## **MATCH PREVIEW**

Sounders FC 2 (3-7-2, 11 points) and Las Vegas Lights FC (3-5-4, 13 points) on Saturday will meet for the first time ever (8:00 p.m. PT / ESPN+). The match is the first of two between the teams this season. S2 hosts Las Vegas on July 26 at Cheney Stadium in Tacoma (7:00 p.m. PT / ESPN+).

S2 is in 14th place in the Western Conference, while Las Vegas sits in 13th. Seattle will look to build upon a home victory in its last match and earn its first road win of the season. Las Vegas dropped a 4-0 decision on Wednesday at Phoenix Rising FC.

Sounders FC 2 defeated OKC Energy FC in its last match on Sunday in Tacoma, 2-1. Forward David Estrada scored twice in a two-minute span to help S2 snap a five-game winless streak. Estrada was named to the USL Team of the Week for his performance.

# **S2 WEEKLY NOTES**

## LAST MATCH RECAP

A pair of dramatic late goals from forward David Estrada lifted Sounders FC 2 (3-7-2, 11 points) to a 2-1 comeback victory over OKC Energy FC (2-10-1, 7 points) at Cheney Stadium in Tacoma last Sunday afternoon. The win improved S2 to 3-4-0 in front of the home crowd this season, and it snapped a five-game winless streak overall.

OKC struck first in the 76th minute when midfielder Alex Dixon tapped in a cross from the far post to give Energy FC a 1-0 lead. Estrada equalized in the 83rd minute with a stunning goal. He received the ball just beyond the 18yard line, tapped it between two defenders and volleyed it into the back of the net to even the game at 1-1. Two minutes later, in the 85th, Estrada scored the game-winning goal by finding a rebound in open space and lifting the ball into the top of the net to make it 2-1. He now leads the team and ranks tied for fifth in the USL with six goals on the season.

## S2 HEAD COACH JOHN HUTCHINSON

On playing against Las Vegas:

**S2 MOVES TO TACOMA** 

Seattle Sounders FC and the Tacoma Rainiers announced on November 1, 2017 that beginning in 2018, Sounders FC 2's previously-announced transition to Tacoma is accelerating, allowing S2 to play its home matches at Cheney Stadium, while progress continues toward a new soccer-specific facility. Earlier in 2017, the two clubs reached a historic agreement to build a 5,000-seat facility in Central Tacoma on the footprint of Cheney Stadium. While that process moves forward, South Sound soccer fans are now able to see their USL side play in Tacoma several seasons ahead of schedule.

"Our organization was already thrilled to be moving ahead with the Rainiers and the City of Tacoma on the new stadium project, but when we learned of the opportunity to begin playing USL games as soon as 2018 in a facility like Cheney Stadium, we embraced the chance," said Sounders FC Owner Adrian Hanauer. "From Rainiers leadership to the many civic officials in Tacoma that are working hard to deliver professional soccer to their city, we're humbled to have such willing partners in this effort. As soon as next season, fans can enjoy a first-class experience at Cheney, allowing the club to make a tangible connection to the City of Tacoma earlier than expected."

"We are so proud to bring another professional sports franchise to Tacoma," Rainiers President Aaron Artman said. "To partner with the top soccer organization in the country, the Sounders, adds a layer of passion and prestige to the project, fueled by a vibrant South Sound base of supporters. We are excited to deliver a fantastic USL experience with S2 at Cheney in 2018 and 2019, while keeping our focus on delivering a world class soccer specific stadium by 2020."

Originally announced in May of 2017, the partnership brings together two of the Northwest's premier professional sports organizations to reach a first-of-its-kind relationship in USL within the same regional market. The Tacoma Rainiers are an award-winning franchise that has been a staple of the South Sound community for over 50 years, operating as the top affiliate of Major League Baseball's Seattle Mariners. They will operate the business side of the new era of the USL club, taking advantage of the decades of experience operating a professional organization in the Tacoma market, while Sounders FC is set to maintain leadership over soccer operations and sporting infrastructure. With key details coming together - including a name for the organization that is representative of its new home - it was announced today that much like the naming of the Sounders FC First Team, Tacoma fans will have influence over the identity of their new club. Details for that process are forthcoming, with the team to play under the S2 brand in the near-term during this transition.
