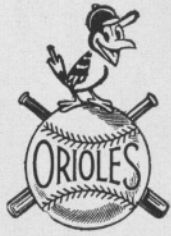

The Orioles and the Red Sox set a new American League endurance record on June 23 in Baltimore when they played a 17-inning game that lasted 4 hours and 58 minutes. Forty-two players were used in the game, to set a new major league record.

Three opposing pitchers gained victories against the Orioles in their major league debuts (Zuverink for Detroit on May 26, Kemmerer for Boston on July 18 and Gray for Philadelphia on July 24).

An extensive survey made by the Orioles last season revealed that 26.1% of Baltimore's home attendance came from out of town and over half of these from outside the state of Maryland. Over \$5,500,000 was spent in Baltimore by out-of-town fans.

The shortest game of the year in which the Orioles participated was with Washington on July 28, when Joe Coleman beat Bob Porterfield 2 to 1 in 1 hr. 42 min. There were 22 games that took less than 2 hrs. to complete and Coleman pitched in exactly half of them.

The Orioles used 132 relief pitchers in 1954, as compared to their opponents' 124.

The Birds made only 3 unassisted double plays. All were by departed Orioles and oddly enough the first was made by Clint Courtney—an unusual feat for a catcher.

General Manager Paul Richards conducted a baseball clinic for the Orioles' minor league managers and several of the scouts January 23-26 in San Antonio, Texas. The new Bird skipper went over all phases of the game and outlined what he expects of his aides.
