PREVIEW

Wednesday's contest features two of the three highest scoring offenses in the 35-team USL Championship through four weeks of action, Pittsburgh's nine goals placing second, followed by Indy with eight. Eleven forward Tyler Pasher paces the league with four goals, while Riverhounds SC attacker Kenardo Forbes paces the USLC in assists with four helpers of his own.

"Pivotal" might be too heightened a term this early in a season for a game featuring two teams sitting atop their respective groups with spotless records. However, their form out of the gates have Indy and Pittsburgh as the East's teams to beat in 2020, which makes their first of two meetings during the shortened 16-game campaign one likely to be circled for end-of-the-season reviews come October.

Of the 17 Championship squads with at least three games under their belts, Indy Eleven is the only one to start off with three victories. A win Wednesday would not only make Indiana's Team the first in the USLC to reach double-digit points, but it would also end Pittsburgh's 25-game home undefeated streak in regular season play - a figure Indy might be in awe of were it not for the fact it's similar run does the Riverhounds two better at 27.

Indy Eleven will look to even its all-time regular season series with Riverhounds SC, its record currently standing at 1W-2L-2D (6 GF/9 GA) after meetings across the 2018 & '19 USL Championship campaigns.

Pittsburgh also had the leg up in its Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup meeting last season, a Third Round affair the Riverhounds took via a 1-0 score at Highmark Stadium on May 29. Indy Eleven exacted revenge just three days later with a dramatic 2-1 win at Lucas Oil Stadium, while Pittsburgh took the return leg in regular season play via a 3-0 scoreline back in the Steel City.

Despite not being grouped together, the close proximity of the two growing rivals has them playing twice during the shortened 2020 season, with Indy Eleven set to host Riverhounds SC in the Circle City on August 15.

#PITvIND Roster Connections

Only one player across both rosters has suited up for Wednesday's opposite side – the man everyone's talking about, Eleven forward Tyler Pasher. The Ontario native made his USL Championship debut with Riverhounds SC during their 2015 season, when he scored twice in 21 appearances for the Mark Steffens-managed side.

Indy's 3-for-3

It took seven tries, but Indy Eleven finally began a season with two straight wins for the first time in 2020 – and it upped the ante by making it three wins out of the gate with last Saturday's 2-1 victory over Sporting Kansas City II. Of the 17 USLC clubs to play at least three games (as of Monday), Indy is the only one yet to drop a point. Pittsburgh and Birmingham are the only other two squads to play multiple games without dropping a point, both with two wins in as many games to start their seasons.

Indiana's Team began all four seasons of its NASL tenure from 2014-17 with two draws, while each of its first two USL campaigns began with a win and a loss – although last year's season opening defeat at Saint Louis FC was followed by four consecutive victory for the Eleven.

Pasher 3-for-3, Too

Has Tyler Pasher lived up to the lofty expectations heaped upon him prior to the 2020 campaign? Scoring four goals – including two game-winners – in three games has us answering with a resounding "YES."

After Week 4 of USL Championship play, the Canadian speed merchant's four tallies has him alone atop the USL Championship Golden Boot chart, and he is one of three players to have scored in his team's first three games (joining Phoenix's Junior Flemmings and Tampa Bay's Leo Fernandes). His 16 shots and 11 shots on target are also league bests, while his eight chances created leads Indiana's Team. Pasher has actually scored in five straight games when counting his goals in last year's USL Championship Eastern Conference Playoff games at Nashville SC and against Louisville City FC.

The 26-year-old's 39th minute tally last weekend against Sporting KC II made Pasher the first player in team history to notch multiple three-game scoring streaks. Pasher scored in three straight last year as well (6/01 v. PIT, 6/08 @ MEM, 6/15 @ LDN), joining Kleberson (2014), Dane Richards (2015) and Dane Kelly (2019) as Indy players to accomplish the feat.

Fireworks Show on the River

While Indy Eleven and Pittsburgh might be more known in league circle for their defensive prowess in previous seasons, in the early going in 2020 it is all about the offense. Indy Eleven has put at least two on the board in each of its three games so far, its eight goals this far ranking third across the 35team USL Championship. Not to be outdone, Pittsburgh enters the weekend second with nine goals, thanks in large part to a 6-spot over the weekend against Philadelphia Union II. Both teams rank behind only Phoenix Rising's 11 goals from their first three outings.

Newton USLC's Victory & Shutout King (and "Save-ior"):

With every outing this year, goalkeeper Evan Newton will look to pad his USL Championship career leads in a trio of categories. Last weekend's 2-1 triumph over SKC II boosted the Virginia Beach native's league-best marks to 48 shutouts, 452 saves, and 66 wins (career record 66W-44L-38D).

Home Streak 2 Years (and Counting)

Indy Eleven's current 27-game regular season home undefeated streak (20W-0L-7D) spans 742 days as of Saturday's win over SKC II, dating back to a 2-1 win over Charlotte Independence at Lucas Oil Stadium on July 7, 2018.

Indiana's Team is in the unique position of possibly ending Pittsburgh's attempt to even Indy's near-historic run, as Riverhounds SC enters Wednesday's showdown with a 26-game home unbeaten run of its own. Here's where their streaks rank on the USLC record charts:

Sharing Means Caring

If the Indy Eleven attack seems to be coming from all directions across its first three games, that's because it is. Five players currently rank in the league's top 15 in chances created – Tyler Pasher with 8 (T-6th), Nick Moon with 7 (T-9th), and Ayoze, Drew Conner and Carl Haworth all with 5 apiece (T-15th). Already six players have registered an assist, Nick Moon with two and Pasher, Haworth, Ayoze, Andrew Carleton, and Ilija Ilic all with one. Of Indy's eight goals thus far, only was has gone unassisted – which Moon should get an honorary nod for after seeing his saved shot set up Pasher's rebound tap-in.

Blue Debuts in 2020

Moon counts as one of six players to make his Indy debut under Head Coach Martin Rennie so far this season. Andrew Carleton, Yeferson Contreras and Carl Haworth all made their first appearances with the Eleven as members of the starting XI in the season opener on March 7 at Memphis, while Moon made his debut in that match off the bench. 2019 USL League One Defender of the Year Conner Antley made his Eleven debut earlier than expected after spelling an injured Ayoze in the 11th minute versus Sporting Kansas City II, while Carmel native and Guerin Catholic H.S. product Cam Lindley made his first appearance for his hometown side in the 63rd minute.

A COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

Indy Eleven did itself no favors by going into a 0-2 hole within the first 20 minutes in its season-opener at Memphis 901 FC back on March 7 ... but it did set Indiana's Team up for some club history. The 4-2 win allowed the club to rewrite a few club records, including:

• Most goals scored during the USL Championship era (72 regular season & postseason games)

Most goals scored in an away match in club history First win in club history after being down two goals

The game was also the first in 121 regular season and postseason league outings in which Indy Eleven notched at least four goals in a game, dating back to a 5-2 win over Jacksonville Armada FC on Aug. 3, 2016. In fact, the only two other times in which the Eleven scored at least four goals also came during that 2016 NASL campaign – a 4-2 win over Minnesota United FC on May 21, 2016, and the "Miracle at the Mike" 4-1 triumph over the then-Carolina RailHawks (now North Carolina FC) on June 11, 2016.

Moon Mission

For Nick Moon, two of those chances created turned into assists – both on Pasher finishes in Indy's 4-2 win at Memphis back on March 7 – while a third resulted in Pasher's rebound goal in last Saturday's win over SKC II. The former Lansing Ignite FC midfielder is one of 12 Championship players with multiple assists heading into Week 5 action, sitting two behind new league leader Kenardo Forbes of Pittsburgh. Following his active – and productive – 27-minute stint off the bench against Memphis, the Waukesha, Wisc.-native was rewarded by head coach Martin Rennie with starting XI nods in Indy's last two contests.

Eleven Adds Academy Goalkeeper Alex Svetanoff

On the other end of the goalkeeping career spectrum, Indy Eleven continued its trend of bringing in homegrown Hoosier talent with last Friday's signing of Crown Point native Alex Svetanoff to a USL Academy contract. The 17-year-old goalkeeper, who has suited up 30 times for former USSDA club Indiana Fire Juniors' U-15 through U-18 sides since 2017, will take the third goalkeeper reins from the soon-to-depart Holden Brown, who will report to the University of Virginia for his freshman season with the Cavaliers.

The New Blue Crew

With the mid-June addition of defender Felicien Dumas and last week's signing of Academy product Alex Svetanoff, 10 of the 26 currently rostered players are calling Indy home for the first time in 2020. That group includes several players that will earn or fight for starters' minutes, including Carl Haworth, Cam Lindley, Andrew Carleton, Yeferson Contreras, Nick Moon and Conner Antley (continue further in the notes for their "mini bios" and visit IndyEleven.com/2020-roster for their full bios). Dumas, Svetanoff, Kyle Folds and New Jersey native Jeremy Rafanello round out the list of 2020 newcomers for Indiana's Team

A Glass Two-Thirds Full

For the first time in his three seasons with Indy Eleven, Head Coach Martin Rennie enters a campaign with more familiar faces than new ones, as 16 of the 24 rostered players on Opening Day 2020 were returning from the 2019 edition. With that, the bulk of the production is also back for the Indiana's Team

Minutes: The 16 returning players represent 77% of the minutes logged in 2019 (28,516 of 36,822 played, to be exact). Only two Boys in Blue that played over 1,000 minutes last season – Dane Kelly (2,258) and Thomas Enevoldsen (1,716) – are not returning in 2020.

Goals: Players tallying 30 of the 48 goals scored last year return in 2020, including breakout leading goal scorer Tyler Pasher (13). While Kelly and Enevoldsen combined for 15 of the 18 goals lost, Indy does bring back five players other than Pasher who tallied multiple goals last year – Ayoze (3), Karl Ouimette (3), Drew Conner (2), Ilija Ilic (2) and Neveal Hackshaw (2).

Assists: A total of 70% of Indy Eleven's contributed assists (26 of 37) return, including co-leaders Ayoze and Kenney Walker (5 each). Pasher (4), Macauley King, (3), Paddy Barrett (3), Ilic (2) and Tyler Gibson (2) are other multi-assist men who are returning from a year ago.

Coaching Staff: Consistency on the sideline is just as important as it is on the field, and to that extent Indiana's Team will be returning 100% of its braintrust. Head Coach Martin Rennie and Goalkeeper Coach Andy Swift are both back for their third seasons on the Eleven sideline, while Assistant Coaches Juan Guerra and Phil Presser return for their second seasons on the Indy bench.

Youth Shall Be Served

A common trait amongst pretty much all of those new roster signings is youth, as only Haworth clocked in at over 24 years of age as of 2020's Opening Day back in March. The other nine newcomers range in age from 17-24: Alex Svetanoff (17), Kyle Folds (18), Andrew Carleton (20), Jeremy Rafanello (20), Yeferson Contreras (20), Cam Lindley (turns 23 on gameday this Saturday), Nick Moon (24), Conner Antley (24) and Felicien Dumas (23). When you factor in reigning USL Championship All-First Team Defender Neveal Hackshaw (24) and Folds' fellow Academy signings and roster returnees Emerson Nieto (18) and Holden Brown (18) into the mix, 11 of 25 players are 24 years of age or younger (Macca King just "aged out" of this group upon his 25th birthday on April 10).

Indy Eleven Player to Watch | DF Paddy Barrett

We've noted the voracity of the Riverhounds attack, which means the Eleven back three – anchored by the Irish captain Paddy Barrett in the middle – will likely be under sustained pressure. Expect Barrett and the Indy defense to be up for the challenge, as the squad has conceded just once in the last 254 minutes of play after a two-goal hiccup in the first 16 minutes of the season opener at Memphis 901 FC. Pittsburgh will also have to account for Barrett in the opposite final third as well, as his deft finish in last Saturday's 2-1 win over Sporting Kansas City II was preceded by eye-opening long-distance efforts in each of the last two outings.

Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC Player to Watch | MF Kenardo Forbes

The 2019 USL Championship MVP finalist and All-League First Team performer was a thorn in the side of Indy last year, as he notched a late game-winner in their Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup fixture in May and tallied twice in a 3-0 win late in the regular season.
