SERIES HISTORY: The match between Chicago and Seattle Reign FC marks the third time this season that the two teams will meet, with each taking a win at home. When facing off on June 28 at Memorial Stadium, Seattle was able to earn thier first win over Chicago since 2014.

SCOUTING SEATTLE: Seattle enters the match winning just one game out of their last five matches (1-3-1). However, the Reign has converted 31 goals, strong enough for first overall in NWSL and 17 assists. However, NWSL leading scorer (12) Megan Rapinoe is now out for five weeks due to a knee injury. The Reign have seen a surge in production from Nahomi Kawasumi, who leads the league in assists (7), while managing four goals and will look for her to step up during Rapinoe's absence. Haley Kopmeyer, is currently second in the NWSL in saves (70), but has acquired just two shutouts.

2017 ROSTER: Chicago announced the signing of Yuki Nagasato, a Japan international who earned her first minutes with the Red Stars on Saturday against the Portland Thorns. The team brought in three new players to begin the 2017 NWSL season with draft picks Lauren Kaskie and Morgan Proffitt, plus Summer Green who was acquired from Seattle. The roster returned a solid core with four U.S. Women's National Team players in Julie Ertz, Alyssa Naeher, Christen Press, and Casey Short, plus NWSL All-League members Sofia Huerta, Arin Gilliland and Danielle Colaprico. The 17 returning players from the 2016 season accumulated 184 starts for Chicago.

RED STARS MILESTONES: Alyssa Mautz currently sits at 103 overall appearances for the Red Stars.

LEADING THE NWSL: Red Stars midfielder Vanessa DiBernardo is tied for the lead in assists (16) for all active players in NWSL. The previous two seasons, DiBernardo has finished second overall in the league in assists.

USWNT CALL-UP: Sofia Huerta earned her first call from the U.S. Women's National Team and practiced with the team during the recent FIFA break. Huerta, 24, did not dress for the games due to the U.S. WNT currently trying to gain the rights from Mexico, in which Huerta played five games for.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: Chicago moved to Toyota Park full-time for the 2016 NWSL season and quickly adapted to the pitch. Since moving to Toyota Park, the Red Stars have have lost just twice, a 2-3 loss to FC Kansas City on September 7, 2016 and their last match at home, a 2-3 outcome, against the Portland Thorns.

YOUNG & EXPERIENCED SQUAD: The Red Stars have one of the youngest rosters in the league, with a combined average age of 24.45, with seven players 23 years old or younger. However, a majority of the team has been together for three seasons, making it one of the most cohesive teams in the league.

TOP-NOTCH GOALKEEPERS: During the 2016 season, with the combination of goalkeepers Alyssa Naeher and Michele Dalton, Chicago only allowed 22 goals. The Red Stars currently have allowed 18 goals, which is top three for fewest allowed in the NWSL.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Red Stars currently sit in third place in the NWSL league standings and are eyeing their third consecutive playoff appearance. In 2016, Chicago faced Washington, but lost in double overtime in a heart-breaking match. In 2015, Chicago sealed home field advantage and faced eventual NWSL Champions, FC Kansas City, but the duo of Lauren Holiday and Amy Rodriguez was too much for the young squad.

NEXT MATCH: Red Stars finish their three-game home series on Sunday, August 20, against FC Kansas City. The last match between the two clubs was April 22, where the Red Stars grabbed a 1-0 win with a goal from Julie Ertz.

Chicago Hosts Seattle in Mid-Week Showdown

CHICAGO - The Red Stars will look to jump back into second place when they take on Seattle Reign FC in a mid-week contest on Wednesday, August 16. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. CT at Toyota Park.

After a tough 2-3 loss to Portland on Saturday, Chicago dropped in the standings to third place, just out of hosting a semi-final match. Against the Thorns, the visiting team quickly took a 2-0 lead in the first 10 minutes of the match with goals by Hayley Raso and Christine Sinclair.

The home side fought back and equalized going into halftime. Christen Press tallied her ninth goal of the season, while Sofia Huerta notched her fifth goal. It was an unfortunate free kick that found the head of Emily Sonnett to give Portland the win.

Seattle saw the same fate on Sunday, as they fell 1-2 to league leaders, North Carolina, in their first home loss in 15 games. The Courage took the lead off a Samantha Mewis strike, but the Reign equalized just before halftime with Rumi Utsugi's first goal of the season. It would be Mewis once again to put North Carolina in the lead with a second half goal at Memorial Stadium.

Both Chicago and Seattle each have a win this season against the other, with each side winning on their home turf. Press grabbed the only goal in a 1-0 shutout on June 4 at Toyota Park, while Megan Rapinoe tallied a brace off two penalty kicks to come back after Alyssa Mautz earned a goal in the first half on June 28 in Seattle. In the meeting at Memorial Stadium, it marked the first time Seattle had beat Chicago since 2014.

In the standings, Chicago remains in playoff contention with 29 points, while Seattle falls in fifth place with 24 points. The Reign will also be without Rapinoe, who leads the league with 12 goals, due to knee surgery after the Tournament of Nations.

Press and Huerta will look to combine once again in an effort to attack the Reign's backline, as the captain continues to lead the league in shots (65) and shots on goal (38). Chicago holds a 5-4-4 all-time record against Seattle, outscoring the Reign 19-12.

After Seattle, the Red Stars will end their three games in a 10-day home stretch when they take on FC Kansas City on Sunday, Aug. 20. The match is set to kick off at 5 p.m. CT at Toyota Park. Tickets for Aug. 20 are available [here](#).

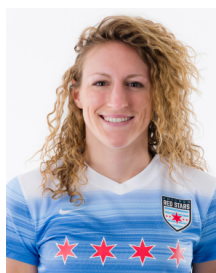
