 Attendance Notes: The Orioles' largest crowd of the year at home was 38,253 for a Bat Night game against the world champion A's on April 27th. Only one other gate exceeded 30,000. That was a June 29th Tee Shirt Night gathering of 32,905 for a Yankees game. Away from home the Birds drew nine crowds of more than 30,000 including 42,818 in Cleveland on July 26th, the Orioles' largest crowd of the year . . . Attendance at Orioles games in opponents' parks outdistanced Memorial Stadium totals for the year by 327,169. It was the 9th straight year the Birds have topped a million on the road, but the third consecutive season that they failed to reach that level at home. . . . However, the exciting inte season pennant race did generate a September attendance at Memorial Stadium of 205,006 for 12 dates (average 17,084), the highest total. The Yankees and Red Sox were the Birds best draws both home and run Baltimore 130,349 attended Yankees games and 120,976 showed up for the Red Sox . . . Fenway Park attracted 194,285 for eight Orioles dates and 159,486 came to Shea Stadium to watch the Birds and Yankees tangle.

# FARM SYSTEM NOTES

BEST MINOR LEAGUE RECORD: For the 13th consecutive season the Orioles' farm system compiled a composite winning record. The five clubs combined won 330 and lost 292 for a percentage of .531. Rochester won the International League championship while Bluefield (Appaiachian) captured a divisional title. Asheville (Southern) was second and Miami (Florida State) third. Only Lodi (California) had a losing record.

During this stretch of 13 straight winning seasons (beginning 1962) Orioles farm teams have achieved the highest won-lost percentage among all major league organizations (4932-4240, .538).

The Orioles have been chosen as the Topps "Baseball Organization of the Year" three times: 1966, 1971 and 1972. The winner of that annual award is determined by a formula that emphasizes the quality of indi-vidual prospects in a baseball system rather than team won-lost records.

Keystone Kombinations: Four second base-shortstop combinations in the Baltimore organization received significant honors in 1974 starting with Bobby Grich and Mark Belanger, both of whom won A.L. gold gloves at their respective positions. In addition, both members of the keystone combination achieved league all star recognition on three of the five clubs in the minor league system: Rob Andrews and Tim Nordbrook at Rochester . . . Kim Andrew and Kiko Garcia at Asheville and Richard Rickman and Juan Martinez at Bluefield.

ROCHESTER (88-56, 1st North Div.) won the divisional championship by 14 games over Syracuse while finishing the regular season 24 games over .500. Then, the Red Wings under Joe Altobelli, who won his second "manager of the year" award in four years, defeated Memphis, the South

Division titlist, four games to two and wound up a super season by downing Syracuse, which had eliminated Richmond in the first round of playoffs, four games to three to win every prize in sight. Second baseman Rob Andrews, shortstop Tim Nordbrook and third baseman Doug DeCinces were all elected to the I.L. all star team as was veteran pitcher Bill Kirkpatrick.

Andrews, since traded to Houston in the Lee May deal, batted .306; Nordbrook hit .287, played outstanding defense and was voted "mvp" in the I.L. all star game, and DeCinces picked up an all star team berth for the second straight year, and batted .282 with 11 homers and 69 rbi. Other offensive standouts were Tommy Shopay (.313) and Curt Motton (.300).

(300). Kirkpatrick, who was assigned to Montreal with Dave McNally and Richie Coggins in the deal for Ken Singleton and Mike Torrez, had a 15-7 record to lead the league in wins and a 2.82 era. Paul Mitchell (14-6 plus 3-0 in playoffs), Dyar Miller (12-8 and 3-1 in playoffs) and Mike Willis (9-4) also enjoyed outstanding seasons as attrets. Mickey Scott (9-3 with 17 saves and an 0.99 era in 57 games), now with the California Angels, paired with southpaw Dave Johnson (7-4 with 7 saves in 35 games) to form the most effective right-left relief team in the 1.L. Johnson was absent from the club for seven weeks while doing a tour working together (starting 1961) Rochester led the I.L. in attendance with a final figure of 269,703. It was also the 11th time in that 14-year span that the Rochester team has qualified for post-season playoffs.

ASHEVILLE (70-67, 2d Western Div.), managed by Cal Ripken, finished three games back of divisional champion Knoxville (White Sox)... Asheville's keystone combination of second baseman Kim Andrew and shortstop Kiko Garcia was voted to the Southern League all star team. Andrew, who was selected in the major league draft by the Red Sox for \$25,000 in December, hit .317 and led the Baltimore minor league system in hits (165). He also set a S.L. record by hitting safely in 30 consecutive games. It was the third time in his three pro seasons that he batted over .300. Garcia hit .213 with 53 rbi and had an excellent season defensively. Outfielder Jim Buckner, brother of the Dodgers' Bill, started at Lodi, but came to Asheville early and went on to lead the organization in home runs (17, tied with Mike Satterlee) and total bases (235). He hatted .283 at Asheville and .296 overall. Rich Dauer, the U.S.C. All-American who was the Orioles' first choice in the summer draft, was limited to 51 games because of a broken ankle, but batted .324 and hit 11 home runs ... Taylor Duncan batted .290.
Righthander Doug Wessel, a Vanderbilt alumnus who was the O's first pick in the secondary phase of the '73 summer draft, led the club in wins with a 1.8-3 record. Larry McCall, an Asheville native, was 10-7 there (and 2-4 at Rochester) and former Univ. of Mass. standout Mike Flanagan was 6-4 with a 1.82 era after compiling a 6-6 record and 2.10 era at Miami earlier in the year. Overall, Flanagan allowed only 128 hits in 187 innings.

LODI (61-79, 6th composite) finished dead last in the eight-team Cali-fornia League during the first half (21-49), but then Manager Jim Schaffer's club rallied to wind up second in the last half with a 40-30 record.

Mike Satterlee, a four-year pro who started the season at Asheville and batted only .198 came to life at Lodi and hit .327. He wound up with a total of 17 homers for the year to tie Jim Buckner for the organization lead. He was second in the system in rbi with 78 to teammate Ismael Oquendo, a first baseman who drove in 88 runs, hammered 16 homers and batted .298.

and batted .298. Creighton Tevlin, a teammate of Rich Dauer on the NCAA champion Southern California team (selected 24th in regular phase of '74 summer draft), batted .359 for Lodi in 76 games and 10th round choice outfielder Jim Bryan from Merced Jr. College hit .296, and drove in 47 rbi in 72

games. Two Mikes, lefthander Hile who was 11-5 and righthander Parrott with an 11-11 record were the club's leading hurlers, along with Duane John-son who also won 11 while losing a league leading 15 games. Parrott, the Birds' first round selection in the '73 summer draft, compiled a 2.78 era, yielded only 139 hits in 194 innings, fanned 181 and led the league with 16 complete games.

MIAMI (74-58, 3rd, Southern Div.) failed to qualify for the playoffs for the first time in six years yet finished 16 games over .500. The Miami Birds finished first in their division five straight times (1968 thru 1972) and won four consecutive league championships (from 1969 thru 1972) before dropping to second place and losing the first round of playoffs in .1072

in 1973. First baseman Eddie Murray, second baseman Rick Cuoco and catcher Willie Royster were selected to the Florida State League all star team. Murray, a 3rd round choice in the summer draft of 1973, batted. 289 with 63 rbi and 12 homers while leading the organization in both triples (7) and doubles (29). He also led his league in doubles and total bases (212). Cuoco, chosen second by the Orioles in the secondary phase of the same draft, batted .254 and Royster hit 12 homers while driving in 66 runs on a .268 average.

a .268 average. The leading winner on the club was righthander Dennis Martinez (15-6). John Flinn (12-10) had the lowest era in the system (1.74) among pitchers with 85 or more innings and led FSL in shutouts (6). Antonio Chevez compiled a 9-6 record with a 1.57 era while making 38 relief appearances in 41 assignments. Tim Hoyles (6-5), Russ Peach (7-7), Mike Flanagan (6-6), and Baltimore area residents Myrl Smith (4-3) and Ken Califano (4-5) were also on the Miami staff for all or part of the season.

He also won the award in 1971, his first at the Red Wings helm. GRAND SLAM NOTES: Jim Gentile set an American League record and tied a major league mark in '61 when he hit five home runs with the bases full. The major league record had been established by Ernie Banks in '55 ...Gentile also set a major league standard by hitting consecutive bases loaded home runs at Metropolitan Stadium (Minnesota) on 5/9/61 in the 1st inning off Pete Ramos and the 3rd off Paul Giel ... In addition, Gentile also had a run producing single in that game to set a club record for rbi in a game (nine).

Frank Robinson became the second player in history to hit consecutive grand slams on 6/26/70 at R.F.K. Stadium in Washington, in the 5th off Joe Coleman and 6th off Joe Grzenda. Since then, Jim Northrup (then with Detroit) duplicated that feat. Four other players (Lazzeri, Tabor, York and Cloninger) have hit two grand slams in a game, but they were not on consecutive plate appearances.

Brooks Robinson once blasted bases loaded homers in successive games— at Dodger Stadium off Angels' Ken McBride on 5/6/62 and at Memorial Stadium off the K.C. A's Ed Rakow on 5/9/62.

Statum off the R.C. A S Ed Rakow on 5/9/92. One of Dave McNally's two grand slams was hit in the '70 World Series, off the Reds' Wayne Granger (3rd game) . . . Dave's was the 12th grand slam in series history, but the only one ever hit by a pitcher . . . Mike Cuellar hit his grand slam in the '70 ALCS off the Twins Jim Perry in Met Stadium . . . Mike remains the only player ever to hit a bases loaded home run in championship series competition in either league league.

Four opponents have hit two grand slams in Memorial Stadium: Roy Sievers (Wash.), Bill Skowron (N.Y.), Mike Epstein (Wash.) and Rico Petrocelli (Bos.) . . . In all, opponents have hit 48 grand slams off Baltimore pitching including 24 in Memorial Stadium . . . Neither Harmon Killebrew nor Mickey Mantle has ever hit a grand slam gainst the O's although Killebrew has hit more home runs vs. O's than any other opponent as well as more in Memorial Stadium—66 (30) and Mantle ranks second with 54 (25).

LONG HOME RUNS/MEMORIAL STADIUM: The longest "measured" home run ever hit in Memorial Stadium was a 471' drive by Harmon Killebrew on May 24, 1964 off Milt Pappas over the hedge in left-center field . . This exceeded by two feet the only other blast that has ever cleared the hedge . . That was one by Boog Powell 469' to the same area off Boston's Don Schwall on June 22, 1962. Aside from these there have been three balls hit into the hedge (approximately 450'), by Mickey Mantle in 1954, by Powell in 1965 and by Frank Robinson in 1967.

Frank Robinson is the only player to have hit a ball completely out of Memorial Stadium. In the second game of a doubleheader with Cleveland on May 8, 1966, Frank hit a Luis Tiant offering over the left field stands and into the parking lot beyond, a drive that measured 451' on the fly and rolled to a stop 540' away from home plate.

# Notes On 20-Game Winners

Notes On 20-Game Winners During the seven years that George Bamberger has been the Orioles' pitching coach (starting in '68), the Birds' staff has produced 13 20-game winning performances. In the club's first 14 years of operation only one pitcher was able to reach that plateau—Steve Barber in 1963. In this period Dave McNally, Jim Palmer and Mike Cuellar have each been 20-game winners four times, and Pat Dobson once. In 1971 four Baltimore pitchers reached the 20-win level. The only other foursome in the entire history of major league baseball to have achieved that feat were four hurlers from the 1920 White Sox (51 years earlier): Urban "Red" Faber-23, Clude Williams-22, Dickie Kerr-21 and Ed Cicotte-21. Despite that achievement, incidentally, the White Sox that year finished second, two games back of Cleveland. The four Orioles pitchers all reached the 20-win plateau within six days:

The four Orioles pitchers all reached the 20-win plateau within six days: McNally was first on 9/21, then in the same weekend series in Cleveland, the other three joined him: Cuellar (9/24—1st game—clinched pennant), Dobson (9/24—2nd game), Palmer (9/26).

vs. ORIOLES Whitey Ford, now the Yankees pitching coach, retired after the 1967 season but the Hall of Famer who had a lifetime mark of 236-106 for 16 seasons still holds the distinction of having beaten the Orioles more often than any other pitcher, active or retired. Ford who was 30-16 vs. the Birds is followed by: Mickey Lolich (24-18), Billy Pierce (23-11), Early Wynn and Frank Sullivan (21-8), Earl Wilson (20-9), and Camilo Pascual (20-23). In addition to Lolich, other active pitchers with high win totals against the Orioles are: Jim Kaat (19-19), Jim "Catfish" Hunter (19-14) and Jim Perry (18-20). Pascual is the all time biggest loser to the Orioles with 23 defeats. Others oft-beaten by Baltimore are: Jim Perry (20), Fritz Peterson (13-20), Sam McDowell (9-19), Lolich (18), Bill Monbouquette (10-17), Dean Chance and Denny McLain (both 11-16) and Ford (16). Lefthander Bud Daley enjoyed the most productive year ever against the Birds when he compiled a 6-1 record against them for K.C. in 1959. Ford had back to back 5-2 seasons vs. the O's in 1959 and 1960 while Bob Lemon (Cle.) was 5-0 vs. Baltimore in 1956 and Mike Garcia (Cle.) was 5-1 in 1954. Three pitchers have lost five times to the Orioles in a single season, all mere 6-1 bit defendence

5-1 in 1954. Three pitchers have lost five times to the Orioles in a single season, all were 0-5: Ned Garver (K.C.), 1957; Dick Stigman (Min.), 1963; and Stan Williams (Cle.), 1969. Last year Lolich (1-4) and the Royals' Steve Busby (0-4) were the biggest losers to the Birds while Jim Bibby of Texas (3-0) and Boston's Bill Lee (3-2) were the biggest winners against them.

# 1974 HIGHLIGHTS ORIOLES vs. OPPONENTS

BOSTON: The Orioles captured the season series, 10-8... The O's won six of nine at Fenway Park, but were only 4-5 against the Red Sox in Baltimore... The O's won five of their last six against the Sox, all during September.

Blanks: The O's shutout the Red Sox three straight times in a series at Baltimore in early September and held Boston to eight hits in 86 at bats (.093) but the Sox wound up with a .290 average (180-for-621) on the year vs. the O's . . In a Labor Day doubleheader September 2, Ross Grimsley and Mike Cuellar each pitched the O's to 1-0 victories . . Grimsley allowed three hits and Cuellar two . . Jim Palmer, on September 4, continued the scoreless streak as he whitewashed the Bosox, 6-0, on a three-hitter . . . Overall the Sox batted .304 vs. the O's in Fenway, and .272 in Baltimore . . . The Birds batted .282 in Boston and .278 vs. the Sox in Baltimore.

On and On: The Orioles and Red Sox played a game September 21 at Fenway Park that started in early afternoon and wound up late in the evening, consuming almost seven hours . . . It was a cold, rainy day when the game started at 2:20 P.M. and several rain delays took place before the game was completed at 8:48 P.M. . . . To make matters worse for the O's, the Red Sox scored four in the ninth to tie the game at 5-5 and then won it in the 10th on a run-scoring single by Deron Johnson . . . Lefty Bill Lee pitched the entire game for Boston.

Swap: In a classic example of finding gold in the other fellow's mine, the Red Sox took a two-game set from the O's in Baltimore July 1-2... The scene then shifted to Boston for three more games and the O's gained a measure of revenge and then some by sweeping the series July 3-4.

Red-Faced: The Orioles set a club record, the kind stashed away in small print, when they committed six errors while losing to the Red Sox, 11-2, at Memorial Stadium May 19.

Late Start: The O's were scheduled to open their road season April 9 in Boston, but the game was called off after four inches of snow fell on Fenway Park... The game was re-set for the next day but again was postponed, this time because of rain... Finally, on April 11, the skies cleared and the field dried long enough for the O's to spoil the Red Sox' opener, 7-6, in 11 innings.

Sparking Relief: Dave McNally started against the Red Sox in the first game of a twi-nighter July 3 at Fenwav Park, but was ejected in the first inning for complaining about two balk calls on him by umpire Hank Morganweck ... Doyle Alexander relieved McNally and pitched five-hit ball the rest of the way to gain a 9-2 victory ... In the nightcap, first game villain McNally turned hero as he came on to pitch the O's out of trouble in the 9th inning to save a 6-4 victory.

Long Distance Clout: Tommy Davis, never known for his power, smashed two home runs to aid Mike Cuellar in a 6-0 victory over the Red Sox at Memorial Stadium May 17 in a game halted by rain after six innings.

# 1974 HIGHLIGHTS ORIOLES vs. OPPONENTS

CALIFORNIA: The O's won the series for the year against the Angels, 7-5... The Orioles were 4-2 against the Angels in Baltimore and 3-3 at Anaheim Stadium.

**Big Crowd:** One of the Angels' largest crowds of the year, 35,084, saw Bill Singer stop the Orioles on six hits as he pitched the Angels to a 3-1 victory May 4 at Anaheim Stadium . . . The crowd was lured by a bat night promotion.

**Only Win:** Don Hood, O's stylish southpaw, got his only victory of the year when he gained a 5-4 verdict over the Angels July 19... He pitched four innings of no-hit ball in relief to gain the triumph.

Surprise: Light-hitting Mark Belanger, using a 32-ounce bat, slammed a three-run home run in the last of the 9th to power the Orioles to a 5-2 win over the Angels July 20.

CHICAGO: The O's were 5-7 against Chicago for the year, winning four of six in Baltimore but dropping five of six in Chicago.

Spoilers: The White Sox twice in less than a month ended O's winning streaks . . . The O's had a four-game streak broken by the Sox June 16 and then on July 11 the Sox snapped a five-game O's victory skein.

**Comeback:** The Orioles twice came from behind to defeat the White Sox June 15 at Memorial Stadium . . . The O's got two in the 9th to deadlock the game, then won it in the 11th on a Boog Powell opposite field home run.

Winning Return: Jim Palmer, making his first appearance following 54 days on the disabled list, gained an 8-2 decision over the White Sox August 13... Palmer hurled the first six innings and got some immediate working margin as Powell bashed a grand-slam home run in the first inning.

Weirdo: The O's had 13 base runners against the White Sox July 14 in Chicago, but managed to score only one of them while dropping a 3-1 verdict . . Ten runners reached base via walks, but the Sox turned in three doubleplays to keep the O's run output at a minimum.

CLEVELAND: The Orioles won twice as many against the Indians as they lost, posting 6-3 records home and away.

Club Mark: The O's set a club record when they collected 22 hits while defeating the Indians, 12-1, May 11 in Cleveland . . . Mark Belanger led the hit parade with five safeties, to tie another club record, while Paul Blair and Don Baylor each had four hits and Jim Fuller blasted two home runs.

Skein Ends: A two-run homer by Charlie Spikes in the 9th inning ended a record-setting scoreless innings performance by the O's staff September 7 . . . The staff had gone 54 frames without giving up a run, an American League record, until Spikes homered against Ross Grimsley . . In the first inning of the game, George Hendrick doubled for the first extra base blow in 71 innings against O's pitching . . . The staff had given up just 38 hits over a period of more than seven full games.

Streak Stopped: The O's had a 10-game winning streak, their longest of the year, stopped by the Tribe September 8 . . . The Indians hit three home runs en route to a 7-4 victory.

Milestone: Boog Powell hit the 300th home run of his O's career September 13 (first game) off Dick Bosman.

Suspended: The second game of a twi-nighter between the Indians and Orioles at Memorial Stadium September 13 had to be stopped because of curfew . . . The game, interrupted twice by rain, was called after eight innings at 1:13 A.M., then completed the following night . . . The O's woon, 8-6.

Hero Blair: A grand-slam home run by Paul Blair, the third of his career, sparked the O's to a 7-1 victory May 21 over the Tribe... The next night Blair again was the hitting hero as he singled home the winning run to give the O's a 1-0 triumph in 12 innings over the Tribe... Ross Grimsley pitched the distance for the O's.

Rich Hitter: Rich Coggins tied a club mark with five hits as the O's beat the Indians, 9-5, in 11 innings July 26 in Cleveland . . . Coggins' 5th hit of the game, a double, drove in the tie-breaker in the 11th when the O's scored four times.

DETROIT: The Orioles enjoyed a 14-4 advantage over the Tigers, winning six of nine at Memorial Stadium and eight of nine at Tiger Stadium.

Clinching Day: The O's edged the Tigers, 7-6, at Tiger Stadium on October 1 and then waited several hours to find out they had clinched their fifth divisional title in six years . . Jim Northrup and Andy Etchebarren were pinch-hitting stars for the O's . . . Northrup ripped a two-run homer against his former mates to keep the O's in the game, and Etchebarren accounted for the winning tally with a double in the 9th . . . Several hours after the O's game came the news that New York, the other contending finalist, had been eliminated by Milwaukee.

# 1974 HIGHLIGHTS **ORIOLES VS. OPPONENTS**

No. 3,000: Al Kaline, born and raised in Baltimore, used his home town as a setting for his 3,000th career hit... He reached the pinnacle with a double into the right field corner against Dave McNally leading off the 4th inning September 24... Only 11 other players in the game's history have reached 3,000 career hits.

Walking Loss: Mike Cuellar had a nine-game winning streak ended by Detroit June 25 in which he wound up taking a hike . . . Cuellar was ejected by home plate umpire Russ Goetz after the third inning for dis-puting some of the arbiter's calls . . . Cuellar was charged with five walks in three innings and the Tigers scored two runs off him in the third . . . Those were the only runs in the game . . . The loss for Cuellar was his first since April 27.

Hit Man: Dave McNally pitched the O's to a 9-3 win over Detroit in the nightcap of a twi-night doubleheader August 4 in Detroit, but the one batter he couldn't get out was Ellie Rodriguez . . . The Tigers' third baseman had four of Detroit's seven hits, including two home runs and two doubles.

Triumphant End: The Orioles ended their 1974 regular season with a 5-4 victory over the Tigers October 2 to wind up the season with a ninegame winning streak.

KANSAS CITY: The Orioles posted an 8-4 record against the Royals, winning four and losing two in both Baltimore and Kansas City.

Rojas Slam: Cookie Rojas, the Royals' veteran second baseman, sent the Orioles down to a 9-5 defeat May 28 when he smashed a grand-slam home run off Bob Reynolds in the 11th inning.

Little Big Guy: Fred Patek tumbled the Orioles on Tumbler Night August 17 at Memorial Stadium as he drove in all three KC runs in a 3-2 win, including the deciding tally in the 10th inning.

TD's Five: Tommy Davis, the O's hitting specialist, collected five safeties to tie a club record for the second time in the season as he paced the O's to a 9-2 win August 30 . . . Davis also had five hits against Cleveland July 25.

MILWAUKEE: The Orioles were 8-10 against Milwaukee and had more trouble against the Brewers than with any other club in the Eastern Division . . . The O's won the series in Baltimore, 5-4, but lost six of nine at County Stadium where they had won 24 of 30 from 1970 through 1973 . . . Milwaukee was the only Eastern club to hold a winning margin for the year over the O's . . . Despite losing the series for the year, the O's are 58-29 (.667) against Milwaukee since the club was formed in 1969. in Seattle. 1969, in Seattle.

Slams: Milwaukee hit three grand-slam homers during the year against the O's . . . Johnny Briggs had one and Darrell Porter the other two . . . Briggs hit his June 20, Porter got his first June 23 and the other September 9 as a pinch-hitter.

Youthful Vet: Robin Yount, the Brewers' 18-year-old shortstop, showed all the poise of a grizzled veteran against the O's April 13 . . . In the 8th inning he committed an error which allowed a run to score that enabled the O's to the the game, 2-2 . . . In the 9th, however, he delivered a game-winning home run off Ross Grimsley.

Biair's Grab: Long noted for his defensive skills, Paul Blair made one of the greatest catches of his career to save a 6-5 victory for the O's September 9 at County Stadium . . . There were two outs and runners at first and second in the 11th inning when George Scott smashed a screaming line drive to dead center field . . . Blair snared the ball at the fence and his momentum carried him through a gate leading to the bullpen area.

Zero Match: The O's and Brewers went through 16 innings in a score-less game September 27 before the Orioles pushed over a run in the 17th to win, 1-0... It was one of two 17-inning tilts during the year for the O's... The other was against New York September 11.

Unhappy Holdover: The Orioles and Brewers were rained out of their scheduled Easter Sunday game April 14 in Milwaukee and it was re-set for the next night . . . The O's could have done just as well skipping the game because they lost, 6-1, to Clyde Wright and had only four hits . . Wright retired 24 of the last 25 batters he faced, including the last 17 in succession.

MINNESOTA: The O's played .500 ball against the Twins, winning four of six in Baltimore but only two of six in Minnesota. Rare Feat: Bob Grich became the first player in club history to hit three home runs in a game at Memorial Stadium when he did it June 18 against the Twins ... Three other Orioles have hit three in a game but all did it on the road—Boog Powell, who has done it three times; Curt Blefary and Paul Blair.

Quickest: The Orioles beat the Twins, 1-0, behind Mike Cuellar June 17 in a game reeled off in 1:43, the fastest of the season for the Orioles.

Big Innings: The Twins handed the O's successive losses August 24-25 in which their best weapon was the big inning . . . The Twins scored six runs in the second to win by a 9-5 score August 24 and they came back with five in the sixth inning the following night to register a 5-1 victory.

Thankful Killer: Harmon Killebrew was honored by the Twins before the August 11 game with the O's at Metropolitan Stadium . . . To show his appreciation, he drove in two runs and scored another to pace the Twins to a 5-4 win.

NEW YORK: The Orioles won 11 and lost seven against the Yankees . . . The O's won five of nine at Memorial Stadium and won six of nine in the Yankees' temporary home at Shea Stadium.

the Yankees temporary nome at Shea Statuth. Protests: O's Manager Earl Weaver filed two protests in games with the Yankees during the week-end of April 19-21 in Baltimore, but neither was upheld . . . He protested the game of April 19 on the basis that New York manager Bill Virdon did not immediately indicate his substi-tute after Bill Sudakis was ejected . . . In the second game of a double-header two days later, he filed another protest based on the fact that pitching coach Whitey Ford, acting on behalf of manager Virdon who had been ejected, made two trips to the mound to talk to his pitcher (Sam McDowell) without having to remove him.

TV Star: Lefthander Mike Cuellar showed a national television audience how to pitch when he fired a two-hitter against the Yankees while winning 5-1 in a game shown on NBC-TV as the "game of the week." how

Big Step: The Orioles took a big step toward their divisional title target when they swept a three-game series from the Yankees at Shea Stadium September 17-19... The sweep moved the O's into first place in the AL East and they stayed there the rest of the way.

Replay: Dave McNally shut out the Yankees on two hits, 2-0, June 29 and the next night Mike Cuellar followed with another shutout as he stopped the Yanks on six hits, 3-0.

Timely Hi: A single by pinch-hitter Boog Powell drove in the winning run as the O's edged the Yankees, 3-2, in a 17-inning game September 11 at Memorial Stadium . . . Ross Grimsley started for the O's and worked 14 innings before retiring for the night . . . It was the third longest individual pitching effort in club history . . . He gave up 10 hits over the first seven frames, but restricted the Yanks to only two hits over the next seven innings.

Huge Blast: The O's broke loose for their biggest inning of the year when they scored seven times in the 6th frame en route to a 10-4 win at Shea Stadium September 18.

OAKLAND: The Orioles ended the year with a split (6-6) against the A's, posting a 2-4 record at Baltimore and 4-2 mark in Oakland.

Standout: Southpaw Ross Grimsley accounted for half the O's wins over the A's as he beat them three times during the regular season . . . He defeated them 4-3 April 28, 9-3 May 7 and 3-0 July 6, when he hurled a five-hitter.

Hitting Explosion: The Orioles accumulated 21 hits while routing the A's 9-3 May 7 . . . All nine starters for the O's had at least two safeties while Paul Blair and Enos Cabell paced the attack with four and three hits respectively.

Great Effort: Rookie Wayne Garland pitched eight innings of no-hit ball against the A's July 15 but ended up not only losing the gem bid but also the game . . . Dick Green spoiled Garland's no-hitter with a single leading off the 9th and before the inning ended the A's had scored five runs, three unearned . . In his previous outing, July 8 vs. Cali-fornia, Garland worked 4.1 innings in relief without allowing a hit to run his no-hit streak to 12.1 frames.

Disappointing: The Orioles, playing before their largest home crowd of the year, a Bat Night crowd of 38,253, got trounced 11-5 by the A's April 27.

Dual Win: When Mike Cuellar beat the A's 6-3 May 6, the victory served a dual purpose: It was his first victory of the year after three straight losses and broke a five-game losing streak for the club.

TEXAS: The O's, who have had great success over the years against the Rangers and their predecessors, the Senators, dropped eight of 12 to Texas... The O's were only 2-4 at Memorial Stadium and did no better in Arlington... Until 1974, the O's had compiled a 151-69 record against the Washington-Texas franchise.

Super Steve: Bespectacled Steve Foucault had a great year against the Orioles, winning one and saving four . . . In seven appearances he held the O's scoreless for 15.2 innings, allowed only eight hits and fanned 12.

First Win: Wayne Garland picked up his first major league victory when he received credit for a 6-5 win over the Rangers June 2 . . . He held the Rangers scoreless and allowed only two hits in six innings of relief work.

**Gate High:** A throng of 39,269, the largest crowd ever to see the Rangers at home, packed Arlington Stadium June 1 and watched as the Rangers defeated the O's, 4-2.

Notable Hit: Brooks Robinson collected the 2,700th hit of his O's career against the Rangers June 7 to continue a pattern of setting personal milestones against the Washington-Texas franchise . . . Other noteworthy accomplishments against that club: 2,000th career hit (June 20, 1970); (Jonet Career run batted in (September 29, 1970); 2,300th career hit (June 10, 1972).

Big Push; The O's started their 28-6 spurt to the divisional title in Texas on Aug. 29 after losing the first two games of the series.

# SUMMARY OF THE 1974 SEASON

For the Orioles the drive to a fifth division championship in six seasons was a short one. It began precisely on Thursday, August 29th, in Arlington, Texas, just one day after they had reached their lowest ebb. At the time of the turnaround the Birds had sunk to 63-65 and trailed Boston by eight full games.

The surge consumed five pulsating weeks during which the Orioles won 28, lost only 6, overhauled the Red Sox, then took on the gallant latestarting Yankees in the toughest and most exciting pennant scrap the Birds have ever experienced.

The first five months of the season contained, as always, some notable events and individual performances, but team-wise it was mostly a Boston show, though Milwaukee and Cleveland also indulged their dreams for brief periods. The Birds for the most part played a supporting role. After the annual April scramble, they saw precious little of first place. There was a day on top in May and there were three more in July, but the lead was never more than  $\frac{1}{2}$  game.

Through the all star break and for some weeks thereafter the Birds at least hung close, always seemingly ready to make the big push expected of them. Then as the season wore on through August the Orioles began to slip back gradually but alarmingly until on a Wednesday night in Texas (8/28) they lost their fourth straight game and dropped two games under .500. For Baltimore the season was to start tomorrow.

Meanwhile, the Yankees, with a cast dominated by players from other organizations acquired in countless trades, began to stir. They had floundered in last place for three weeks in late June and early July, then played .500 ball for 5½ weeks. On August 20th they were only 61-61, but then went on to snatch 19 of their next 25 thru September 15th.

If the early stages of the Yankees' comeback went unnoticed, it was understandable because on August 23rd the Red Sox were at the pinnacle with a 70-54 record and a seven-game edge over both the Orioles and Yanks with six weeks to go. There was no reason whatsoever to believe Boston would fold. But fold they did. Over the next month they won only eight of 28 games.

It was on Labor Day, September 4th, that the Yankees finally caught the fading Sox, thanks to the Orioles. While the Birds were shutting out Boston in both ends of a doubleheader in Baltimore, the Yankees were blanking the Brewers to move into a first place tie. However, as the public and press marvelled at the upstart Yankees, the Orioles in the midst of a ten-game winning streak had moved quietly back into contention, just two games off the pace.

The Yanks took over undisputed possession of first place the following day. The Red Sox, who had been on top for all but 11 days during the  $3\frac{1}{2}$  months from May 24th thru September 4th, came back on the 8th to tie, but within the week they were permanently consigned to third place.

For two weeks after grabbing the top rung the Yankees fought off all challengers and in the process dealt the Orioles two losses in three tries in Memorial Stadium (Sept. 11-12). On September 16th, the eve of the critical and final series between the Orioles and Yankees, New York held its biggest lead, 2½ games.

The pennant race could have ended in Shea Stadium over the next three days (Sept. 17-18-19) had the Yankees swept the series. But, instead, it was the Orioles who did so, twice by shutouts, and the Yanks' biggest lead disintegrated completely. When the Orioles left Fun City for a series in Boston, they led by ½ game.

Now it was the Yankees' turn to show their character and they responded by sweeping a four-game set from Cleveland while the Birds won two of three in Fenway, and once again New York was back in front by one game.

Boston then went to Shea and won a doubleheader on Tuesday, the 24th, while the Birds squeezed out a one-run win over Detroit. And the lead changed hands again. Over the last weekend of the season the Birds swept Milwaukee but the Yankees did the same thing to Cleveland (they had beaten the Indians seven straight times over a nine-day period) and the situation was unchanged.

The Birds had two games to play in Detroit before the Yankees took the field on Tuesday night in Milwaukee. They won them both to clinch a tie and now New York, winners of 27 of their last 38 games, couldn't afford a single mistake. They took a 2-0 lead in the 7th, but the Brewers came back to tie, then Milwaukee won in the 10th on George Scott's single. For the first time ever the Birds had beaten the Yankees in a pennant race.

Here are some of the day-to-day highlights of the Orioles' quick and dramatic thrust to the eastern division title:

Aug. 29 . . . Grimsley went the route to beat the Rangers' Jim Bibby, 6-2. It was the start of the 10-game winning streak, longest in the league this year . . . 4th, 8 g.b.

Aug. 30-31, Sept. 1. . . The Birds swept a three-game series in Kansas City . . . 3d, 5 g.b.

Sept. 2 . . . In the opening game of the Labor Day doubleheader both Grimsley and Luis Tiant hurled 3-hitters, but the Orioles won 1-0, on Bobby Grich's 18th home run in the 4th. In the nighteap Cuellar was even stingier, limiting the Sox to just two hits, as he, too, won 1-0 over Bill Lee. Paul Blair's sacrifice fly provided the difference . . . 3d, 3 g.b. Boston and New York were tied for 1st.

Sept. 4... The Birds blanked the Red Sox for the third straight time on Palmer's 3-hitter and extended their streak to seven. Earl Williams blasted two homers in the 6-0 win. In the series, the Sox were held to eight hits, all singles, in 27 scoreless innings ... 3d, 2 g.b.

Sept. 6 . . . The Orioles set an A.L. record by stretching their consecutive shutout string to five after whitewashing the Indians in both ends of a twin bill. Dave McNally pitched a 3-hitter in the opener to win, 2-0, as Enos Cabell hit his first home run. In game two Cuellar hurled a 5-hitter to win his second 1-0 decision in a row. Richie Coggins' double in the 7th produced the only run. The O's were tied with Boston, 1½ games back of N.Y.

Sept. 7 . . . The winning streak reached 10, but the O's string of consecutive scoreless innings stopped at 54, a new league record, when Grimsley, leading 3-0 in the 9th, yielded a 2-run homer to Charlie Spikes. Bob Reynolds came on to preserve the edge as the Birds beat Gaylord Perry for the third straight time . . . 3d, 1 g.b.

Sept. 8 . . . Jim Perry defeated Palmer, 7-4, to end the win string . . . 3d, 1 g.b.

Sept. 9 . . . In Milwaukee, Darrell Porter's grand slam off Reynolds in the 9th erased a 5-1 Baltimore lead, but the O's scored on a Tom Murphy wild pitch in the 11th, then Paul Blair saved the day in the bottom half of the inning when he ran into the center field fence with his back to the plate to collar George Scott's long two-out drive with the tieing and winning runs aboard . . . 2d place tie with Boston, 1 g.b.

Sept. 11 . . . Boog ended the longest game of the year in the A.L. with a 17th-inning single off Cecil Upshaw scoring Blair from second. However, the Birds dropped a 5-1 decision to the Yankees' Larry Gura in the nightcap of the twin bill that ended at 12:27 a.m. . . . 2d, 1 g.b.

Sept. 12 . . . The Yankees' Mike Wallace, making his first start, blanked the Birds on four hits, 3-0. Palmer also had a shutout until the Yanks scored all their runs in the 8th . . . 3d, 3 g.b.

Sept. 13-14... The Orioles won three straight from Cleveland including the second game of a doubleheader that began on Friday the 13th and, after two rain delays, was suspended at 1:13 a.m. and resumed the following evening. The Birds trailed in that one, 4-0, but bounced back to win 8-6. Tommy Davis' clutch home run in the 7th, right after the first rain interruption, tied the score, then Al Bumbry and Richie Coggins broke the tie in the 8th with rbi singles ... 2d, 1½ g.b.

Sept. 15 . . . Gaylord won his 20th in a tight duel with Grimsley who walked in the game's only run in the top of the 9th . . . 2d,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  g.b.

Sept. 17 . . . At Shea Stadium, Palmer and Doc Medich pitched shutout ball for six innings, but in the 7th Bumbry drove home a run on a sacrifice fly, then in the 8th Blair, who had stolen a triple from Chris Chambliss with a fine catch earlier, drilled a 3-run homer off Sparky Lyle and Palmer won, 4-0...2d,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  g.b.

Sept. 18 ... The Birds enjoyed their biggest inning of the year scoring seven runs in the 6th to break a 2-2 tie as Cuellar went the route to gain the 20-win circle for the fourth time in his career ... 2d, ½ g.b.

Sept. 19... McNally pitched the Birds into first place for the first time since July 13th by shutting out the Yankees, 7-0, on three hits to climax a sweep of the three-game series in Shea... 1st,  $\frac{1}{2}$  g.a.

Sept. 20 . . . Boog blasted a home run into the left field net in Fenway to break a 1-1 tie in the 7th, then starter Grimsley and reliefer Grant Jackson made it stand up. The field was sloppy after a 90-minute rain delay in the 8th and the conditions cost the Sox a tie. When Dwight Evans doubled to left with Yastrzemski on first, Jim Northrup fell down fielding the ball. At that point, Yaz, approaching third, was waved home, but, as Northrup recovered, Yaz also fell and was nailed a few feet off the bag. While winning 19 of 24 games since August 28, the Orioles' pitching staff had compiled a superb 1.76 era . . . Despite the win, the Yankees moved into a tie for first by taking a doubleheader from Cleveland.

# SUMMARY OF THE 1974 SEASON

Sept. 21 . . . The Birds suffered one of their most traumatic losses in 21 years. The game started in rain and after only two out in the top of the lst with the O's already up 2-0, time was called. That delay consumed nearly 2½ hours, and two other half-hour interruptions followed.

As the playing surface grew progressively worse the O's held doggedly to a 5-1 lead. Palmer came out after six and was relieved by Reynolds. In the 9th Reynolds and Jackson yielded four runs, the last three on Evans' home run with two aboard and the score was tied. But, only briefly because Deron Johnson ended it in the 10th with an rbi single off Dave Johnson. Bill Lee went all the way for the Sox in a game that started at 2:21 and ended at 8:48. The Yankees meanwhile came from a 7-2 deficit to beat Cleveland 14-7 and take a one-game lead over the Birds.

Sept. 22... Showing no psychological effects of the sudden and heartbreaking defeat of the day before, the O's scored three times in the first and Cuellar scattered eight hits to pick up his 21st win, 7-2, with help from Boog who contributed another home run and three rbi ... The Yankees beat Cleveland again though to retain their one-game lead.

Sept. 24 . . . Al Kaline, a native Baltimorean, picked up his 3000th and 3001st base hits in his home town and Eddie Brinkman hit a 2-run homer off McNally to give the Tigers a 4-3 lead. But in the 8th, another old pro, Brooks Robinson, doubled home the tieing run off John Hiller then scored the winning tally from third on Andy Etchebarren's perfect squeeze bunt. Meanwhile the Red Sox swept a doubleheader at Shea Stadium and the Birds moved back on top by ½ game.

Sept. 25 . . . The Tigers jumped off to a 3-0 lead behind Mickey Lolich and still led, 4-2, with the Birds coming to bat in the 9th. Blair singled home one run with one out, but then Ron LeFlore leaped over the centerfield fence to steal a would-be game winning homer off the bat of Bobby Grich with two on. However, the two runners moved up a base after the catch and then Davis looped a drive to center to plate the tieing and winning tallies in one of the most exciting finishes ever. The Yankees went 10 innings to beat Boston, 1-0, and stayed one game back.

Sept. 27 . . . It took the Orioles four hours and 28 minutes, and 17 innings, to score a run, but that was all that was needed to beat the Brewers. It was the longest game of the year by time in the A.L. and tied with the Birds-Yankee game 16 days earlier as the longest by innings. The winning tally scored on a bases-loaded swinging bunt by Bob Oliver. Jim Palmer pitched 12 shutout innings, but the win went to Jackson who had fanned the side in the 17th . . . N.Y. was rained out and the Birds' lead jumped to a full game, biggest of the year.

Sept. 28 . . . Cuellar and Blair, that day elected as co-winners of the "Most Valuable Oriole" award for 1974, contributed to the Birds' fifth straight win. Cuellar went the route to pick up his 22nd victory and Blair drove in two runs as the O's enjoyed a rare breather, 7-1, over the Brewers' Billy Champion . . 1st, ½ g.a.

Sept. 29... The Birds found another way to win. With the score tied at 3 in the 9th, starter Jim Slaton walked three straight hitters with one out. Tom Murphy came on, got a force at the plate for out number two, then ran the count to 3-2 on Powell. Ball four followed and the Birds had picked up their 38th one-run victory. The Yanks completed their sweep of Cleveland with a 10-0 win ... 1st, ½ g.a.

Sept. 30 . . . In Detroit the O's jumped out to a 6-0 lead, later led 9-2 and wound up with a 12-6 victory on a 16 hit attack with Grich and Williams leading the way, each with a homer and three rbi . . . The Yankees were idle . . . 1st, 1 g.a.

Oct. 1 . . . The Birds stretched their streak to 27-6 (and eight straight) with an incredibly agonizing 7-6 win over the Tigers in the afternoon, then had to wait until precisely 11:06 p.m. (EDT) to celebrate. At that moment in Milwaukee County Stadium, George Scott singled up the middle with the bases loaded in the 10th inning off Yankee righthander Doc Medich and the pennant race was over.

The Orioles had spotted the Tigers an early 3-0 lead but fought back on two-run homers by Coggins in the 5th and Northrup in the 6th to go ahead. Detroit tied it almost immediately. In the 8th the O's went two runs up on Davis' single but again the Tigers came back to tie. Then, in the 9th Etchebarren doubled down the left field line to score Brooks all the way from first base with the go ahead run. But even in the bottom of the 9th Detroit kept the pressure on. When Reynolds struck out Kaline to end the game, the tieing run was on third base ... 1st, 2 g.a.

Oct. 2 . . . Although it was meaningless, the Orioles won the final game of the regular season in typical fashion, 5-4. It was the Birds' 40th onerun victory of the year, their 15th one-run win during their fantastic 28-6 surge, and their ninth straight victory . . . The Yankees also won . . . . 1st. 2 g.a.

Orioles MVPs: Three Orioles have won "mvp" honors in all star competition: Billy O'Dell (1958), Brooks Robinson (1966) and Frank Robinson (1971). O'Dell, the former Orioles lefthander who also pitched for the Giants, Braves and Pirates, hurled the last three innings of the only all star game ever played in Baltimore, and retired all nine batters he faced to protect a one-run lead, thus giving the A.L. a 4.3 win. ... Brooks won the '66 Arch Ward Memorial Trophy on the strength of a 3-for-4 effort at bat (including a triple) and an 8-for-8 performance afield. He was the first player from a losing team to be so honored. ... Frank's fourth inning home run at Detroit in '71 put the American League on top to stay and earned him "mvp" honors. It was the A.L.'s first all star victory since 1962.

Brooks Robinson: Brooks has now played in 18 consecutive all star games (including two games each in '60, '61, and '62) and has been a starter 11 times, starting with both games in 1961 and including nine of the last 12 (beginning 1964). His lifetime average is .289 (13-for-45) with three triples, one home run and five rbi. He has also handled 43 chances (11 putouts, 32 assists) without error.

In addition to winning the "mvp" award in the 1966 all star game Brooks came close on two other occasions. In 1964 at Shea Stadium he went 2-for-4 with a two-run triple and made a sensational defensive play on an Orlando Cepeda smash, then in 1970 at Cincinnati went 2-for-3, hit another triple and drove in two runs.

Brooks has not had a hit in his last three all star games.

EAST vs. WEST: Last year for the fifth time in six seasons the eastern division teams of the American League won more games than their western counterparts in inter-divisional play, 219-213. However, only one team in the East had a winning record vs. western division teams. That was the Yankees who were 48-24. The Orioles and Cleveland were both 36-36; Boston was 35-37 and Detroit and Milwaukee were both 32-40. In the West, Texas with a 39-33 record was tops followed by Chicago (38-34), Minnesota (37-35), Oakland and K.C. (36-36) and California (27-45). It is interesting to note that the two divisional first place teams, the A's and O's, had identical 36-36 records and were 6-6 against each other. Oakland's four game victory over the Birds in the ALCS gave the West

Oakland's four game victory over the Birds in the ALCS gave the West its third American League title in six years, but the East still holds a 14-9 overall lead in ALCS games.

100 WINS: The Orioles won more than 100 games in each of three straight seasons—'69 (109), '70 (108) and '71 (101). Only two other clubs have achieved this feat in the history of major league baseball: the '29-'30-'31 Philadelphia A's (104-102-107) and the '42-'43-'44 St. Louis Cardinals (106-105-105).

NUMBER "20" RETIRED: After Frank Robinson was traded to the Dodgers following the '71 season, his uniform number "20" was retired as an expression of respect and gratitude for his many achievements during six Baltimore seasons that produced four American League pennants and two world championships. Frank was the first Orioles player to be so honored.

#### **ORIOLES SET A.L. RECORDS FOR CONSECUTIVE SHUTOUTS (5)** AND CONSECUTIVE SCORELESS INNINGS (54)

\* \* \*

The Orioles pitching staff set two A.L. records in early September, 1974 by putting together a string of five straight shutouts and by blanking their opponents over a stretch of 54 consecutive innings. The scoreless streak actually started in the 9th inning of a game in Kansas City on September 1. Dave McNally gave up his only run in the 8th and then pitched a scoreless 9th while beating the Royals, 7-1. The streak ended six games later in the 9th inning on September 7 when Ross Grimsley working on a 3-0 lead gave up a two-run home run to Cleveland's Charlie Spikes. Grimsley who was the winner anyway by a 3-2 score was relieved at that point by Bob Reynolds. That also ended another string, of six straight complete games, but extended the Birds' winning streak to 10. The Orioles pitching staff set two A.L. records in early September, 1974

During the 54 inning skein the O's out-scored their opponents, 14-0, and out-hit them 37-20 . . . Mike Cuellar won two of the five straight shutouts, both by 1-0.

The major league records of six straight shutouts and 56 consecutive innings which the O's came very close to at least tying were set by the 1903 Pirates (June 1 thru 9). The previous A.L. record of 47 consecutive inings was held by the 1948 Cleveland Indians and the mark of four consecutive shutouts had been accomplished four times, most recently by the Orioles' foursome of Hal Brown, Billy Loes, Connie Johnson, and Ray Moore between June 24 and 28, 1957.

### -BIRDS' FIRST GAME IN BALTIMORE IN '54-

The modern American League Orioles made their Baltimore debut in Memorial Stadium on April 15, 1954 before a crowd of 46,354 including Vice President Richard M. Nixon who threw out the first ball. Behind the seven hit pitching of Bob Turley who fanned nine, the Orioles of Jimmy Dykes defeated Paul Richards' White Sox, 3-1, in Baltimore's first American League game in 52 years. Clint Courtney won the distinction of hitting the first home run in the brand new stadium (built on the site of the previous municipally owned ballpark used by the International League O's). It was a bases empty blast off Virgil Trucks who also yielded a solo homer to Vern Stephens in the fourth and was the losing pitcher. The Birds' starting lineup in that game was: Bobby Young, 2b; Eddie Waitkus, 1b; Gil Coan, cf; Vic Wertz, rf; Sam Mele, lf; Stephens, 3b; Billy Hunter, ss; Courtney, e and Turley, p.

In November-December 1954 the Orioles and Yankees engineered a 17 player deal, one of the biggest in baseball history. General Manager Paul Richards sent the following players to New York: pitchers Mike Blyzka, Don Larsen and Bob Turley: catcher Darrell Johnson, first baseman Dick Kryhoski, shortstop Billy Hunter, and outfielders Ted del Guerico and Jim Fridley .... The Birds in turn acquired the contracts of: pitchers Harry Byrd, Jim McDonald and Bill Miller: catchers Hal Smith and Gus Triandos; second baseman Don Leppert, third baseman Kal Segrist, shortstop Willie Miranda and outfielder Gene Woodling.

Last year the Orioles earned four Gold Gloves for the fourth time in six seasons. Only three other clubs have ever won as many as four in a season and none more than once: Chicago White Sox (1960), St. Louis Caradinals (1963) and Cincinnati Reds (1974). The Orioles have won 33 Gold Gloves (including 21 in the last six years), more than any other major league club. The Cardinals rank second in the majors with 30. In 1974 Brooks Robinson won his 15th straight Gold Glove, Paul Blair his sixth straight and seventh in eight years, Mark Belanger his fourth and Bobby Grich his second.

Until 1958 major league clubs could draft players within a range between \$15,000 (for ana players) and \$2,000(for class d players) ... In 1958 the price for big league drafts rose to \$25,000. However, in 1959, a first year player draft at the big league level was set up to discourage the payment of inordinately large bonus pay-ments to free agents. The new rule provided that first year players could be selected at the major league level (if not protected on a major league team's 40 man roster) for \$12,000. In 1961 an even lower draft price was set up for more recent first year players. That figure was \$3000. That year, incidentally, the Baltimore organization set a record of sorts by being relieved of 19 eligible first year players (seven during the big league selections and 11 more during the minor league draft). In 1965 the first year player draft began to lose its significance and then dis-appeared in 1970.

The Orioles have made 18 separate transactions with N.L. clubs during inter-league trading periods since the inception of the practice in 1959. They have dealt with the Reds four times, with the Phillies three times and with the Giants, Astros and Cardinals twice each ... The Birds have also traded once each with the Dodgers, Pirates, Padres, Braves and Expos... They have not dealt with the Mets or Cubs.

### HOW THEY JOINED THE ORIOLES

Of the 36 players currently on the Orioles roster, 22 were signed by Baltimore as free agents, two were selected in the major league draft, 11 were acquired in trades and one was obtained thru the outright purchase of his contract from another organization. A total of 24 players (including Paul Blair) spent all or most of their minor league careers in the Orioles' farm system (67%). Here is the breakdown by category:

**SUSPENDED GAME RULE:** A game terminated by curfew or by a pre-arranged time limit is a suspended game only if it has progressed far enough to be an official game (i.e.  $4\frac{1}{2}$  to 5 innings).

A game terminated by light failure is a suspended game anytime after it begins.

Suspended games shall be resumed at the exact point of suspension immediately preceding the next scheduled single game between the two clubs on the same ground . . . If this is not possible, other provisions for resumption are specified in American League Regulation 3.8.

A game called at the END of a completed inning AFTER NINE INNINGS for any reason shall be a SUSPENDED game. This rule became effective in 1969. Formerly, the game would have been declared a tie and replayed in its entirety at a later date.

BALTIMORE CURFEW: Night Games—see A.L. Regulation 3.4 (13) —Saturday night—play must be called at 11:59 P.M. regardless of the game situation . . . All other nights—no inning may be started after 11:59 P.M., but any inning which begins before that time may be completed.

In other American League cities not governed by local curfews, no inning may start after 1:00 A.M., but any inning beginning prior to 1:00 A.M. may be played to completion.

**BATTING/PITCHING (ERA) CHAMPION QUALIFICATION:** 502 or more plate appearances/162 or more innings.

**ROOKIE QUALIFICATIONS:** A player shall be considered a rookie unless, during a previous season or seasons, he has (a) exceeded 130 at bats or 50 innings pitched in the major leagues; or (b) accumulated more than 45 days on the active roster of a major league club or clubs during the period of the 25-player limit (opening day thru Aug. 31) excluding time in military service.

NEW SAVE RULE (10:20): Credit a pitcher with a save when he is the finishing but not the winning pitcher, and when he qualifies under <u>one</u> of the following conditions—(1) he enters the game with a lead of no more than three runs and pitches for at least one inning; or (2) he enters the game with the potential tying run either on base or at bat, or on deck; or (3) he pitches effectively for at least three innings regardless of his team's lead.

**DEFINITION OF NIGHT GAME:** Any game scheduled to start after 6:00 P.M. (i.e. 6:01 P.M. or later) will be considered a night game. If a game is scheduled to start at 6:00 P.M. and is delayed by rain or for any other reason, it will be considered a day game.

However, both games of a twi-night doubleheader shall be considered night games. When afternoon and night games are played on the same date and separate admissions are charged, they will be counted as one day and one night game, and will not be included in doubleheader statistics.

# 1969 AMERICAN LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

The Orioles swept the Minnesota Twins in three straight to capture the first ALCS ever played, but it wasn't all that easy. In games one and two the Birds went 12 and 11 innings respectively to win a pair of cliffhangers, then exploded in game three to bring the American League pennant back to Baltimore after two years as an "also ran."

The opener, played in Baltimore, featured four home runs, but the winning run crossed on a ball that traveled only 22 feet. It was a bunt dropped by Paul Blair with two out in the 12th and Mark Belanger on third that won the game though that play wouldn't have been possible if Boog Poweil had not tied the score in the 9th with a lead-off home run. Two innings earlier Tony Oliva had given the Twins a one-run edge with a two-run homer off Mike Cuellar. The winning pitcher was reliever Dick Hall while Kon Perranoski, who replaced Jim Perry in the 9th, was the victim of Blair's surprise bunt on a 1-1 pitch.

Game two was dominated by the outstanding pitching of Dave McNally and Dave Boswell and neither team scored until pinch-hitter Curt Motton lined a Perranoski pitch over Rod Carew's head to plate Boog Powell from second with two out in the home half of the 11th. Motton was the first hitter to face Perranoski. McNally wound up with a 3-hit shutout and 11 strikeouts, while Boswell scattered seven hits over 10.2 frames.

The scene changed to Minnesota for game three. After spotting the Twins a first inning run, the Birds came to life with an 18-hit attack off starter and loser Bob Miller and six other hurlers and won going, away, 11-2, behind Jim Palmer. Blair went 5-for-6 with two doubles, a home run and five rbi, while Don Buford was 4-for-5 and Ellie Hendricks drove in three runs with two hits.

# **1970 AMERICAN LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES**

The Orioles scored 27 runs in three games to sweep the Twins for the second year in a row, but, though they won the first two games by 10-6 and 11-3 at Minnesota, both were considerably closer than the scores would imply. Only the final game, won by Jim Palmer, 6-1, was rarely in doubt.

Two 24-game winners, Jim Perry and Mike Cuellar, were matched up in the first game but neither stayed around long on a cold and windy day in Minnesota. The Orioles broke a 2-2 tie with a 7-run outburst in the 4th, highlighted by Cuellar's wind-blown grand slam that started off in foul ground plus home runs by Don Buford and Boog Powell. Unfortunately for Cuellar, he was ko'd in the 5th when the Twins pulled within three runs (6-9) and he was not eligible for the victory which went deservedly to Dick Hall who allowed just one hit over the last 4.2 innings. Perry was the loser.

Though the Birds won the second game by an eight-run margin, Dave McNally who went the route was forced to protect a 4-3 lead from the 4th thru the 8th and the Twins threatened in every inning. Then in the top of the 9th the Birds staged their second 7-run inning in two days to put the game on ice. Tom Hall, the starter who left in the 4th trailing 4-0, was the losing pitcher.

Back in Baltimore the Orioles jumped out to a 5-0 lead off Jim Kaat after three innings and Palmer held the Twins in check on seven hits. Jim had now gone the route to win the clincher in all three of the Orioles' pennant winning seasons.

### **1971 AMERICAN LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES**

For the third straight year the Orioles won the ALCS in three games, this time against the Oakland A's by scores of 5-3, 5-1 and 5-3. The Birds had now won all nine ALCS games played since the divisional system was instituted in 1969.

The A's were favored in game one, largely because Vida Blue, the ultimate Cy Young award winner and A.L. MVP, was starting. The odds looked good when Oakland jumped out to a 3-0 lead off Dave McNally after 3½ innings and even better when they still led 3-1 after 6½. However, in the Orioles' 7th Curt Motton, who had won game two of the ALCS vs. the Twins two years earlier with an 11th-inning pinch-single, batted for McNally and delivered a clutch rbi double that tied the score at 3 after Mark Belanger had singled home the second run. Then Paul Blair followed with another double that scored the winning run plus an insurance tally. Eddie Watt finished up for the O's to save the win for McNally.

Four home runs including two by Boog Powell, all off the A's Jim Hunter, accounted for all the Birds' runs in their 5-1 second game triumph. Mike Cuellar went all the way for Baltimore, holding the A's to six hits.

Jim Palmer once again had the honor of pitching the Orioles to a pennant despite a yield of three home runs including two to Reggie Jackson. The score was tied at one-all in the 5th when Manager Dick Williams ordered starter Diego Segui to walk Ellie Hendricks intentionally, thus loading the bases and bringing Brooks Robinson to bat. Brooks promptly singled up the middle to put the O's on top 3-1. Sal Bando's 6th-inning homer cut the lead in half, but the Birds scored twice more in the 7th providing a three-run lead which was more than enough for Palmer who finished with a flourish by fanning Gene Tenace, Mike Hegan and Curt Blefary in order in the 9th.

# **1973 AMERICAN LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES**

After a year's respite, the O's won the division title again and put their perfect ALCS record on the line. They won the opener behind Jim Palmer's 5-hit shutout to extend their streak to 10 straight, but then Catfish Hunter stepped in, won game two and came back in the deciding 5th game to blank the Birds and give the A's their second straight pennant.

Palmer fanned 12 in the opener while going the route but his adversary, Vida Blue, didn't even get out of the first inning during which the Birds touched him for four runs en route to a 6-0 win.

Before 48,425 in Memorial Stadium the A's jumped on Dave McNally for four home runs and went on to tie the series at one game apiece, 6-3. Sal Bando hit two of the homers and was robbed of a third on a fine leaping catch by Al Bumbry. Ironically, the beneficiary of the home runs was Catfish Hunter who had yielded a like number in his one 1971 ALCS start against the O's.

The two clubs moved west to Oakland where Mike Cuellar pitched one of the finest games of his career only to lose 2-1 in 11 innings on Bert Campaneris' leadoff home run. Mike had successfully protected a 1-0 lead for six innings until the A's tied it in the 8th on a pair of looping singles by Jesus Alou and Joe Rudi. Cuellar yielded only four hits, but Oakland's Kenny Holtzman, who also went the distance, gave up only three.

The A's knocked out Jim Palmer with a 3-run second inning and were coasting to the pennant with a 4-0 lead thru six innings. Then the Birds suddenly struck for four runs in the 7th, the last three on an Andy Etchebarren homer with two aboard off Vida Blue, to tie the game, and Bobby Grich followed an inning later with what proved to be a gamewinning homer off loser Rollie Fingers. The winner in relief was Grant Jackson.

Hunter was in complete control throughout the decisive fifth game while the A's scored three times off Doyle Alexander thru four innings. Palmer came on in relief and pitched 4.1 shutout innings but the horse had already been stolen as Hunter shutout the Birds on five hits, winning 3-0.

### **1974 AMERICAN LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES**

The Orioles retained the distinction of having won the first game in every post-season series in which they've been involved (5 ALCS and 4 WS), but then went into a disastrous scoring slump, scored only one run in the last three games, and dropped the playoffs to the A's for the second year in a row. In one stretch, beginning with the 6th inning of game one through the 8th inning of game four, the Birds went 30 innings without scoring a single run. They finally broke the string in the final frame of the last game, but it was one run too few.

Catfish Hunter, who had beaten the Orioles seven straight times over two seasons including twice in the 1973 ALCS, was bombed for six runs on eight hits including homers by Paul Blair, Brooks Robinson and Bobby Grich before giving way to John Odom in the 5th inning. Mike Cuellar held a 6-2 lead entering the 9th but gave up a leadoff single to Jesus Alou and a pinch-double to Claudell Washington. At that point Ross Grimsley made a rare relief appearance and retired the side in order, giving up only a sacrifice fly to Bert Campaneris.

### Game No. 2 . . . Sun., Oct. 6 at Oakland

The Orioles, who were 3-1 against Ken Holtzman in the regular season, had only one hit off the Oakland lefthander for the first seven innings but were still only two runs back (on a homer by Bando and an rbi triple by Joe Rudi) until Ray Fosse hit a three-run homer off Grant Jackson in the 8th. Four of the five Oakland runs were unearned. McNally was the loser.

The A's had only one hit all day but still beat the Birds 2-1, thanks in part to an unusual wild streak by Mike Cuellar who gave up no hits, but walked nine batters in 4.2 innings. Cuellar, who had never issued more than six walks in a game during his six years in Baltimore, loaded the bases on passes in the first, but got out of the jam unscathed. However, with two down and none on in the 5th he walked two more hitters, passed Reggie Jackson intentionally to load the bases, then walked Gene Tenace to force in the game's first ru. The A's led 1-0 without benefit of a base hit until, with one down in the 7th, Reggie Jackson doubled to left for his first hit of the playoffs to drive in Bando with run number two. Bando had reached on a walk from Grimsley. The Orioles who had been blanked for 30 straight innings finally mounted a threat in the 9th when Blair reached on a walk and Grich singled. With two down Boog Powell singled sharply up the middle to score Blair from second and move pinch-runner Enos Cabell, the potential tieing run, to third. At that point, however, Rollie Fingers, who had relieved Hunter in the 8th, struck out Don Baylor to end the Baltimore season.

The Orioles entered their first world series as 8-5 underdogs to the Dodgers, but the odds changed quickly. While sweeping the Dodgers in four straight the Birds' most questionable commodity, pitching, enjoyed its finest hour, allowing the N.L. champions only 2 runs and shutting them out in the last three games and over the final 33 innings of the world series.

In the very first inning of the opener the Birds scored three quick runs off Don Drysdale at Dodger Stadium when a one-out walk to Russ Snyder was followed by back-to-back homers off the bats of Frank and Brooks Robinson. Snyder drove in another run in the second upping the Birds' lead to 4-0, but then Dave McNally yielded a home run to Jim Lefebvre in the home 2d and lost control in the 4th, walking the bases loaded. At that point Moe Drabowsky came out of the bullpen, fanned a batter, walked another to force in the Dodgers' second run, and then turned in a nearly perfect record-breaking effort the rest of the way. Moe finished with 11 strikeouts, a series mark for a reliever, and tied another standard at one point by fanning six straight L.A. batters. In picking up the 5-2 win, he yielded just one hit over the last 6.2 innings.

In game two Jim Palmer, nine days short of his 21st birthday, became the youngest pitcher ever to throw a shutout in world series play. His opponent, the great Sandy Koufax, who was making the final appearance of his major league career, was victimized by six Dodger errors, three of them in the 5th inning by centerfielder Willie Davis, that led to three unearned runs in a previously scoreless game. Davis dropped two fly balls and committed a throwing error in that inning. The Birds contributed eight hits to the 6-0 victory, while Palmer limited the Dodgers to four.

After returning to Baltimore the Orioles put together a pair of 1-0 wins to capture their first world championship. In game three Wally Bunker, coming off a mediocre year, blanked the Dodgers on six hits and, although Claude Osteen and Phil Regan held the Birds to only three safeties, one of them was a decisive 5th-inning home run by Paul Blair.

The fourth and final game matched McNally and Drysdale again, but this time McNally went through the afternoon unscathed. He and Drysdale each allowed only four base hits, but again the home run, this time by Frank Robinson in the 4th, provided the difference. Two other drives, one by each side, would have gone out also except for the defensive genius of the centerfielders. Willie Davis stole a homer from Boog Powell with a great over-the-fence catch in the 4th and then Blair snatched Jim Lefebvre's bid for a game tieing homer in the 8th in similar style. For his two home runs in the series Frank Robinson was honored as the series' myp.

# **1969 WORLD SERIES**

After winning 109 regular season games and sweeping the ALCS, the Orioles were a solid favorite over the Mets and even more so after Mike Cuellar went the route to beat Tom Seaver in the opener played at Memorial Stadium, 4-1. Don Buford, the Orioles' leadoff hitter, homered in the first and the Birds remained on top throughout.

Everything else that happened in that world series was downhill. From that point on the Mets' defense more than anything else stymied the Birds as the N.L. Champions won four in a row. In the second game Jerry Koosman no-hit the Birds for six innings, but Brooks Robinson tied the score at 1-1 with a single in the 7th. However, third baseman Ed Charles snuffed out what might have been a bigger inning with a fine play on a Dave Johnson shot to his left. Dave McNally, who had given up just three hits in eight innings, yielded three in a row in the top of the 9th, the last by Al Weis that drove in the winning run in the Mets 2-1 triumph for Koosman who yielded just two hits all day.

At Shea Stadium Tommie Agee, the Mets' centerfielder, had a day for himself. He homered off Palmer in the first then later made two sensational catches to help Gary Gentry and reliefer Nolan Ryan blank the Birds on four hits, 5-0.

Plate umpire Shag Crawford and Baltimorean Ron Swoboda shared top billing in the fourth game, won by the Mets, 2-1. Crawford, using a quick thumb, gave Earl Weaver the distinction of being the first manager to be ejected from a world series game in 34 years when he bounced the Birds' skipper in the 3rd inning. It was only the third time in series history that a manager had received such treatment.

The Birds, trailing 1-0 as the result of a second-inning homer by Donn Clendenon, finally got it going in the 9th off Tom Seaver. A pair of oneout singles by Frank and Boog put runners at the corners and Brooks followed with a lined shot to right which at very worst would tie the score and put men on second and third. However, Ron Swoboda then made his magnificent contribution to series lore with an unbelievable headlong backhanded diving catch inches off the grass. Frank scored from third after the catch but that was all the scoring the Birds could muster in the inning. In the bottom of the 10th Crawford was again involved in controversy. With Mets runners on 1st and 2d and Pete Richert pitching, J. C. Martin bunted with one out. Richert fielded the ball and threw to first, but the ball hit Martin who was running outside the three-foot lane in the back and rolled into right field, allowing the winning run to cross the plate. Crawford presumably watching the play did not issue an interference call.

In the fifth game Dave McNally hit a two-run homer off Koosman and Frank Robinson hit a solo shot, both in the third inning, to stake the Birds to a 3-0 lead. In the 6th Frank appeared to have been hit on the foot by a pitched ball but plate umpire Lou DiMuro said no and a substantial argument ensued to no avail.

In the bottom of the inning, with the O's still up by three, Cleon Jones made the same claim and again DiMuro ruled negatively, until manager Gil Hodges ran out of the dugout with a ball bearing traces of shoe polish. DiMuro relented and sent Jones to first (movies tended to confirm DiMuro's judgment on this call). When Clendenon followed with his third homer of the series the Birds' lead was narrowed to 3-2. Light hitting Weis hit his first Shea Stadium homer ever in the 7th to tie it off McNally. Then with Eddie Watt pitching in the 8th, doubles by Jones and Swoboda produced the ultimate winning run while two Orioles' errors admitted an insurance tally, as the Mets captured the world championship by a 5-3 score.

# **1970 WORLD SERIES**

The all-around brilliance of Brooks Robinson and a hefty Baltimore offense that produced a team average of .292 with 10 home runs were the dominating factors in the Orioles' five-game world series victory, despite the fact that Cincinnati enjoyed the early lead in four of those games by scores of 3-0, 4-0, 1-0 and 3-0. The Birds out-scored the Reds 33 to 20.

Brooks batted .429 (9-for-21), hit two doubles and two homers, had six rbi and drove the Reds to distraction, particularly Johnny Bench and Lee May, with repeated defensive gems. Paul Blair actually led the club in hitting with a .474 average (9-for-19) and both he and Brooks tied the series record for hits in a five-game set. In addition, Ellie Hendricks batted .364, Dave Johnson .313 and Boog Powell .294.

With Jim Palmer going against Gary Nolan the Birds were down 3-0 in the 4th inning of the opener at Cincinnati when Powell sliced the deficit to one with a two-run homer, then Hendricks tied it with another home run an inning later.

Perhaps the most exciting and significant inning of the series was the Reds' 6th with the score still tied. Lee May who had already singled and homered led off with a one-hop smash over third base bound for extra bases until Brooks made a miraculous stop and while falling into foul territory threw a one-hop strike off balance to Powell to nip May. That play took on more importance as the inning progressed.

# 1970 WORLD SERIES (Cont.)

With one out, Bernie Carbo on third and a runner on first, pinchhitter Ty Cline bounced a high chopper in front of the plate. Hendricks stepped out to grab it, plate umpire Ken Burkhart went out also to position himself for a fair or foul call and Carbo broke from third. He came in on the foul side of the line while Hendricks dove at home from the fair side. Both runners jostled Burkhart who ended up on his seat with his back to the plate. Hendricks tagged Carbo with his gloved hand and Burkhart called the runner out, a decision that prompted a violent argument. Films and photos later revealed that (1) Ellie was holding the ball in his bare hand and (2) Carbo did not touch the plate.

In the 7th Brooks broke the tie with a home run off Nolan, and the Birds held on to win, 4-3, though Weaver summoned Pete Richert to relieve Palmer with two out and one on in the 9th to face Bobby Tolan whom he retired on one pitch.

In the second game the Reds scored three unearned runs in the 1st off Mike Cuellar and built the lead to 4-0 in the 3rd on Tolan's homer. The Birds got, one back on Powell's home run off Jim McGlothlin then broke thru for five more runs in the 5th. The most telling blows in that big inning were Brooks' game-tieing single and Hendricks' two-run double to left that gave the O's a 6-4 edge. Cincinnati reduced the lead to one on a Bench homer in the 7th, but then Dick Hall, the fifth Orioles' pitcher, came on and retired seven straight hitters to preserve the 6-5 lead though it took an over-the-shoulder catch by Blair at the centerfield fence to get pinch-hitter Jimmy Stewart for the final out of the game. Tom Phoebus, who had relieved Cuellar in the 3rd, was the winning pitcher.

The Orioles never trailed in game three, back in Baltimore. They already led 4-1 when Dave McNally doubled the run count with a grand slam in the 6th off Wayne Granger. That still ranks as the only basesloaded homer ever hit by a pitcher in a world series. Brooks doubled home the first two runs in the opening inning, hit another double later, and also contributed a diving backhanded catch of Pete Rose's sharp line drive in the 3rd.

The Birds seemed on the verge of a four-game sweep when they led 5-3 thru seven innings of the fourth game, but Palmer weakened in the 8th and left in favor of Eddie Watt with two on and two out. Lee May hit Watt's first pitch into the left field stands and the Reds went on to win, 6-5. Clay Carroll who pitched the last 3.2 innings got the win. Cincinnati's staff compiled an era of 6.70 during the series, but Carroll, in four appearances spanning nine innings, did not yield a run.

In game five the Reds, refreshed by their dramatic victory the day before, jumped on Cuellar for three first-inning runs just as they had in the second game at Cincinnati. However, Frank Robinson hit a two-run homer in the bottom of the inning, then the O's went ahead in the 2d with two more. Mark Belanger drove in the tieing run and Blair produced the go-ahead tally. Another two-run inning in the 3d put the game out of reach because by this time Cuellar had settled down. After his four-hit (including three doubles), three-run, first inning yield, he retired 24 of the last 27 hitters to face him and was never again in serious trouble as the Birds breezed home, 9-3.

The top of the 9th provided a fitting climax to the Brooks Robinson story. Bench, the first man to bat, lined a shot just foul of third base but not too foul for Brooks who grabbed it with a hearty lunge. Then with two out Pat Corrales sent a routine bounder to third and Brooks threw easily to Powell to clinch the Orioles' second world championship.

# 1971 WORLD SERIES

The Orioles jumped out to a quick two-game edge in Baltimore but then lost three in a row in Pittsburgh before returning home to win a tension-packed 10-inning sixth game. In the decisive 7th game, Steve Blass, who had pitched a three-hitter in game three to blunt the Orioles' win streak, came back with a four-hitter to win 2-1, thus giving the Pirates their fourth world championship in six world series.

Just as they had in four of the five games in the 1970 World Series vs. Cincinnati, the Birds spotted the Pirates an early lead. Trailing 3-0 in the bottom of the second, Frank Robinson got one back with a solo homer, then Merv Rettenmund connected an inning later with two aboard off starter Dock Ellis to put the O's ahead for good. Don Buford completed the day's scoring with the third homer of the day in the 5th, to make the score 5-3.

After struggling thru the first three innings, Dave McNally retired 19 straight and 21 of the last 22 batters while striking out nine. It was Dave's 16th win in his last 17 decisions.

While the O's scored all their runs on homers in game one, they hit nothing but singles, 14 of them, in the second game and, aided by seven walks and a Pirate error, scored 10 times in the middle three innings to take an 11-0 lead. Brooks Robinson, with three hits and two walks, tied a world series record for reaching base safely and Rettemmund also tied a series mark with two hits in one inning, the six-run 5th. Jim Palmer, who walked eight and threw 168 pitches, lost his shutout on Richie Hebner's three-run homer in the 8th and Dick Hall pitched the last inning. Bob Johnson was the starter and the loser for the Pirates in the 11-3 shellacking.

In Pittsburgh Steve Blass held the Birds to three hits, but led only 2-1 after Frank Robinson's 7th-inning homer until Bob Robertson missed the bunt sign in the bottom of that inning and instead hit one out off Mike Cuellar to produce the Pirates' 5-1 final margin.

Pat Dobson, who had not pitched in 15 days, started against Luke Walker in the first world series game ever played at night, but neither hung around for a decision. The game was actually decided by a pair of 21-year-old Pirates named Bruce Kison and Milt May. Kison, who relieved starter Walker in the 1st with the Birds ahead, 3-0, pitched six and one-third scoreless innings during which he allowed just one hit, though he did tie a series record by hitting three Orioles' batters. The Pirates battled back to tie the game with two in the 1st and one in the 3d and the score remained tied until May, batting for Kison, singled home the ultimate winning run in the 7th. Dave Giusti then came on and set the Birds down in order over the last two innings.

In game five Nelson Briles, who had not worked for two weeks, set the Orioles down on two hits as the Pirates won easily, 4-0, with Dave McNally getting the loss.

Back in Baltimore with their backs to the wall, the Birds spotted Pittsburgh a 2-0 lead early, came back to tie in the 7th, then won in the 10th, thanks to Frank Robinson and his aching legs. With Bob Miller, the Pirates' fourth pitcher, on the mound Frank drew a one-out walk. Suffering from a painful Achilles tendon injury in his right leg, Frank, nevertheless, streaked all the way from first to third on Merv Rettenmund's ground single up the middle. Vic Davalillo's throw to third baseman Hebner might have been in time, but Frank dove to the outside of the bag to evade the tag. Then Brooks hit a flyball to medium center. After Davalillo's catch, Frank came home and slid over safely with the winning run.

The Pirates' early lead was the result of Robertson's 2d-inning single and Clemente's 3d-inning home run. Buford homered in the 6th for the Birds' 1st run and Dave Johnson produced the tieing tally with a 7thinning single. Dobson relieved Palmer at the start of the 10th, but with two on and two out, McNally was called in for a rare relief appearance. He loaded the bases with a walk then got Oliver on a fly ball to end the threat.

For eight innings in the final game Blass and Cuellar matched four hitters, but the Pirates led 2-1. Clemente homered in the 4th after Cuellar had retired the first 11 batters to face him and the Pirates bosted their advantage to 2-0 on Jose Pagan's hit-and-run double that scored Willie Stargell from 1st in the top of the 8th. The Birds' lone run came in the bottom of the same inning, crossing on Don Buford's ground out. In the 9th Blass set down Powell, Frank and Rettenmund in order to wrap up the world championship. Though Clemente was voted the mvp in the series, Blass would have been an equally deserving winner.

Named "Manager of the Year" by A.P. in 1973 . . . Has second best won-lost percentage (.608) among all managers with five or more years service in major league history (see page 37).

His clubs have compiled 12-6 record in five American League cham-pionship series and were 10-0 until A's won second game of '73 ALCS... Managed A.L. all star team in 1970, 1971 and 1972 and was named honorary manager for the 1974 classic.

Served as first base coach for Orioles in first half of 1968 season, after spending 11 years honing skills as manager in Orioles farm system . . . Compiled an excellent record as his clubs won three pennants and finished second five times . . . The Baltimore Orioles were charter members of the American League when it began operation in 1901. However, after two seasons the club was moved to New York where it ultimately became known as the New York Yankees.

as the New York Yankees. The franchise from which the current Orioles descend came into the A.L. in 1901 representing Milwaukee, but in 1902 was transferred to St. Louis and named the Browns. In 52 seasons (1902 thru 1953) the Browns were, perhaps, the most unsuccessful team in major league history. They were 3,416-4,465 (.433) and finished in the second divi-sion 40 times. They won their only pennant in 1944 then lost the world series in six games to their home town rivals, the Cardinals. In June, 1951, Bill and Charles DeWitt sold their controlling in-terest to Bill Veeck who operated the club for the next 2½ seasons. On September 29, 1953, he sold his shares to a group of Baltimore businessmen who brought major league baseball back to this city after a 51-year lapse.
