Sounders FC 2 (3-9-2, 11 points) and Swope Park Rangers (8-4-4, 28 points) on Thursday will play the second of two matches this season (7:00 p.m. PT / ESPN+).

Swope Park defeated S2 on March 24 in Kansas City, 4-2. David Estrada scored twice in the first road game of the season for Seattle. Kharlton Belmar recorded a brace for the Rangers, while Rodrigo Saravia and Colton Storm each notched one goal and one assist.

S2 is in 16th place in the Western Conference, while Swope Park sits in 4th. S2 looks to snap a two-game losing streak on Thursday, while Swope Park has won three of its last four matches.

LAST MATCH AT LA GALAXY II

LAST MATCH RECAP

Seattle Sounders 2 on Sunday equaled their highest goal output of the season with three, but fell on the road to LA Galaxy II, 5-3. Jesse Daley scored his first goal with S2 and added two assists, while captain Ray Saari found the back of the net for the second consecutive match. David Estrada netted the third goal for S2, pushing his team-leading goal total to seven.

Seattle got on the board first in the 14th minute on Saari's second goal of the season. Shandon Hopeau made a sliding tackle to win the ball in the midfield before finding Jesse Daley, who set up Saari for a long-range strike. Los Angeles answered with two quick goals in the 26th and 28th minute to take a 2-1 lead.

Daley netted his first S2 goal just before halftime to even the game at 2-2. Denso Ulysse sent the ball to the center of the area after a long buildup, and Daley was able to slot the ball past LA goalkeeper Justin Vom Steeg from short range. Daley now has one goal and three assists in six games since being signed from Australia on May 1.

Efrain Alvarez scored his first of two goals just after halftime to give Galaxy II a 3-2 lead. His second of the match came in the 62nd minute, two minutes after Alex Mendez scored the eventual game-winner.

In the 80th minute, Daley found Estrada off a quickly taken free kick, and the veteran finished from inside the area for his team-leading seventh goal of the season.

S2 HEAD COACH JOHN HUTCHINSON

On Swope Park Rangers:

"They're actually guite good at keeping the ball. They've got good buildup, they play out of the back. They do keep it and they do move it really well. They just have electrifying pace in wide areas. Last time we played them, we came against (Kharlton) Belmar, who, on the night, was just unplayable. It didn't matter what we did - change personnel - we couldn't contain him. He's a good player and he's done really well for them. In terms of their ability on the ball, they're probably one of the better teams in this competition to keep it in play and move really well. Good forward runs. We're going to have to be on our game to compete. We come off a poor performance against LA in a game that should have been winable. So, we need to have a reaction and a bounce-back effect against Swope."

On if they need to change what they do:

"I think on the road, we maybe need to have a look at what we're doing. We've conceeded 13 goals now in true games and maybe we look at our tactics, maybe we look at our personnel, etcetera. At home, I feel like in the majority of games, we've been competing, we've been in and amongst them, so we want to be more aggressive with our press, more aggressive with how we keep the ball. We want performances to rise higher and higher at home. Our expectation at home is that we go for it, we try to take the game and make the run of it. Maybe on the road, we have to have a look at how we play and maybe adjust that."

S2 MOVES TO TACOMA

Seattle Sounders FC and the Tacoma Rainiers announced on November 1, 2017 that beginning in 2018, Sounders FC 2's previously-announced transition to Tacoma is accelerating, allowing S2 to play its home matches at Cheney Stadium, while progress continues toward a new soccer-specific facility. Earlier in 2017, the two clubs reached a historic agreement to build a 5,000-seat facility in Central Tacoma on the footprint of Cheney Stadium. While that process moves forward, South Sound soccer fans are now able to see their USL side play in Tacoma several seasons ahead of schedule.

"Our organization was already thrilled to be moving ahead with the Rainiers and the City of Tacoma on the new stadium project, but when we learned of the opportunity to begin playing USL games as soon as 2018 in a facility like Cheney Stadium, we embraced the chance," said Sounders FC Owner Adrian Hanauer. "From Rainiers leadership to the many civic officials in Tacoma that are working hard to deliver professional soccer to their city, we're humbled to have such willing partners in this effort. As soon as next season, fans can enjoy a first-class experience at Cheney, allowing the club to make a tangible connection to the City of Tacoma earlier than expected."

Originally announced in May of 2017, the partnership brings together two of the Northwest's premier professional sports organizations to reach a first-of-its-kind relationship in USL within the same regional market. The Tacoma Rainiers are an award-winning franchise that has been a staple of the South Sound community for over 50 years, operating as the top affiliate of Major League Baseball's Seattle Mariners. They will operate the business side of the new era of the USL club, taking advantage of the decades of experience operating a professional organization in the Tacoma market, while Sounders FC is set to maintain leadership over soccer operations and sporting infrastructure. With key details coming together - including a name for the organization that is representative of its new home - it was announced today that much like the naming of the Sounders FC First Team, Tacoma fans will have influence over the identity of their new club. Details for that process are forthcoming, with the team to play under the S2 brand in the near-term during this transition.
