Gus Triandos in 1958 . . . tied A.L. record for homers by catcher in season, 30, equaling Yogi Berra's totals for 1952 and 1956 . . . established new Oriole homer record . . . led club in RBI and HR for fourth straight season . . . led club in runs scored, 59 . . . drove in winning run in 7th inning or later five times . . . was chosen to start All-Star game by vote of fellow American Leaguers . . . was selected as the Orioles' Most Valuable Player by both the "Maryland Professional Baseball Players Association" and the "Maryland Sports Boosters".

Jack Harshman eclipsed three modern Oriole standards last season. His 2.90 ERA broke the old record, 3.12, set by Duane Pillette in '54, and his 17 complete games surpassed Joe Coleman's mark of 15 in 1954. Harshman's six home runs doubled the highest previous output by an Oriole pitcher (three by Ray Moore in 1957).

Bob Boyd was hitting only .179 on June 23 last year. Four weeks (26 games) later he crashed the .300 circle, hiking his average 129 points to .307. During that span, he went 44-111, a .396 pace. Boyd's final .309 elevated his lifetime mark to .304. In addition, Boyd . . . led the American League in hitting under the lights, .367 (177-65) . . . led the Orioles at Memorial Stadium with a .324 average . . . led the club in hitting vs. lefthand pitchers, even though he is a southpaw swinger, for the second straight year by walloping portside hurlers at a .356 clip.

The Birds' 46-31 record at Memorial Stadium last year surpassed their best previous record at home, 42-33 in 1957.

The Orioles' 108 home runs in 1958 eclipsed the former club standard of 91, set in '56.

Five club pitching records established in 1957 were broken last year (old records in parentheses): 1—Low ERA, 3.40 (3.46); 2—Fewest BB, 403 (493); 3—Most Shutouts, 15 (12); 4—Fewest runs all'd, 575 (588), and 5—Fewest ER all'd, 517 (542).
