

### ATTENDANCE NOTES

The Orioles played 33 night games in 1955, 8 of which were played as the second half of twilight-night double-headers. The 38,085 fans that attended the opening day game against Boston was the largest crowd to see an Oriole game last year. Six days later, on April 18, the largest night crowd of the year—35,372—attended the season's first night game in Baltimore between the Orioles and the Cleveland Indians. The average crowd for a 1955 night game was 15,436. Eight Sunday double-headers and the Labor Day double-header attracted an average of 20,094. Four Sunday single games averaged 14,124. Nine Saturday afternoon games and six week-day afternoon games averaged 5,704.

## ITEMS OF INTEREST

**Longest Winning Streak:** 7 Games (September 16 through September 21).

**Longest Losing Streak:** 12 Games (June 18 through July 2).

**Shortstop Willy Miranda** led all other American League shortstops in total chances accepted (815), put-outs (300), assists (481), double-plays (101), and errors (34).

**On August 31, 1955,** the Orioles and the Cleveland Indians set a new major league record for fewest assists by both clubs in a nine-inning game (5) and fewest chances, infield, by both clubs (18). The Orioles had 3 assists and the infield of Triandos (1b), Marsh (2b), Miranda (ss) and Causey (3b) accepted only 9 chances and did not commit an error.

**On the same day,** the two clubs tied a major league record when batters of each side struck out 23 times. Herb Score struck out 13; Hal Brown fanned 10.

**In that game,** Brown relieved Bill Wight in the first inning with none out and pitched eight full innings without allowing a hit.

**Chicago and Baltimore** set a new American League record on May 1 when a total of 14 pitchers saw action in the first game of the Sunday double-header. Each side paraded 7 hurlers to the mound before the Orioles finally won, 9-8. Bob Alexander, the last of the Baltimore pitchers was credited with the victory.

**Only 54 home runs** were hit in Baltimore's Memorial Stadium last year—a new American League record.

**Not only did Hal Smith** accomplish an unusual fete for a catcher when he engineered an unassisted double play against Kansas City in the 7th inning of the first game on August 3 but it completed the Orioles' only triple play of 1955. Gus Triandos had registered the first out at first base.

**The Orioles have added five new farm clubs to their system for 1956.** They are Vancouver (PCL), Columbus, Ga. (Sally), Phoenix (West Texas-Mexico), Lubbock (Big State), and Thomson, Ga. (Georgia State).

**During the final six weeks** of the 1955 season the Orioles played at the rate of .488 (21-22) which surpassed Washington, Kansas City, Detroit, and Boston.

**Bill Wight** failed by a mere 14 innings to qualify for the ERA standings in the American League (Bill pitched 141 innings—154 are necessary). If he had qualified his 2.49 would have placed him second in the league behind Chicago's Billy Pierce.


