MATCH PREVIEW

The "Airing of Grievances" may be a Festivus tradition each December, but Indy Eleven will need not wait so long to share its problems with Sporting Kansas City II left over from the 2020 campaign. The two Central Division sides square off in the first of four 2021 meetings Saturday at The Mike, and while SKC enters the contest winless in their first four outings of the season, Indiana's Team doesn't need to be reminded of the "feats of strength" the Kansans can display after last year's surprising season split.

Why would the Boys in Blue seek revenge against the squad that it finished seven points above in the Group E standings last year? Firstly, SKC earned one of the shock results of the Championship season last Aug. 1, their 1-0 triumph at Lucas Oil Stadium snapping the second-longest home undefeated (28 games) and winning (11 games) streaks in USL Championship history.

More importantly, Sporting's 2-1 victory over the Eleven on Sept. 30 denied the Boys in Blue the chance to clinch a postseason berth in their penultimate game of the regular season, a quest that fell two points short of its aim one week later. The lack of playoff soccer for the first time since joining the USL in 2018 was indeed a considerable driver in Indy's offseason roster makeover - and precisely because there are so many new faces around, revenge may not be the primary source of motivation for Indiana's Team this week.

If one bit of history does pull through, the hope is for the continuation of entertaining affairs with ample goals being scored. Indy Eleven has bagged multiple goals in four of the six previous contests (1.67 avg.), while Sporting has scored in every meeting - one goal in five games and two in the other (1.17).

READY TO BOUNCE BACK AT HOME AGAIN

With an early season bye week now in the rear view, Indiana's Team is ready to hit the ground running in its second home fixture in as many games this Saturday vs. Sporting Kansas City II. Indy Eleven started the season on the front foot after a 1-0 win at Birmingham Legion FC in Week 2 with Manuel Arteaga notching the game-winning goal and Jordan Farr collecting his clean sheet of the season. However, the Boys in Blue got the first taste of defeat at home after falling 0-2 to FC Tulsa on May 8. It wasn't for a lack of effort, with Indy out-shooting FC Tulsa 16-4 on the evening, but two second-half tallies from TUL's Joaquin Rivas (62', 82' PK) led the visitors to victory.

LONGEST OFFSEASON EEEEEVVVVVEEEERRRR

If you thought last year's early season hiatus felt like a long time away from the field, then the 2020/21 offseason must have felt like being stuck in purgatory. The season opener at Birmingham on Saturday, May 1 marked 210 days between regular season games for Indiana's Team - nearly SEVEN MONTHS since last year's regular season finale at Saint Louis FC on October 3, marking the longest break ever between games in the Eleven's now eight-season history.

MAX-IMUM EFFECT

Speaking of that game against STLFC, Indy Eleven last week welcomed a member of the Missouri side's coaching staff in the person of Max Rogers, who joins Head Coach Martin Rennie's staff alongside fellow assistant coaches Phil Presser and Andy Swift. Rogers spent 2018-20 USL Championship seasons as an assistant on the Saint Louis FC sidelines, and brings additional experience from time with MLS outfit Orlando City FC and Scottish side St. Mirren FC (read more in Rogers' mini bio later in the notes, or click here to read more at IndyEleven.com).

TRANSFERS OF POWER


Part of the offseason makeover came in the form of five transfer transactions, marking what we believe to be the most active season ever for a USL Championship side in the transfer market. Four of those moves saw players sold to Major League Soccer franchises - FW Tyler Pasher (Houston Dynamo), GK Evan Newton (Vancouver Whitecaps), Josh Penn (Inter Miami), and Cal Jennings (LAFC) ... the latter actually never suiting up for the Boys in Blue after signing on a free transfer from Memphis 901 FC in December. Speaking of Memphis, that is where the fifth transfer, MF Mitch Guitar, landed after another transfer deal in March.

WELCOME BACK

Of the 10 returning players to Indy Eleven, only six were regular contributors during the 2020 campaign - GK Jordan Farr, DF Neveal Hackshaw, DF Karl Ouimette, MF Ayoze, MF Carl Haworth, and FW Nick Moon (the other four were Academy Contract returnees GK Alex Svetanoff, DF Matthew Senanou, MF Patrick McDonald, and FW Matthew Roou). Of those six regulars, Farr, Ayoze, and Ouimette will be spending their fourth seasons with Indiana's Team in 2021, Hackshaw his third, and Moon and Haworth their second.

OH CAPTAINS, OUR CAPTAINS

Speaking of Ayoze and Karl Ouimette, the veteran duo were named this week as the team's Captain and Vice-Captain, respectively, for the 2021 season. Ayoze has more than earned the right to wear the captain's armband, the 35-year-old Spaniard serving as the elder-statesman of the squad and the heart of the soul of the team's on-field pulse. Backing him up will be the 28-year-old Quebec native Ouimette, who is taking the field for his tenth professional campaign in 2021. With Ayoze sitting out the season opener in Birmingham, it was Ouimette who was the first to don the armband for the Boys in Blue in 2021.

WHO WHO WHO'S ... HOOSIERS

This year's squad has plenty of Hoosier State representation, with four players coming "Back Home Again" to Indiana (if you will). The three native Hoosiers new to the team are Auburn's own Rece Buckmaster, Bloomington native Jeremiah Gutjahr, and the pride of "The Region" in Crown Point's Alex Svetanoff. In addition, Jared Timmer is now an "honorary Hoosier" after spending four years at Butler University in Indianapolis from 2015-19, while Gutjahr and Buckmaster were "actual Hoosiers" while attending Indiana University, both attending the Bloomington campus from 2015-18.

NEW YEAR, NEW GEAR

Not only is the bulk of the roster new for 2021, but so are the kits Indiana's Team will suit up in after the organization made the jump to global sports apparel giant and USL Championship partner PUMA in February. The squad debuted their new secondary white kits Saturday in Birmingham and lived up to their "Boys in Blue" moniker for the first time this season at home vs. FC Tulsa on May 8.

STEP (BACK) UP TO "THE MIKE"

The May 8 home opener vs. Tulsa marked Indy Eleven's official return home to IUPUI's Michael A. Carroll Stadium, which Indiana's Team called home for its first four seasons of existence from 2014-17 (marking the squad's entire "NASL era"). In all, more than 620,000 fans and supporters filed into Carroll Stadium for a combined 70 regular season, postseason, Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, and exhibition contests between 2014-2019, adding a new and electric atmosphere to Indianapolis' thriving sports scene along the way. Though the match was team's official return to "The Mike", it was not its first USL Championship games in the venue, as Indy Eleven hosted a pair of Eastern Conference Playoffs contests at Carroll Stadium in 2019.

OFFSEASON OVERHAUL

The longer than usual offseason allowed Martin Rennie & Co. to tinker with the roster more than usual, resulting in 16 new players on what is now Indy Eleven's 26-man roster. The newcomers include:

CENTRAL FOCUS

After competing against a necessarily condensed slate of competition in 2020, Indy Eleven will expand its opposition horizons this year as a member of the eight-team Central Division, highlighted by the presence of archrival Louisville City FC. The new grouping also includes Atlanta United 2, Birmingham Legion FC, Memphis 901 FC, OKC Energy FC, FC Tulsa, and Sporting Kansas City. Indy Eleven will face each division foe four times throughout the 32-game season.

The squad's four match-ups against out-of-division opposition include several marquee matchups, featuring games against 2019 USL Championship title winner Real Monarchs SLC, two-time defending Western Conference runner-up El Paso Locomotive FC, perennial Eastern Conference contender Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC, and Eastern up-and-comer Loudoun United FC.

Full bio and stats at IndyEleven.com/Jordan-Farr Farr returns to Indy Eleven for his fourth season with the club, this time as the Number One between the sticks for the Boys in Blue. Farr earned his first professional minutes for Indiana's Team in 2019 after making 12 appearance (10 starts) in USL Championship action while former Eleven GK Evan Newton was sidelined by injury, earning five clean sheets, an 80% save rate and 0.66 goals against average in that span.

Though he only made a single appearance in 2020, Farr is set to fill in the gap that Newton left after departing for Vancouver Whitecaps FC (MLS) in January.
