Harry Dunlop, Stockton manager, won the California League pennant, and was selected as the league's "Manager of the Year." . . . In seven full seasons as an Oriole minor league pilot, Earl Weaver (Elmira) has never finished out of the first division. . . . Bluefield coasted to its second Appalachian League pennant in a row under Billy Hunter. . . . The Orioles have scheduled an exhibition game at Aberdeen, June 8. . . . The Baltimore Club and its predecessor, the St. Louis Browns, have worked with Aberdeen since 1946 (this is 19th consecutive season). . . . Rochester led the International League in attendance (271,968) and Elmira (74,811) topped the Eastern League. . . . Aberdeen, Stockton and Bluefield all finished second in their leagues in attendance. . . . Twenty-three minor league Orioles were selected to 1963 all-star teams.

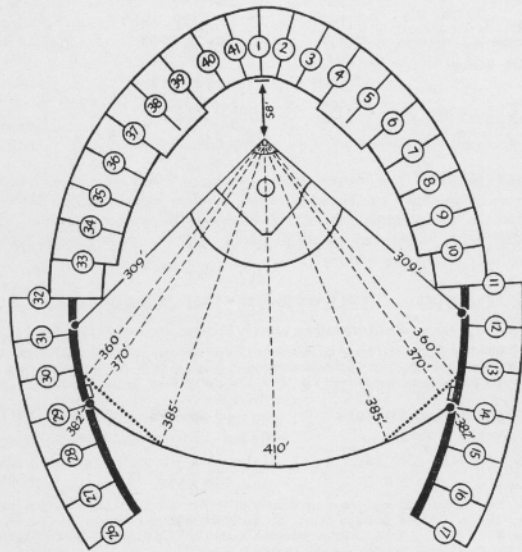

Hit four homers in 1958 series with eight rbi and .323 average . . . Lifetime average was .277.

HARRY BRECHEEN is the only member of the ball club who has been with the Birds since their 1954 opening in Baltimore . . . Harry was a standout lefthand pitcher for 11 seasons in the majors, all but one of these with the St. Louis Cardinals . . .
