## ITEMS OF INTEREST

Average Age — The Orioles 1960 spring training roster is the second youngest in the A.L. with an average of 26 years, 4 mos. . . . They rank next to Cleveland (25 yrs., 7 mos.).

First Division — The Orioles spent 128 of a possible 172 days in the first division in 1959 . . . Almost 3/4 (74.4%) of the entire campaign. . . . The longest stretches were from April 23 thru June 30 (69 days), and from July 2 thru August 22 (52 days). . . . Their last day in the first division was September 15 when they were tied with Detroit for fourth.

Days in each position: 1st (1); 2nd (18); 3rd (82); 4th (27); 5th (35); 6th (6); 7th (2); 8th (1). . . . The Birds tied Chicago for first on June 9. . . . Five times they were as many as six games over .500 . . . The last occasion was June 26 (38-32). . . . No Oriole club had ever been more than two games better than even in five previous seasons. . . . The Birds were last at the .500 level on August 20 (59-59).

Vs. First Division Clubs — The Orioles fared better against first division clubs than against second division opponents. . . . In games vs. Chi., Cleve., N. Y. and Det., they were 46-42 . . . While Bos., K. C. and Wash. held them to 28-38. The Birds took the season series from the Yankees for the first time in club history (12-10).

Vs. Chicago — The Orioles were the only A.L. club to break even with the White Sox. . . . The two teams played the equivalent of almost 27 games, i.e. 241 innings. . . . Each won 11 games, and there was one 18-inning tie. . . . Two games went 17, one went 16 and two others were decided in 10 innings. . . . Luis Aparicio, who stole 56 bases, succeeded only 5 times in 11 tries against Baltimore. . . . Triandos nipped him 4 times, and Ginsberg twice.

Woodling — Gene led the club last year in hitting (.300), RBI (77), doubles (22), total bases (200) and walks (78). . . . As a pinch hitter, he went 10 for 18 (.556), and drove in eight runs. . . . During his hottest period, he accomplished a series of memorable feats. . . . On July 26, he drove in all the Orioles runs in a 4-0 win over Chicago. . . . The following day he hit the first grand slam home run of his major league career, and singled home another run to spark the Birds to a 5-2 win over Detroit. . . . In two games, he had driven in all 9 Oriole runs, and also raised his bat figure to a league leading .344. . . . It was also on that date that he learned of his first selection to an A.L. All-Star team in 13 seasons. . . . Despite his 37 years, Gene played in more games last year (140) than in any previous big league campaign.

Wilhelm — In 1959 Hoyt became the first pitcher in history to have won ERA titles in both major leagues. . . . His 2.19 figure last year easily outdistanced his nearest qualifying competitor (Bob Shaw, Chicago, 2.65) while in 1952, his freshman year with the Giants, he won the N.L. crown with a 2.43 ERA. . . . He tied the Oriole record for most wins (15), and led the club in strikeouts (139) and innings pitched (226). . . . After winning his 9th straight decision (and his 10th straight over two seasons) on June 7, his ERA was 0.996 for 90 1/3 innings. . . . Until Harvey Kuenn homered off Hoyt on June 15, the night he lost his first game, he had worked 115 straight innings without allowing a home run. . . . At one point in 1959 he worked 22 consecutive scoreless frames.

Pappas — Milt tied the club record for wins (15), and led the team in complete games (15), second only to Camilo Pascual in the A.L. . . . He also tied an Oriole mark by pitching four shutouts. . . . From June 5 (at which time he owned a 6.49 ERA), Milt completed 14 of 20 starts, and allowed only 2.46 earned runs/game. . . . He allowed fewer home runs (8) than any other Oriole regular.

Grand Slams — Among the current Orioles, Walt Dropo has the most grand slam home runs in the majors (7) . . . Triandos has 3 and Woodling has 1 hit.

Most Valuable Orioles — Since 1954 the following players have been awarded the Annual Sports Boosters of Maryland trophy as Most Valuable Orioles: 1954 — Chuck Diering; 1955 — Dave Philley; 1956 — Bob Nieman; 1957 — Billy Gardner; 1958 — Gus Triandos, and 1959 — Gene Woodling.

Pinch-hitting — As a club, the Orioles hit .262 in pinch-hitting situations last season (195-51), and reached base safely 85 times in 235 plate appearances (36.2%). The leading pinch-swingers were Woodling (.556—see Woodling paragraph above), and Al Pilarcik who hit .333 (21-7).

Hall of Famer — The following former Orioles (incl. International League players) are members of Baseball's Hall of Fame: Roger P. Bresnahan, Dennis Brouthers, Wm. A. Cummings, Robert M. Grove, Rogers Hornsby, Hugh A. Jennings, William H. Keeler, Joseph J. McGinnity, John J. McGraw, Wilbert Robinson and George H. Ruth.
