After a long preseason and having to sit out the North American Soccer League Opening Kick weekend, the Jacksonville Armada and new head coach Tony Meola will finally make their debut this Sunday against the New York Cosmos in Long Island.

It will be a homecoming of sorts for Meola, who hails from Kearny, N.J., and played goalkeeper for the Red Bulls from 1996-98 (then known as the New York/New Jersey MetroStars) and again from 2005-06. He also played for the Long Island Rough Riders of the old USISL in 1995 along with Armada assistant coach Jim Rooney and Cosmos head coach Giovanni Savarese.

The Armada is no stranger to James M. Shuart Stadium, having played there twice in 2015 and faring with a draw (3-3 on June 13) and loss (1-0 on June 13). Jacksonville came out on top 1-0 on July 18 at Community First Park.

Despite a different looking squad than last year's NASL Championship-winning outfit, particularly with the loss of Spanish legend Raúl, the Cosmos have restocked nicely. New York came out on top 3-0 over Ottawa Fury FC in a rematch of last year's Championship Final and got two goals from NASL Player of the Week Juan Arango.

The Armada has been looking forward to this date since commencing preseason training in January and faced stiff competition to prepare. Jacksonville faced three MLS opponents – Philadelphia Union, Orlando City SC and New York Red Bulls – and went 2-1 while finishing 4-2-3 overall in the preseason.

A WHOLE NEW FLEET

Compare last season's Armada squad this year's both in roster makeup and style of play, and it would be safe to say that it is a whole new fleet. In addition to a coaching staff overhaul, now led by Meola, the Armada has brought on 13 new faces to fit with a more direct and physical American style of play in contrast to the finesse, Tiki Taka style of the 2015 Armada.

LAST TIME OUT RECAP (SEPTEMBER 12, 2015)

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. - Even down a man for the majority of the second half, the Jacksonville Armada FC gave the North American Soccer League's best team, the New York Cosmos, all it could handle before falling 1-0 at Shuart Stadium on Saturday night.

Defender Shawn Nicklaw was named the Farah & Farah Man of the Match after a strong defensive effort, which aided goalkeeper David Sierra in his solid four save performance.

Playing in a steady stream of heavy rain and wind, the Armada (3W-2D-8L NASL Fall, 6-5-11 Combined) and Cosmos (6-4-2, 11-9-2) battled back and forth in an uneventful scoreless first half. The Cosmos had a 6-1 shot advantage in the first half, but only two of those were on goal and relatively easy saves for Sierra.

Jacksonville's one shot was the best scoring chance of either team in the half, and it came in the 35th minute when forward Pascal Millien took the ball at midfield and pushed it ahead to Shawn Nicklaw. Nicklaw brought it up to the right wing and curled a cross through the box for an open Tyler Williams, but Williams' shot was too strong and went high.

After more of the same in the first few minutes of the second half, the tables turned in the 52nd minute when defender Lucas Trejo was shown a red card after his foot accidentally kicked the face of Cosmos forward Lucky Mkosana when he was trying to corral a bouncing ball.

Then in the 74th minute, Raúl showed some of his legendary elusiveness when he took a feed from Walter Restrepo and shook a couple of Armada defenders in the box before putting it past Sierra to give New York a 1-0 advantage.

Despite being down a man, it didn't change Jacksonville's aggressive approach, and in the 77th minute, the Armada were awarded a free kick 25 yards away from New York's goal, and forward Alhassane Keita blasted it over the Cosmos wall, but it sailed just high over the crossbar.

Following that, the Cosmos sought to put the match out of reach and turned up the pressure a notch on the Armada. Midfielder Walter Restrepo took it on a breakaway in the 77th and tried to slide it into the bottom right of the goal, but his shot narrowly missed. Cosmos forward Gaston Cellerino had two other shots that were stopped the Armada in the 83rd and 90th minutes.

It was the first time the Armada fell to the Cosmos this season after playing to a 3-3 draw in New York on June 13 and winning 1-0 on July 18 in Jacksonville.

TONY MEOLA

HEAD COACH/TECHNICAL DIRECTOR



Legendary former U.S. Men's National Team and MLS goalkeeper Tony Meola was named the Jacksonville Armada FC head coach and technical director on Nov. 24, 2015.

Meola, who was inducted in the U.S. Soccer Hall of Fame in 2012, takes over an Armada FC club that finished 8-7-15 (W-D-L) overall in its inaugural season in the North American Soccer League, good for an 11th-place combined finish.

Meola has been a prominent figure in U.S. Soccer since he stormed onto the scene in 1987 when he helped lead the U-20 National Team at the 1987 FIFA World Youth Championship in goal. Following a two-year college career at the University of Virginia, where he was a two-time All-American under the guidance of U.S. Soccer icon Bruce Arena, Meola embarked on an illustrious international career in 1988 with the U.S. Men's National Team. The Kearny, N.J., native earned 100 caps for the USMNT, which is tied for 14th all-time overall and third among goalkeepers, and was on the squad for the 1990, 1994 and 2002 FIFA World Cups. His 37 wins and 32 clean sheets rank third all-time in U.S. Soccer history.

Meola also had a successful 18-year club career, most of which was spent in MLS with the New York/New Jersey MetroStars, Kansas City Wizards and New York Red Bulls. In 2000, he was named league MVP, MLS Goalkeeper of the Year and led the Wizards to an MLS Cup victory, where he was also named MLS Cup MVP. He still holds the MLS record for most shutouts in one season with 16, which he set in 2000 with Kansas City. In 2005, he was named to the MLS All-Time Best XI.

Prior to playing in MLS, Meola had brief stints in En-

gland with Brighton & Hove Albion and Watford in 1990. In 1991, he returned to the United States and played for the Fort Lauderdale Strikers, then competing in the APSL. Meola also played for indoor team Buffalo Blizzard in 1994 and for the USISL's (now USL) Long Island Rough Riders in 1995.

After becoming involved with the U.S. National Team the past several years in training sessions with the U-17 and U-20 teams, Meola also showed his ability as a player development expert. He made waves with former USMNT teammate Tab Ramos and the U-20 National Team, taking a hands-on approach with goalkeeper training and helping scout players. Meola has also developed a robust knowledge of the NASL after a successful broadcasting career with Sirius XM, Fox Sports, ONE World Sports and several other outlets.

Somewhat of a renaissance man, Meola was a multi-sport star in high school, serving as captain of his Kearny High School basketball team and was an all-state baseball player, which led him to be drafted by the New York Yankees in 1987. He also played baseball at the University of Virginia, and in 1994, Meola tried his hand at American football in 1994 when was a placekicker for the New York Jets in training camp.

And beyond sports, Meola has shown off his theatrical talents, appearing in the off-Broadway play Tony and Tina's Wedding in 1995. He also formed the New Jersey cover band Mushroom with hometown friends in 1998.

Meola's love of the "beautiful game" was passed on to him from his father Vincent, who played professionally in Italy in the 1960s. Meola, who is married to Colleen Meola, has since paid that passion forward to his three children, Jonathan (18), Kylie (15) and Aidan (13) and recently coached Aidan's U-12 soccer club in New Jersey. He has also been active nationally in the promotion of soccer among youth clubs.
