NOTES

Undefeated in its first two games, S2 is off to a strong start having scored eight goals while only allowing two. Both the attacking prowess and defensive structure have shown well in both games. Against WFC2, Seattle only allowed four shots while peppering the 'Caps keeper with 20 shots, including eight on goal.

Timbers 2 are also off to an impressive start, undefeated in three games (2-0-1, 7 points), winning against Real Monarchs SLC with a brace from forward Kharlton Belmar, a Timbers Second Round pick of the 2015 MLS SuperDraft. The club also defeated Sacramento Republic FC, and earned a draw while short-handed against the Monarchs on Wednesday night.

Forward Schillo Tshuma creatively found space for a cross to assist on the first goal in T2 history. However, the forwards will have to beat a tall S2 backline that could include Damion Lowe (6'3") and Nick Miele (6'4"), who both put in solid performances last time out against WFC 2.

LAST TIME OUT

In the first Cascadia match-up in modern USL history, S2 erupted to four goals, including a hat trick from Sounders FC Homegrown Player Darwin Jones. Jones earned the Week 2 USL Player of the Week for his performance. Andy Craven also scored in the game when he headed in a rebounded shot from Damion Lowe that hit the post. Craven also assisted two of Jones' goals, and the game marked goalkeeper Charlie Lyon's first professional shut-out.

VERTICAL INTEGRATION

True to Sounders FC General Manager and President of Soccer Garth Lagerwey's structure of vertical integration, S2 seems to have already made an impact in the development and future of the First Team. Victor Mansaray and Cristian Roldan both made their first professional appearance with S2 against Sacramento Republic FC on March 21, 2015, the team's inaugural match. Roldan scored one goal during his appearance, which was assisted by a Mansaray cross.

Roldan got his first Sounders FC start against FC Dallas on March 28, a game that ended 0-0. Mansaray made his First Team debut in the same match as an 85th-minute substitute for Chad Barrett.

Be on the lookout in coming months for S2 players who begin to make their mark in the USL and earn their spots on the First Team roster.

HOLD THE LINE

Although S2 has only played two matches, the defense has already made a huge impact in how the game is played at Starfire. All you need is one look at the numbers to know the backline is doing its job and doing it well.

- WFC 2 recorded only one shot on goal, resulting in an easy save for S2 goalkeeper Charlie Lyon.

- S2 has posted a plus-six (8-2) goal differential, which is best in the entire league, only allowing one goal from the run-of-play.

The backline has looked different in both games with a lineup of Oniel Fisher, Dylan Remick, Jimmy Ockford and Damion Lowe against Sacramento, then Aaron Long, Andres Correa, Lowe and Nick Miele against WFC2. Fans can expect a combination of both formations against T2 as Head Coach (and former USL Defender of the Year) Ezra Hendrickson experiments with the team in the early days of the season.



SACRAMENTO REPUBLIC RECAP

Playing its second home match in the 2015 USL season, Sounders FC 2 (2-0-0, 6 points) earned three points against Cascadia rival Whitecaps FC 2 (0-1-0, 0 points) on March 29 at Starfire Stadium. Forward Darwin Jones scored three goals for his first professional hat trick, while Andy Craven recorded a goal and two assists. It is the first shutout recorded by goalkeeper Charlie Lyon and the S2 backline.

S2 has now scored eight goals between its first two matches, having scored four against defending USL champion Sacramento Republic FC in its home-opener on March 21. Jones, a Sounders FC Homegrown Player, opened the scoring in the 17th minute, converting a low cross by Andy Craven. The ball found Jones in front of a wide-open net for an easy tap-in.

Craven added to the S2 tally nearly 10 minutes later after defender Damion Lowe fired a shot from 25 yards that bounced off the post. Craven dove forward and headed in the rebound to make it 2-0.

Jones gained his second of the night in the 37th minute after Craven sent in a long pass forward that found Jones in the box. He fought off a defender and slotted the shot home to the bottom left to make it 3-0. He completed the hat trick early in the second half after a poorly cleared ball from defender Ethan Sampson that fell to Jones in the area. He volleyed the shot home for the final goal of the game.

Forward Qudus Lawal made his first professional appearance when he came on as a substitute in the 71st minute. Two Sounders FC Academy players also made their first S2 appearance, with defenders Choong Sil Lim and Kasey French coming on in the second half.

S2 HEAD COACH EZRA HENDRICKSON

Ezra Hendrickson was announced as an assistant coach on January 20, 2009, after completing a 14-year professional career, including 12 seasons in Major League Soccer. He is now the head coach of Sounders FC 2, the club's USL team.

Hendrickson played parts of eight seasons for Sounders FC Head Coach Sigi Schmid, including three in Columbus prior to his retirement. Hendrickson appeared in 266 regular season matches with 225 starts. Playing defense, he scored 23 goals and added 30 assists.

He also played in 32 postseason games with five goals and three assists. Hendrickson was a member of three MLS Cup championship teams, winning two with Schmid. Together, they won the 2002 MLS Cup with the Los Angeles Galaxy and the 2008 MLS Cup in Columbus. Hendrickson was also with the champion D.C. United team in 2004.

A native of the island of St. Vincent in the Caribbean, Hendrickson began his career in 1997 with the New York MetroStars, before joining the Galaxy later that season. He totaled six seasons in Los Angeles, where he won the 2000 CONCACAF Champions Cup, scoring two goals in a 3-2 victory, and the 2001 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, scoring one goal in a 2-1 victory. He was named Galaxy's Most Valuable Player for the 2001 season.

Hendrickson went to Dallas in 2003 and began the next season with the A-League's Charleston Battery before joining D.C. United for its run to the 2004 MLS Cup. After starting all 31 appearances in 2005 for expansion Chivas USA, Hendrickson was acquired by Columbus in early 2006.

An All-American and business administration major at Drake University, Hendrickson first played professionally with New Orleans of the USISL Select League (1995-96). After earning his first international cap in 1995, he served 12 years as captain of the St. Vincent and the Grenadines national team.

Hendrickson earned his U.S. Soccer 'A' Coaching License in December of 2008. He is a resident of Layou, St. Vincent, and has two daughters, Xavia and McKenzie.
