SERIES HISTORY:

The match between Chicago and Washington marks the second time the two times will face off this season. The teams met at Toyota Park on June 17, which saw Christen Press and Francisca Ortega find the back of the net for their respective teams. In 12 matches between the two clubs, all but two games have been decided by one goal or less, including the 2016 NWSL semifinals, where Washington took an overtime win over Chicago. Washington holds the advantage in the series with seven wins over the Red Stars, losing just three.

SCOUTING WASHINGTON: Despite a strong season in 2016, Washington is rebuilding for the future in 2017. The Spirit enter the last part of the NWSL season with just four wins under their belt, however three of the wins have come on their home turf at Maureen Hendricks Field. Havana Solaun is top-10 in the NWSL with goals (5), while notching three assists, while Francisca Ortega has four goals and three assists. The bright spot for Washington though is in their goalkeeper Stephanie Labbe. Without the likes of Labbe in goal, Washington could be in an even deeper hole than allowing 32 goals.

2017 ROSTER: The past two weeks, Chicago has seen the most movement on their roster in three seasons. On Monday, Chicago announced a trade with the Spirit that sent Kristie Mewis to the Red Stars in exchange for a conditional first round pick. With the signing of Mewis, Chicago had to release rookie Morgan Proffitt. In the beginning of the month, the Red Stars announced the signing of Yuki Nagasato, a Japan international who earned her first start and first assist with the Red Stars on Sunday against FC Kansas City. With the addition of Nagasato, Chicago waived midfielder Mary Luba. The team has brought in three new players to begin the 2017 NWSL season with draft picks Lauren Kaskie and Proffitt, plus Summer Green who was acquired from Seattle. The roster returned a solid core with four U.S. Women's National Team players in Julie Ertz, Alyssa

Naeher, Christen Press, and Casey Short, plus NWSL All-League members Sofia Huerta, Arin Gilliland and Danielle Colaprico. The 17 returning players from the 2016 season had accumulated 184 starts for Chicago.

RED STARS MILESTONES: Alyssa Mautz currently sits at 105 overall appearances.

LEADING THE NWSL: Red Stars midfielder Vanessa DiBernardo is tied for the lead in assists (16) for all active players in NWSL. In 2015 and 2016 DiBernardo finished second overall in the NWSL in assists.

USWNT CALL-UP: Sofia Huerta earned her first call from the U.S. Women's National Team and practiced with the team during the recent FIFA break. Huerta, 24, did not dress for the games due to the U.S. WNT currently trying to gain the rights from Mexico, in which Huerta played five games for.

HOME HEARTBREAK: Chicago moved to Toyota Park full-time for the 2016 NWSL season and quickly adapted to the pitch. Since moving to Toyota Park, the Red Stars have lost just four times. However, the past three home games mark all three of those losses at Toyota Park in 2017.

YOUNG & EXPERIENCED SQUAD: The Red Stars have one of the youngest rosters in the league, with a combined average age of 24.45, with seven players 23 years old or younger. However, a majority of the team has been together for three seasons, making it one of the most cohesive teams in the league.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Red Stars currently sit in third place in the NWSL league standings with 29 points. However, it is just six points that are decided right now between teams three to eight.

NEXT MATCH: Red Stars return to Toyota Park for their final regular season home game on September 3 against North Carolina. Chicago has played the Courage twice this season, winning both.

Chicago Looks to Rebound on the Road in Washington

CHICAGO - The Red Stars will look to regain momentum on the road when they travel to Washington D.C. to take on the Spirit. The game will kick off at 6 p.m. CT on Saturday, August, 26, at Maureen Hendricks Field. Watch live on the go90 app or NWSLsoccer.com.

Chicago is coming off its worst home appearance in club history, creating a three-game losing streak at Toyota Park. The most recent being a 1-3 defeat against Midwestern rival, FC Kansas City. The first half found Chicago down 2-0 after two goals in six minutes by Sydney Leroux and Katie Bowen.

The scoreline was down to just one goal after Julie Ertz scored her third goal of the season, her second against Kansas City this year. However, it was Kansas City that would score the final goal when midfielder Maegan Kelly found the back of the net to secure the win.

Meanwhile, Washington Spirit dropped back down to the bottom of the leaderboard with only 16 points, being one of two teams under 20 points. The Spirit fell to league leaders North Carolina in a 2-0 battle on the road. Courage rookie Ashley Hatch notched the first goal, while an unfortunate own goal by Spirit defender Kassey Kallman sealed the Courage victory.

Teams will look a bit different on the field, as this past week, former Spirit midfielder Kristie Mewis was traded to Chicago for a conditional first round pick in the 2018 NWSL College Draft. With the addition of Mewis, the Red Stars waived rookie Morgan Proffitt, who was then picked up by the Spirit through waivers.

In recent years, Washington has had the upper edge on Chicago, creating a 7-3-2 record against the Red Stars. The Spirit have managed to score 14 goals on Chicago, compared to the Red Stars 11.

The last time the two teams met, the match ended in a 1-1 draw, as Christen Press equalized late in the game off a penalty kick after Francisca Ortega gave Washington the lead before halftime.

Chicago controls their own destiny for clinching a coveted playoff spot and will look for three points to continue its third-place run. Orlando Pride is currently tied with Chicago at 29 points, with Seattle Reign FC and Sky Blue FC closing in with 27 and 26, respectively.

After their trip to Washington, Chicago will return home for their last regular season home match at Toyota Park when they take on North Carolina Courage on Saturday, Sept. 3, at 5 p.m. CT. Tickets are available [here](#).
