New single date attendance marks were set, both home and away. The old record of 46,796 (set May 16, 1954) was broken Friday, August 14 by a crowd of 47,424, and then that standard fell the very next night (Saturday, August 15) when 47,987 paid their way into Memorial Stadium. The third game of that set with the Yankees, on Sunday, August 16, drew 43,382 to swell the total for the series to 138,793, also an Oriole record.

The Orioles and Yankees played to the largest crowd of the regular 1964 major league season, 58,102, on Sunday, August 9 in Yankee Stadium (double-



SUSPENDED GAME RULE: A game terminated by curfew or by a pre-arranged time limit is a suspended game if it has progressed far enough to be an official game (i.e.  $4\frac{1}{2}$  or 5 innings) .

A game terminated by light failure is a suspended game anytime after it begins.

Suspended games shall be resumed at the exact point of suspension immediately preceding the next scheduled single game between the two clubs on the same ground . . . If this is not possible, other provisions for resumption are specified in American League Regulation

A game called at the end of a completed inning AFTER NINE INNINGS shall be a TIE game and NOT a SUSPENDED game.

PLAYER LIMITS: 28 players from opening day thru 30th day of eason . . . 25 players from 31st day of season thru August 31 . . . 40 players from September 1 thru end of season.

Throughout the year a major league club may carry 40 men on its "under control" list . . . A 41st player may be added if he is a first year player selected and the annual draft meeting in late November . . . However, the list must be reduced to 40 again by opening day.

Players in military service do not count against the "under control" list while on active duty . . . Upon separation from the service a player will be reinstated to his club's normal player limits after he has completed a 15 day trial period or has participated in a championship game, whichever comes first.

TRAVEL: From March to October the Orioles will travel over 33,000 miles as a club . . . They will make some 67 inter-city jumps including 44 by air, 21 by bus and two by train . . . There will be 33 charter flights and 11 trips on scheduled jets . . . United Air Lines will carry the club on 39 of their trips . . . Transportation will cost the Orioles \$110,000 (\$90,000 during regular season for 51 city-to-city jumps) . . .

Some Orioles will spend as much as 16 weeks in hotels from the start of spring training to the end of the season (112 days). Hotel accommodations and meals for the club will cost about \$95,000 (\$43,000 in regular season) . . .

CLOSE GAMES: One-run games were the Orioles' forte for the first half of last year . . . They had an amazing 21-2 record thru the first half of a July 12 doubleheader in Detroit, but starting with the nightcap of that twin-bill until the end of the season they slipped to 11-16.

MINIMUM MAJOR LEAGUE SALARY: A player is entitled to a minimum rate of \$7000 per year if he is on the roster during the period June 15 thru August 31... If such a player was on the roster before June 15 he is also entitled to the \$7000 rate retroactive to the date he joined the club during that season.

A player who is on the roster before June 15, but who is no longer with the parent club on that date, as well as a player who joins the club after August 31 will be paid at the rate of at least \$6000 per year for each day of service.
