GROUP E UPDATE

LouCity's in the thick of the playoff race given its three recent results — a draw versus Indy Eleven before victories over Loudoun United FC and Sporting KC II. The boys in purple (4-3-1, 13 points) enter Wednesday one point out of second, a playoff spot, and chasing Indy Eleven (6-2-1, 19 points) for the USL Championship's Group E lead. Only nine points separate first from last with Saint Louis FC and Sporting others in the pod.

UPPING THE OFFENSE

LouCity went six games into the season without scoring more than one goal in a contest. The attack increased recently, however, in a 2-0 win over Loudoun United FC and 4-1 victory over Sporting KC II. What changed? In part, how much the boys in purple made the opposing goalkeeper work. LouCity's nine shots attempted against Sporting KC II were a season low, but six of them were on target.

LATE BLOOMERS

Since coach John Hackworth's hire was announced Aug. 2, 2018, the month has served LouCity well. In 2018, the boys in purple went 3-1-3 on their way to a second straight USL title. In 2019, they were 4-1-0 while turning around a season that ended with another trip to the final. This month, they're riding a three-game unbeaten streak into Wednesday, evidencing consistent late-season improvement under Hackworth's direction.

STAT STUFFER

LouCity's unbeaten run has coincided with a new role for Napo Matsoso, who shifted from the central midfield to right wing to rave reviews. The University of Kentucky product has racked up two goals and just as many assists in his last three games. Last time out against Sporting KC II, he split defenders before delivering an ideal ball to Corben Bone for a first half goal. In the second, a deflection goal made the lead 4-1 LouCity.

THE LIPAFC

Known as the Louisville-Indianapolis Proximity Association Football Contest, this season series could well decide Group E's winner. Indy Eleven and LouCity played to a 1-1 draw in their first meeting of the year on Aug. 8. After Wednesday, these rivals will play twice more at Lucas Oil Stadium — primarily home to the NFL's Indianapolis Colts — on Wednesday, Aug. 26, and Saturday, Sept. 5.

TOP STRIKERS

Whenever LouCity and Indy Eleven meet, attention will be demanded up top. Indy's Tyler Pasher ranks second in the USL Championship with eight goals scored, while LouCity's Cameron Lancaster, on Ioan from MLS' Nashville SC, is tied for third with five goals. Pasher's a speedster who makes room with his run, whereas Lancaster has produced goals form the run of play, via a header and a free kick already this year.

BONE'S BREAKTHROUGH

Speaking of midfielder Corben Bone, pressure ramped up on him to produce with Magnus Rasmussen staying home in Denmark due to COVID-19 and Niall McCabe out due to injury. Bone responded against Sporting with a brace, his first two goals in a LouCity uniform, coming up big in an area where LouCity needed more creativity — the attacking midfield. Bone boasts prior USL and MLS experience with FC Cincinnati.

LYNN FAMILY STADIUM

The \$65 million stadium sits on a 10-acre parcel in the Butchertown neighborhood east of downtown. Normal capacity is 15,304, and the venue could range up to 25,000 for concerts. Unique to Lynn is a 72-foot Modelo bar in the open end, believed to be the longest of its kind in Kentucky. The jumbotron ranks second in size behind only Churchill Downs' Big Board.

JOGO'S A REGULAR

Youth international Jonathan Gomez, who has represented both the U.S. and Mexico, has appeared in five games with a pair of starts in 2020. The 16-year-old outside back has also signaled an especially bright future, leading LouCity with 11 crosses Aug. 15 against Loudoun while completing 81.8% of his passes in the opponent's half of the field, close to a team high. Gomez is in Louisville on a professional contract after international appearances for the U.S. (U-16, U-17) and Mexico (U-17).

IN THE STANDS

LouCity's attendance of 4,850 (about 30% of maximum capacity) in its first five games back have marked the highest number of people to attend team sporting events in the country since the COVID-19 pandemic put sports on pause. Club officials are following local government guidance and the Venue Shield plan devised by stadium operator ASM Global that calls for wearing masks in the building, physical distancing and temperature checks, among other measures to keep fans safe.

WYNDER SEES THE FIELD

Midfielder Elijah Wynder, a local 17-year-old star on an academy deal, made his USL debut a successful one earlier this month against Loudoun. In 23 minutes on the pitch, the rising high school senior had five touches on the ball. Three were completed passes, one a shot and another a key corner won late in the going that allowed LouCity to hold possession while nursing a 2-0 lead.

ABOUT THE PITCH

The natural surface is made up of Tahoma 31 Bermuda overseeded with rye, and it can remain green year round thanks to a sub-air system that removes excessive moisture, but can also blow hot or cold air to keep grass at an ideal temperature. The lines measure 120 feet by 80, a major upgrade from the 105 by 75 pitch at LouCity's former home, Louisville Slugger Field.

FAMILIAR FACES

Head coach John Hackworth kept the core of the roster, returning 16 players from the 2019 Louisville City team which won the Eastern Conference Title. Ten of the 11 starters from Louisville City's 2019 USL Championship Final team returned for the 2020 season.

HEAD COACH JOHN HACKWORTH

On Thursday, August 2, 2018, Louisville City Football Club announced the appointment of John Hackworth as the club's second-ever head coach. After an international search led to Hackworth, the 48-year-old native of Dunedin, Florida, signed a contract spanning through the 2022 season.

Hackworth had been in charge of the U.S. U-17 Men's National Team since 2015 and has served as an assistant to the U.S. Men's National Team since the beginning of this year. An experienced coach at the national level, Hackworth began with U.S. Soccer in 2002 when he first served as an assistant to then-U.S. U-17 Men's National Team head coach John Ellinger. Hackworth would go on to succeed Ellinger and lead the U-17's to finishes in the quarterfinals of the 2005 FIFA U-17 World Cup and Round of 16 in the 2007 FIFA U-17 World Cup. Following his time in charge of the U-17's, Hackworth also served as the inaugural Technical Director of the U.S. Soccer Development Academy.

Outside of his time with U.S. Soccer, Hackworth's experience extends to both the collegiate and professional levels of the game. He began as an assistant coach for the Wake Forest University women's and men's teams in 1993 and 1994. Hackworth was then named the head coach at the University of South Florida in 1998, where he led the Bulls to two NCAA Tournament Appearances.

In Major League Soccer, Hackworth spent five years with the Philadelphia Union, serving as the club's Youth Development Coordinator from 2009-12, and head coach from 2012-14 before returning to take charge of the U.S. U-17 Men's National Team.



ASSISTANT COACH DANNY CRUZ

On Thursday, September 27, 2018, Louisville City FC announced the addition of Danny Cruz as coach John Hackworth's first Assistant Coach.

A former assistant at Real Monarchs SLC, Cruz came on board after ending his playing career ahead of the 2018 USL regular season. Prior to taking on his role with the Monarchs, Cruz's

extensive playing career saw him register 137 career Major League Soccer appearances in total.

A native of Petersburg, Virginia, Cruz's decade-long playing career began with the Des Moines Menace, where current LouCity players Richard Ballard and Tim Dobrowolski have spent time. After leaving the University of Nevada-Las Vegas, Cruz was drafted in the third round (41st overall) of the 2009 MLS SuperDraft by the Houston Dynamo. The former winger clocked time with the Dynamo, D.C. United, and Philadelphia Union in Major League Soccer before spending one year with Minnesota United and part of one year with the San Francisco Deltas in the NASL before leaving for Real Monarchs SLC in August 2017.
