## LAST TIME OUT

In its first rematch of the season, Sounders FC 2 earned its first point on the road against Whitecaps FC 2 in a 1-1 draw which saw defender Nick Miele get his first goal of the season, earning him USL Team of the Week honors.

The scoring opened up in the 16th minute when Whitecaps FC forward Robert Earnshaw capitalized on a misplayed back pass from S2 defender Damion Lowe to goalkeeper Charlie Lyon. Earnshaw poked his shot past Lyon, and the ball bounced slowly to the back of the goal.

S2 equalized as Aaron Kovar took a corner from the right which Andy Craven flicked on with a headed pass. His pass found Miele whose shot made it past the diving 'Caps keeper, Paolo Tornaghi.

# SOUNDERS FC 2 WEEKLY NOTES

## NOTABLE BLUES

Orange County Blues FC captain Didier Crettenand is currently the team points leader with two goals and three assists this season, including the game-winning goal last week against defending USL champion Sacramento Republic FC. The midfielder earned USL Team of the Week honors for his performance.

Joining Crettenand on the Team of the Week is OC Blues FC forward Denzel Slager, who also tallied against the Republic.

Cuban goalkeeper Pepe Miranda has started in net for each game, allowing only three goals while recording two shutouts and the fourth lowest Goals Against Average.

## STARTING POINTS

Sounders FC 2 forward Andy Craven has recorded either a goal or an assist in four out of five starts this season. He is currently tied for second in the USL for assists with four. Craven is known for his speed, a trait he has utilized effectively on the wing assisting two of Darwin Jones' three goals against Whitecaps FC 2 earlier this season from out wide. As a Sounders FC 2015 MLS SuperDraft pick, Craven is proving his worth in the ranks for the club that is very deep in his position. Against the stout defense of Orange County Blues FC, Head Coach Ezra Hendrickson will look to Craven to create opportunities for the Rave Green to put the ball into the back of the net.

## WEEKLY AWARDS

Sounders FC 2 defender Nick Miele scored the lone goal for the Rave Green, and helped contain Vancouver's pressure in a 1-1 draw against the 'Caps on Sunday, earning himself USL Team of the Week honors.

## ABOUT OC BLUES FC

Orange County Blues FC is in its fourth season in the USL, having made the playoffs only twice in its history. The Blues have only allowed three goals this season, the fewest in the USL Western Conference and second fewest in the entire league. The team won its only previous game on the road this season against defending USL champion Sacramento Republic FC.

The Blues currently sit fourth in the Western Conference with nine points, ahead of Arizona United SC on goal differential (plus-five).

The team is led by Swiss head coach Oliver Wyss who is in his first year at the club helm.

## RETURN OF GARZA

After sitting out three weeks with a hamstring injury, Sounder FC 2 forward Sam Garza returned to the 18 against Whitecaps FC 2 on Sunday. Garza had played in both games prior to his injury, scoring a goal 15 seconds after being substituted on against Sacramento Republic FC in the S2 home-opener. He made his return against Whitecaps FC 2, subbing on for Darwin Jones in the 77th minute. As one of the few players on the S2 roster with MLS pedigree, Garza will likely remain in Head Coach Ezra Hendrickson's plans for the rest of the season.

## RIGHT THE WRONGS

For a team that started out the season with strong defense as well as potent goal-scoring, it was a rough road trip for the Sounders FC 2 team that gave up six goals in three games.

"I think we have been giving up soft goals and we have nobody but ourselves to blame," said Head Coach Ezra Hendrickson.

The Blues have scored eight goals in four games, and are yet to be shutout in a match. The S2 defense will need return to its form in order to keep the Orange County offense from finding the net. S2 has recorded one shutout since the start of the season with goalkeeper Charlie Lyon playing every minute in goal so far.

## S2 HEAD COACH EZRA HENDRICKSON



Ezra Hendrickson was announced as an assistant coach on January 20, 2009, after completing a 14-year professional career, including 12 seasons in Major League Soccer. He is now the head coach of Sounders FC 2, the club's USL team.

Hendrickson played parts of eight seasons for Sounders FC Head Coach Sigi Schmid, including three in Columbus prior to his retirement. Hendrickson appeared in 266 regular season matches with 225 starts. Playing defense, he scored 23 goals and added 30 assists.

He also played in 32 postseason games with five goals and three assists. Hendrickson was a member of three MLS Cup championship teams, winning two with Schmid. Together, they won the 2002 MLS Cup with the Los Angeles Galaxy and the 2008 MLS Cup in Columbus. Hendrickson was also with the champion D.C. United team in 2004.

A native of the island of St. Vincent in the Caribbean, Hendrickson began his career in 1997 with the New York MetroStars, before joining the Galaxy later that season. He totaled six seasons in Los Angeles, where he won the 2000 CONCACAF Champions Cup, scoring two goals in a 3-2 victory, and the 2001 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, scoring one goal in a 2-1 victory. He was named Galaxy's Most Valuable Player for the 2001 season.

Hendrickson went to Dallas in 2003 and began the next season with the A-League's Charleston Battery before joining D.C. United for its run to the 2004 MLS Cup. After starting all 31 appearances in 2005 for expansion Chivas USA, Hendrickson was acquired by Columbus in early 2006.

An All-American and business administration major at Drake University, Hendrickson first played professionally with New Orleans of the USISL Select League (1995-96). After earning his first international cap in 1995, he served 12 years as captain of the St. Vincent and the Grenadines national team.

Hendrickson earned his U.S. Soccer 'A' Coaching License in December of 2008. He is a resident of Layou, St. Vincent, and has two daughters, Xavia and McKenzie.

## S2 GENERAL MANAGER ANDREW OPATKIEWICZ



Andrew Opatkiewicz started with Sounders FC in July of 2014, and was announced as General Manager of the Sounders Second Team, S2, on October 14, 2014.

Opatkiewicz has worked for over a decade in the sports industry beginning as General Manager of Seattle Wolves FC, a USL Premier Development League team he started while in graduate school. Prior to being named General Manager of S2, Opatkiewicz most recently worked as Vice President of Strategic Partnerships at Intersport, a sports marketing agency in Chicago.

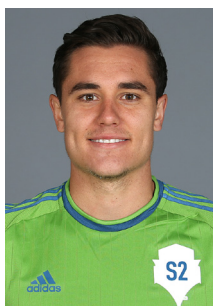
Opatkiewicz built the Seattle Wolves Football Club with the vision of bridging the developmental gap between elite youth and professional soccer players. The Wolves cultivated a number of players and front office staff now employed with professional clubs in the U.S. and abroad. At Intersport, he worked with Fortune 500 sports and entertainment brands to deliver marketing campaigns leveraging Intersport's properties on national television, as well as developing and distributing custom branded digital content.

He has also worked as the Associate Vice President of Strategic Development at STATS, directing the organization's global soccer and ice hockey businesses, and building the sports marketing business unit applying STATS global sports data content. And, as Head of Business Development with Prozone Sports before that, Opatkiewicz managed the Prozone business in North and South America providing performance analysis consultancy services to professional football clubs, national teams and colleges.

A native of The Berkshires, Massachusetts, Opatkiewicz studied biological sciences in undergraduate (University of New Hampshire) and graduate school (University of Washington), and has published research papers on topics including MLS salary allocation strategy and physical effects on team performance. Opatkiewicz also serves on the advisory board for the University of New Haven Master's degree in sports management.
