GROUP E UPDATE

LouCity has played just once since July 29, but little changed on the table as the USL Championship's restart nears its midpoint. Indy Eleven (5-2-1, 16 points) continues to lead the four-team pod, but they've dropped points in three of their last four outings. Saint Louis FC (3-3-1, 10 points) is without a win in its last three. That leaves Sporting KC II and LouCity — both 2-3-7 with 7 points — chasing. The top-two Group E finishers going to the playoffs in October at the end of a 16-game season.

THE SCORING LOAD

LouCity has registered five goals in six games split between two players. Forward Cameron Lancaster has scored three, while midfielder Devon "Speedy" Williams accounts for two. Williams headed in an early cross Saturday to give LouCity an early 1-0 lead over Indy Eleven before the clubs played to a draw. The Jamaican international also scored the first goal in Lynn Family Stadium history going back to a July 12 matchup with Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC.

NAPO'S NEW ROLE

Napo Matsoso shifted from the defensive midfield to the right wing for LouCity last Saturday with much success. Matsoso's third-minute cross to Devon "Speedy" Williams marked his first assist of the season, and the native of Lesotho continued to push the attack from there, pacing LouCity with three of what Opta statistics termed "good" crosses. He completed 81.8% of his passes as well, including 77.7 percent of attempts in Indy's half.

CHANCES APLENTY

LouCity ranks second in the USL Championship in shots taken with 103 and fifth in the league with 2,922 passes attempted. Opportunities are there, but the boys in purple haven't yet taken advantage of them. With five goals, that's just a 6 percent conversion rate, 33rd-best of 35 teams in the league. Meanwhile, opponents have capitalized well on the 46 shots taken against LouCity, converting at a 15 percent clip.

NOT-SO-POSITIVE

LouCity was scheduled to be playing its third game in eight days Saturday, but a positive COVID-19 test for a covered member of Sporting KC II's organization forced postponement of a midweek match for the boys in purple. SKC II is now scheduled to visit Wednesday, spreading out what originally looked like the busiest stretch of the restarted season.

THE RIGHT SIDE OF HISTORY

In 2019, coach John Hackworth's first full season leading LouCity, the boys in purple also limped into August, fighting for a playoff spot off consecutive losses to end July. Can they similarly turn things around in 2020? August 2019 began a 10-game unbeaten streak for the club, which earned points in 12 of its final 13 games. That sparked a run back to LouCity's third straight USL Championship Final appearance.

McCABE SIDELINED

LouCity's Niall McCabe has undergone successful surgery to repair a right foot injury, the club announced Monday, with the midfielder's prognosis positive for a return to the pitch later this season. McCabe is no stranger to coming back strong from an operation. He shut down his 2016 season to proactively repair hip cartilage, then returned as a key piece of LouCity's USL title runs in 2017 and 2018.

JOGO GETS A START

Youth international Jonathan Gomez, who has represented both the United States and Mexico, logged 26 minutes across his first two LouCity appearances upon the USL's restart. The 16-year-old left back then found his way into a starting role on July 29, the last time Sporting KC II visited. Gomez was unable to clear a ball into the box leading to the visitors' initial goal but was otherwise solid in his first start on a professional contract, completing 90 percent of his passes from the left back spot.

JOHNSON SEES THE FIELD

Forward Jason Johnson, a Jamaican international who most recently suited up for the Western Conference's Phoenix Rising, checked in Saturday for his debut in purple. His 19 minutes off the bench marked his first action since an injury-riddled 2019 campaign. But two seasons ago, he tallied nine goals, including a soaring scissor kick that won USL Goal of the Month for June of 2018.

MINUS MAGNUS

LouCity and its leading scorer from last season, midfielder Magnus Rasmussen, agreed effective July 31 to terminate their contract. Rasmussen and his wife, Camilla, last month welcomed new daughter Olivia to their family in Denmark, where he will remain amid the COVID-19 pandemic. LouCity's technical staff plans to re-sign Rasmussen for 2021 after he poured in 13 regular-season goals and four more in the playoffs in 2019.

A FEW FIRSTS

Last Saturday's Indy Eleven meant new ground in 2020 for the boys in purple. They previously hadn't played an opponent to a draw, nor had they carried a lead into halftime. Williams' third-minute score — tapped in after midfielder Napo Matsoso secured possession on a sliding challenge — was also the earliest LouCity has scored a goal in a game this season.

LYNN FAMILY STADIUM

The \$65 million stadium sits on a 10-acre parcel in the Butchertown neighborhood east of downtown. Normal capacity is 15,304, and the venue could range up to 25,000 for concerts. Unique to Lynn is a 72-foot Modelo bar in the open end, believed to be the longest of its kind in Kentucky. The jumbotron ranks second in size behind only Churchill Downs' Big Board.

IN THE STANDS

LouCity's attendance of 4,850 (about 30% of maximum capacity) in its first five games back have marked the highest number of people to attend team sporting events in the country since the COVID-19 pandemic put sports on pause. Club officials are following local government guidance and the Venue Shield plan devised by stadium operator ASM Global that calls for wearing masks in the building, physical distancing and temperature checks, among other measures to keep fans safe.

ABOUT THE PITCH

The natural surface is made up of Tahoma 31 Bermuda overseeded with rye, and it can remain green year round thanks to a sub-air system that removes excessive moisture, but can also blow hot or cold air to keep grass at an ideal temperature. The lines measure 120 feet by 80, a major upgrade from the 105 by 75 pitch at LouCity's former home, Louisville Slugger Field.

HEAD COACH JOHN HACKWORTH

On Thursday, August 2, 2018, Louisville City Football Club announced the appointment of John Hackworth as the club's second-ever head coach. After an international search led to Hackworth, the 48-year-old native of Dunedin, Florida, signed a contract spanning through the 2022 season.

Hackworth had been in charge of the U.S. U-17 Men's National Team since 2015 and has served as an assistant to the U.S. Men's National Team since the beginning of this year. An experienced coach at the national level, Hackworth began with U.S. Soccer in 2002 when he first served as an assistant to then-U.S. U-17 Men's National Team head coach John Ellinger. Hackworth would go on to succeed Ellinger and lead the U-17's to finishes in the quarterfinals of the 2005 FIFA U-17 World Cup and Round of 16 in the 2007 FIFA U-17 World Cup. Following his time in charge of the U-17's, Hackworth also served as the inaugural Technical Director of the U.S. Soccer Development Academy.

Outside of his time with U.S. Soccer, Hackworth's experience extends to both the collegiate and professional levels of the game. He began as an assistant coach for the Wake Forest University women's and men's teams in 1993 and 1994. Hackworth was then named the head coach at the University of South Florida in 1998, where he led the Bulls to two NCAA Tournament Appearances.

In Major League Soccer, Hackworth spent five years with the Philadelphia Union, serving as the club's Youth Development Coordinator from 2009-12, and head coach from 2012-14 before returning to take charge of the U.S. U-17 Men's National Team.



ASSISTANT COACH DANNY CRUZ

On Thursday, September 27, 2018, Louisville City FC announced the addition of Danny Cruz as coach John Hackworth's first Assistant Coach.

A former assistant at Real Monarchs SLC, Cruz came on board after ending his playing career ahead of the 2018 USL regular season. Prior to taking on his role with the Monarchs, Cruz's

extensive playing career saw him register 137 career Major League Soccer appearances in total.

A native of Petersburg, Virginia, Cruz's decade-long playing career began with the Des Moines Menace, where current LouCity players Richard Ballard and Tim Dobrowolski have spent time. After leaving the University of Nevada-Las Vegas, Cruz was drafted in the third round (41st overall) of the 2009 MLS SuperDraft by the Houston Dynamo. The former winger clocked time with the Dynamo, D.C. United, and Philadelphia Union in Major League Soccer before spending one year with Minnesota United and part of one year with the San Francisco Deltas in the NASL before leaving for Real Monarchs SLC in August 2017.

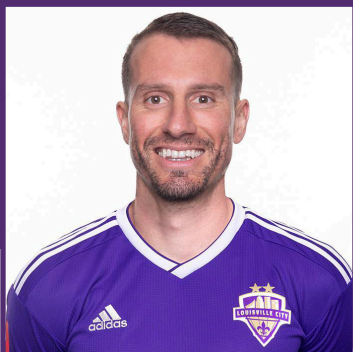

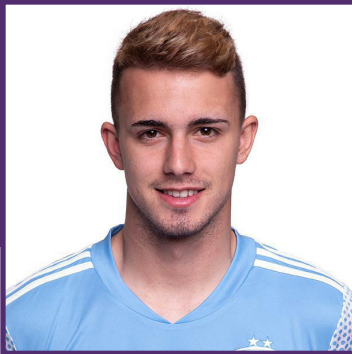
