MATCHUP PREVIEW

On Saturday evening, Sounders FC 2 (1-4-3, 6 points) faces Sacramento Republic (3-3-1, 10 points) at Bonney Field in the Rave Green's second road contest of the season. In the season opener at Starfire Stadium, Seattle and Sacramento played to a 1-0 result for the visitors.

Last Sunday, S2 ended its four-match unbeaten streak after falling to Tulsa Roughnecks FC by a score of 2-1. Former Sounders FC striker Sammy Ochoa recorded a brace en route to winning USL Player of the Week honors, as Oalex Anderson recorded S2's lone goal.

Sacramento Republic hosts S2 after defeating LA Galaxy II on the road 2-0 last Saturday. Previously, Sacramento lost three consecutive matches by a score of 1-0 to Portland Timbers 2, Saint Louis FC and Orange County FC. The 2014 USL champion, Sacramento Republic FC posted a 13-8-7 record in 2015, finishing in fourth place in the Western Conference. The club performs under the direction of Head Coach Paul Buckle.

S2 HITS THE ROAD

Saturday's contest at Bonney Field marks the second road trip for S2 of the 2016 campaign, after beginning the season with six of its seven matches at home. In its lone road trip, S2 tied Real Monarchs SLC 0-0 on May 1. Most recently, S2 lost to Tulsa Roughnecks FC 2-1 last Sunday.

In addition to winning games, the primary purpose of S2 is to give players a chance to develop as they learn the system and are watched closely by Sounders FC's First Team coaching staff.

General Manager & President of Soccer Garth Lagerwey: "You have to vertically integrate the clubs. You have your First Team, and you have to push strategically to grow the Sounders, but you have to, below that, integrate S2 and the Academy."

SOUNDERS FC 2 NOTES

SCHWEITZER MAKES DEBUT

Jordan Schweitzer, the club's sixth Homegrown Player, made his professional debut as a late substitute against Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC before earning his first start at Real Monarchs SLC. Schweitzer missed the first four matches of the season due to injury, but has played the full minutes the past three matches.

Schweitzer, a 22-year-old native of Everett, Wash., was a three-time All-Summit League First Team selection at the University of Denver and led the Pioneers to three-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances.

Schweitzer started 70 of his 73 appearances across four collegiate seasons from 2012-2015 at DU. As a senior in 2015, the defensive midfielder was named First Team All-West Region selection after co-captaining the Pioneers to their second-straight conference title.

S2 ADDS DRAFT PICKS

In March, S2 announced the signing of 2016 MLS SuperDraft selections Zach Mathers, Emir Alihodzic and Michael Nelson. The club adds three of its 2016 SuperDraft picks to the S2 roster after selecting Mathers in the Second Round before adding Alihodzic and Nelson in the Third Round and Fourth Round of January's SuperDraft.

Mathers, 21, was a three-time All-ACC selection at Duke, including a First Team nod as a senior in 2015. The Keller, Texas native led the Blue Devils last season with eight goals, eight assists and 64 shots, completing a collegiate career in which he started 69 of 71 appearances and recorded 14 goals and 18 assists.

Alihodzic, 22, was an NSCAA Third Team All-West Region selection at Nebraska-Omaha after tallying four goals, including two game-winners, and two assists in 16 appearances as a senior. The St. Louis native started 60 of 65 appearances for the Mavericks in his collegiate career, twice receiving All-Summit League Second Team honors, in addition to being a 2014 Academic All-Summit League selection.

A 21-year-old defender, Nelson earned First Team All-Conference USA and NSCAA First Team All-Southwest Region honors in his senior season at Old Dominion in 2015. After playing his freshman season at North Carolina State in 2012, Nelson transferred to Old Dominion, where he registered four goals and four assists in 54 career appearances (53 starts) for the Monarchs from 2013-2015.

ANDERSON OPENS ACCOUNT

In the 18th minute of the last Sunday's match, S2 pulled the game level when Oalex Anderson - who was playing down from the First Team - finished off forward Myron Samuel's free kick in spectacular fashion. The ball fell to him after taking a touch off a defender's head deep inside box, which Anderson put away with a shoulder-height flying scissor kick. It was the first goal of the season for Anderson, who netted four goals for S2 last season.

S2 EXPANDS ROSTER

S2 has signed the following players: Matt Bersano, Devon Fisher and Mark O'Ojong, Nouhou Tolo, Brandon John, Jordy Delem and Willy Kapawa.

Bersano, 23, joins S2 after one season at Penn State, where he starred as goalkeeper while earning his Masters degree. As a Nittany Lion, Bersano recorded shutouts in five of his 13 matches and made 42 saves. Previously, Bersano played three seasons at Oregon State. In 2013, he set the school's single-season record with 101 saves.

Fisher, 22, enters his second season in USL after competing with Timbers 2 in 2015. The midfielder shined in three seasons at Virginia Commonwealth University, where he scored 12 goals and added five assists. O'Ojong, 19, comes to S2 from Cameroon's Rainbow FC. The midfielder has two international appearances for Cameroon, including the 2016 Africa Nations Championship, where the country fell to Ivory Coast in the Quarterfinals.

Tolo, 18, joins S2 after competing for Cameroon's Rainbow FC. He also has experience with Cameroonian sides Botafogo FC and Daga Young Stars.

John, 21, signs with S2 after most recently playing for FC Erzgebirge Aue's U-23 squad, which competes in the Oberliga, the fifth division of soccer in Germany. Born in Kingstown, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, John has Canadian citizenship and made his first international appearance for Canada's U-20 side in January of 2015.

Delem, 23, joins S2 after most recently playing for Club Franciscain of Martinique's Championnat National League. Previously, Delem played for France's AC Arles-Avignon B squad. The versatile defensive midfielder has 29 caps and four goals for the Martinique National Team.

Kapawa, 23, comes to the Rave Green from Lion Blesse de Fotouni. The club plays in Cameroon's top domestic league, Elite One.

S2 HEAD COACH EZRA HENDRICKSON



Ezra Hendrickson initially joined Sounders FC as an Assistant Coach on January 20, 2009, after completing a 14-year professional career, including 12 seasons in Major League Soccer. He is now the Head Coach of Sounders FC 2, the club's USL PRO team.

Hendrickson played parts of eight seasons for Sigi Schmid, including three in Columbus prior to his retirement. Hendrickson appeared in 266 regular season matches with 225 starts. Playing defense, he scored 23 goals and added 30 assists.

He also played in 32 postseason games with five goals and three assists. Hendrickson was a member of three MLS Cup championship teams, winning two with Schmid. Together, they won the 2002 MLS Cup with the Los Angeles Galaxy and the 2008 MLS Cup in Columbus. Hendrickson was also with the champion D.C. United team in 2004.

A native of the island of St. Vincent in the Caribbean, Hendrickson began his career in 1997 with the New York MetroStars, before joining the Galaxy later that season. He totaled six seasons in Los Angeles, where he won the 2000 CONCACAF Champions Cup, scoring two goals in a 3-2 victory, and the 2001 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, scoring one goal in a 2-1 victory. He was named Galaxy's Most Valuable Player for the 2001 season.

Hendrickson went to Dallas in 2003 and began the next season with the A-League's Charleston Battery before joining D.C. United for its run to the 2004 MLS Cup. After starting all 31 appearances in 2005 for Chivas USA, Hendrickson was acquired by Columbus in early 2006.

An All-American and business administration major at Drake University, Hendrickson first played professionally with New Orleans of the USISL Select League (1995-96). After earning his first international cap in 1995, he served 12 years as captain of the St. Vincent and the Grenadines national team. Hendrickson earned his U.S. Soccer "A" Coaching License in December of 2008. He is a resident of Layou, St. Vincent, and has two daughters, Xavia and McKenzie.

S2 GENERAL MANAGER ANDREW OPATKIEWICZ



Andrew Opatkiewicz started with Sounders FC in July of 2014, and was announced as General Manager of the Sounders Second Team, S2, on October 14, 2014.

Opatkiewicz has worked for over a decade in the sports industry beginning as General Manager of Seattle Wolves FC, a USL Premier Development League team he started while in graduate school.
