FARM NOTES: Fifteen players in the Oriole farm system were selected to all star teams last year, and two Oriole minor league pilots, Billy Hunter and Cal Ripken received "manager of the year" awards. . . . George Sisler, Jr., Rochester G.M., capped this by being selected the "Minor League Executive of the Year" by the SPORTING NEWS. . . . The six club minor league network posted a composite 396-354 won-last record in 1962, third best among the 20 major league organizations. . . . All but one of the clubs finished above ".500". . . . There will be only one new face among the Orioles' minor league managers. Darrell Johnson will pilot the Rochester club, replacing Clyde King who took a job as a coach with the Cardinals. Ripken and Billy Demars who managed at Appleton and Aberdeen respectively last year will trade assignments for 1962. . . . This will be Earl Weaver's seventh season as a manager in the Baltimore system, and Demars' fifth. . . . The Orioles and their predecessors (St. Louis Browns) have worked with the Aberdeen franchise for 18 consecutive seasons, making this the longest unbroken association between a major and minor league club in organized baseball today. It all began in 1946.

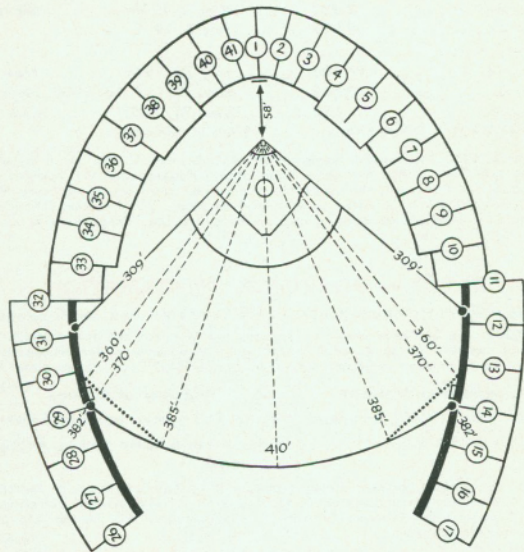

SPRING TRIPS—The Orioles will be based at the Hillsboro Hotel in Tampa on their annual four game trip to the Florida west coast on March 18, 19, 20 and 21. They will stay at the Golden Triangle Hotel in Norfolk, Va. on Friday, April 5, and then return to Baltimore the next evening following their game with the Mets in Portsmouth.

TRAVEL—During the regular season the Orioles will travel 25,000 miles on 40 inter-city trips. . . . They will make 29 trips by air, 7 by bus (between Baltimore and Washington) and 4 by train (between Baltimore and New York).
