GROUP PLAY BEGINS

A 3-1 loss Sunday to Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC was an early setback, but not a decisive one, for LouCity. Pittsburgh is not within the club's "Group E" against which 12 games are upcoming beginning with Saturday's tilt. Indy Eleven and Sporting KC II make up the rest of the pod, from which the top-two teams in the standings will advance to the USL playoffs in October.

FEELING AT HOME

The Pittsburgh loss marked just the first of eight straight LouCity games played at Lynn Family Stadium as the USL Championship restarts. The league's Board of Governors previously allowed unbalanced scheduling that favors clubs who are able to host amid the COVID-19 pandemic. Overall, 11 of the club's 16 regular-season games are scheduled for Lynn Family Stadium.

KNOW THE FOE

Saint Louis FC is led by head coach Steve Trittschuh, in his first year there after a switch from Colorado Switchbacks FC. LouCity's Kings' Cup rival has Kyle Morton between the posts, with the former Pittsburgh goalkeeper key to last year's regular-season Eastern Conference crown. Morton made seven saves last weekend in a 2-0 loss to Indy Eleven in a game where former LouCity midfielders Guy Abend and Kadeem Dacres both appeared for Saint Louis.

SPEEDY SCORES

Midfielder Devon "Speedy" Williams wrote himself into the Lynn Family Stadium history books Sunday when a Brian Ownby cross was deflected and redirected to Williams near the top of the box. The Jamaican international grounded an 18th-minute shot past the Pittsburgh goalkeeper to score the first goal inside the new facility, after which he said: "It is a historic moment, and I'm glad I was the one who scored that goal."

IN THE STANDS

LouCity's attendance of 4,850 on Sunday marked the highest number of people to attend a team sporting event in the United States since the COVID-19 pandemic put sports on pause. Club officials are following local government guidances and the Venue Shield plan devised by stadium operator ASM Global that calls for wearing masks in Lynn Family Stadium, physical distancing and temperature checks, among other measures to keep fans safe.

DEFENSIVE LAPSES

After Williams' strike, the wheels fell off for LouCity in a rematch from the 2019 playoffs. The Riverhounds scored three times in six minutes on either side of the half, first by finishing a lob pass that caught the purple back line sleeping, then twice after LouCity surrendered possession in its own half. LouCity out-shot and out-possessed Pittsburgh, but there was no coming back from that scoring spree.

JOGO'S DEBUT

Youth international Jonathan Gomez, who has represented both the United States and Mexico, checked in during the 83rd minute of Sunday's Pittsburgh game to mark his LouCity debut. The 16-year-old left back — in Louisville on a professional contract — is a player to watch bringing in some first team experience with FC Dallas system and with USL League One side North Texas SC.

LYNN FAMILY STADIUM

The \$65 million stadium sits on a 10-acre parcel in the Butchertown neighborhood east of downtown. Normal capacity is 15,304, and the venue could range up to 25,000 for concerts. Unique to Lynn is a 72-foot Modelo bar in the open end, believed to be the longest of its kind in Kentucky. The jumbotron ranks second in size behind only Churchill Downs' Big Board.

THE ESTOPINAL END

LouCity has ensured its late founder's legacy lives on within the club's new home. Architect and philanthropist Wayne Estopinal, who brought pro soccer to town, is the namesake behind the closed end of Lynn Family Stadium, the standing supporter zone. Estopinal, whose firm also designed the University of Louisville's similarly named Lynn Stadium, died in a November 2018 plane crash at age 63.

ABOUT LOUISVILLE CITY FC

Since starting play in 2015, Louisville City FC has quickly established a reputation both for winning on the pitch and solid fan support off it.

Louisville City FC has advanced to the USL's Eastern Conference Final every season since starting play in 2015. In its second year, the club was the last remaining independent side – one that doesn't have an MLS affiliation – in the playoffs.

LouCity reached the pinnacle of the league in 2017, winning both the Eastern Conference regular-season title and the USL Cup Final for the first time.

Beginning in 2020, LouCity moved from Louisville Slugger Field to the new Lynn Family Stadium, a soccer-specific facility in the Butchertown neighborhood just east of downtown. It can accommodate 15,304 fans and will also be home to Racing Louisville FC of the National Women's Soccer League that starts play in 2021.

LouCity originally launched with the help of local architect Wayne Estopinal, a part-owner in Orlando City SC, a former USL member that moved up to MLS in 2015. The USL franchise shifted to Louisville, and James O'Connor, a native of Ireland and former Orlando City player, was hired as coach. John Neace currently serves as LouCity's chairman, heading a local ownership group.

In 2018, Louisville City FC became the first

USL team in history by winning back-to-back championships. LouCity has been under the direction of head coach John Hackworth since Aug. 2, 2018.

LouCity returned to the USL Championship's final in 2019, continuing the club's run of excellence.

HEAD COACH JOHN HACKWORTH

On Thursday, August 2, 2018, Louisville City Football Club announced the appointment of John Hackworth as the club's second-ever head coach. After an international search led to Hackworth, the 48-year-old native of Dunedin, Florida, signed a contract spanning through the 2022 season.

Hackworth had been in charge of the U.S. U-17 Men's National Team since 2015 and has served as an assistant to the U.S. Men's National Team since the beginning of this year. An experienced coach at the national level, Hackworth began with U.S. Soccer in 2002 when he first served as an assistant to then-U.S. U-17 Men's National Team head coach John Ellinger. Hackworth would go on to succeed Ellinger and lead the U-17's to finishes in the quarterfinals of the 2005 FIFA U-17 World Cup and Round of 16 in the 2007 FIFA U-17 World Cup. Following his time in charge of the U-17's, Hackworth also served as the inaugural Technical Director of the U.S. Soccer Development Academy.

Outside of his time with U.S. Soccer, Hackworth's experience extends to both the collegiate and professional levels of the game. He began as an assistant coach for the Wake Forest University women's and men's teams in 1993 and 1994. Hackworth was then named the head coach at the University of South Florida in 1998, where he led the Bulls to two NCAA Tournament Appearances.

In Major League Soccer, Hackworth spent five years with the Philadelphia Union, serving as the club's Youth Development Coordinator from 2009-12, and head coach from 2012-14 before returning to take charge of the U.S. U-17 Men's National Team.



ASSISTANT COACH DANNY CRUZ

On Thursday, September 27, 2018, Louisville City FC announced the addition of Danny Cruz as coach John Hackworth's first Assistant Coach.

A former assistant at Real Monarchs SLC, Cruz came on board after ending his playing career ahead of the 2018 USL regular season. Prior to taking on his role with the Monarchs, Cruz's

extensive playing career saw him register 137 career Major League Soccer appearances in total.

A native of Petersburg, Virginia, Cruz's decade-long playing career began with the Des Moines Menace, where current LouCity players Richard Ballard and Tim Dobrowolski have spent time. After leaving the University of Nevada-Las Vegas, Cruz was drafted in the third round (41st overall) of the 2009 MLS SuperDraft by the Houston Dynamo. The former winger clocked time with the Dynamo, D.C. United, and Philadelphia Union in Major League Soccer before spending one year with Minnesota United and part of one year with the San Francisco Deltas in the NASL before leaving for Real Monarchs SLC in August 2017.
