MATCH PREVIEW

The match will be the second and final meeting between the teams this season. Fresno FC defeated S2 on March 28 in Tacoma, 1-0. A late strike from Jemal Johnson in the 82nd minute gave the visitors the victory.

S2 (2-6-2, 8 points) is in 15th place in the Western Conference, while Fresno FC (2-4-6, 12 points) sits in 11th.

The result snapped a two-game losing streak for Seattle.

In the 71st minute with the away side down 1-0, Daley lofted a reverse pass into the box and Estrada headed it past Reno keeper JT Marcinkowski's right side to even the match at 1-1. The 20-year-old Daley came on for starting center midfielder Harry Shipp in the 67th minute and made an immediate impact. On the defensive front, Seattle goalkeeper Calle Brown made a pair of saves late in the match to preserve the road point for S2. Sounders First Team players Shipp, Lamar Neagle and Waylon Francis each started for S2 after MLS entered into Standard USL Loan Agreements with them on Friday.

CHENKAM SIGNED TO FIRST TEAM

Sounders FC on May 25 announced the signing of Cameroonian forward Felix Chenkam. The 19-year-old is tied for the team lead with four goals in nine appearances for Sounders FC 2 this season, in addition to five goals in 19 appearances for the USL side in 2017. Chenkam now occupies one of Sounders FC's allocated international roster spots.

"We're pleased to announce the signing of Felix to the First Team after over a year with S2," said Sounders FC General Manager & President of Soccer Garth Lagerwey. "We've spoken in the past about the importance of developing talent from our internal development pipeline. Not only are we excited to reward Felix for his hard work with S2, but also to add a young player that addresses a position of need for us."

Chenkam has started seven of his nine appearances for S2 this season, and he scored two of his four goals in a 3-2 win over Rio Grande Valley FC at Cheney Stadium in Tacoma on April 14. The striker was named to the USL Team of the Week for his performance. The Douala, Cameroon native joined S2 in March of 2017 from Cameroonian side Rainbow FC.

"He'll add a different dimension to what the club has at the moment, in that he's good at hold up play, he'll connect plays in the buildup and he wants to score goals," said Sounders FC 2 Head Coach John Hutchinson. "He's got a decent shot from range, and he'll add a bit of enthusiasm up top, as well. He's young, hungry and wants to go from there."

S2 MIDFIELDER RAY SAARI

On facing Fresno for the second time this season:

"The first result against Fresno -- we lost, 1-0 -- was really a heartbreaker. It's really hard when you're so invested in the game to lose late like we did. I think it will put a little bit of a chip on our shoulder for our guys. It's still in our memory. We were happy with the majority of our performance against Fresno, so I think we just look to capitalize a little bit more on the chances that we created in the first game. If we do so, I think we'll do just fine, and we'll be able to get a good result."

On his quarterly goals:

"We have had a couple of meetings talking about team goals on a couple of different fronts. We divide it up into defenders, midfielders, forwards. For the group of midfielders, we talked about it, and a passing accuracy goal is something that we set that we'd like to meet. We were able to meet it in the first quarter, so we want to continue to build on that. I think the most important thing, though, is points. None of these statistical points and goals really matter unless you get points on the board and points on the table. That's really my sole focus of the second quarter of the season."

S2 MOVES TO TACOMA

Seattle Sounders FC and the Tacoma Rainiers announced on November 1, 2017 that beginning in 2018, Sounders FC 2's previously-announced transition to Tacoma is accelerating, allowing S2 to play its home matches at Cheney Stadium, while progress continues toward a new soccer-specific facility. Earlier in 2017, the two clubs reached a historic agreement to build a 5,000-seat facility in Central Tacoma on the footprint of Cheney Stadium. While that process moves forward, South Sound soccer fans are now able to see their USL side play in Tacoma several seasons ahead of schedule.

"Our organization was already thrilled to be moving ahead with the Rainiers and the City of Tacoma on the new stadium project, but when we learned of the opportunity to begin playing USL games as soon as 2018 in a facility like Cheney Stadium, we embraced the chance," said Sounders FC Owner Adrian Hanauer. "From Rainiers leadership to the many civic officials in Tacoma that are working hard to deliver professional soccer to their city, we're humbled to have such willing partners in this effort. As soon as next season, fans can enjoy a first-class experience at Cheney, allowing the club to make a tangible connection to the City of Tacoma earlier than expected."

"We are so proud to bring another professional sports franchise to Tacoma," Rainiers President Aaron Artman said. "To partner with the top soccer organization in the country, the Sounders, adds a layer of passion and prestige to the project, fueled by a vibrant South Sound base of supporters. We are excited to deliver a fantastic USL experience with S2 at Cheney in 2018 and 2019, while keeping our focus on delivering a world class soccer specific stadium by 2020."

Originally announced in May of 2017, the partnership brings together two of the Northwest's premier professional sports organizations to reach a first-of-its-kind relationship in USL within the same regional market. The Tacoma Rainiers are an award-winning franchise that has been a staple of the South Sound community for over 50 years, operating as the top affiliate of Major League Baseball's Seattle Mariners. They will operate the business side of the new era of the USL club, taking advantage of the decades of experience operating a professional organization in the Tacoma market, while Sounders FC is set to maintain leadership over soccer operations and sporting infrastructure. With key details coming together - including a name for the organization that is representative of its new home - it was announced today that much like the naming of the Sounders FC First Team, Tacoma fans will have influence over the identity of their new club. Details for that process are forthcoming, with the team to play under the S2 brand in the near-term during this transition.
