LAST TIME OUT

With a perfect home record on the line, as well as first place in the USL Western Conference up for grabs to the victor, Sounders FC 2 hosted Orange County Blues FC at Starfire Stadium on Friday, May 1. In a slow, backand-forth first half, the Blues were able to get on the board first as Denzel Slager rushed down the right wing and sent a cross into Christopher Ramirez who headed it home.

Second-half substitutes Sam Garza and Oalex Anderson changed the tune for S2, as Garza struck a 20-yard half-volley off the crossbar and in to equalize in the 66th minute. Anderson drew a penalty one minute after being subbed on, which Pablo Rossi converted for the game-winner in the 83rd. S2 improved to 4-0-0 at home, and moved to first place in the USL Western Conference with the victory.

In a rematch of Sounders FC 2's inaugural match, the Rave Green face Sacramento Republic FC at Bonney Field. S2 was victorious by a score of 4-2 over a weakened Sacramento roster without Rodrigo Lopez, the team's current leading goal-scorer and 2014 USL MVP finalist. Andy Craven scored the first-ever goal for S2, while Pablo Rossi earned USL Player of the Week honors scoring from a direct free kick, and assisting a Sam Garza goal 10 seconds after Garza came on.

REPUBLIC FC NOTABLES

Midfielder Rodrigo Lopez currently leads Sacramento Republic FC in scoring with five goals this season, including three game-winning goals. Lopez's 60-yard goal against Whitecaps FC 2 was voted the USL April Goal of the Month.

Goalkeeper Patrick McLain sits second in the USL with 22 saves in eight games with two shutouts.

In his last match against Seattle, Sacramento forward Justin Braun scored a half-volley goal from outside the box to draw level at Starfire. Braun, however, has been called up to the San Jose Earthquakes Although S2 went on to score three more times, Octavio Guzman put his mark on the match with a direct free kick goal from 25 yards.

With its roster up to full strength, it will likely be a much different Sacramento team to face S2.

ROAD WOES

In three games on the road this season, Sounders FC 2 has only been able obtain one point, a draw with Whitecaps FC 2. The Rave Green are 0-2-1 on the road, losing back-to-back matches by a one-goal margin against Tulsa Roughnecks FC and Oklahoma City Energy FC in April. In both matches, S2 held a lead, losing it in the final 30 minutes.

Although the S2 road record is bleak, Sacramento Republic FC, a team that only lost once at home in 2014, lost consecutive games including one at home against OC Blues FC and one on the road against Real Monarchs SLC. S2 looks to obtain its first road victory, while Sacramento hopes to right the ship and defend its home turf.

ABOUT SACRAMENTO REPUBLIC FC

Defending USL champion Sacramento Republic FC returns for its second season in USL play, having won the league title in its inaugural year.

Sacramento currently sits tied for second in the USL Western Conference with Orange County Blues FC.

The franchise is pushing to be the next club included in MLS expansion. Sacramento is affiliated with the San Jose Earthquakes and Portland Timbers of MLS.

Sacramento is coached by former MLS Coach of the Year and MLS MVP Predrag Radosavljevic (Preki).

WATCH THE THRONE

A quarter of the way through the 2015 season, only four points separate the top eight teams in the USL Western Conference, and three teams tied for third place sit one victory away from the top spot. Sounders FC 2 and Sacramento Republic FC currently sit first and second with 13 and 12 points, respectively. With a victory, either team could separate itself from the pack and assert its dominance on the Western Conference table.

The USL defending champion Sacramento has more experience near the top of the table, finishing second in the league table with 17 wins and 55 points in 2014. The next seven games leading up to the halfway point in the season will likely show a clearer picture in the West as expansion teams start to find their groove, and returning teams figure out how to play within the league's new format.

S2 HEAD COACH EZRA HENDRICKSON

Ezra Hendrickson was announced as an assistant coach on January 20, 2009, after completing a 14-year professional career, including 12 seasons in Major League Soccer. He is now the head coach of Sounders FC 2, the club's USL team.

Hendrickson played parts of eight seasons for Sounders FC Head Coach Sigi Schmid, including three in Columbus prior to his retirement. Hendrickson appeared in 266 regular season matches with 225 starts. Playing defense, he scored 23 goals and added 30 assists.

He also played in 32 postseason games with five goals and three assists. Hendrickson was a member of three MLS Cup championship teams, winning two with Schmid. Together, they won the 2002 MLS Cup with the Los Angeles Galaxy and the 2008 MLS Cup in Columbus. Hendrickson was also with the champion D.C. United team in 2004.

A native of the island of St. Vincent in the Caribbean, Hendrickson began his career in 1997 with the New York MetroStars, before joining the Galaxy later that season. He totaled six seasons in Los Angeles, where he won the 2000 CONCACAF Champions Cup, scoring two goals in a 3-2 victory, and the 2001 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, scoring one goal in a 2-1 victory. He was named Galaxy's Most Valuable Player for the 2001 season.

Hendrickson went to Dallas in 2003 and began the next season with the A-League's Charleston Battery before joining D.C. United for its run to the 2004 MLS Cup. After starting all 31 appearances in 2005 for expansion Chivas USA, Hendrickson was acquired by Columbus in early 2006.

An All-American and business administration major at Drake University, Hendrickson first played professionally with New Orleans of the USISL Select League (1995-96). After earning his first international cap in 1995, he served 12 years as captain of the St. Vincent and the Grenadines national team.

Hendrickson earned his U.S. Soccer 'A' Coaching License in December of 2008. He is a resident of Layou, St. Vincent, and has two daughters, Xavia and McKenzie.

S2 GENERAL MANAGER ANDREW OPATKIEWICZ

Andrew Opatkiewicz started with Sounders FC in July of 2014, and was announced as General Manager of the Sounders Second Team, S2, on October 14, 2014.

Opatkiewicz has worked for over a decade in the sports industry beginning as General Manager of Seattle Wolves FC, a USL Premier Development League team he started while in graduate school. Prior to being named General Manager of S2, Opatkiewicz most recently worked as Vice President of Strategic Partnerships at Intersport, a sports marketing agency in Chicago.

Opatkiewicz built the Seattle Wolves Football Club with the vision of bridging the developmental gap between elite youth and professional soccer players. The Wolves cultivated a number of players and front office staff now employed with professional clubs in the U.S. and abroad. At Intersport, he worked with Fortune 500 sports and entertainment brands to deliver marketing campaigns leveraging Intersport's properties on national television, as well as developing and distributing custom branded digital content.

He has also worked as the Associate Vice President of Strategic Development at STATS, directing the organization's global soccer and ice hockey businesses, and building the sports marketing business unit applying STATS global sports data content. And, as Head of Business Development with Prozone Sports before that, Opatkiewicz managed the Prozone business in North and South America providing performance analysis consultancy services to professional football clubs, national teams and colleges.

A native of The Berkshires, Massachusetts, Opatkiewicz studied biological sciences in undergraduate (University of New Hampshire) and graduate school (University of Washington), and has published research papers on topics including MLS salary allocation strategy and physical effects on team performance. Opatkiewicz also serves on the advisory board for the University of New Haven Master's degree in sports management.
