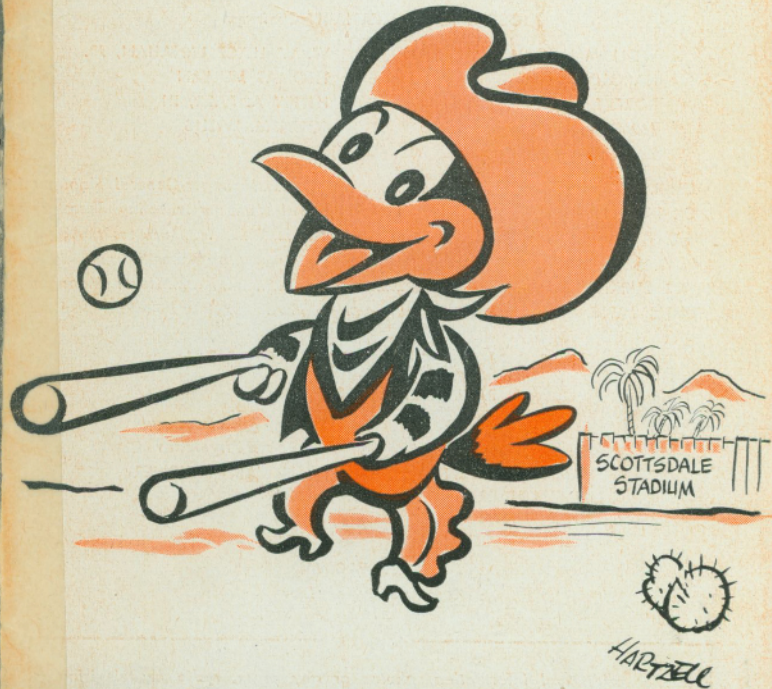

ATTENDANCE NOTES

In 1957, the Orioles drew an average of 16,375 fans to their 43 home night games of which four were played as the second half of twilight-night double-headers. A total of 10 home doubleheaders averaged 18,670 per date. Four two-night doubleheaders averaged 20,626 while four Sunday twin bills drew an average of 15,324.

Eight Sunday single games averaged 12,828 fans per game. On Saturdays, the Orioles drew an average of 21,240 for eight night dates (including one two-night doubleheader) and 9,641 for four single afternoon games.

The largest crowd in 1957 was 45,276 for a single night game with the New York Yankees on July 1. This set a new Memorial Stadium record for attendance at a night game. The Interfaith Night game with the Chicago White Sox June 18 drew 41,515 and a June 29 two-night doubleheader with the Cleveland Indians attracted 40,699. The largest crowd to attend a daylight contest was 38,227 at the Birds' home opener with the Boston Red Sox.

The Orioles in 1957 gained 128,380 in home attendance over 1956, a 14.2 per cent increase, as compared to a net increase in the American League for 1957 of 302,535 or 3.8 per cent. In their four years at Memorial Stadium the Orioles have drawn an annual average of 960,933.

ITEMS OF INTEREST

Longest 1957 Winning Streak: 5 games, twice (June 23 through June 28 and August 2 through August 6).

Longest 1957 Losing Streak: 5 games, twice (May 10 through May 17 and September 5 through September 11).

Since Major League Baseball was officially founded with the formation of the National Association in 1871, Baltimore has been represented in five Major Leagues: National Association, 1872-1874; American Association, 1882-1891; Union Association, 1884; National League, 1892-1899; and the American League, 1901-1902, 1954 to date. There were two Big League clubs in Baltimore in 1884, one in the American Association and the second in the Union Association which collapsed after its first and only season.

During the 28 seasons in which Major League ball has been played in Baltimore, local teams have won three league championships, have finished in the first division 12 times, and have finished last seven times.

In 1957 the Orioles led the Major Leagues in sacrifice hits (110) and tied for the Major League lead in sacrifice flies (54) with the St. Louis Cardinals. The Birds finished second in the American League in fielding percentage (.981) to the White Sox (.982), and in least errors committed (112-107). They were also runner-up to the White Sox in stolen bases (57-109) and in stealing percentage (62-69).

Billy Gardner set three Baltimore Major League records, and another Oriole American League mark in 1957. His 154 games played, 644 official at-bats and 36 doubles represented new highs among all players who have performed for a Baltimore Major League club. He also surpassed the previous Oriole American League mark for base hits in a season with 169.

Paul Richards in his seven years as a Major League pilot has markedly improved his clubs' record in all but one season. The exception occurred in 1952 when his Chicago White Sox duplicated their 81-73 mark of 1951 which had been Richards' first. However, this was in itself a sharp improvement for Chicago which had won only 60 games in the season prior to Richards' arrival.

In Richards' first year in Baltimore in 1955, the Orioles won 57 games, three more than the club had won the year before. In each of the past two years, the Orioles have shown the best improvement in the American League, having won 12 more games in 1956 than in the previous season, and seven more games in 1957 than in 1956.

Billy Loes who compiled a 12-7 won-lost record in '57 to tie with two others for the all-time Oriole American League mark in pitching percentage (.632) allowed fewer home runs (8) than any other pitcher in the A.L. who worked more than 154 innings. Loes ranked ninth in the league in earned run average (3.25).

Connie Johnson turned in the best won-lost record at night in the American League in '57 (10-2). The second best arc light record among pitchers with six or more night game decisions was the Cleveland Indians' Mike Garcia's 6-2. Johnson ranked eighth in the A.L. in earned run average (3.20). George Zuverink (2.47), Billy O'Dell (2.70) and Ken Lehman (2.78) also turned in impressive earned run averages, but did not qualify among the official league leaders because they all worked less than 154 innings.

Of the Birds' 87 homers, 38 were hit at Memorial Stadium (8 more than the opposition) and 49 were hit on the road. Better than one-fourth of the Orioles' overall total (22) came off Kansas City pitching. The Yankees yielded the fewest Oriole homers (5).

Oriole pitchers allowed fewer home runs (95) by a wide margin than any other staff in the A.L. in 1957. The Yankees gave up 110 homers to finish second in this category. Roy Sievers, A.L. home run champion, and Yogi Berra found the range most often against the Birds with six apiece. Mickey Mantle, who didn't hit any home runs in Memorial Stadium in 1956, belted three of his five against the Orioles in 1957 in the Baltimore park. Ted Williams hit only one off the Birds all season. Only 30 of the opposition's home run total were hit in Memorial Stadium.

Jim Busby played in his 1,000th Major League game on September 15, 1957. Only one other Oriole, Larry Doby (1,405), has played in more. Busby also expects to pass the 1,000 hit mark early this season. His total after 1957 was 973.

In 1957 the Orioles were in 1st place for one day, in 3rd for one day, in 4th for 12 days, in 5th for 43 days, in 6th for 73 days and in 7th for 38 days.
