COACHING CAREER

- Is in his fifth season as the D-backs' manager (285-261; .522) and his 21st in a managerial or coaching capacity in professional baseball.
- Enters this season 68 wins shy of tying Kirk Gibson (353) for the most wins by a manager in franchise history.
- Honored with the Tommy Lasorda Managerial Achievement Award in 2019.
- Named the 2017 BBWAA NL Manager of the Year, the third D-backs manager to earn the honor, joining Bob Melvin (2007) and Kirk Gibson (2011).
- Was the seventh person to garner the honor in his first season as a manager: Hal Lanier in 1986 (Astros), Dusty Baker in 1993 (Giants), Joe Girardi in 2006 (Marlins), Matt Williams in 2014 (Nationals), Jeff Banister in 2015 (Rangers) and Dave Roberts in 2016 (Dodgers).
- Spent 4 seasons (2013-16) in the Red Sox' organization as the bench coach under John Farrell...was the first base coach on Farrell's staff with the Blue Jays from 2011-12.
- Acted as Boston's interim manager for 48 games from Aug. 14, 2015-end of the season while Farrell was on medical leave...guided the Red Sox to a 28-20 record.

HOW IT HAPPENED


- Named the club's eighth manager on Nov. 4, 2016.
- Met D-backs general manager Mike Hazen, who was an intern in Cleveland's baseball operations department, in 2001 at Spring Training when he was the Indians' Roving Coordinator...the duo also worked together in Boston from 2013-16.

TEAM HISTORY & RECORDS

- Guided the D-backs to a second-place finish in the NL West (93-69), and a Wild Card win over the Rockies.
- His 93 wins were the most by an Arizona manager in his first 162 games, 1 more than Bob Brenly's 92 in 2001, and were 24 more than their total of 69 in 2016, the second-largest win difference in the Majors behind the Twins (26), and fourth-best increase in franchise history.



- A basketball enthusiast, he shoots around almost every morning at his house...on the road, he organizes games for the coaching and support staff, which has included visits to: Marquette University, University of Kansas, UCLA, Minnesota Timberwolves, Brooklyn Nets and Houston Rockets.



- Served as the assistant basketball coach for his son, Connor's, high school basketball team at New Way Academy in Phoenix for the 2018-19 season.

As a Minor League manager from 2002-10, wore jersey No. 11 to honor Sparky Anderson, his first Major League manager...has worn No. 17 since joining the Red Sox in 2013, a reference to his wife's birthday (Dec. 17).

"My thoughts and strategies of how I get to know the players on that level first...Having conversations beyond the game and asking about parents, children, understanding how important families are."

COACHING CAREER

- In his third season as the D-backs' hitting coach.
 - Served in the same capacity with the Brewers for 4 seasons (2015-18)...it was his second stint in Milwaukee's organization, having previously served as Minor League hitting coordinator (2010-11) and manager at Double-A Huntsville (2012-13).
 - Was the Tigers' assistant hitting coach in 2014, his first coaching position in the Majors...Detroit led the Majors in average (.277) and ranked second in runs (757), OBP (.331), SLG (.426) and OPS (.757).
 - Spent 4 years in the Nationals' organization (2006-09) as a Minor League roving hitting instructor (2006), manager at Short-Season A Vermont (2007) and Single-A Hagerstown (2008), and hitting coach at Triple-A Syracuse (2009).
 - Began his coaching career as the Minor League hitting coordinator with the Mariners in 2000.

- In his first season as hitting coach, the D-backs matched the club record with 220 home runs (also: 2017), up from 176 in 2018...the 44-home run increase was the third-biggest jump in club history.
 - Arizona featured a club-record-tying 6 players with 25+ doubles (also: 2005-06, '17), tied for the second most in the Majors (also: Colorado and Philadelphia), behind only Boston (7).
 - The D-backs logged 40 triples, tied for third in the Majors with the Royals...only the Rockies (41) and Tigers (41) had more



PLAYING CAREER

- Played 14 Major League seasons with the Mariners (1983-85, '88-90), Tigers (1986-87, '90), Pirates (1987-88), Giants (1991), Reds (1992), Blue Jays (1993-94), Cardinals (1995) and Rockies (1997).
- Was a member of the 1993 World Champion Toronto Blue Jays.
- Is 1 of 15 players all-time, including Babe Ruth, to hit 3 homers in a game in both the NL (1987 Pirates) and AL (1994 Blue Jays).
- Finished his career in the Japanese Central League (1996 Chunichi Dragons; 1997 Hanshin Tigers).

HALL OF FAME FRIEND

- Remains close friends with former teammate Ken Griffey Jr., who thanked him in his Hall of Fame induction speech in 2016.
- While Coles was coaching for Countryside (Fla.) High School in 2010, Griffey gave each player 2 pairs of shoes and batting gloves.

- Married to Shari...has 3 children: DeAnna, Darnell Jr. and Jared.
- Is a 1980 graduate of Dwight D. Eisenhower High School in Rialto, Calif...committed to UCLA to play baseball and football before signing with the Mariners.

"I just felt like it was important to let them know that I was part of the process, that I was going to be in it with them," Coles told *The Athletic*. "I made sandwiches every day. I hauled boxes and took the trash out like anybody else."

- Is in his second season as the D-backs' pitching coach and 30th overall in professional baseball...spent the previous 2 seasons (2018-19) as the bullpen coach for the Giants.

"I was really impressed about how he was able to get one of the leaders of the San Francisco Giants pitching staff to slow down the process and understand exactly what was going on," said Torey Lovullo.

COACHING CAREER

- Is in his third season as the D-backs' assistant hitting coach...spent 2018 as the hitting coach for the Angels.
- Spent 4 seasons on the Cubs' Major League coaching staff, first as the first base coach in 2014 and then as the assistant hitting coach from 2015-17... during his tenure as assistant hitting coach, the Cubs led the NL with a .334 on-base pct., ranked second in runs (2,319) and fourth in home runs (593).

"It brings a smile to my face [to talk about Hinske], because he was a coach long before he knew he was a coach because of his presence in the clubhouse," former Braves manager Fredi Gonzalez told MLB.com in 2014, whom Hinske played under in 2011. "He is a smart baseball person. And nobody wants to win more than he does."

- Hit .249 with 240 doubles, 137 home runs and 522 RBI in 1,387 games over 12 Major League seasons with the Blue Jays (2002-06), Red Sox ('06-07), Rays ('08), Pirates ('09), Yankees ('09), Braves ('10-12) and D-backs ('13).
- Played 52 games for the D-backs in his final Major League season in 2013, hitting .173 with 1 home run and 6 RBI.
- Named the 2002 AL Rookie of the Year after hitting .279 with 38 doubles, 24 home runs and 84 RBI for the Blue Jays.
- Selected by the Cubs in the 17th round of the 1998 draft.

CALL YOUR SHOT

Prior to a game vs. the Rays as a member of the Braves in 2010, Hinske, Chipper Jones, Jason Heyward and Bobby Cox met with Atlanta Falcons quarterback Matt Ryan at batting practice at Turner Field... during the conversation, Hinske told the 4-time Pro Bowler he planned on going deep in that night's game:

"He was standing out in the tunnel, signing some stuff, and I said, 'Man, nice to meet you,'" Hinske told the *Atlanta Journal Constitution*. "Make sure you're watching because I'm going deep tonight.' He's like 'All right, bro.'"

Hinske would later go on to hit a solo home run in the sixth inning, an event that Ryan called one of the "coolest" experiences of his life.





- Is adept with either hand...he shoots a bow, bats, writes and ropes right-handed, but throws from the left side.
- Started playing coach-pitch baseball at age 4 against 7-year olds.
- His father, Kevin, wouldn't let him throw a curveball until after he had a driver's license.
- Before he started dating his wife in high school, he dated a girl named Madison Bumgarner ("No relation, I'm sure of it," he says).
- He never in his life owned a suit prior to winning *Sports Illustrated's* Sportsman of the Year Award in 2014.

NO TITLE WOULD DO THIS JUSTICE

- In Spring 2014, he and his wife, Ali, were roping cattle when Madison was startled by a large snake...he grabbed an ax and hacked it to pieces.
- When Ali, an expert field dresser, examined what was left of the snake, she found 2 baby jackrabbits inside pieces of it and extracted them...a short while later the Bumgarner's noticed that one of the rabbits was still alive.
- Ali brought the rabbit back to their apartment and for the next few days kept it warm and bottle-nursed it...the rabbit soon was healthy enough for them to release into the wild.

PART-TIME MECHANIC

As a 20-year old rookie in 2010, the Giants' team bus broke down on a trip in Colorado...Bumgarner was sitting in the back, yelled, "I'll take care of it," got off the bus, popped the hood and helped get the bus running again.

NEIGH

- He and his wife, Ali, own horses in the Phoenix area and enjoy riding them in their free time...while with the Giants, he would tow his horses with him to Spring Training each year from North Carolina to Scottsdale.
- On his 125-acre ranch in North Carolina, he estimates he has 50 cows and 20 horses.
- On Opening Day 2015, he rode a horse around the warning track at Oracle Park to raise the 2014 World Series banner in center field.
- Growing up, his family owned horses, so he learned to ride at a very young age.



YEE-HAW

- At age 17, he began competing with his wife Ali's father and brother in team-roping and considers it one of his hobbies...in the 2019-20 offseason, he won a competition in Wickenburg, Ariz. under the pseudonym, Mason Saunders.
- In 2010, former teammate Jeremy Affeldt invited he and his wife to stay at his house during a homestand and observed urban cattle-roping in action.

"He practiced roping cows by roping my lawn furniture," Affeldt told SFGate.com in 2010. "He's good at it. I'd come home and he'd be spinning this rope. He's lassoing all my furniture. Then he wants to make me walk this weird, funky walk while he's trying to lasso my foot."

SMALL-TOWN LIVIN'

His father's family goes back 100 years in Caldwell County, N.C....Located 4 miles southwest of Hudson and 10 miles northwest of Hickory, one area is called "Bumtown" for all the Bumgarner's living on both sides of Deal Mill Road.

RURAL NORTH CAROLINA

Graduated from South Caldwell High School in Hudson, N.C., a town of 2,800 people, 90 minutes northwest of Charlotte...notable alumni include country musician Eric Church.

"You wave at everybody you see, pretty much," he says.

ALMOST A HEEL

Was committed to play baseball at the University of North Carolina before signing with the Giants as the 10th overall pick in the 2007 draft...the Tar Heels also had Matt Harvey and Rick Porcello as part of that same recruiting class.

CASHIN' IN HIS RIDE

Sold his 2018 Ford Shelby GT350 Custom Coupe for \$88,000 at the 2020 Barrett Jackson car auction.

PERSONAL

- Married high school sweetheart, Ali, on Valentine's Day 2010...the story of giving her a 5-day-old bull calf as a wedding present has been exaggerated...he says Ali wanted a calf and he bought her one.
- He was married in a white, open-collar shirt and blue jeans while carrying a pocket-knife.





"I saw him taking infield, and he was the best infielder I saw," Ozzie Guillen told the *Twin Cities Pioneer Press*. "I said, 'Wait a minute, this is the best infielder I see and he's my son's backup? This is the best infielder we have. Why is he not playing?'"
