**PITCHING NOTES:** The Orioles were edged out for league pitching leadership by the Yankees in 1960 (3,515 to 3,520) . . . They did, however, lead the league in complete games (48) and allowed fewest runs (606), earned runs (538) and home runs (117) . . . The Birds set a club record for strikeouts (785) while finishing second in the circuit to Detroit (824).

During the second half of the season, Oriole pitchers compiled a cumulative 3.02 era (634 i.p., 213 e.r.) to reduce the over all figure from 3.94 . . . Chuck Estrada tied Cleveland's Jim Perry for most wins (18) while setting a club record and Hal Brown established an Oriole standard for highest won-lost pct., .706, with a 12-5 log . . . Jack Fisher also set a Baltimore record by pitching three consecutive shutouts and working a total of 29-1/3 straight scoreless innings from Aug. 29 to Sept. 14.

Five Oriole pitchers, all 22 or younger, accounted for 58 of the Birds' 89 wins in 1960: Estrada (18), Pappas (15), Fisher (12), Barber (10) and Walker (3) . . . Six pitchers, all trained in the Oriole system, won 60 games . . . The five above plus 26-year old Wes Stock who won two.

Brown has won more games lifetime as an Oriole (46) than any other pitcher while Milt Pappas is second (40) . . . In lifetime Oriole shutouts, Pappas leads with 7 followed by Brown (6) and Hoyt Wilhelm (5).

## ITEMS OF INTEREST

**First Division**—The Birds spent 153 of a possible 167 days in the first division in 1960, and were never out of the top four after May 4 . . . Following is a breakdown of the number of days in each position: 1st (29); 2nd (61); 3rd (41); 4th (22); 5th (9); 6th (1); 7th (3); 8th (1) . . . During the period May 27 thru June 7, the Orioles were in first place for 12 straight days, and on June 2 built up their biggest lead of the season, three games over second place Cleveland . . . At that point, the Birds were six games up on the Yankees.

From September 3 thru 9, the Orioles held first for seven consecutive days, and held a two game lead on September 4 after beating New York three straight. They never regained the lead after the 9th although immediately prior to the four game series in New York (9/16-17-18) they trailed the Yankees by only .001 (.589 to .590) . . . On three occasions the Birds were 26 games over .500, a club record (79-53, 80-54 and 81-55) . . . Before 1960, they had never been more than six games better than even.

**The Big Mitt**—On May 27, 1960, a catcher's mitt roughly half again as big as the standard glove was introduced by the Orioles in Yankee Stadium. Its purpose was to make Hoyt Wilhelm a more effective pitcher by cutting down on his catcher's passed balls and his own wild pitches. To that point he had worked 28-1/3 innings and his catchers had been charged with 11 passed balls and he with four wild pitches . . . The year before, the Orioles had established a league record by committing 49 passed balls (38 of these with Wilhelm on the mound) . . . From the point of introduction of the Big Mitt, Wilhelm pitched 118-1/3 innings, was 10-6, saved seven other games in relief and compiled an era of 2.66 to reduce his seasonal figure from 5.96 to 3.31. During the same period he was charged with only two wild pitches and his batterymates with only three passed balls.

**Fielding**—The Birds finished second in league fielding to Chicago by .0002 (.9817 to .9819). Their 172 double plays, second to Chicago's 175, set a club record while their 108 errors were low for the league and also established an Oriole record . . . Among individual fielding feats, Brooks Robinson led all regular third basemen with a .977 average (only 12 errors in 511 total chances).

**Pinch-hitting**—Orioles hit .265 as a club in pinch-hitting roles, and reached safely 103 times in 266 total appearances, a percentage of .387 in 1960 . . . The year before they hit .262 and compiled a reached safely percentage of .362 . . . Among 1960 leaders were Bob Boyd who hit .309 (17-55) as a pinch-swinger, Clint Courtney who reached safely 14 times in 26 tries, and Jim Gentile who got on 19 times in 39 efforts.

**Home Runs**—Birds hit 123 for season, a club record . . . 60 w/0 on, 30 w/1 on, 17 w/2 and 7 w/3 on . . . Gentile had most homers with men on: 3 w/1 on, 7 w/2 and 1 w/3 on.

**Grand Slams**—Birds hit 7 with bases loaded to set club record: Triandos—2; Robinson, Gentile, Klaus, Pearson and Woodling, 1 each . . . Lifetime: Drogo—7; Triandos—5; Busby and Philley—3; Brandt, Robinson, Gentile and Stephens, 1 each.

**MVP**—Brooks Robinson was selected as "Most Valuable Oriole" in 1960 by the Maryland Sportsboosters Inc. Other winners in previous years were: 1954—Chuck Diering; 1955—Dave Philley; 1956—Bob Nieman; 1957—Billy Gardner; 1958—Gus Triandos; 1959—Gene Woodling.

In addition, Robinson with 211 points finished third in the American League "Most Valuable Player" balloting behind Roger Maris (225) and Mickey Mantle (222). Robinson was the only player to be named on all 24 ballots cast.

**Rookie of the Year**—The Orioles cornered all 24 votes for "Rookie of the Year" in the American League last season . . . Hansen won with 22 votes while first year mates Chuck Estrada and Jim Gentile were awarded one vote each.

**Come from Behind**—The Orioles came from behind to win in 36 games last year, and in 22 of these rallied in the 7th inning or later.

**Opponents' Notes**—Pete Runnels, who led the American League in hitting in 1960 with a .320 average, hit only .206 against the Orioles (13-63) and .335 vs. the rest of the loop . . . Rocky Colavito has not hit a home run at Memorial Stadium since the night of June 10, 1959 when he tied a major league record by hitting four in the same game . . . Mickey Mantle's 14 homers in Memorial Stadium represent the most hit by an opponent lifetime . . . Roy Sievers has hit 11 in Baltimore and Harmon Killebrew 9 . . . Whitey Ford has won more lifetime decisions from the Birds, 22, than any other pitcher, active or retired. He has lost 9. Chicago's Early Wynn (21-6) and Billy Pierce (20-9) rank second and third . . . The biggest losers to the Orioles since 1954 are Ned Garver, K. C. (14-16); Frank Lary, Det. (13-14) and Chuck Stobbs, Minnesota, who, despite a 4-0 record against Baltimore last year, is 8-13 lifetime.

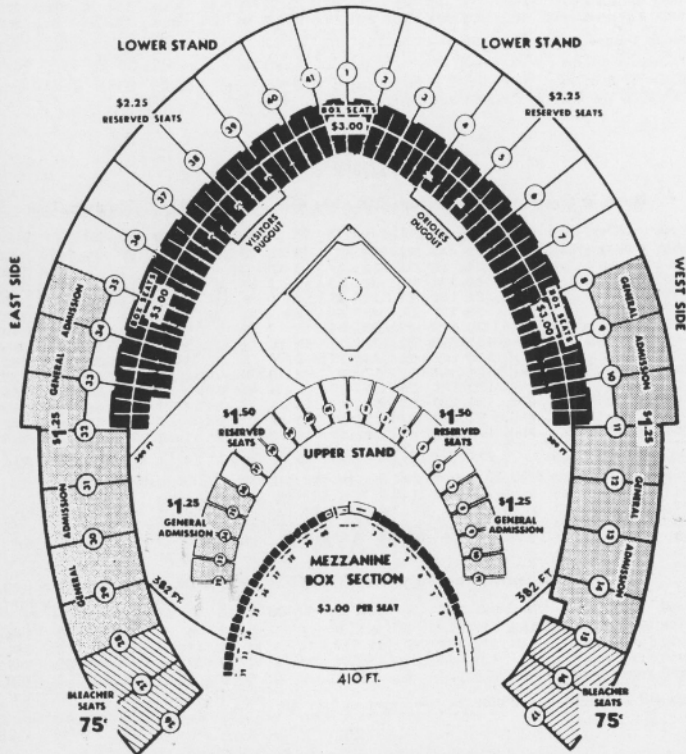
