger, signifying a youth movement under Head Coach Martin Rennie (more on that next). #### Fast Start

Indy Eleven's four straight wins to start 2020 made it just the fifth team to open a Championship campaign with four consecutive victories, matching the 2018 editions of Louisville City FC and Real Monarchs SLC for the third best start in league annals.

Prior to 2020, Indy had never managed to start a campaign with even two consecutive wins – although it did start the 2016 season by going 13 games unbeaten (6W-OL-7D). Indiana's Team began all four seasons of its NASL tenure from 2014-17 with two draws, while each of its first two USL Championship campaigns began with a win and a loss – although last year's season opening defeat at Saint Louis FC was followed by four consecutive victories for the Circle City squad.

#### A Comeback for the Ages

Indy Eleven did itself no favors by going into a 0-2 hole within the first 20 minutes in its season-opener at Memphis 901 FC back on March 7 ... but it did set Indiana's Team up for some club history. The 4-2 win allowed the club to rewrite a few club records, including:

- Most goals scored during the USL Championship era (72 regular season & postseason games)
- ·Most goals scored in an away match in club history
- ·First win in club history after being down two goals

The win at Memphis broke a 121-game streak (counting regular season and postseason league outings) in which Indy Eleven had failed to notch at least four goals in a game – something the squad has now accomplished twice in its first six games in 2020 (club record of five goals was accomplished in a 5-2 win over Jacksonville Armada FC on Aug. 3, 2016). In fact, the only two other times in which the Eleven scored at least four goals also came during that 2016 NASL campaign – a 4-2 win over Minnesota United FC on May 21, 2016, and the "Miracle at the Mike" 4-1 triumph over the then-Carolina RailHawks (now North Carolina FC) on June 11, 2016.




